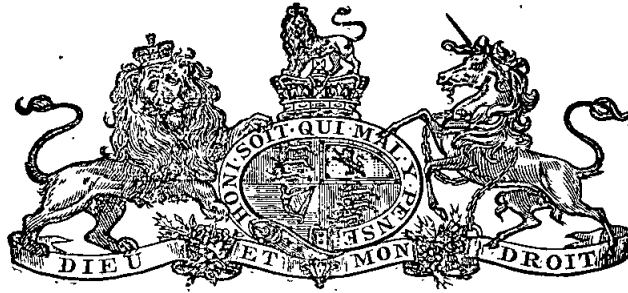

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million one hundred and twenty-one thousand nine hundred and ninety-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and ninety-six.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fifty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Reduction of traverses and bearings;
Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves;
Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field;
Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.
- Trigonometry, Astronomy, &c.:
Plane trigonometry (practical);
Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.
- Levelling, &c.:
Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.
- Drawing and Charting:
Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *vidæ vocæ* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

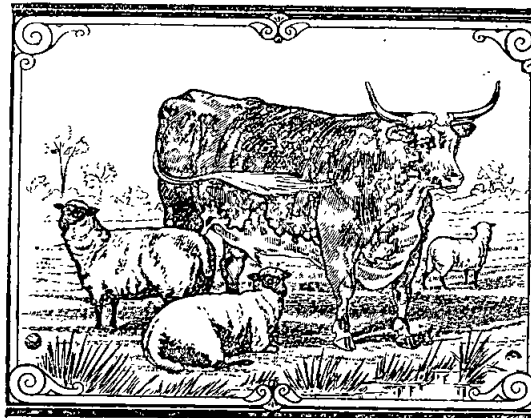

The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labour, and also all material where not otherwise specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall, as soon as finished, deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge. The contractor shall, in every case, immediately after despatching any goods to the Department or to any of the drills, send or give notice to the officer in charge of the time of despatch, of the place where such goods have been forwarded, and the number of the order for the same; failing which being done, the contractor will be liable to have his contract cancelled without further notice, at the option of the Secretary for Mines.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish, in duplicate, any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied; each account must include all the goods mentioned in the order.

3. The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July, 1895, to 30th June, 1896. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit, at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description.
