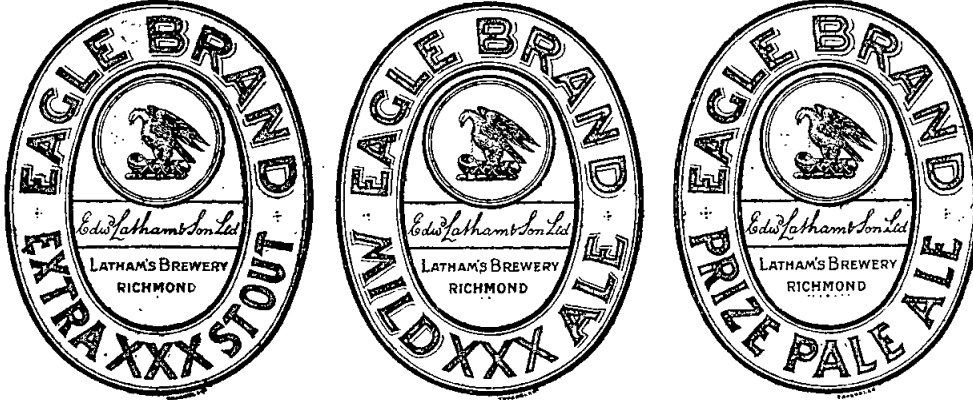

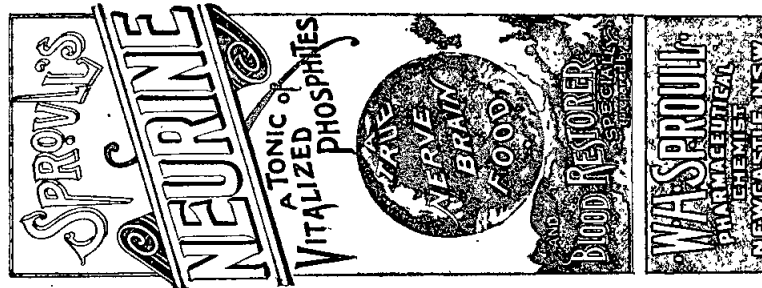

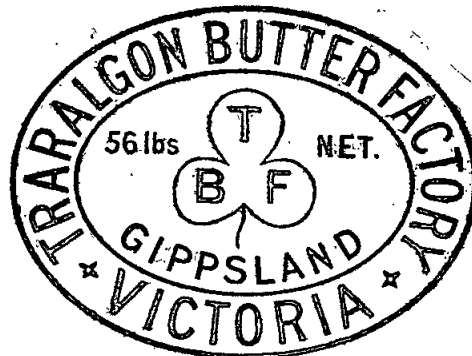

The populations as shown in the last table have been derived from municipal estimates, which relate to various dates in 1894, adjusted in this office to the middle and end of the year. Such estimates have usually proved to be approximately correct; and there appears, after careful consideration, to be no reason to doubt their accuracy on the present occasion. This question will be dealt with in a later paragraph.

At the end of 1894 the estimated population of the whole district was 438,955, as compared with 444,832 twelve months previously. There was thus a net decrease during the year of 5,877, or 1 1/2 per cent., as compared with 6 per cent. during 1893. As, however, there was a gain of 6,801 by excess in births over deaths, the total loss to the metropolitan population was 12,678 by migration to the country districts or to other colonies or countries. During the 3 1/2 years which have elapsed since the last census the net decrease of population has amounted to 51,941, and the total loss to 82,671 persons.

On examining the changes that have occurred in the 25 municipal districts* embraced in Greater Melbourne it will be found that an increase of 2,319 in the population took place in ten of them, but a decrease of 3,190 in the other fifteen, resulting in a net decrease of 5,877, as already stated. More than half the total increase occurred in Hawthorn alone, and the principal decreases were in Brunswick, Williamstown, and Fitzroy (in the order named), which districts alone account for more than half the total decrease. The following table shows the increase or decrease in each sub-district during the twelve months:—

In the year 1894 the registered births exceeded the registered deaths in Greater Melbourne by 99 per cent., but excluding the births and deaths which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., the excess of the former over the latter was 134 per cent.

