### SHIRE OF MAFFRA.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF MAFFRA, MADE THE 4TH DAY OF APRIL, 1894.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 890 and 391 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Maffra hereby orders that the land hereinafter described shall be a public highway from and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, that is to say:—

All that piece of land, being part of allotment I<sup>four</sup>, parish of Glenmaggie, county Tanjil: Commencing at a point bearing S. 41° 38' E. two hundred and one links from the north-west angle of allotment I<sup>four</sup>; thence by a line bearing N. 79° 49' E. one hundred and eighty-eight links; thence S. 68° 7' E. four hundred and seventy-two links; thence S. 79° 13' E. five hundred and thirty-eight links; thence S. 54° 23' E. two hundred and thirty-eight links; thence N. 79° 13' W. seven hundred and sixty-four links; thence N. 68° 7' W. six hundred and forty-one links to the commencing point.

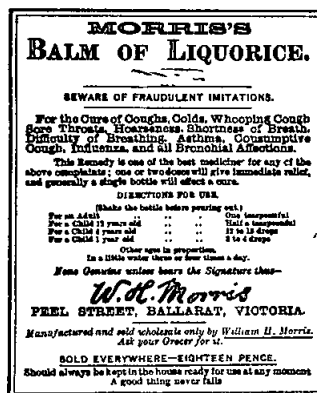

## SHIRE OF ARARAT.—DEVIATION OF A ROAD IN THE PARISH OF ARARAT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of July, 1894.

WHEREAS, by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly : And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Ararat has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parish of Ararat, county of Ripon : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say) :—

**Dairy Produce Dealers.**—Shopkeepers of the class of dairy produce dealers, on obtaining a licence so to do from the municipal clerk, may keep open their respective shops on each and every evening of the week, except Saturdays, until the hour of Nine of the clock, and on Saturdays until the hour of Eleven of the clock in the evening.

**Penalty.**—Any shopkeeper of any of the classes above specified failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence, being a first offence, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and shall, on conviction of any second or subsequent offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Every person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10.)
