### EXTRADITION TREATY WITH GERMANY.

Sir,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 2nd February, 1895, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her Majesty and His Majesty the German Emperor, for the mutual extradition of Fugitive Criminals between the Territories of Her Majesty and certain Dependencies of Germany, which was signed at London on the 5th of May, 1894, and of which the ratifications were exchanged at London on the 3rd of December, 1894.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.—EXTRADITION TREATY WITH GERMANY.

Osborne House, Isle Wight, 2nd February, 1895.  
At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 2nd day of February, 1895.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

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And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 17th day of November, 1888, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 5th day of May, 1894, between Her Majesty and His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals between the territories of Her Majesty and certain dependencies of Germany, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, considering it advisable to regulate by a Treaty the extradition of criminals between certain dependencies of Germany and the territories of Her Britannic Majesty, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries for this purpose:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, the Right Honorable John, Earl of Kimberley, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, &c., &c., Her Britannic Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, His Minister of State, Paul, Count von Hatzfeldt-Wildenburg, Knight of the Exalted Order of the Black Eagle, &c., &c., Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of His Imperial and Royal Majesty to Her Britannic Majesty;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, which were found to be in good and due form, have agreed to and concluded the following Articles:—

#### "ARTICLE I.

"The provisions of the Extradition Treaty signed between Germany and Great Britain on the 14th May, 1872, shall be applicable to the dependencies of Germany specified in the following Article, in such manner that persons in any of these dependencies, and within the sphere of the authorities established there, who are accused or who have been convicted of having committed a criminal act in the territories of Her Britannic Majesty, and persons in any of the aforesaid territories of Her Britannic Majesty who are accused or who have been convicted of having committed a criminal act in any of the dependencies of Germany, shall be mutually extradited in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid Treaty, in so far as they are not modified by the present Treaty.

#### "ARTICLE II.

"For the purposes of the present Treaty, the following are the dependencies of Germany referred to in Article I. :—

"The territories in Africa, in New Guinea, and in the Pacific Ocean which, by agreement between Germany and Great Britain, have been, or shall in future be, reserved to Germany as spheres of influence, protectorates, or possessions.

#### "ARTICLE III.

"In place of Article III. of the Extradition Treaty of the 14th May, 1872, it is hereby provided, with regard to the dependencies of Germany, that there shall be no obligation to grant the extradition from those dependencies of natives or of subjects of the Empire, and that the British authorities shall be under no obligation to grant the extradition of British subjects who have been accused or convicted of a criminal act in those dependencies.

#### "ARTICLE IV.

"There shall be no obligation to grant extradition from the dependencies of Germany in cases where, before the extradition has taken place, such an application has been received for the

transfer of the person in question to the territory of the German Empire as must, according to law, be complied with. The granting of extradition from a dependency of Germany must always be considered as being on the condition that no such application shall have been received before the extradition is carried out. In case the transfer to Germany takes place, it shall, however, be open to the British Government to apply for the extradition of the person concerned from Germany, in accordance with the terms of the Treaty of the 14th May, 1872.

“ARTICLE V.

“Applications for extradition from dependencies of Germany shall be made through the British Ambassador at Berlin, in accordance with paragraph 1 of Article VIII. of the Treaty of the 14th May, 1872; but in the case of persons who are accused or who have been convicted, of criminal acts in the Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, the application for extradition may be made to the chief authority of the dependency of Germany from which the extradition of the persons in question is desired by the chief Consular officer of Her Britannic Majesty in the dependency in question, if there be a Consular officer therein; or, if there be none, then by the Governor or other chief authority of the Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty concerned. It shall, however, be open to the chief authority of the dependency of Germany to refer to the German Government in case of doubt whether the application for extradition should be complied with.

“Applications for the extradition of criminals to one of the dependencies of Germany shall be made in the manner provided in Article VIII. paragraph 1, and Article XV. of the Treaty of the 14th May, 1872; in case, however, there should be no German Consular officer in the Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty from which the extradition is desired, the application may be made by the Governor or other chief authority of the dependency of Germany which is concerned to the Governor or other chief authority of the Colony or possession concerned.

