Audit Act 1890.

ALTERATION OF GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 of the *Audit Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1066), made the following alteration in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, viz.:—

In paragraph 32 the following is repealed—

(b) To holders of a power of attorney on production of the power, or a copy certified by the Registrar-General, and after registration of the same, first by the Head of the Department concerned, secondly by the Receiver and Paymaster, and lastly by the Commissioners of Audit respectively. In the case, however, of powers of attorney made for the sole purpose of collecting refunds, drawbacks, &c., from the Collector of Customs, registration need be effected only at the Customs Department and the Audit Office.

And the following is substituted—

(b) To holders of a power of attorney on production of the power, or a copy certified by the Registrar-General, and after registration of the same, firstly by the Department concerned, secondly by the Treasury and the Paymaster at the Office at which an account is payable, and lastly by the Commissioners of Audit. In the case, however, of powers of attorney made for the sole purpose of collecting refunds, drawbacks, &c., from the Collector of Customs, registration need be effected only at the Customs Department and the Audit Office, the power being retained by the Customs Department. In all other instances, where the original power of attorney has not been filed at the Office of the Registrar-General, it must be attached to the first account paid under its authority for ultimate filing in the Audit Office.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of £10,000 for the giving of Bonuses for Dairy Produce, Fruits, and Honey, of best quality and in best order, exported to Foreign Markets; also for the Development of the Wine Industry, and for the payment of expenses in connexion with any of the items named herein; as also in connexion with the shipment of Poultry, Meat, and other products, to be expended under regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council.

EXPORT EXPENSES.

All expenses incurred in receiving and storing butter, cheese, honey, poultry, meat, and other products for export, and in working the machinery for refrigerating same, may be paid out of the sum of £10,000, as also expenses arising from the inspection of such products on arrival at London.

EXPORT OF FRUIT.

A bonus not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) per case, of a size and construction to be approved by the Minister, may be paid upon all green fruits grown in Victoria and exported therefrom to such foreign ports as may be approved by the Minister. No payment shall however be made as bonus for export of fruit exceeding 25 per centum of the amount for which the fruit in respect of which it is payable is sold in the country to which it is exported. The Minister may, by order under his hand, fix the maximum amount of green fruit on the export of which during any period of twelve months a bonus will be paid; and the Minister may, by any such order, fix the maximum amount of bonus to be paid to any one person, association, or company. No fruit for the export of which it is intended to claim bonus under these Regulations shall be exported until it has been examined and approved by some person or persons appointed for that purpose by the Minister. No bonus shall be paid in respect of any fruit not arriving at the port of consignment in a good and marketable condition.

Account sales of the fruit so exported shall be obtained from the country to which the same has been exported, and shall be forwarded by the person claiming the bonus for export to the Minister not later than the 20th August, 1895, and shall be verified to the satisfaction of the Minister in such manner as he may think fit to require.

EXPORT OF HONEY.

A bonus of One penny per pound may be paid for honey of approved quality made in Victoria and exported prior to 1st October, 1895, to such port outside the Australasian Colonies as may be sanctioned by the Minister of Agriculture.

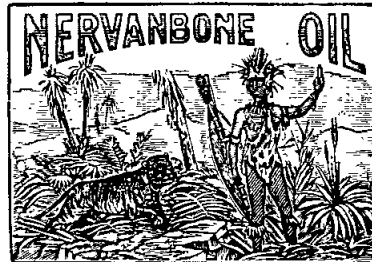

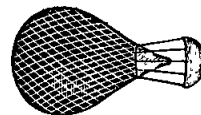

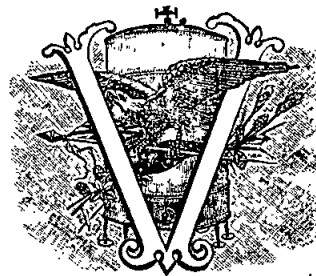

**THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

195. No person shall drive or take any cart or carriage or ride any horse across or over the floating or pontoon bridges now or at any time hereafter under the control of the Commissioners except at a walking pace.

No person shall take or attempt to take upon or across the floating or pontoon bridges at the entrance of Wright, Orr, and Company's Dock, Duke's Dock, Victoria Dock, the entrance to the Railway Coal Canal, or any other floating or pontoon bridge now or hereafter under the control of the Commissioners, any cart or carriage having a greater weight or load than 5 tons; nor shall he take or attempt to take upon or across any such bridge any cart or carriage if there be at the same time any other cart or carriage thereon the weight of which, and of the cart or carriage requiring to be taken across, shall exceed 5 tons. Carts or carriages shall have the right to cross any such bridge in the order in which they respectively reach such bridge.

These Regulations shall be read and construed with Part II. of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 30th day of November, 1891.

5. Such rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1896, and on the 1st day of July, 1896.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

**SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1896.—No. 6.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the Rates for 1896 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be Fifteen shillings per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 20,000.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1896.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1896.—No. 8.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1896 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

3. A rate of Twenty shillings per acre shall be charged on all garden property not supplied by meter. The minimum rate to be Five shillings.

4. Any person using water for garden purposes after Nine o'clock p.m. shall be liable to a penalty of £5.

5. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1896, and the 1st day of July, 1896.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

**LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION.**

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1895 on all rateable property within the Trust District.

