AGREEMENT WITH MESSRS. CHAFFEY BROTHERS. —OFFICER APPOINTED TO CARRY OUT CERTAIN DUTIES.

WHEREAS by a certain Indenture, bearing date the 31st May, 1887, made between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey of the other part, it is among other things provided that the said George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey, their executors, administrators, and assigns, will erect and construct bridges over all channels, races, and drains constructed by them or under their authority within a certain area of two hundred and fifty thousand acres of land situated in the counties of Karkaroc and Millewa, the boundaries of which said area are fully described in the before-mentioned Indenture, and which channels, races, and drains may be intersected by public roads or thoroughfares wherever and whenever the said George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey, their executors, administrators, or assigns, shall be required by the Governor to do so, and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed to inspect the same, and further, that they will form, make, and maintain all roads throughout the said area which the Governor shall either cause to be set out by the officer appointed for such purpose, or which the Governor shall direct the said George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey, their executors, administrators, or assigns, to set out and make for the use of the public:

And whereas it is now deemed necessary to appoint an officer to fulfil the duties hereinbefore referred to, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has appointed

WILLIAM DAVIDSON, Inspector-General of Public Works,
to be the officer to discharge such duties.

CHILD'S BODY FOUND—BARKER'S-ROAD STATION, HAWTHORN.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on Monday, the 25th March last, the dead body of a female child, wrapped in an old white pillow-slip tied with string and a worn-out bodice of an old black dress outside the slip, was found inside the railway fence, near Barker's-road station, Hawthorn: And whereas at an inquest it was shown that death had been caused by fracture of the skull—apparently the result of a blow with some blunt hard substance—and suffocation, and a verdict of Wilful Murder was returned against some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderer or murderers.

CHILD'S BODY FOUND IN FOOTSCRAY.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the morning of Tuesday, the 5th March last, the dead body of a male child was found on a vacant allotment in Regent-street, Footscray, dressed in a flannel roller sewn on with white cotton, an old pink striped gown washed nearly white, and an old napkin, and rolled in a piece of black silesia sewn with white cotton, the whole being covered with brown paper: And whereas at an inquest it was shown that the cause of death was inflammation of the lungs, and that the child was probably alive when put into the brown paper parcel: And whereas the jury returned a verdict that the child died from inflammation of the lungs through wilful exposure, and that some person or persons unknown were, for wilfully exposing and causing the death of the child, guilty of Wilful Murder: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderer or murderers.

SHIRES OF ST. ARNAUD, KORONG, AND GORDON.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREAS AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of the petitions in accordance with the said Act, which have been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the rate-payers in the respective portions of the shires of St. Arnaud, Korong, and Gordon which are described in their petitions, and they desire that the areas so described may be severed from the shires of St. Arnaud, Korong, and Gordon respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Charlton."

Areas described in petitions:—

PORTION PROPOSED TO BE SEVERED FROM THE SHIRE OF KORONG.

Commencing at a point on the River Avoca intersected by the northern boundary of the shire of Gordon, in the parish of Narrewillock; thence along the southern boundary of allotment 45; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 53; thence east by north boundary of same allotment to its intersection with the eastern boundary of allotment 54; thence to north-west angle of allotment 56; thence east by the northern boundary of same allotment to road running north; thence along that road to north-west angle of allotment 15; thence by road running east to western boundary of parish of Terraptee (the said boundaries from starting point on River Avoca, constituting the southern boundary of shire of Gordon, in the parish of Narrewillock); thence by a road and the south boundary of the shire of Gordon to south-east angle of allotment 66; thence south by a road to north-east angle of allotment 72; thence turning east by a road to north-east angle of allotment 32; thence south by a road to south-east angle of same allotment; thence east by a road to the intersection of main road, Charlton to Boort, parish of Buckrabanyule, at south boundary of allotment 40; thence turning south-west along said main road to north-east angle of allotment 91 (J. Grose); thence south by a road following east boundary of said allotment (91) to intersection of northern boundary of parish of Woosang; thence west by a road following railway line, Korong Vale to Charlton, to north-east angle of allotment 14A (E. J. Ower); thence south by east by a road into parish of Woosang to south-east angle of allotment 16B (J. Hand); thence bearing west along a road to north-east angle of allotment 20A (Annie Paterson), turning south along east boundary, same allotment, by a road to south-east angle of village reserve, parish of Woosang, and intersecting main road, Charlton to Wedderburn, following said road in south-east direction to north-east angle of allotment 44A (W. H. Leach); thence by a road south to south-east angle of allotment 42 (John Collings) to southern boundary, parish of Woosang; thence west by the southern boundary, parish of Woosang, to

intersection of eastern boundary, parish of Yeungroon, allotment 14 (M. A. McGowen); thence south by eastern boundary, parish of Yeungroon, to intersection of northern boundary, parish of Coonoer East; thence following eastern boundary of same parish to south-eastern corner; thence westerly following southern boundary of same parish to River Avoca; thence northerly by that river to the commencing point in the parish of Narrewillock.

PORTION PROPOSED TO BE SEVERED FROM THE SHIRE OF GORDON.

