## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

**T**HE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a Despatch bearing date the 17th April, 1895, has intimated to the Administrator of the Government of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 58th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:-

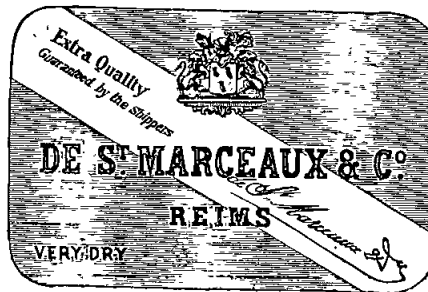

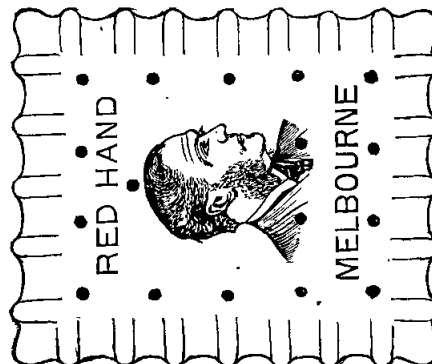

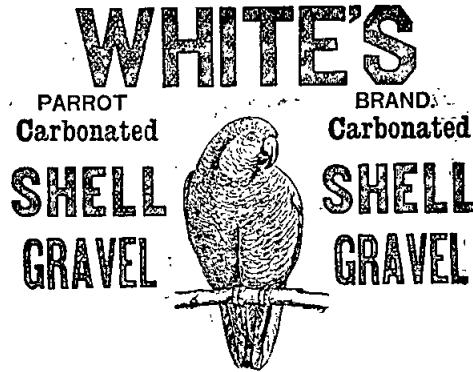

The blue tartan is to be indigo dyed, and the scarlet tartan cochineal dyed.

Trade system of measurement will be followed, viz., 36 inches to the yard, with the thumb measurement given in.  
All cloth must be supplied at the rate of 100 yards per week, except Khaki tweed, which must be supplied at the rate of 300 yards per week, if required.

Should any portion of a delivery be found to be inferior to the samples either in weight, strength, quality, colour, or texture, the whole delivery may be rejected.

All material must be delivered thoroughly dried (no damp whatever allowed) and clean scoured, free from grease, soap, or any other admixture which may be used to give fictitious weight or substance to the goods, free from grass seeds, burrs, or other imperfections, and also thoroughly shrinkless, i.e., so fully shrunk that it cannot be shrunk more.

The colours of the cloths are to be true to patterns, and are to be fast in shade, even if in this respect the samples may be faulty.

All cloths may be submitted to such tests as may be deemed proper for the purpose of ascertaining that they are in accordance with the patterns and specifications in every respect, including the dye, which may be tested by lengthened exposure to the weather or otherwise, and to cut off and destroy a portion not exceeding nine (9) inches in length from each piece as often as may be considered necessary, or to wash and dry any piece of cloth for such purposes.

Three (3) threads of pale blue cotton must be woven into the heading of each piece of cloth, and they must be of the full width of the cloth.

All pieces of the cloth which it may be found necessary to reject will have a small piece removed from the end, and no piece of cloth from which the heading has been removed will be received.

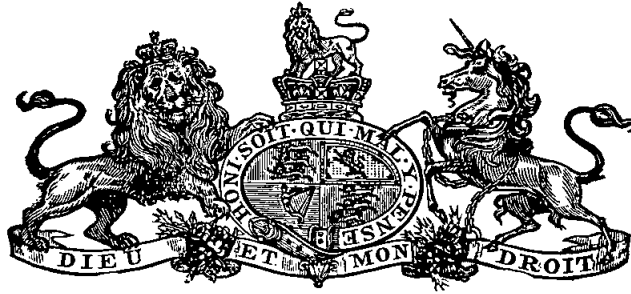
