CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

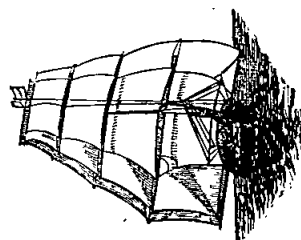

Major C.V.P.A.REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE
FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1890.

WHEREAS under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* it is provided that every person who is in occupation of any building or place which after the commencement of this Act is about to become for the first time, or after a period of disuse is about to again become, a factory or work-room, shall before the same is used as such forward to the office of the council for the district a complete plan of such building or place, together with particulars of the same, to the satisfaction of such council; and such building or place shall not be registered as a factory or work-room until such council has, in writing, approved of such building or place as suitable for a factory or work-room, or has within ten days after the receipt of such plan and particulars omitted to notify to such person any objection thereto: And whereas it is further provided that such powers and authority shall be exercised subject to and in accordance with regulations to be made by the Board of Public Health; and that the Board is authorized to make such regulations and at any time to alter or repeal the same: Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:-

1. The Regulations made by the Board under the said Act on the 27th day of March, 1895, are hereby repealed.
2. When required by the council, the said plan shall show the area of every floor and work-room, and all doors and stairs (if any), yards, and all appurtenances and places of accommodation proposed to be used in connexion with any such factory or work-room.
3. When required by the council, a cross-section plan, showing the roofing, work-room or rooms, and means of ventilation shall be also furnished.
4. The particulars hereinbefore mentioned shall fully describe the business or trade and the nature of the work proposed to be carried on in such factory or work-room, and the number of persons to be employed, and such other particulars as may be required by the council.
5. No building or place shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless proper means be adopted to the satisfaction of the council for the prevention and extinction of fire, and for the escape of the inmates in the event of fire occurring.
6. No building or place shall be approved in which it is proposed to employ a greater number of persons than one person for every four hundred (400) cubic feet of space below the level of thirteen (13) feet above the floor of any of the rooms.
7. No building or place shall be approved unless the work-room shall be provided with means and appliances for efficiently warming the same when such means and appliances are considered necessary by the council.
8. No building or place shall be approved unless, in the absence of an approved system of artificial ventilation, each work-room be provided with means of ventilation by openings for the inlet and outlet of air in the proportion of not less than 12 square inches of inlet openings and 12 square inches of outlet openings for each person employed in such work-room; such space to be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamentation, or other obstruction thereto. Such inlet openings shall be provided at the height of about 7 feet from the floor level by tubes, shafts, or hoppers in the external walls, external doors, or external windows, and shall be provided with means by which they may be readily closed and opened and by which they may be kept open; and such outlet openings shall be provided either in the walls of such room by externally hooded openings as close to the ceiling thereof as may be practicable, or else in the ceiling; and in the latter case there shall be connected with each such opening an open tube or shaft having a transverse area equal to that of the clear transverse area of such opening and leading through and above the roof of the building, and having its upper end terminating in a cowl or other similar contrivance.
- The provisions of this Regulation shall not, unless considered necessary by the council, apply to a work-room in which there are a fire-place with chimney and a window made to open, and in which not more than four persons are to be employed.
- If in the opinion of the Officer of Health of the district any of these provisions concerning ventilation is unnecessary or unsuitable for any particular building or place by reason of any special circumstances of the case, then such building or place may be approved of by the council without such provision or provisions being carried out.
9. Every heating appliance in any work-room, whether used for warming for the persons there engaged or used in the manufacturing process, shall be provided with a flue of at least 4 inches diameter and extending to the outer air to a point at least 8 feet above the appliance, and capped at the outer end by a fixed cowl.

10. No building or place in which females are to be employed shall be approved unless the factory or work-room shall be provided with properly-appointed lavatories to provide the means of free ablution for the females employed therein in the proportion of at least one lavatory or basin for every twenty females employed. When considered necessary by the council, properly-appointed lavatories, sufficient in number to provide the means of free ablution for the males employed, may also be ordered in any factory or work-room, in the proportion of at least one lavatory or basin for every twenty males employed.