In 111 instances twins, and in one instance triplets, were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 13,672, the confinements must have numbered 13,553. Thus one mother in 121 gave birth to more than one infant, as compared with 1 in 97 in the previous year.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1894 numbered 1,143, or 112 less than in 1893. Over a third of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 12, which proportion was the same as in the two previous years.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1894. Births and deaths in hospitals, asylums, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate being placed first and the rest in succession:—

As was noticed in the previous year, the birth-rate was lower in Melbourne City than in any other sub-district; but, contrary to the experience of the preceding year, the death-rate in that city was above the average.

In view of its open and apparently healthy position, the exceptionally high death-rate in Oakleigh will, no doubt, excite surprise; as will also the low birth-rate in St. Kilda, a town in which the preponderance of females over males was found at the last census to be greater than in any other part of Victoria. These towns occupied similar positions in the preceding year.

In consequence of the excessive mortality which attends the period of infancy, high death-rates are often concurrent with high birth-rates. This is especially noticeable in the case of Oakleigh; but exceptions occurred in the cases of Footscray, Northcote, and Flemington, which, although they had birth-rates higher than any town except Oakleigh, had death-rates much below the average.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, there was an average of about 27 persons to the acre at the end of 1894, but the density of the population varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from 35½ persons to the acre in North Melbourne Town to 1 person to the acre in Coburg, and less than 1 to the acre in Boroondara, Oakleigh, Preston, and the outlying portions of the district. The following table shows the area of, and the density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

On comparing this with the previous table it would appear *prima facie* that density of population does not operate in any marked degree in increasing the death-rate in Melbourne and suburbs. Thus it is found that North Melbourne, with the greatest density, has a death-rate below the average; and that of eight towns, with over 12 persons to the acre, as many as three had death-rates below the average; whilst of eleven sub-districts, which had less than 4 persons per acre, one (Oakleigh) had the highest death-rate; and three altogether had death-rates above the average, although, on the other hand, six of them were at the bottom of the list of death-rates. Possibly the density of not one of the sub-districts is high enough to affect materially the mortality, or it may be there are other factors in operation to conceal its influence. Five of the towns, it will be noticed, are on the shores of the Bay, and the beneficial influence of the sea on health should not be overlooked.

The estimated population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to the population, the excess of births over deaths, the mean temperature in the shade, the rainfall, and the mean atmospheric pressure in Greater Melbourne, during each of the twenty years ended with 1894, were as follow:—

The births in Greater Melbourne during 1894 were fewer than in any of the seven years immediately preceding, but were more numerous than in any year prior to that period; and their proportion to the population was lower than in any of the previous nineteen years.

A remarkably low mortality also prevailed in 1894. The deaths were fewer in this year than in any other since 1884, whilst the proportion of deaths to the population was much lower than in any other year named in the table.

The proportion by which the births exceeded the deaths was higher in 1894 than in any previous year, except 1892. All the figures in the table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should these be eliminated the number of births would be somewhat less and that of deaths would be considerably less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be very much higher.

The exceptional reduction in the birth and death rates which has taken place since 1890 might at first sight suggest some doubt as to the accuracy of the estimates of population on which the rates for 1894 have been based; but a consideration of the circumstances only confirms their reliability. In the first place, it will be observed that a precedent for an almost equally low birth-rate occurred in 1880 (when the population estimates were either verified or corrected according to the results of the census of 1881), although the fall in the rate as compared with years immediately preceding was only 2½ per 1,000 then as compared with 6 per 1,000 in 1894. In both years there was a marked financial and commercial depression, but much more accentuated in 1894 than in 1880. Such a circumstance always acts as a check to the number of marriages,* on which the number of births mainly depends, although in addition there are other causes of a low birth-rate which operate in times of depression. Had the marriage-rate not fallen as it did, by one-fourth since 1890, there would have been 4,050 more marriages in the ensuing four years, and this would account, allowing the usual average of 3 annual births to every 10 married women under 45, for a diminution of at least 1,200 births in 1894, which alone would have raised the birth-rate to 33·7. Then, again, the low death-rate has resulted not only from the diminished birth-rate, which had the effect of reducing the proportion of the infantile population amongst which the mortality is excessive, but also from the increased vigour of the infants born, as indicated by the unusually low mortality amongst them, as recorded in a subsequent paragraph; and it has also been influenced by the beneficial effects on the general health of plain living, absence of luxury, and increased sobriety and temperance, as evidenced by the arrests for drunkenness (in the whole colony) having fallen off by 30 per cent. since 1890, and the revenue from spirituous liquors (excepting the newly imposed excise duty on beer) from £354,000 in 1890-1 to £576,000 in 1893-4, or by 33 per cent., notwithstanding an increase in the rates of duty.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1894 was 105·7°, on the 27th November; and the lowest was 31·7°, on the 11th July. The mean temperature of the year (58·4°) was more than half a degree above the average of the decade, and the highest, with two exceptions, during the last 20 years. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45·3°) took place on the 17th February, and the least range (2·8°) on the 16th April and 6th July. The mean daily range was 17·1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·427 inches, on the 18th August, and the lowest was 29·258 inches, on the 16th September. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·93 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 138 days, and the amount of rainfall was 20·61 inches, which was 4½ inches below the average, and the lowest in the last 20 years, excepting 1879 and 1888. The number of days in which fog occurred was 11.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1894, 50 per cent. were of males, and 50 per cent. of females. Of the deaths during the year, 54 per cent. were of males, and 46 per cent. of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 34 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 41 per cent. in 1893, 38 per cent. in 1892, 40 per cent. in 1891, 39 per cent. in 1890, 44 per cent. in 1889, 42 per cent. in 1888 and 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, 38 per cent. in 1885, 41 per cent. in 1884, and 36 per cent. in 1883.

