No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the persons named hereunder from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for a period of two years from the 10th day of June, 1895, viz.:-

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Councils of the Town of Warrnambool and the Borough of Koroit have requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Councils for the purpose of making streets within the said Town of Warrnambool and Borough of Koroit respectively, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Town of Warrnambool and Borough of Koroit aforesaid respectively, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—
