PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1895.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1895, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

1. No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received on or before the 31st May, 1895, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by evidence on the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined. Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st May, 1895.

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st of April in the year in which the examination is to be held.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the Vote of Two thousand five hundred pounds (£2,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c., during the year 1894-5.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1894, and 31st December, 1894, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February, 1895. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1894, and 31st December, 1894; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1894.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1894 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS for the Distribution of the Sum of Ten thousand pounds (£10,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1894-5.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February, 1895, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked B.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding Twenty-five pounds each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£10,000), a sum not exceeding Nine thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not to exceed Two hundred and fifty pounds shall be paid to the Hamilton Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring Show, held on the 12th and 13th September, 1894, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.—No. 10.**

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1895. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable, in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, in addition to the Twenty-five shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound annual value from Twenty-six pounds to One hundred pounds inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum for every pound annual value from One hundred pounds upwards.

4. On every shop or place of business not used wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value. Minimum charge, Twenty-five shillings.

5. On every hotel, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value up to One hundred and fifty pounds, and for every pound annual value from One hundred and fifty pounds upwards, a sum of Three pounds per centum.

6. On every cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water, a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings per annum; on every flour mill, a charge of Fifteen pounds per annum; and on every livery stable, a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

7. On every steam-engine, a charge of Twenty shillings, not to include any steam-engine working any factory or mill named in clause 6.

8. On every horse-trough, a charge of Ten shillings.

9. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter-acre of land. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a private house, an extra charge of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Two shillings and sixpence for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre.

10. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where Water is not Laid On.

11. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of the same shall be paid. The minimum charge under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

12. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of the same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

13. Any owner or occupier of property wishing to have the water turned off, by giving due notice in writing will be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clause 12. Such minimum charge to take effect after the expiration of the current quarter.

Water Supplied by Measure.

14. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons; such supply to be in every case by or through a meter to be provided and affixed by the consumer, and approved by the Trust. Provided that the charges under this clause shall not be less than those hereinbefore made. As a guarantee of good faith, each consumer must lodge with the Trust the sum of One pound, which shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust and the water supply cut off if the meter is not kept in good working order, or if the charges are not paid punctually when due. A one-inch service-pipe may be allowed.

15. The Trust may order meters to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary; such meters to be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumers. The charge under this clause to be similar to that under clause 14. The Trust will not in any way be held liable to supply water under this and the last preceding clause until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons.

General Provisions.

17. Any person supplied with water (except by meter) by the Trust who shall, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Six p.m., use the water of the Trust for the purpose of watering the ground, trees, or plants by means of hose, pipe, or drain (except with the written authority of the Trust), or who shall cause or suffer the water to be so used, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds for the first offence, and for any subsequent such offence to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for every day on which such offence is repeated or continued after notice of the offence from the said Trust.

18. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust, when the supply is not by measure, who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person (except with the written authority of the Trust), shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take and carry away water from any public or private service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving at the least twelve hours' written notice, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement. Each house or tenement to have a separate service-pipe. Stand-pipes will not be allowed of a less height than two feet above the ground. Any person acting in contravention of this clause (except with the written authority of the Trust) shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and any licensed person as aforesaid so acting shall be liable to have his licence cancelled.

25. That in any case where rates and charges are six months in arrears the water may be cut off until such arrears are paid.

26. That in all cases not herein provided for the Trust may make such special provisions as may be deemed necessary.

27. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

28. In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1895; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

29. The foregoing Regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the 29th day of October, 1894, and the seal of said Trust was affixed hereto this 26th day of November, 1894.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 5.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose water district has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban district) make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Fifteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of January, or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