The deaths of 1,674 infants under 1 year of age occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1894, the proportion being 12·24 to every 100 births. This was the lowest infantile death-rate that has occurred in the district during the last twenty-two years, the next lowest being 12·86, in 1892, and the highest 19·43, in 1889. The corresponding proportion in 1891 was 15·83; in 1890, 14·40; in 1888, 17·18; in 1887, 17·51; and in 1886, 17·84. In the twenty-one years ended with 1893, the mean proportion to every 100 infants born of those who died before completing their first year of life was 16·50.

The deaths of 563 persons, viz., 284 males and 279 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during 1894, or 66 more than in the previous year. Of these, 318 were between 75 and 80, 143 between 80 and 85, 71 between 85 and 90, 29 between 90 and 95, and 2 between 95 and 100. The following are the numbers of deaths in 1894 which took place in Public Institutions:—627 in the Melbourne Hospital, 128 in the Alfred Hospital, 25 in St. Vincent's Hospital, 43 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 75 in the Children's Hospital, 63 in the Women's Hospital, 39 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Infant Asylum, 114 in the Benevolent Asylum, 66 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 113 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 46 in the Austin Hospital, 35 in the Melbourne Gaol, 5 in the Pentridge Penal Establishment, 5 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 8 in the Protestant Refuge, and 29 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor. The number is 1,469 in all, which figures, compared with the total deaths (6,871), furnish a proportion of 21 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 4.7 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1894 ended his days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

It will be observed that a decrease in 1894 as compared with the preceding year occurred under all the principal diseases except whooping-cough (which appeared in an epidemic form for the first time since 1889), scarlet fever, diphtheria and croup, typhoid fever, and cancer. Another leading feature was the subsidence of the epidemic of measles, which prevailed in 1893, and the consequent falling off of 385 deaths under that head. The other principal decreases in the number of deaths in 1894 as compared with 1893 were as follow:—80 under diarrhoeal diseases, 68 under phthisis, 85 under bronchitis and laryngitis, 71 under other lung diseases, 136 under diseases of the digestive organs, and 230 under atrophy and debility (not shown in the table). As compared with a series of years, the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases and erysipelas, bronchitis, brain and nervous diseases, phthisis, and diseases of the digestive organs were not only much below the average but were absolutely the lowest on record in the last 20, 15, 13, 11, and 8 years respectively. On the other hand, the mortality from cancer was the highest on record, being as much as 25 per cent. above the average of the last ten years.

The following table shows the number of deaths in Greater Melbourne from all causes, also from typhoid fever, diarrhoeal diseases, and diphtheria and croup, registered in each month of the last ten years:—

According to the experience of the ten years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases are greatest from November to April, the worst months being December and January; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest from December to May, the worst months being February, March, and April; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest from April to September, the worst month being May. It will be noticed that the last-mentioned complaints are the only ones named which appear to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

The estimated mean population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to population, and the excess of births over deaths in each of the metropolitan cities of Australasia in 1894 were as follow:—

It will be noticed that the birth-rate was higher in Melbourne than in Brisbane, Adelaide, Hobart, or Wellington, but lower than in Sydney or Perth; that the death-rate in Melbourne was lower than in Perth or Hobart, but higher than in any of the other cities; and that the proportion of excess of births over deaths was lower in Melbourne than in any, except Perth and Hobart.

