**VITAL STATISTICS.**

**RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1895.**

**THE** births of 59 boys and 55 girls, or in all of 114 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of March. Of these, 45 occurred in Ballarat East, 61 in Ballarat West, 6 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 9 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 112, viz., 62 of boys and 50 of girls.

The deaths registered in March numbered 75, viz., 38 of males and 37 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 39. In February the recorded deaths numbered 95; in March, 1894, they numbered 98; in March, 1893, they numbered 92; in March, 1892, they numbered 80; in March, 1891, they numbered 91; in March, 1890, they numbered 77; in March, 1889, they numbered 78; in March, 1888, they numbered 53; in March, 1887, they numbered 78; in March, 1886, they numbered 64; and in March, 1885, they numbered 86.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:

## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

In pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

89A. Where goods upon which the rates, tolls, and charges imposed by section 110 of Act No. 1119, being the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, have been paid shall be exported to any place outside Victoria, the Commissioners may allow a refund by way of drawback to the owner of the goods at the time of exportation of an amount equal to the rate, tolls, and charges previously paid on the goods so exported, less the sum of One shilling per ton. Such drawback shall be allowed in the case of all goods other than tea only when such goods are exported in the original packages. The tonnage shall be ascertained in the case of all goods except tea, either by weight or measurement, at the option of the Commissioners, and in the case of tea by reckoning eight chests, or sixteen half-chests, or forty quarter-chests, or eighty boxes of the original packages, or eight hundred pounds of tea repacked as one ton measurement.

This Regulation shall be read and construed as part of the said Regulations of the 30th day of November, 1891.

## NETTING AT THE MOUTH OF THE RIVER YARRA.

## Beef Barrels (Piège) Rocks, French Pass.

DURING the recent survey of the Beef Barrels Reef (Piège) Current Basin, French Pass, by Mr. Perham, C.E., foul ground has been discovered in a S.W. by S. direction and in a S.E. by E. direction from the western rock of the Beef Barrels above water. These two patches of foul ground extend from the said rock three cables length, in the shape of two arms; in the direction above stated. The depth of water on the foul ground is from 1 to 5 fathoms, from the rock towards the mainland. A buoy, painted red, has been placed a quarter mile S. by W. a quarter W. of the western Beef Barrel, and this buoy is moored midway between the two patches of foul ground, which are five cables apart, and is one cable's length south of a line running E. by N. and W. by S., connecting the extreme patches of foul ground. To avoid these dangers, vessels are recommended not to pass anything to the northward of midway between the Beef Barrels and the mainland.

REGULATIONS FOR PAYMENT OF BONUSES FOR  
DAIRY PRODUCE AND FRUITS TO 30TH JUNE, 1895.

REGULATIONS for the Distribution of the Sum of £10,000 for giving Bonuses for Dairy Produce, Fruits, and Honey of best quality and in best order exported to Foreign Markets, also for the Development of the Wine Industry, as also in connexion with the Shipment of Poultry and Meat, and to include expenses in connexion with any of the items named herein.

## EXPORT OF CHEESE.

A bonus of Six pounds (£6) may be paid for each ton weight of cheese, and a proportionate amount for any lesser quantity over and above one ton weight of approved quality made in Victoria, of Victorian produce, exported to London by the s.s. *Thermopyla*, which sailed from Melbourne on the 28th April, 1894, provided the price obtained on the sale of such cheese was not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for each one hundred and twelve pounds (112 lbs.) weight of cheese. The total amount to be paid to any one person, association, or company shall not exceed Three hundred pounds (£300), including previous payments. No bonus shall be paid in respect of any cheese exported unless same has been sold in the country to which exported by some agent approved by the Minister, nor unless account sales of such cheese, and, if required, statutory declarations verifying such account sales, have been received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 30th June, 1895.

## SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW  
MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Hampden which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Hampden, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Heytesbury."

Area described in petition:—Bounded by a line commencing at the sea-coast, at the mouth of Curdie's Creek, county of Heytesbury; thence up the said creek to the southern boundary of the parish of Brucknell West, to and along the west boundary of the parishes of Brucknell and Ecklin to the Emu Creek; thence along the county boundary to the shore of Lake Corangamite, by the said shore to Pirron Yallock Creek, up that creek to the westward angle of allotment (72) seventy-two, parish of Irrewillipe, south by its west boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the Gellibrand River, down the said river to and westward along the sea-shore to the starting point.

The petitioners state that the area above described is unrepresented in the Shire Council of Hampden, and that none of the members of the said council reside in the said area; that, as a consequence of the extent of the shire, it is impossible for the members of the council to become fully cognizant of the requirements necessary for the advancement of the more remote portions of the district; that the ratepayers who have business to transact with the municipal officers at Camperdown are put to great inconvenience in going there; and they consider that offices more locally situated would obviate this inconvenience.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Hampden, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Heytesbury," such municipality to be subdivided into three ridings.