“ARTICLE VI.

“The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible.

“The Treaty shall come into operation two months after the exchange of the ratifications, and shall remain in force as long as the Treaty of the 14th May, 1872, remains in force, that is, it shall terminate with the termination of that Treaty.

“In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

“Done at London, the fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

(N.B.—The above Treaty is also set forth in German in the original Order in Council.)

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at London on the third day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the third day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the said Treaty with His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, and of the dependencies of Germany referred to therein.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to the said dependencies of Germany and to the said Treaty, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

And whereas the immediate operation of this Order is urgent, this Order shall come into operation on the said third day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

MY LORD,—With reference to Your Lordship's Despatch No. 54, of the 17th August, 1894, I have the honour to inform you that the accession of Victoria to the Copyright Convention between Great Britain and Austria-Hungary of the 24th April, 1893, was notified to the Austro-Hungarian Government on the 5th October last.

I enclose copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council applying to the colony the provisions of the Order in Council of 30th April, 1894, giving effect to the Convention.

WHEREAS Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886, and having regard to the provisions of a Convention the ratifications of which were exchanged on the 14th day of April, 1894, between Her Majesty and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, and Apostolic King of Hungary, was pleased to make an Order in Council dated the 30th day of April, 1894, providing amongst other things that the said Convention should, as from the commencement of the said Order, and subject to clause 5 of the said Order, have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions:

And whereas by clause 5 of the said Order it was provided that the said Order should apply to all the Colonies and Foreign Possessions of Her Majesty, excepting to those named in the said clause, but that nevertheless the provisions of the said Order might be applied by further Order to any Colonies or Foreign Possessions named in the said clause on whose behalf notice to the effect indicated in Article IX. of the said Convention should be duly given:

And whereas the Colonies of Newfoundland, Natal, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and New Zealand, being some of the Colonies excepted from the operation of the said Order, have severally expressed a wish that the said Convention may be applicable to them, and the notice required by Article IX. of the said Convention has been duly given on behalf of the above-named Colonies by Her Majesty's Representative at the Court of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886, and of the proviso in clause 5 of the said Order of the 30th day of April, 1894, and Article IX. of the said Convention, doth Order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the said Order of the 30th day of April, 1894, shall apply and the same are applied accordingly to the following Colonies, that is to say:—

Victoria,  
Queensland,  
South Australia,  
Western Australia,  
New Zealand.

This Order shall come into operation on and from the date hereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information 18th January, of your Government, an extract from the *London Gazette* containing Notes exchanged between Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Sofia and the Bulgarian Minister for Foreign Affairs, recording a Commercial Arrangement between Great Britain and Bulgaria.

Notes exchanged between Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Sofia and the Bulgarian Minister for Foreign Affairs, recording an Arrangement between Great Britain and Bulgaria relating to Commerce:—

M. LE MINISTRE,—I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of the note which your Excellency was good enough to address to me on November 26, December 8, proposing a Commercial Convention for a period of two years with Customs duties of 10½ per cent. ad valorem on British imports into Bulgaria.

I am instructed to inform your Excellency that Her Majesty's Government are prepared to accept the above-mentioned proposal on the following conditions:—

1. That British merchandise imported into Bulgaria should enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation both in regard to transport tariffs or dues, and also in every other respect.

2. That British merchandise should not be subject to any municipal taxes or octroi duties which shall exceed a maximum of 2 per cent. ad valorem, with the exception of certain articles specified in a tariff agreed upon between the two Governments. It is also understood that, in no circumstances, British merchandise shall pay higher taxes or duties than native merchandise of the same category, or than merchandise of the most favoured nation.

On receipt of a note from your Excellency, conveying the assent of the Bulgarian Government to the above conditions, Her Majesty's Government will consent that, from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1895, British merchandise imported into Bulgaria should be subjected, till 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1897, to Customs duties of 10 per cent. ad valorem, together with the additional 1/2 per cent. hitherto accorded.

