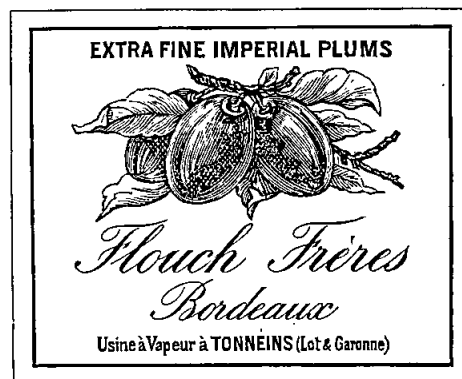

SOUTH BARWON MUNICIPAL COMMON.—AMEND-  
MENT OF REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, having drafted the following Regulation for the management of the South Barwon Municipal Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of Clause I. of the existing Regulations in respect of such Common:—

REGULATION.

Each person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any cattle on the common, give to the herdsman a true and correct description of such cattle and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate of having done so, and shall at the same time obtain a badge and chain from the herdsman (both of which shall be the absolute property of the managers) for any number of cattle he wishes to depasture. He shall then be held responsible and liable to be charged for that number, from the time the herdsman delivers the badge or badges to him to the date of delivery back to the herdsman. No person shall use other than registered badges in connexion with cattle legally depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against the foregoing Regulation shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 7, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
