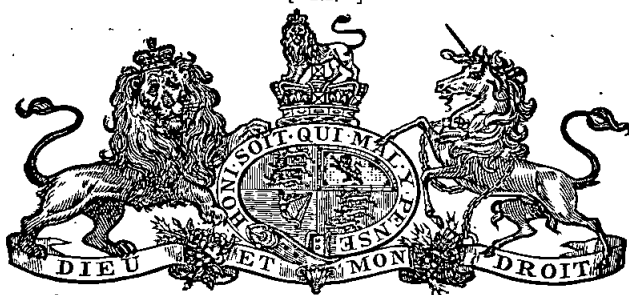

MARINE ACT 1893 (No. 2).—ROYAL ASSENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Althrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it was amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to Governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, should apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council made on the third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say,

"An Act to amend the Sixty-fifth Section of the *Marine Act 1890*,"

which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales until the Governor

of the said Colony shall signify either by speech or message to the Legislative Council of the said Colony or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it was provided among other things that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force, as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria, to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*:

And whereas the Governor of the said Colony of Victoria has reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council, and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled *An Act to amend the Sixty-fifth Section of the Marine Act 1890* for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

PROTECTORATE OF THE GERMAN NEW GUINEA COMPANY.—TRADING, RECRUITING OF ISLANDERS, FISHING, ETC.

NOTIFICATION.

By the ordinances and regulations issued for the Protectorate of the German New Guinea Company, the only ports of entry and clearance within the limits of the said Protectorate are the following:—

The port of Friedrich Wilhelmshafen, for Kaiser Wilhelmshafen; and the roadstead of Herbertshoek for the Bismarck Archipelago, including New Mooklenberg (formerly called New Ireland), and New Pomerania (formerly called New Britain), and for northern part of the Solomon Islands and adjacent islands and groups.

Trading, recruiting of Pacific Islanders, and fishing of pearl shells, pearls, and beche-de-mer within the limits of the said Protectorate are permitted only after obtaining a special licence for such purpose through the competent German colonial authority.

These ordinances, as well as the Custom House Regulations, have to be observed by the captains and the crews, of ships of all nations visiting the said Protectorate.

MY LORD,—With reference to your Lordship's despatch, Federal Council No. 2, of the 18th of September last, I have the honour to transmit to you, for communication to your Lordship's Government, copies of Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 3rd of March, 1894, by which each Colony which is or shall be represented in the Federal Council, except any Crown Colony, shall be represented by five members each.

The original Order in Council has been transmitted to the Governor of Tasmania, with a request that it may be deposited among the archives of the Federal Council in Hobart.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 48th and 49th years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is amongst other things enacted that each Colony shall be represented in the said Council by two members, except in the case of Crown Colonies, which shall be represented by one member each; and that Her Majesty, at the request of the Legislatures of the Colonies, may, by Order in Council, from time to time increase the number of representatives for each Colony:

And whereas the said Act has come into operation in the manner therein provided in respect of five Colonies, namely, the Colonies of Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, and Fiji:

And whereas the Legislatures of all the said five Colonies have requested Her Majesty to make an Order in Council increasing the number of representatives for each Colony, except any Crown Colony, to five:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Act, and in exercise of the power given to Her Majesty as aforesaid, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that each Colony which is or shall be represented in the said Council, except any Crown Colony, shall be represented by five members each.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than six females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