Commencing at a point on the Avoca River, intersected by the northern boundary of the parish of Jeruk; thence east by the northern boundary of same parish to north-east corner of allotment 64 (J. McGrath); thence south by the eastern boundary of the same parish to its intersection with the parish of Glenloth at allotment 1A (O. Ryan); thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Terraptee to the north-east corner of allotment 95A; thence south following three-chain road on the east of allotment 95A, 95, and 94 to south-east corner of allotment 93 to northern shore of Lake Mannal; thence running west and following shore of Lake Mannal in west by south direction to north-east corner of allotment 91; thence southerly by frontages to Lake Mannal of allotment 90A to south-east corner of allotment 90; thence turning east to north-east corner of allotment 88 (P. O'Callaghan); thence southerly to south-east corner of allotment 86; thence westerly by southern boundary, shire of Gordon, to Avoca River, at south-west corner of allotment 45 (R. Allan); thence northerly following said river to starting point.

PORTION PROPOSED TO BE SEVERED FROM THE SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

Commencing at a point on the Avoca River intersected by the northern boundary of the parish of Teddywaddy at the north-east corner of allotment 1; thence westerly by northern boundary of same parish (which constitutes northern boundary, shire of St. Arnaud) to its intersection with Wycheproof to Watson's Lakes three-chain road; thence southerly following said road to intersection with northern boundary of parish of West Charlton; thence westerly by northern boundary of same parish to intersection with eastern boundary, parish of Corack East, at north-west corner, allotment 92 (A. Pearson); thence running due south by west boundary, parish of Charlton West, and western edge of swamp to northern boundary, parish of Jeffcott, at allotment 112 (J. Ryan); thence due west by north boundary of same parish to north-west corner, allotment 111 (J. M. Kenna); thence south by three-chain road to south-west corner, allotment 97; thence north-east to north-west corner, allotment 88; thence south to south-east corner, same allotment; thence east to north-west corner, allotment 91; thence along boundary of same allotment to south-west corner, allotment 90 (T. McLoughlin); thence by portion of south boundary of allotment 90 to north-west corner, allotment 72A; thence south by west boundary of said allotment 72A and allotment 72; thence east by southern boundary, allotment 72, to intersection of west boundary of parish of Wooroonook at allotment 81; thence southerly following boundary of said parish and western boundary, parish Doboebetic, and portion of western boundary of parish of Coonoer West to intersection of northern boundary of shire of Kara Kara; thence easterly by that boundary to River Avoca; thence northerly by that river to starting point.

The petitioners state that the areas proposed to be excised are situate at the extreme ends of the said shires, and are too remote from the seat of their respective councils to receive that supervision which the same requires, and they believe that if the said shire of Charlton is formed, with the town of Charlton as its centre, the areas proposed to be formed into the said "Shire of Charlton" will be greatly benefited in the sense that the roads will be kept in good order, and that the public works required to be done in the proposed new shire will be properly and permanently effected, that the town of Charlton is their business centre, and they state it would be more convenient, and in their interests, to have the said town as the seat of their municipality, so that the transaction of municipal business could be facilitated, and the rates collected with greater economy, &c.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas, and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Charlton," and that such municipality be not subdivided.

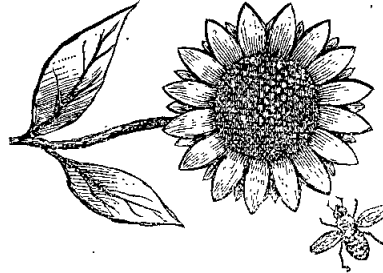

NETTING AT THE MOUTH OF THE RIVER YARRA.

STEAM-SHIP "BHUNDARA" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Bhundara* is about to arrive in Victorian waters: And whereas a case of the contagious disease known as small-pox has occurred on board the said steam-ship on her voyage: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore the said Board hereby orders and directs that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship, on arrival in Victorian waters, shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the outer anchorage, Williamstown, only, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or persons authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and lastly, that any person landed from the said steam-ship at the Quarantine Station shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Thursday, the 2nd May, from persons willing to supply Boots, as may be ordered by the Victorian Government, from the 1st June, 1895, to the 30th June, 1896.

Schedules giving an estimate of the numbers required, and printed forms of tender, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, or the Controller, Naval and Military Stores, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Sealed sample and specification of boots approved by the Defence Department will be submitted to tenderers; but tenderers may, if they so desire, either tender strictly to such sample and specification or they may submit samples and specifications of their own, along with their tenders, of a boot which they may deem equally serviceable, although differing in some respects from the sealed pattern; or the tenderer may quote alternative prices for the sealed pattern and his own pattern; but in all cases where a quotation is given for any boot not the sealed pattern, a clear and workable specification must accompany it.

Rejected samples will be returned to tenderers, but in the event of a tender being accepted where a sample is submitted by the tenderer, the same will be retained by the Defence Department free of cost.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of £3 in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security to the amount of £25 will be required, either in Government debentures or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for Boots for the Permanent Force" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor the full quantity estimated, but only such quantities of those articles as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

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2. The boots are to be made in Victoria, of Victorian leather, and the contractor must provide everything necessary for the due fulfilment of the contract.

3. The boots are to be strictly in accordance with approved sample. They must be of such trade sizes as may be ordered, and subject in every respect to the approval of the Controller, Naval and Military Stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the department requiring the boots. The boots shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the boots not being delivered within the time allowed as per schedule, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 3, or the head of the department to whom the boots are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of boots ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

7. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Controller of Ordnance Stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any boots objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the boots. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such boots may be returned to the contractor.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the boots have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 5.

9. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the boots are not of proper quality, they must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which they, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 5. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

11. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances, except those mentioned in clause 15, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

14. No subletting will be allowed, all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the articles tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed forty-eight per week. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds) as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, Ararat, and Ballarat can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the teas, sugars, soaps, and tobacco required at Geelong, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of the tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and the conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale; and the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case

be received). Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy cases, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the

officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