Whereas His Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 18th day of November, 1895, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of Lowan Division, the Shire of Dimboola Division, the Shire of Lawloit Division, and the Shire of Kowree Division, and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such several divisions, and that the proportion in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say:—That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be:—Shire of Lowan Division, Fivepence; Shire of Dimboola Division, Fourpence; Shire of Lawloit Division, Sixpence; Shire of Kowree Division, Eightpence.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Lowan Shire Waterworks District, according to the valuation on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the shires of Lowan, Dimboola, Lawloit, and Kowree respectively, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of Lowan Division a rate of Fivepence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dimboola Division a rate of Fourpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Lawloit Division a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Kowree Division a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st of January, 1895, and terminating on 31st December, 1895, and shall be payable on the 1st day of December, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 3.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1896, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
7. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
8. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of cylinder of the engine.
13. For water supplied to market gardens or for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon; and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 30,000 gallons; the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance; first payment on the 1st day of January, 1896, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1896.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.
—RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following

REGULATION NUMBERED 15,

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1896.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows :—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.
4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.
5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.
6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation.
7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.
8. Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.
9. Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.
10. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000 gallons.
11. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.
12. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.
13. For water supplied to steam-boilers the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.
14. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
15. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.
16. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.
17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge at 2s. per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 15, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 11th day of November, 1895.

**NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1896.**

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and ninepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). And the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1896, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1896, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1896, and the 1st day of July, 1896.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 2.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of One shilling and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) That all water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons to be paid for at the end of each half-year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure and supplied through a meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty.

5. The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved by the Trust or by such officer as may be appointed for that purpose; and that no meter shall be removed without giving six days' notice to the Trust.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

13. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main, the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

14. Any person infringing against any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1896 in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate of less than Ten shillings shall be made.

4. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust this 28th day of October, 1895, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation No. 1 for determining Rates to be paid for the supply of water for other than domestic use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply in the Urban District of Donald:—

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour) or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose; no hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls, or carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Syphons will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum 8,000 gallons.

(b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum 12,000 gallons.

(c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.

(d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 28,000 gallons.

(e) Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 40,000 gallons.

(f) And at a rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

(g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. For every water-trough not exceeding 12 feet in length supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum, and for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof in length of such trough, a further sum of One pound per annum.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum charge for the water supplied to such trough shall not be less than the charge made for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust), where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate, payable in respect of the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure. In all cases where water is supplied for other than domestic purposes solely, not otherwise provided for in this regulation, the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 5,000 gallons.

7. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

8. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

11. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

12. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

13. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

14. No person shall connect any service or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

15. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

16. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, fitting or cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

17. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling the licence at any time. All persons so licensed shall conform to such conditions as are specified on such licence.

18. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

19. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service pipes or otherwise as the Trust may deem fit, unless the necessary repair has been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

20. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

21. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust, does or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

23. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

24. In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean the Donald Waterworks Trust.

REGULATION FOR 1896.

THE Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for the making of a rate on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

A rate of One Shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Benalla Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Benalla, is hereby made for the year 1896.

No. 1374) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations not inconsistent with the said Act for the purposes, or any of them, therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

APPEALS TO COUNTY COURTS.

1. *Form.*—The form in the schedule hereto, or a form to the like effect, varied by or with the approval of the Commissioner as circumstances require, shall be the form prescribed of Notice of Appeal under section 26 of the Act, and may be used as required, and shall be sufficient in law.

2. *Court.*—That where a taxpayer desires that the appeal shall be heard before the county court nearest to his residence, he shall, if he be the appellant, state such desire in the notice of appeal, or, if the Commissioner be the appellant, such taxpayer shall give to the Commissioner or his solicitor, within seven clear days from the date of the service of such notice of appeal, written notice of such his desire, in default of which the County Court sitting at Melbourne shall be the court of appeal to hear and determine such appeal.

3. *Service.*—That where a taxpayer has appeared before the police magistrate by his solicitor, service upon such solicitor of the notice of appeal shall be good and sufficient service.

No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, and that any error in any Order under the said part of the said Act, or under any of the analogous provisions of the Acts by that Act repealed, may be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made pursuant to the provisions of Part II. of the *Local Government Act 1890* aforesaid, and bearing date the 4th day of November, 1895, the conterminous boundaries of the Shires of Buln Buln and Narracan were re-defined for the purpose of adjustment: And whereas an error in defining the said conterminous boundaries was made in the said Order: And whereas it is desirable that the said error should be rectified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that, in lieu of the descriptions of the boundaries of the said Shire of Buln Buln and of the said Shire of Narracan, as set out in the said Order of 4th day of November, 1895, the boundaries of the same respectively, and of the several ridings thereof, shall be as herein described, and the said Order shall be read and construed accordingly, that is to say:—

ELLERSLIE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Ellerslie Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF IRREWILLIPE.

WE, John Baker, Charles Cottle Ching, Roderick McKenzie, Edward Tilley Silk, and John Rankin, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Irrewillipe, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the improvement and maintenance of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless lead by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young shrubs or trees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1.