11. No building or place shall be approved unless the factory or work-room shall be provided with proper closet accommodation in the proportion of one closet at least for every twenty persons employed therein; and where persons of different sexes are employed all such accommodation shall be separate for the sexes, and approaches thereto properly separated for the sexes shall be provided. Adequate urinal accommodation shall be provided for every factory or work-room in which four or more males are to be employed, and separate and distinct urinal accommodation for the use of the females employed may be ordered for every factory or work-room in which more than twenty females are to be employed. Provided that in factories and work-rooms in which the majority of those employed are to be of one sex, and not more than two are to be of the other sex, separate and distinct privy accommodation for the persons of different sexes shall not be required, if in the opinion of the council the same is suitably provided in adjoining or adjacent premises.

12. No building or place in which any articles of wearing apparel (including boots) are prepared or any article of food for human consumption is being manufactured shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless all the walls, ceilings, passages, and privies have been recently limewashed, painted, or papered.

13. If in any building or place any manufacture is to be carried on of such a nature as to necessitate the females employed changing their dresses on entering or on leaving such factory or work-room then such building or place shall not be approved unless the factory or work-room be provided with a suitable dressing-room for the use of the females employed therein.

14. The following rules respecting the materials and the construction of factory buildings are to be observed as far as possible in approving of the same:-

CLASS A.

Buildings for ham and bacon curing, fish-curing, meat-preserving, jam-making, fruit-preserving, and dairy-produce manufacturing, and such other trades.

The ceiling or roof to be not less than 12 feet in height; walls to be painted, plastered with smooth cement, or covered with other impervious material at least 6 feet in height above floor level, so as to be easily washed and cleaned. The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and all floors laid so as to drain into paved channels, the latter to be intercepted by deodorizing tanks when required by the council. All yards to be either gravelled or paved, as may be required by the council, and well drained.

CLASS B.

Buildings for fellmongery, leather-dressing, tanning, parchment-making, and similar trades.

The roofs or ceilings to be not less than 12 feet in height from the floors. The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and laid to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS C.

Buildings for soap and candle works, glue-making, bone and carcass boiling-down, bone-crushing, manufacture of artificial manures, and such like trades and works.

The roofs or ceilings to be not less than 15 feet in height. The floors to be imperviously paved, and laid so as to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. Close boilers or covered vats only are to be used, from which pipes are to be fixed to convey the vapours and fumes through an effective disinfecting and deodorizing apparatus.

CLASS D.

Buildings for antimony works, smelting works of any kind, works for treatment of pyrites, ammonia, and other works.

Buildings for works included in this class to be provided with suitable condensing apparatus, so as to render the fumes innocuous.

All ground floors should be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain to channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS E.

Marine stores. The yards and floors of the buildings shall be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain into paved channels.

CLASS F.

Bedding and mattress works; biscuits, bread, confectionery, &c., works; boot, shoe, &c., factories; boxes, trunks, bags, &c., factories; brush, broom, &c., factories; cigar, tobacco, cigarette, &c., factories; clothing factories; corset factories; dressmaking, millinery, mantles, ladies' underclothing, &c., work-rooms; dye works; grocer's sundries, maize, spices, &c., factories; hat and cap factories; hosiery works; printing, stationery, book-binding, card boxes, &c., works; shirt factories; laundries; umbrella works; waterproof clothing factories; woollen mills.

No room to be used by females in buildings of the above kinds shall be approved if the roof of such room be of iron and at a shorter distance than 20 feet above the floor unless the said room be ceiled or the roof be lined.

In the event of the plan and particulars hereinbefore mentioned disclosing that the building or place proposed to be registered does not come up to the standard required by these Regulations, or by such one or more of them as may be applicable to the particular building or place in question, the council shall, within the ten days hereinbefore mentioned, notify to the person in occupation of such place or building the particular objection which, on examination, is disclosed, so that such place or building shall not be registered until these Regulations are complied with.

When the Council has approved of any such building or place as suitable for a factory or work-room, the Town Clerk shall issue an approval in writing in the following form:—

REVISED REGULATIONS FOR RIFLE CLUBS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of September, 1895.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act* 1890 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Rules and Regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof : And whereas the Governor in Council has from time to time made certain Rules and Regulations for the said purposes : And whereas it is expedient to annul all such Rules and Regulations so made as relate to the Rifle Clubs, and to make new Rules and Regulations : Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order annul from this present date all previous Rules and Regulations regarding Rifle Clubs, and doth make the Rules and Regulations following, that is to say :—

1. Rifle Clubs may, on the recommendation of the Council of Defence, be established in such localities as may be authorized by the Governor in Council, provided that no Rifle Club shall be established within 10 miles of any other club.