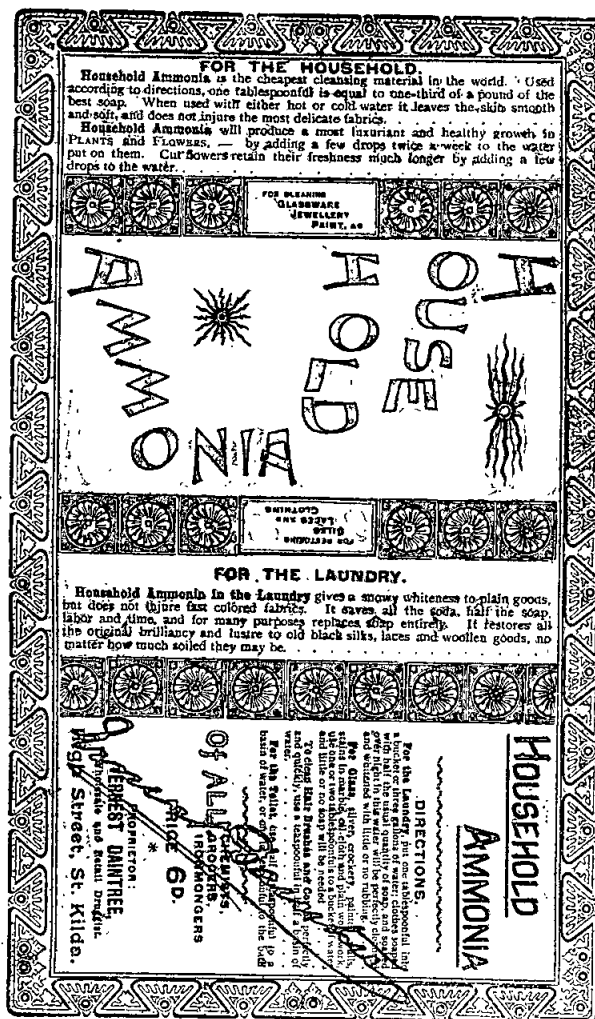

VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART II., PAY OF MILITIA FORCES.—SECTION III., VICTORIAN MILITIA.

I.—Rates of Pay.

In para. 57, for the sub-heading—"Artillery, Field Company of Engineers, and Infantry," the following sub-heading is substituted—"Artillery, Field Company of Engineers, Infantry, and Ambulance Corps."

The rates of pay fixed for the Ambulance Corps are cancelled.

PART VII., STORES.—SECTION I., GENERAL REGULATIONS, ORDNANCE STORES.

After para. 167 the following is added:—

167A. When Government rifles or carbines have become damaged or unserviceable in any other way than by fair wear and tear, or have been lost through negligence, the corps or person responsible will be required to pay the cost of the same, allowance being made according to the period during which the arm has been on issue.

The life of a rifle or carbine will be fixed at ten years constant issue. During the first two years no allowance will be made; but for each successive year during which the arm has been in use one-tenth of the cost of repairs will be allowed; for example, if the damage has occurred at the end of the third year of issue, seven-tenths of the cost of repair will be charged; and so on until completion of the tenth year, after which the cost will be borne by the State.

When a new barrel has been fitted, the rifle will be considered as new from the date of re-issue.

If, in the opinion of the Commandant, culpable negligence shall be proved in the case of arms on issue, it shall be in his power to order the full or any proportionate value to be paid irrespective of the age of the weapon; but not less than half-price will be charged for any article wilfully or carelessly lost or damaged, although it may have been in use for the prescribed period of wear.

Tampering with arms, such as filing sights, using on them, or any part of them, emery or other forbidden substances, will be considered culpable negligence, and will be charged for accordingly.

REGULATION.

CHAPTER X.—SWAMP LANDS.

Permissive occupation of certain allotments of reclaimed land on the Koo-wee-rup Swamp set aside for selected labourers employed by the Public Works Department in connexion with the reclamation works.

Regulation 12.—The permit to be issued for the occupation of any such allotment shall be in the form and subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto:—

SCHEDULE.

9. After the expiration of this permit, and on satisfactory proof being given that the above conditions have been fulfilled, a lease for 21 years will be issued under the provisions of Part I., Division 6, of the *Land Act 1890*. The rent under the lease shall be fixed by the Governor in Council.
10. In all proceedings for any alleged breach of the conditions of this permit, or of the regulations under which it is issued, the burden of proof of compliance therewith shall rest with the holder thereof.
11. Should the holder of this permit commit a breach of or neglect to comply with the above conditions, or be deemed by the Minister not to be a fit and proper person to hold a lease as aforesaid, this permit may be cancelled and possession of the land resumed.
12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that this permit has been forfeited or cancelled, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited or cancelled.

And the Honorable John McIntyre, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

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7. Schedule of the articles required and printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Controller of Stores, Stores Branch, General Post Office, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6 or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

14. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

15.
