THE substance and prayer of a petition to the Administrator of the Government in Council, signed by not less than 25 contributors within the meaning of Part I. of the Act 54 Vict., No. 1099, to the society called The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital, are published hereunder, pursuant to an Order of the Administrator of the Government in Council, made on the 14th day of October, 1895, under the provisions of section 4 of the Act aforesaid.

To His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria and Administrator of the Government of the said colony in Council assembled.

The memorial of the undersigned, in number more than 25, and each a contributor of The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying in Hospital, and in the matter of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890, Part I., humbly sheweth:—

That The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital of Ballarat, in the colony of Victoria, was established in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and now exists.

That the said institution is established and exists to relieve the aged, infirm, disabled, and destitute, and to minister to their necessities according to the ability of the institution.

to their necessities according to the ability of the institution.

That the said institution is supported in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than £1 per annum or £20 in one donation. That your petitioners are each of them contributors to and have paid not less than £1 per annum or £20 in one donation. That the said institution has at the present time 348 in patients, and 877 men, women, and children receiving out-door relief.

That the last year's receipts of the said institution were £4,250 from the Government grant, and £2,435 2s. 11d. from all other sources, and the expenditure was £7,441 3s. 5d. That at the last annual meeting of the governors and contributors of the said institution, held at the Board-room of the said institution, at Camp-street, in the City of Ballarat, in the said colony, on the 18th day of July, 1895, to consider and order on the report of the committee of management recommending the institution should be incorporated under Part I. of the said Act, it was resolved—"That the said Report be adopted that it was advisable to incorporate the institution under Part I. of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890."

GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1895-6.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

To is hereby notified that the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 2nd December proximo (as the 1st December will fall on a Sunday), and that persons who have not already enrolled may do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such province; and no person whose name is already on the new List of Ratepaying Electors (now being prepared) for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

Foreigners who desire to obtain Electors' Rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain from the Chief Secretary letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.