The petitioners state that the Yallock Riding is too large and does not admit of being fairly represented at the council table, and they desire that the said Riding be re-subdivided, and an additional Riding created, to be called the Yannathan Riding.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired.

The Factories and Shops Acts.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE  
FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1890.

WHEREAS under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* it is provided that every person who is in occupation of any building or place, which after the commencement of this Act is about to become for the first time or after a period of disuse is about to again become a factory or work-room, shall before the same is used as such forward to the office of the council for the district a complete plan of such building or place, together with particulars of the same, to the satisfaction of such council; and such building or place shall not be registered as a factory or work-room until such council has, in writing, approved of such building or place as suitable for a factory or work-room, or has within ten days after the receipt of such plan and particulars omitted to notify to such person any objection thereto: And whereas it is further provided that such powers and authority shall be exercised subject to and in accordance with regulations to be made by the Board of Public Health; and that the Board is authorized to make such regulations and at any time to alter or repeal the same: Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. The regulations in this respect made on the 8th day of January, 1886, and those made on the 25th day of January, 1888, concerning factories and other places where Chinese are engaged, are hereby repealed.
2. When required by the council, the said plan shall show the area of every floor and work-room, and all doors and stairs (if any), yards, and all appurtenances and places of accommodation proposed to be used in connexion with any such factory or work-room.
3. When required by the council, a cross-section plan, showing the roofing, work-room or rooms, and means of ventilation shall be also furnished.
4. The particulars hereinbefore mentioned shall fully describe the business or trade and the nature of the work proposed to be carried on in such factory or work-room, and the number of persons to be employed, and such other particulars as may be required by the council.
5. No building or place shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless proper means be adopted to the satisfaction of the council for the prevention and extinction of fire, and for the escape of the inmates in the event of fire occurring.
6. No building or place shall be approved in which it is proposed to employ a greater number of persons than one person for every four hundred (400) cubic feet of space below the level of thirteen (13) feet above the floor.
7. No building or place shall be approved unless the work-room shall be provided with means and appliances for efficiently warming the same when such means and appliances are considered necessary by the council.
8. No building or place shall be approved unless the work-room shall, independently of any doors and windows or fireplaces therein, be provided with means of ventilation by openings for the inlet and outlet of air in the proportion of not less than 12 square inches of inlet openings and 12 square inches of outlet openings for each person employed in such work-room; such space to be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamentation, or other obstruction thereto. Such inlet openings shall be provided at the height of about 7 feet from the floor level by tubes, shafts, hoppers, or other suitable means in the walls or windows, and shall be provided with means by which they may be readily closed and opened, and by which they may be kept open; and such outlet openings shall be provided either in the walls of such room by externally hooded openings as close to the ceiling thereof as may be practicable, or else in the ceiling; and in the latter case there shall be connectol with each such opening an open tube or shaft having a transverse area equal to that of the clear transverse area of such opening and leading through and above the roof of the building, and having its upper end terminating in an extracting cowl or other similar contrivance.

9. Every heating appliance in any work-room, whether used for warming for the persons there engaged or used in the manufacturing process, shall be provided with a flue of at least 4 inches diameter and extending to the outer air to a point at least 8 feet above the appliance, and capped at the outer end by a fixed extracting cowl.

10. No building or place in which females are to be employed shall be approved unless the factory or work-room shall be provided with properly-appointed lavatories sufficient in number to provide the means of free ablution for the females employed therein. When considered necessary by the council, properly-appointed lavatories, sufficient in number to provide the means of free ablution for the male employes, may also be ordered in any factory or work-room.

11. No building or place shall be approved unless the factory or work-room shall be provided with proper closet accommodation in the proportion of one closet at least for every twenty persons employed therein; and where persons of different sexes are employed, all such accommodation and the approaches to same shall be separate for the sexes. Adequate urinal accommodation shall be provided for every factory or work-room in which four or more males are to be employed, and separate and distinct urinal accommodation for the use of the female employes may be ordered for every factory or work-room in which more than twenty females are to be employed. Provided that in factories and work-rooms in which the majority of the employes are to be of one sex and not more than two are to be of the other sex separate and distinct privy accommodation for the persons of different sexes shall not be required, if in the opinion of the council the same is unnecessary or is suitably provided in adjoining or adjacent premises.

12. No building or place in which any articles of wearing apparel (including boots) are prepared or any article of food for human consumption is being manufactured shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless all the walls, ceilings, passages, and privies have been recently limewashed, painted, or papered.

13. The walls, ceilings, and floors of all closets for the use of persons engaged in the factory shall be thoroughly cleaned at least once a year.

14. If in any building or place any manufacture is to be carried on of such a nature as to necessitate the female employes changing their dresses on entering or on leaving such factory or work-room then such building or place shall not be approved unless the factory or work-room be provided with a suitable dressing-room for the use of the females employed therein.

