Customs Act 1890 (sec. 101).**BORDER REGULATIONS.**

PERMISSION to import goods, stock, &c., across the border on the deposit of duty may be granted by the Secretary for Trade and Customs on receipt of written application, stating the purpose for which it is desired to import such goods, stock, &c.

The period within which the goods, stock, &c., shall be re-exported, or the amount of duty deposited be carried to revenue, shall be as under, but in no case shall such period exceed six (6) months. If the goods, stock, &c., are exported within the period specified hereunder the deposit may be refunded, but if not so exported the amount shall be carried to revenue:—

1. Persons on horseback, or driving a horse and cart or buggy and pair of horses, on private business—Deposit of duty not exceeding three months.
2. Persons on horseback, or driving a horse and cart or buggy and pair, for business purposes, such as hawkers, commercial travellers, &c.—Deposit of duty not exceeding six months, provided goods are not introduced for competition with Victorian produce or manufactures or Victorian duty-paid goods.
3. Theatrical companies, circuses, travelling shows—Deposit of duty not exceeding six months.
4. Droving plant for use in travelling stock to market—Deposit of duty not exceeding one month.
5. Mares for serving purposes—Deposit of duty not exceeding three months.
6. Horses and mares for racing purposes—Deposit of duty not exceeding three months.
7. Stock to be offered for sale and to be returned if not disposed of—Deposit of duty not exceeding one month.
8. Stock for grazing purposes transferred from private property on or near one side of the border to private property on or near the other side of the border—Deposit of duty not exceeding six months.
9. Stock imported and forwarded by rail for shipment to another colony—Deposit of duty not exceeding ten days.
10. Persons with waggons, &c., and horses (for carting wheat, wool, &c., or for carrying out contracts)—No deposit will be allowed; duty must be paid.
11. Threshing machines with accompanying plant, waggons, &c.—No deposit will be allowed; duty must be paid.
12. Entire horses for stud purposes—No deposit will be allowed; duty must be paid.
13. Persons with horses and vehicles living near and crossing and re-crossing the border for the purpose of visiting their property, relatives, or friends—Brands and description of horses and vehicles to be registered with officer, and, if the collector approves, permit to be granted half-yearly, subject to renewal on like approval and to withdrawal at any time.

Border Regulations.

Permission to import goods, stock, &c., across the border on the deposit of duty may be granted by the Collector of Customs on receipt of written application, stating the purpose for which it is desired to import such goods, stock, &c.

The period within which the goods, stock, &c., shall be re-exported, or the amount of duty deposited be carried to revenue, shall be as under, but in no case shall such period exceed six (6) months. If the goods, stock, &c., are exported within the periods specified hereunder the deposit may be refunded, but if not so exported the amount shall be carried to revenue:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

1. Principles of Construction, Manipulation, Adjustment, and use of following Instruments, viz.:—

2. Principles and Practice of Land Surveying:
Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes;
Topographical surveying;
Setting out block surveys;
Laying out roads;
Setting out of curves;
Plotting from field-notes.
3. Computations connected with Land Surveying:
Reduction of traverses and bearings;
Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves;
Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field;
Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.
4. Trigonometry, Astronomy, &c.:
Plane trigonometry (practical);
Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.
5. Levelling, &c.:
Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.
6. Drawing and Charting:
Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions,

and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

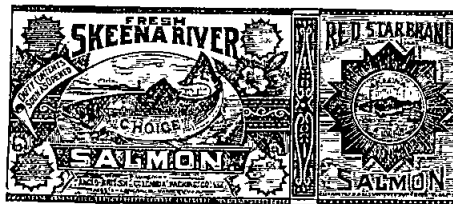

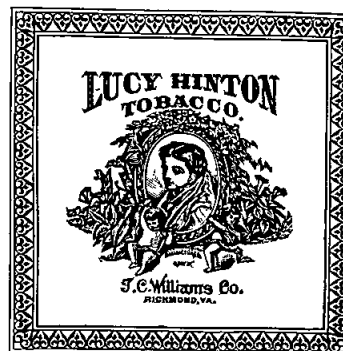

No person shall drive along any road within the Shire of Braybrook any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceeds ten tons; or so that the said engine or roller shall push or haul over any road in the said shire any tender or other vehicle if the weight of such tender or other vehicle, including its loading, exceeds ten tons; or if the pressure per inch width of tire which any one of its wheels exerts upon the road exceeds the pressure per inch width of tire of the heaviest laden wheel of the engine pushing or hauling it; or if the minimum width of tire of such tender or other vehicle be less than eight inches; or so that any part of the said engine or roller shall be or remain upon the same bay, span, or arch of any bridge or culvert within the said shire at the same time as the tender or other vehicle, or any part thereof, pushed or hauled by the said engine or roller unless the joint weight of the whole train, including the engine, be less than ten tons. And no traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed along or over any road within the said shire before the hour of Six p.m., or after the hour of Six a.m. Any person offending against this by-law shall, for every such offence, forfeit a sum of not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. If any goat be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure has been provided shall notify the same, and the situation thereof, in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place, may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district of the Shire of Malvern registered as aforesaid is seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person, or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which has not upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may, by the proper officer of the Council of the Shire of Malvern, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which has on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which has been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice, or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice, shall, for all the purposes of this subdivision, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place within the Shire of Malvern, shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

The large scales on which these lithographs are prepared constitute them valuable working plans for shire and other surveyors, rate collectors, assessors, &c., &c.
