Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1991), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OF THE CASTLEMAINE WOOLLEN COMPANY, OF KENNEDY-STREET, CASTLEMAINE,

for a period of twelve weeks from the 10th June, 1895, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

lowing express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than twenty six females and thirteen males under the age of sixteen for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-six females and thirteen males under the age of sixteen shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than elven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That every female, and each male under the age of sixteen, so employed shall be paid for overtime at the rate of time and a-half.

3. That none of such females or males under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

SOUTH BARWON MUNICIPAL COMMON.—AMEND-MENT OF REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, having drafted the following Regulation for the management of the South Barwon Municipal Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lien of Clause I. of the existing Regulations in respect of such Common:—

in lieu of Clause I. of the existing Regulations in respect of such Common:—

REGULATION.

Each person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any cattle on the common, give to the herdsman a true and correct description of such cattle and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate of having done so, and shall at the same time obtain a badge and chain from the herdsman (both of which shall be the absolute property of the managers) for any number of cattle he wishes to depasture. He shall then be held responsible and liable to be charged for that number, from the time the herdsman delivers the badge or badges to him to the date of delivery back to the herdsman. No person shall use other than registered badges in connexion with cattle legally depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against the foregoing Regulation shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
