LARENZO AT BAILLIESTON.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

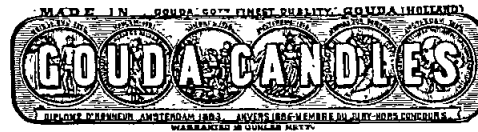

All material to be dyed in the wool, and no yarn or piece-dyed goods will be accepted.

The blue tartan is to be indigo dyed, and the scarlet tartan cochineal dyed.