2. Before any club can be formed the names of not less than 20 men, between the ages of 18 and 45, wishing to join the club as active members, and who have taken and subscribed the oath, must be sent to the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, Victoria Barracks, Melbourne. The list of names will be submitted by the Commandant to the Council of Defence. Such members must be *bona fide* residents of the locality in which the club is formed.

In all places where members of the Mounted Rifles or Victorian Rangers are co-existent with a Rifle Club the club must maintain a strength of 20 members, as laid down in para. 2 of these Regulations, or disbandment will follow, but in special cases, on the approval of the Commandant, the strength to be maintained may be reduced to 15.

In no case can a member of any branch of the Victorian Defence Force be anything but an honorary member of a Rifle Club, and under no circumstances is his name to be shown on any list of members submitted to Head-quarters as claiming any privilege allowed to a Rifle Club member.

Members of the Mounted Rifles or Victorian Rangers who cease to belong to those regiments must, if they desire to join a Rifle Club, re-engage in the same way as if they were recruits.

3. Should the application to establish a club be approved, the approval will be notified by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, whereupon the club may be formed.

4. The members shall take and subscribe the following oath, as prescribed by the Defences and Discipline Act :—

I, A. B., do swear that I will well and truly serve our Sovereign Lady the Queen in the Victorian Defence Force for a period of three years, or until sooner legally discharged, dismissed, or removed, and that I will oppose and resist Her Majesty's enemies and cause Her Majesty's peace to be kept and preserved whether employed upon land or at sea, and that I will prevent to the best of my power all offences against the same, and that while I continue to act in the same I will to the best of my skill and knowledge faithfully discharge my duty according to law.

SO HELP ME GOD.

And shall be engaged to serve with the Victorian Defence Forces in the event of a national emergency.

5. Every club shall elect a Captain, and the property of the club shall be vested in a Committee consisting of such Captain

(a) Correspondence connected with finance—purchase of rifles, ammunition, and accoutrements—should be addressed to "The Secretary of Defence, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne."

To avoid confusion, subjects ²in (a) or (b) should be sent in *separate envelopes*. When ordering rifles, the names of the members for whom they are ordered must be given.

7. The standard set of rules approved by the Governor in Council shall be the rules for clubs.

9. Members of clubs will, during membership, be required to keep their arms and accoutrements in good order, and produce them when called on for inspection by the Commandant or other officer deputed by him. No member can part with his rifle during the first three years of his service except to another member of the club or to the club. At the end of three years' continuous service and compliance with the Regulations for Rifle Clubs, the rifle and accoutrements shall become private property. This rule applies only to purchased rifles.

11. Every member who has been engaged and has taken and subscribed the oath, will be entitled, if in uniform or carrying a rifle, to be conveyed to and from all musters, drills, parades, and rifle practice over the Victorian State Railways, in accordance with the regulations to be issued from time to time.

Every man obtaining 137 points shall, in addition, receive and be entitled to wear a marksman's badge for the year in which he becomes a marksman; but should he fail to again secure the number of points requisite in order to be so classed he must relinquish it. Provided that no man shall wear his marksman's badge except on a uniform of the prescribed pattern.

The best shot of the whole of the Rifle Clubs, and the best shot of each Rifle Club District, shall receive and be entitled to wear a badge similar to that worn by the best shot of a Regiment and Company respectively.

15. The Committee shall hold the money obtained under para. 14 in trust for the benefit of the whole club, and shall devote it to the keeping up of targets, the provision of ammunition, and to the payment of any other expenses necessary for the proper maintenance of the range and its appliances, such as field-firing targets, &c.

16. A balance-sheet, signed by the Captain and Secretary of the club, showing how the money received under para. 14 has been expended, must be forwarded to the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs on or before the 10th of July in each year. No moneys claimed for any subsequent year will be paid until this balance-sheet has been received.

17. For the purposes of these Regulations, all clubs will be formed into districts, which will comprise several clubs, to be determined by local circumstances, and be known by a district or other name, or by a number. The clubs of one district will be permitted, with the sanction of the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, to meet once a quarter at certain places in the district to be fixed upon from time to time; and at such meetings field-firing will take place at unknown distances at head and shoulder targets, instead of volley-firing. Where the clubs are much scattered special field-firing parades may be arranged by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs.