15. The following rules respecting the materials and the construction of factory buildings are to be observed as far as possible in approving of the same:—

CLASS A.

Buildings for ham and bacon curing, fish-curing, meat-preserving, jam-making, and fruit-preserving, and such other trades.  
The ceiling or roof to be not less than 12 feet in height; walls to be painted, plastered with smooth cement, or covered with other impervious material at least 6 feet in height above floor level, so as to be easily washed and cleaned. The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and all floors laid so as to drain into paved channels to be intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS B.

Buildings for fellmongery, leather-dressing, tanning, parchment-making, and similar trades.  
The roofs or ceilings to be not less than 12 feet in height from the floors. The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and laid to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS C.

Buildings for soap and candle works, glue-making, bone and carcass boiling-down, bone-crushing, manufacture of artificial manures, and such like trades and works.  
The roofs or ceilings to be not less than 15 feet in height. The floors to be imperviously paved, and laid so as to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. Close boilers or covered vats only are to be used, from which pipes are to be fixed to convey the vapours and fumes through an effective disinfecting and deodorizing apparatus.

CLASS D.

Buildings for antimony works, smelting works of any kind, works for treatment of pyrites, ammonia, and other works.  
Buildings for works included in this class to be provided with suitable condensing apparatus, so as to render the fumes innocuous.  
All ground floors should be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain to channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.  
In the event of the plan and particulars hereinbefore mentioned disclosing that the building or place proposed to be registered does not come up to the standard required by these regulations, or such one or more of them as may be applicable to the particular building or place in question, the council shall within the ten days hereinbefore mentioned notify to the person in occupation of such place or building the particular objection which, on examination is disclosed, so that such place or building shall not be registered until these regulations are complied with.

CLASS E.

Marine stores.  
The yards and floors of the buildings shall be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain into paved channels.

CLASS F.

Bedding and mattress works; biscuits, bread, confectionery, &c., works; boot, shoe, &c., factories; boxes, trunks, bags, &c., factories; brush, broom, &c., factories; cigar, tobacco, cigarette, &c., factories; clothing factories; corset factories; dressmaking, millinery, mantles, ladies' underclothing, &c., work-rooms; dye works; grocer's sundries, maizena, spices, &c., factories; hat and cap factories; hosiery works; printing, stationery, book-binding, card boxes, &c., works; shirt factories; laundries; umbrella works; waterproof clothing factories; woollen mills.

No room to be used by females in buildings of the above kinds shall be approved if the roof of such room be of iron and at a shorter distance than 20 feet above the floor unless the said room be ceiled or the roof be lined.

KORONG VALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Korong Vale Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
- Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
- No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.
- No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

**EASTER EXCURSIONS.**

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from 8th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on 8th April will be available till 8th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day, and on lines where there is not a daily train service the ticket will be available till the next day on which the train runs. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger (see exception). During the same period, tickets will also be issued at Flinders-street station (Central Booking Office) from Melbourne to all stations. On tickets issued at Flinders-street (Central Booking Office), Spencer-street, and Prince's-bridge stations bearing dates from 8th till 17th April inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return till 17th May inclusive.

*Sydney Excursion Tickets.*—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 1s. first class and 10s. second class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey may be broken for one month going, and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

*Adelaide and Broken Hill Excursion Tickets.*—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide and Broken Hill at the following return fares, viz.—Adelaide—First class, £4 4s. 6d.; second class, £2 10s. 6d. Broken Hill—First class, £7 2s. 6d.; second class, £4 7s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

*Brisbane Excursion Tickets.*—From 8th till 15th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for

return for six calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken for one month going, and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

**Horses and Vehicles.**—From 10th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

**Commercial Travellers' Samples.**—From 10th till 17th April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On 10th, 11th, 12th, 15th, 16th, and 17th April parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

**Goods Sheds Holidays.**—The 12th and 15th April will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. On 11th, 12th, 13th, and 15th April, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Bendigo, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid, and consignments must be at the stations 30 minutes before the starting time of trains. Consignors of fruit and other perishable goods from Melbourne are requested to consult the Goods Superintendent concerning the despatch of their consignments.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment: and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Warrenbayne Riding of the Shire of Benalla, and a portion of each of the North, Central, and South Ridings of the Shire of Euroa as described in such petition, praying that the portions so described respectively be severed from the said shires and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Violet Town: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Violet Town, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Benalla and of the Warrenbayne Riding thereof, and of the said Shire of Euroa, and of the North, Central, and South Ridings thereof respectively as hereby reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby subdivide the said new Shire of Violet Town into three ridings to be named the North Riding, the Central Riding, and the South Riding, the several boundaries whereof shall be those also hereunder set forth and described, and doth order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of Violet Town shall consist of nine members.

No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*; and that except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* aforesaid, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* aforesaid, the land described hereunder, viz. :-

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part 1. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—
