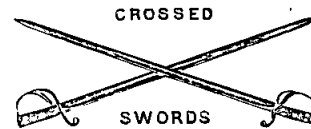

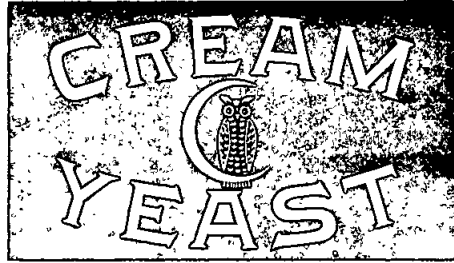

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Mines Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1120) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the regulations in the Thirty-third Schedule thereto contained and substitute others in lieu thereof for the carrying into effect of the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that such substituted regulations shall be deemed to be the regulations in the said Thirty-third Schedule for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal clauses 4 and 6 of the regulations in the Thirty-third Schedule to the Act aforesaid, and doth make the following Regulations, numbered 4 and 6, to be substituted therefor respectively, that is to say:—

4. Every applicant for a lease to mine on private property shall apply for a lease in the manner prescribed by these regulations; but during the seven days immediately preceding the day on which he leaves his application with the warden he must do the following things:—

- (a) Insert in a newspaper published in the district where the land is situated, or if there be no such newspaper then in one published nearest the district, an advertisement or notice in the form in the Appendix A hereto.
- (b) Post similar notices at the office of the warden, and at the post office or police court, whichever is the nearest to the land.
- (c) Deposit with the clerk of the warden the sum of Five pounds sterling, together with the cost of survey, in accordance with the scale of fees in Appendix B hereto, to be dealt with as hereinafter provided. The clerk shall give the receipt set out in the form in Appendix C hereto for such deposit.

If, however, it be deemed advisable to grant, in two or more leases, an area in respect of which an application has been made for one lease in accordance with these regulations, it shall be sufficient if a formal application be lodged with the warden, without complying with the sub-sections of this rule.

6. Within ten days after any application received by the warden has been duly entered, or in case the area applied for be less than one acre or more than thirty acres, then within ten days after having received the direction of the Minister, as provided by clause 3 of these regulations, the warden shall (except in the case of a formal application as before provided, when it shall not be necessary for the warden to carry out the requirements of this rule) give a notice to the owner and occupier of the lands to be entered upon in the form of Appendix E hereto; and at the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice as the time within which particulars shall be lodged with him, he shall authorize a mining surveyor to enter into and upon such land on behalf of Her Majesty, and to mark out and survey and make a plan of the land, and to report, in writing, on the following matters (that is to say):—

- (a) The physical character of the land proposed to be mined.
- (b) Whether it is cultivated or not, and whether any improvements have been effected thereon.
- (c) Whether it is intersected by auriferous or argentiferous veins or contains alluviums; and if it contains alluviums, the probable depth of the auriferous stratum in the same.
- (d) Whether the areas applied for on and under the surface are necessary for the proper working of the mine.
- (e) What rights and easements are necessary for effectual mining in and upon the land.
- (f) Whether the land is occupied or unoccupied, and if occupied, who is in occupation thereof.
- (g) And on all other matters affecting the application or the land proposed to be mined.
- (h) Whether posts defining the position of the area have been properly erected.

If however, a mining surveyor after entry finds that the land applied for is identical with an allotment of land surveyed on behalf of the Crown Lands Department, or with a block previously surveyed in connexion with an application for a mining lease, a copy of the plan of such allotment or of such previous survey shall be made without any further survey. When a lease is applied for by the owner or occupier under any agreement, the warden shall under this rule only authorize the mining surveyor to make a survey and plan of the land, and to report on the matters mentioned in sub-sections (f) and (g) of this regulation.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

BY-LAW No. 17.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin, for the purpose of carrying the said statute into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 17 (that is to say):—

1. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land within the Shire of Moorabbin, not being land which has been proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a place for the reception, utilization, or deposit of night-soil, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth, not less than 6 inches in thickness, and shall so cover the same or cause the same to be covered with the said layer of earth, between the hours of One o'clock ante meridian and Six o'clock ante meridian.

2. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing night-soil on any land within the Shire of Moorabbin, which has been proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a place for the reception, utilization, or deposit of night-soil, shall trench the same into the ground, and immediately on the deposit thereof shall cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth, not less than 9 inches in thickness, and shall so cover the same or cause the same to be covered with the said layer of earth, between the hours of One o'clock ante meridian and Six o'clock ante meridian.

3. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land within the Shire of Moorabbin, which has been proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a place for the reception, utilization, or deposit of night-soil, any washings from pans used in conveying night-soil shall deposit the same in trenches, and shall cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth, not less than 9 inches in thickness, and shall so cover the same or cause the same to be covered with the said layer of earth, between the hours of One o'clock ante meridian and Eight o'clock ante meridian, from the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September both inclusive, and between the hours of One o'clock ante meridian and Seven o'clock ante meridian from the 1st of October to the 30th day of March.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Moorabbin.

If any person commit a breach of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty hereby imposed is sought to be recovered, may order the whole, part, or part only not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be

paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may have powers to remedy such a breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

THE BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following

REGULATION, NUMBERED 13,

For the prevention of the fouling or contamination of the water contained in or supplied from any part of the works, and the protection of every part of the works, springs, creeks, races, water-courses, and reserves from trespass and injury, and imposing penalties for any breach of such regulations:—

1. No person shall throw timber, stones, rubbish, chips, or debris of any kind into any of the springs, creeks, tributaries, reservoirs, races, or water-courses belonging to or under the control of the Trust, nor in any way pollute, defile, divert, obstruct, or otherwise interfere with the water thereof.
2. No person shall light fires in the reserves, nor deposit therein any rubbish or debris of any kind.
3. No person shall damage or deface any notices, notice-boards, buildings, fences, seats, bridges, crossings, boats, pipes, coverings, gates, nor any other property of the Trust in any of the reserves, creeks, tributaries, springs, reservoirs, races, and water-courses belonging to or under the control of the Trust.
4. No person shall climb or jump over any of the gates, fences, or other enclosures, nor stick bills or notices thereon, nor enter any buildings, enclosures, houses, plantations, boat-houses, or boats on the reserves or reservoirs unless duly authorized so to do by the chairman or officers of the Trust who have charge or control thereof.
5. No person shall commit any nuisance nor any offence against decency within the reservoir enclosures, nor in any of the Trust's reserves.
6. No person shall fish in any of the reservoirs or creeks, nor shoot over any of the reserves under the control of the Trust without the written authority of the Trust.
7. No person shall remove any stone, gravel, sand, earth, grass, or other material from any of the Trust's reserves, nor in any way break, remove, or interfere with the surface thereof, nor erect any dwelling, booth, shed, or other structure thereon, nor camp thereon, without the written consent of the Trust.
8. No person shall bring or allow to graze or trespass upon any of the reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, or other animals without the written consent of the Trust; but no person shall under such permission, or on any pretext whatever, bring, or suffer to remain, trespass, or graze upon any of the reserves, any horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, or other animals afflicted with or suffering from any disease.
9. No person shall cut down or remove any live or dead timber, bark, bushes, shrubs, or any other timber or plants, nor in any way damage or interfere with any trees, bushes, or other timber or plants, in the reserves without the written consent of the Trust.
10. No person shall drive any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals across any of the creeks, races, or water-courses within the reserves, except at the crossings set apart by the Trust.
11. In these Regulations, the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust; "officers" shall mean any officer of the Trust or other person appointed by the Trust for the time being to discharge any duty or carry out or supervise any work in connexion with the Trust; and the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

Any person guilty of any offence against or breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, in addition to being liable to defray any expenses incurred by the Trust in consequence of such offence, and to make good any loss or damage sustained by the Trust.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered thirteen, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 27th day of April, 1894.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN WEST COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, as managers of the Chiltern West Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

- In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
- The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—
 For every horse, Twelve shillings per annum.
 For every head of other large cattle, Eight shillings per annum.
 For every head of small cattle, Two shillings and eightpence per annum.
 Progeny (under nine months old) of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free
 Provided always that such progeny of stock shall be registered by the herdsman.
- No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
- Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
- No bull shall be allowed on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.
- In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the common being impounded, the herdsman shall send notice immediately to the owners thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.



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The following table shows the results of the regression analysis for the dependent variable Y. The independent variables are X1, X2, and X3. The regression equation is Y = 0.5X1 + 0.3X2 + 0.2X3 + 1.2. The R-squared value is 0.85, indicating a strong fit. The F-statistic is 15.2, and the p-value is less than 0.001, suggesting that the model is statistically significant. The standard error of the estimate is 0.45.

The regression analysis indicates that X1, X2, and X3 are all significant predictors of Y. The coefficients suggest that as X1 increases by one unit, Y increases by 0.5 units, holding X2 and X3 constant. Similarly, X2 and X3 have positive effects on Y, though smaller in magnitude than X1. The constant term of 1.2 represents the expected value of Y when all independent variables are zero.