18. On or before the 15th day of July in every year the Captain will forward to the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs a return showing—

- (a) The names of all members of the club on the 30th June, and opposite each name state whether in possession of a rifle or not; if possessing a rifle, the number is to be given.
- (b) The number of M.-H. rifles in possession of the club on the 30th June.

Printed forms for the return will be supplied by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs. No moneys due for classified shots will be paid, and no free ammunition will be supplied to any club from which this return has not been received.

19. The Captain or Secretary shall at once inform the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs of the death, departure from the district, or resignation of any member. Absence for a longer period than three months from the locality in which a club is established shall mean departure from the district, and any member so absent, except on leave obtained from the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, shall be liable to be struck off the strength of the club to which he belongs; provided that any man on leaving the locality of his club may, at his own request, made in writing to his Club Captain, be transferred to the club nearest his intended place of residence, should the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs approve and the latter Rifle Club elect him as a member.

20. In the event of any club falling below its minimum establishment of active members, or of these Rules being disregarded, all privileges accorded to such club may be withdrawn temporarily or permanently.

21. Any one joining a Rifle Club must join that one situated nearest to his place of domicile, unless authority is granted by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs for him to join another club. No man shall join a Rifle Club situated at a greater distance than 10 miles from his place of domicile without the sanction of the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs.

* Subject to the requisite funds being voted by Parliament

22. No man can, on any pretence whatever, join a Rifle Club whilst he is on the rolls of another Rifle Club.

23. Any member can resign by giving fourteen days' notice in writing to the Captain of his club, and, on such resignation being accepted by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, his name shall be removed from the list of members. In the case of members who are in possession of Government property, the same must be returned in good order before the resignation can be accepted.

STANDARD RULES.

Referred to in Para. 7 of the Regulations for Rifle Clubs.

RULES OF THE

RIFLE CLUB.

1. This club shall be known as the Rifle Club.
2. Any person duly elected in accordance with the by-laws, may become a member of the club on payment of such entrance-fee and annual subscription as may be fixed thereby.
3. Life members may be enrolled on payment of a donation to be fixed by the by-laws.
4. The business of the club shall be managed by a Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and two Members of Committee, three to form a quorum.
5. The office-bearers and members of committee shall be elected at the annual meeting of the club, which shall be held on such date as may be fixed by the by-laws.
6. Any office-bearer or member of committee being absent for three consecutive meetings of the committee shall be liable, at the discretion of the committee, to have his seat declared vacant.
7. Any vacancy in the committee, caused either by resignation or by enforced retirement under Rule 6, may be filled up by the committee.
8. All meetings of the committee shall be convened by the Secretary; but should he fail to do so within seven days after receiving a requisition signed by three members of the committee, any three such members may themselves convene a meeting of the committee.
9. No meeting of the committee shall be held to have been duly convened unless a written notice be forwarded to each member thereof at least 24 hours prior to such meeting.
10. The annual meeting of the club for the election of office-bearers shall be convened by advertisement in at least one paper circulating in the district, and not less than seven days' notice shall be given of such meeting.
11. A balance-sheet, duly audited by two members appointed at the preceding annual meeting, shall be laid before the members at each annual meeting. Should a vacancy or vacancies occur among the auditors, the committee shall have power to fill the position.
12. The subscription of each member shall become due on such date as may be fixed by the by-laws, and no one shall be entitled to the privileges of membership until his subscription be paid.
13. No member, by reason of his being such, shall have any estate or interest in the property of the club other than a right to use the club property at the Rifle Ranges, in accordance with the resolutions or decisions of the committee.
14. A general meeting of the club shall be called at any time by the Secretary on receiving a requisition signed by so many members as may be prescribed by the by-laws; the time and object of such general meeting to be advertised one week previous to such meeting.
15. Any member may be expelled from the club against whom a vote for his expulsion shall have been carried by a majority of two-thirds of the members present at a meeting specially called to consider the case.
16. The practice days of the club shall be as fixed by the by-laws, but the committee may, on giving due notice to each member, alter the time as they may think necessary, or appoint such other days in addition to the above as may appear expedient.
17. After providing for the necessary expenses of the club, the committee may expend the balance of any moneys other than those received from Government in granting prizes to its members; the rifle matches at which such prizes are to be competed for being duly notified by advertisement.
18. In addition to the annual subscription, the committee shall have power to exact such entrance fee as may be prescribed by the by-laws from each member who shall compete in a match for prizes, provided always that the entrance-fees be devoted to the prize list.