M. L'AGENT.—En réponse à la note que vous avez bien voulu m'adresser le 27 Décembre, 1894, j'ai l'honneur de vous informer que l'arrangement commercial Anglo-bulgare est prolongé pour une période de deux ans, à partir du 1<sup>er</sup> Janvier, 1895, jusqu'au 31 Décembre, 1896, durant laquelle les marchandises britanniques importées en Bulgarie seront soumises à un droit de douane de 10 1/2 pour cent. ad valorem.

À cette occasion le Gouvernement Bulgare déclare que les marchandises britanniques jouiront, sur le territoire bulgare, du traitement de la nation la plus favorisée, soit sous le rapport des tarifs et frais de transport, soit à tout autre point de vue, qu'elles ne paieront pas de taxes ou droits plus élevés que ceux acquittés par les marchandises indigènes de même catégorie ou par les produits similaires des pays les plus favorisés, et qu'elles ne seront soumises à aucune taxe municipale ou droit d'octroi qui dépasse un maximum de 2 pour cent. ad valorem, à l'exception de certains articles spécifiés dans le tableau existant, sur lequel un accord a été établi entre les deux Gouvernements.

En ce qui concerne les marchandises bulgares, importés dans le Royaume-Uni, elles continueront à y être traitées, durant la dite période, sur le même pied d'égalité que celles de la nation la plus favorisée.

M. L'AGENT.—In reply to the note which you addressed to me on the 17th (29th) of December, 1894, I have the honour to state that the Anglo-Bulgarian Commercial Arrangement is prolonged for a period of two years, from the 1st (13th) of January, 1895, till the 31st December, 1896, during which time British merchandise imported into Bulgaria will be subject to a Customs duty of 10 1/2 per cent. ad valorem.

The Bulgarian Government now declares that British merchandise shall, on Bulgarian territory, enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation, in regard either to transport tariffs or dues, or to any other matter: That it shall pay no higher taxes or duties than native merchandise of the same category, or than similar produce of the most favoured nations: That it shall not be subject to any municipal tax or octroi duty which shall exceed a maximum of 2 per cent. ad valorem, with the exception of certain articles specified in the existing tariff, agreed upon between the two Governments.

Bulgarian merchandise imported into the United Kingdom shall continue to be treated, during the aforesaid period, on the same footing of equality as that of the most favoured nation.

**AMENDED LIMITS AND SCALES OF PILOTAGE RATES FOR THE PORT OF GIPPSLAND LAKES.**

**W**HEREAS by section 82 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is enacted that the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, or from any one part of such port to any other, shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule of the said Act, subject to the exemptions therein contained and the powers to alter or reduce such rates as thereinafore in the said Act provided:

And whereas by section 58 of the said Act it is among other things further enacted that the Marine Board may fix the limits within which the rates of pilotage therein mentioned shall be payable, and may appoint a scale of lesser rates for any shorter distance within such limits at which any vessel may be boarded, and also a scale of rates for pilotage from any one part of any one port to any other part thereof, and from time to time reduce such rates of pilotage as well as those set forth in the Third Schedule of the said Act:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 23rd day of November, 1894, fix such limits and appoint such scale of rates as aforesaid, which limits and rates were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th December, 1894:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal the limits and rates now in force applicable to the Port of Gippsland Lakes, and also to fix amended limits and appoint amended scales of rates in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Marine Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, repeal such limits and rates from the date hereinafter specified, and in lieu thereof doth fix the following limits and appoint the scales of rates of pilotage hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK IN THE PARISH OF SAMARIA, KNOWN AS "WARRENBAYNE PARK."**

**W**H. Edward James, Robert Copeman, George Robinson, William Hopkins, and John Vaughan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the Parish of Samaria, known as "Warrenbayne Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.:-

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority (in writing) of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent (in writing) of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.
12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.
14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the