It should be mentioned that the death-rate of Melbourne is much swelled by the large number of country residents who are admitted to and die in the Metropolitan hospitals. In some of the other colonies it is believed to be the custom to eliminate such entries, and it is probable that in Melbourne such deaths bear a higher proportion to the total number of deaths recorded than they do in any of the other cities named.

SHIRE OF WIRMBIRCHIP CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD RE-DEFINED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of March, 1895.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the rate-payers of a portion of the Central Riding of the Shire of St. Arnaud as described in such petition, praying that the portion so described be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Wirmbirchip: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Wirmbirchip, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of St. Arnaud and the Central Riding thereof as hereby reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby further order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of Wirmbirchip shall consist of nine members, and that the said new shire shall not be subdivided at present:—

SHIRE OF WIRMBIRCHIP.

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 53A, parish of Corack; thence west by the southern boundaries of allotments 53A and 52 and a road to the north-west angle of allotment 68; thence south by the western boundary of said allotment to its south-west angle; thence west by the northern boundary of allotment 69 to its north-west angle; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 47; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 28, parish of Warmur; thence south-westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 26; thence west by the northern boundaries of allotments 26 and 25 to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 41, parish of Warmur; thence westerly to and by a three-chain road to the south-west angle of the parish of Warmur; thence north by the western boundary of the parish of Warmur to the south-west angle of mallee allotment 252, county of Karkaroc; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of mallee allotment 221; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of mallee allotment 651; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of mallee allotment 651D; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of mallee allotment 312; thence north by a line being the west boundary of mallee allotments 312, 297, 290, 275, 268, 646, 631, 624, 609, and 602 to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of mallee allotment 605; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of mallee allotment 606; thence east by the south boundary of mallee block 54A and mallee allotments 359, 358, 357, and 356 to the boundary between the counties of Tatchera and Karkaroc; thence south by the said county boundary to the north boundary of the parish of Karyrie; thence east by the north boundary of said parish to a three-chain road forming the west boundary of allotment 56; thence south by said road to the south-west angle of allotment 8; thence east by the south boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 7; thence southerly by the western boundary of allotments 7 and 6 of the said parish, and allotment 6, parish of Narraport, to the south-west angle of allotment last named; thence by a three-chain road easterly and southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 49; thence easterly by a three-chain road forming the northern angle of allotment 24A to the north-west angle of allotment 52a of the parish of Thalia; thence south by the western boundary of said parish and parish of Corack East to the point of commencement.

Wherever the road described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD REDUCED.

CENTRAL RIDING REDUCED.

Commencing at a point where the southern boundary of the shire intersects the Avon River; thence westerly by that boundary, northerly by the west boundary, easterly by the north boundary to the western boundary of the parish of Corack East; thence southerly and south-easterly by that boundary to the south-east angle of same; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Banyenong to Lake Bulcke; thence southerly and westerly by the eastern and southern sides of the said lake to the Avon River; thence southerly by the said river to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from 8th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on 8th April will be available till 8th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day, and on lines where there is not a daily train service the ticket will be available till the next day on which the train runs. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger (see exception). During the same period, tickets will also be issued at Flinders-street station (Central Booking Office) from Melbourne to all stations. On tickets issued at Flinders-street (Central Booking Office), Spencer-street, and Prince's-bridge stations bearing dates from 8th till 17th April inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return till 17th May inclusive.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey may be broken for one month going, and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Adelaide and Broken Hill Excursion Tickets.—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide and Broken Hill at the following return fares, viz.:—Adelaide—First class, £4 4s. 6d.; second class, £2 10s. 9d. Broken Hill—First class, £7 2s. 6d.; second class, £4 7s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Brisbane Excursion Tickets.—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken for one month going, and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

Horses and Vehicles.—From 10th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 10th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On 10th, 11th, 12th, 15th, 16th, and 17th April parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 12th and 15th April will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Schedules as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, and printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown, and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but, with the exception of Schedule No. 4, they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Victorian Government debentures or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender: all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the

General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to take delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of other Governments, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

16. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

17. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 16 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

18. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules are not to exceed forty-eight per week. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds) as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

3. 7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.
8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.
9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.
10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