19. The rules for the matches and club practices, the distances, the conditions of firing, the nature and value of the prizes, and all other details, shall be decided by the committee.

20. The committee, subject to the approval of a general meeting of the club, shall have power to frame such by-laws as may from time to time be necessary for carrying on the business of this club.

21. The conditions and regulations of the Victorian Rifle Association shall generally be observed in the matches and practices of the club.

The site for a Rifle Range is a matter that demands the most careful consideration. In level country there must be a clear space of a mile in rear of the targets upon which the shots that miss the targets may expend themselves, and even with that distance it would be in the highest degree imprudent to have the line of fire directed upon any dwelling or place which might be frequented when firing was going on. The Martini-Henry rifle will carry 3,000 yards, and sometimes ricochet for a distance of a mile in level country. On a plain, therefore, a wall or mound must be constructed behind the targets to a height of 30 feet, unless there is a clear space free from the possibility of encroachment for at least the distance mentioned above.

The following Regulations, taken from the Musketry Regulations for the Army, shall be strictly adhered to:—

No practice shall take place until a large red flag and red ball is hoisted on a long signal staff in a conspicuous place, and sentries or look-out men are posted to warn persons against crossing the range.

The look-out man, whose position should be such that he can observe the ground in rear of the butt while himself well clear of the line of fire, must lower the large red flag on the signal staff should any person or animal come within the line of fire behind the targets, when firing must immediately cease, and a red flag, called the danger flag, be raised both in the marker's butt and at the firing point. When the line is clear, the look-out man will raise the flag on the signal staff, whereupon the danger flag will be lowered both at the butt and at the firing point, and then firing may recommence.

No man shall fire until the previous shot has been signalled.

Firing shall cease at once and the danger flag be raised at the firing point immediately the red flag is raised at any of the markers' butts, or if any person or animal appears in front of the firing party; nor shall any firing proceed until the marker has lowered his. If firing with breech-loading rifles, any man who is loaded will immediately withdraw the cartridge from his rifle when the firing is interrupted.

The marker in the butt must be warned to raise his red danger flag whenever it is necessary to stop the firing, either to re-colour or patch the target, to examine it in order to ascertain the result of the last shot, or on account of danger. He must be careful not to move from his butt until sufficient time has been given to observe his signal, and he is satisfied that the answering signal has been given from the firing point.

The danger flag must always be carried by the marker when he finds it necessary to leave his butt.

The marker's butt must be thoroughly protected from the splashes of lead which fly from the iron target when the bullet strikes the plate. These splashes will frequently fly to a distance of 50 or 60 yards, and cause severe wounds or even death. The marker must look through a small window of $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. plate glass, protected on the side next the target by a strong wire netting.

The space behind the targets on level ground should be, as previously stated, about one mile. A less distance will, however, suffice if a steep hill rises in rear of the targets. In such a case, an earthen wall or ramp behind the targets is unnecessary; but to be of use in stopping stray bullets, and thereby insure the safety of the public, the hill should rise at an angle of 45 degrees, or be cut out to that angle of slope, at least for a vertical height of 30 feet. If at a smaller angle it would, instead of acting as a stop, increase the chance of a ricochet, and therefore be unsafe. Every range should be accurately measured, and the distances defined by pegs or posts at intervals of 100 yards, commencing at 100 yards from the target and ending at 800 yards or at the extremity of the range.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and that where, in consequence of the exercise of such power, any rights, liabilities, or matters require to be adjusted, the Governor in Council may, by any Order, settle and adjust the same: And whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th day of January, 1890, severed a certain area from the Shire of Swan Hill and constituted the same a new municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Mildura, and in consequence of such severance it has become necessary to settle and adjust certain liabilities between the said Shires of Swan Hill and Mildura: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order settle and adjust the accounts as between the two municipalities named, in accordance with the terms and conditions of an agreement made under the hands and seals of the councils of such municipalities, and bearing date the 14th day of November, 1890, which agreement is marked "A," and is deposited in the Office of the Department of Public Works, Melbourne.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
