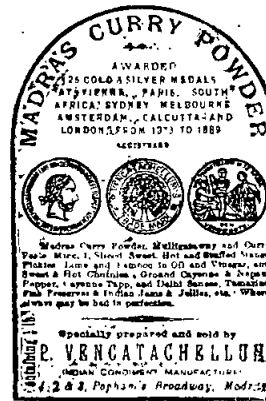

## THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

### REGULATION No. 15.

1. Regulation for graduating rate by the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the *Water Act 1890*, for the term of one year from the 1st day of January, 1894, to the 31st day of December, 1894.

2. That the respective rating in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the following divisions shall be:—

The Township of Dimboola Division, Two shillings.  
The Township of Jung Jung Division, Three shillings.  
The Natimuk Division, Two shillings.  
The Wimmera Division, One shilling.

3. And the owners and occupiers of all rateable property situate within the Township of Dimboola Division, the Township of Jung Jung Division, and the Natimuk Division in all cases wherein the rates named would not produce the sum of Ten shillings according to the municipal valuation of such property, shall pay a minimum rate of Ten shillings, irrespective of such municipal valuation, for each of the aforesaid divisions.

4. Such rates as aforesaid are hereby made on the 6th day of April, 1894, and are payable on the 1st day of May, 1894.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

6. The common seal of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was hereunto affixed, by the authority of the said Trust, in the presence of—

## KILMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The charge for water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

6. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The stop-cocks to be provided on service connexions from cast-iron mains to be built up with bricks round cock, with iron box on top to be the depth of one pitcher below the service, to be covered with one pitcher level with the surface.

Galvanized iron mains.  
Stop-cocks to be on footpath, bricked up with pitcher on top, level with the surface. Bricks to be built up round box and tightly rammed.

On unmade footpaths, stop-cocks to be fixed 3 feet from fence. All works to be completed to the satisfaction of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust.

7. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

8. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

12. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

14. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

15. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person

affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workman-like manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

17. Before any licensed person shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Twenty shillings, and in case he shall not immediately, after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Twenty shillings shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

18. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All end of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

19. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct which, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw or cause to enter therein, any dog or other animal, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

22. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

23. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

25. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the "Kilmore Waterworks Trust."

Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law, the rate to be charged for water supplied during the period from the 1st day of June, 1894, to the 31st day of October, 1894 (both days inclusive), under and in terms of this by-law shall be One farthing (¼d.) per 1,000 gallons. (This amendment to remain in force during the year 1894 only.)

No. 1106, Part I, sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additional Regulations, that is to say:—

**RUNNING CREEK CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE RUNNING CREEK CEMETERY.**

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Running Creek Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
- Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.
- No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

The births of 1,123 children, viz., 561 boys and 562 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. In the month of March, 1,259 births were registered, or 136 more than in the month under review. The births were 120 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 193 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 530, viz., 282 of males and 248 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 593, or 112 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 95, and were below the average of April during the previous ten years by 173. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been under that average by 215.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.52, and of deaths registered 1.19.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 54.5° on the 12th and 15th, and the lowest was 43.9° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month (60.0°) was 1.4° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.8°) took place on the 12th, and the least range (2.8°) on the 16th, the mean daily range being 14.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.325 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.699 inches on the 16th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.032 inches) was a fraction of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 9 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.839 inches. The average rainfall in April during the previous ten years was 2.56 inches, or .28 of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in April, 1893; 38 per cent. in April, 1892; 44 per cent. in April, 1891; 37 per cent. in April, 1890; 41 per cent. in April, 1889; and 38 per cent. in April, 1888.

Forty deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy aged 6, an architect aged 35, and a contractor aged 48, died of injuries consequent on falls; a female, aged 72, was passed over by a tram; a carter, aged 26, by a dray; a labourer, aged 23, died of injuries received whilst playing football; a jockey, aged 34, through being thrown from a horse in a hurdle race; a boy, aged 8, of fracture of the skull—how caused not stated; a publican, aged 70, of blood poisoning from a wound; a female infant, aged 9 months, of shock from severe burns; a male infant, aged 2 years, was drowned in a night pan, a stevedore, aged 46, in the River Yarra, a woodturner, aged 46, in the Saltwater River; a male infant, aged 5 minutes, and a female infant, were suffocated, the latter at birth; and a female, aged 52, died of asphyxia—how caused not stated. The suicidal deaths were those of a publican, aged 29, who shot himself, and a surveyor and a carpenter, aged 53 and 71 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and four deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 3 in the St. Vincent's Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 182, of which 97, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 85, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 135 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 348. Of these, 185, or 53 per cent., were males, and 163, or 47 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 35 were between sixty-five and seventy, 29 were between seventy and seventy-five, 21 were between seventy-five and eighty, 11 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

In April, as compared with March, deaths from miasmatic diseases fell from 54 to 37, and deaths from diarrhoeal diseases from 25 to 19. Under the former head deaths from typhoid fever fell from 31 to 24, and deaths from diphtheria from 7 to 4. Comparing the effects of these two complaints in the first four months of 1893 and 1894, it is found that deaths from typhoid fever rose from 74 to 90, and deaths from diphtheria from 11 to 17. In the month under notice 8 deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 140 births registered.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first four months of 1894:—

The Secretary shall forward to each member, at his registered address, an envelope addressed to the Secretary, indorsed "Voting-paper," enclosing a list of the members nominated and retiring, together with instructions as to the number of seats to be filled up, and the mode in which the names are to be erased.
