





WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Buninyong (thereinafter called the Grantees), and their successors in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Buninyong (allotment 125), it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time heing thereon shall be at all times maintained and used for Public Recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Grantees. And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1850, it is provided that, where any such land has been vested in Trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Borough of Buninyong do hereby make the following Regulations for the Care, protection, and management of the said Reserve for Public Reculations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for public sports.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall light any fires in the reserve, nor erect any dwellings therein, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.

6. No persons, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the council, and any person allowing cattle, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.

8. All goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as horein-before provided, found trespassing within the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for public sports, nor be permitted to bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket, issued by the council, duly authorizing the admission of such person or persons, or of any horses, carriages, or other vehicles; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail, except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots within the reserve.

10. All persons paying for admission to the reserve or bringing therein any horses, carriages, or other vehicles shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the council to demand the production or surrender thereof.

11. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures, so the time being thereon any of the following offe

1st. Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene

1st. Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

2nd. Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

3rd. Trespassing upon any enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots, or upon any portion of the grounds set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the Council in carrying out any sports or amusements.

4th. Being found in any portion of the reserve or in any building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly anthorized to demand the production or surrender thereof a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the reserve, and to any buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, on any days set apart for public sports shall be as follows:—

1st. For admission of each person, such a sum as Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

2nd. For admission of each person to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
3rd. For admission of each saddle-horse (exclusive of rider), such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
4th. For admission of any carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by one horse or other animal, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

animal, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

5th. For admission of any cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Three shillings.

13. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train horses in the reserve, except on payment of the fees specified:

For a single trial of a horse, Two shillings and sixpence.

For a single trial of a horse, Two shillings and sixpence.

For every horse for one year, Ten shillings.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sports may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the Council may determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure; and the Council may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such buildings, erection, stand, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserve, or the buildings, erections, or enclosures, for the time being thereon.

Every person effending against these Regulations shall, in ac-

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 137 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pays penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the grantees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
