REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

for not less than three years, two of when must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.-By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of viva voce or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.



The births of 1,272 children, viz., 661 boys and 611 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May 1,121 births were registered, or 151 less than in the mouth under review. The births were 83 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 105 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 585, viz., 323 of males and 262 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 687, or 117 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in May by 48; but were below the average of June during the previous ten years by 16. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 26.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.12, on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.55, on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (50.05) was three-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.22) took place on the 16th, and the least range (6.47) on the 29th; the mean daily range was 15.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.477 inches, on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.356 inches, on the 9th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.999 inches) was one-fiftieth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 174 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 2.24 inches, or half an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 3 days during the month.

In the month under review, as compared with the previous one, there was a decrease of 15 in the mortality from zymotic diseases, but an increase of 61 in that from local diseases; thus nearly accounting for the net increase of 48 in the total mortality. Under the head of zymotic diseases, the deaths from scarlet fever fell from 4 to 11, those from diphtheria from 4 to 2, and from typhoid fever from 13 to 3; but on the other hand, those from influenza rose from 3 to 6. Under the head of developmental diseases, deaths from old age rose from 14 to 2; but those from premature birth and malformations fell from 26 to 20. Under the head of local diseases, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased from 57 to 68, from those of the circulatory system from 56 to 72, from pneumonia and bronchitis from 43 to 72, from the uterus and vagina from 3 to 7, and from parturition from 2 to 6; whereas those from liver diseases and from enteritis each fell from 18 to 9.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1890 to 1894, and the first six months of 1895. It will be noticed that in the months under review the mortality from both causes was exceptionally low:—

The abovementioned officers shall be elected annually at the annual general meeting in the month of July in each year by duly qualified subscribers. The nominations for the above officers shall be, in writing, placed in the hands of the secretary at or before such meeting, but nominations cannot be received without the consent of persons nominated.

3. The committee shall direct the general business of the hospital, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint, suspend, and discharge all paid officers, and arrange the terms of the employment of such.

4. The committee shall meet on the first Tuesday in each month, at Eight p.n.; seven shall form a quorum.

5. The president may summon a special meeting, if and when requested in writing to do so, by any three members of committee, which writing shall specify the object of such meeting. Three clear days' notice, in writing, shall be given to each member, intimating the meeting, and the object of same.

6. Notice of motion shall be given by any member when a charge of irregularity is brought against any member of staff, and a specially sunmoned meeting shall be convened to consider such charge.

7. The committee shall appoint a house committee of two of its

- and a specially sammoned meeting and a committee of two of its members, who shall attend to the internal management of the hospital, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the medical officers', collector's, dispenser's, and house steward's books, and such other matters as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

 A. The house committee shall retire monthly, and its members shall be eligible for re-appointment on the next committee. B. It shall meet once in each week or oftener, on such days and such hours as it may appoint, and the honorary medical officers shall be members ex officio of the house committee.

 C. It shall also once at least in each month audit the house accounts, and check the stores book.

 D. It shall watch the entire expenditure of the hospital, and shall carefully scrutinize the monthly analysis of such expenditure with due regard to the number of patients in the house, reporting to the committee any matter of importance.

 E. It shall be present without notice once in each fortnight at the receipt and distribution of stores, and once in each quarter shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores with the house steward's and dispenser's books.

 F. It shall have the power to employ persons other than the medical officer, secretary, matron, and nurses for any work in or about the hospital and to discharge the same.

 G. It shall define the duties of officers and servants, and such duties shall be incorporated in their several agreements.

 H. It shall have the benefits of the institution, reporting in its minutes the reason for refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

 8. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the hospital, together with an audited balance-sheet and report at the annual meeting. Such balance-sheet shall be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

 9. The books and accounts of the hospital shall be audited annually by the auditors.

 10. All contracts shall be made by the general committee.

 11. That no member of committee shall be allowed to contract for the supply of any article whatsoever for the use of the hospital either by tender or otherwise.

 12. The common seal of the hospital shall be kept by its banker for the time being.

Elections and Appointments.

Elections and Appointments.

13. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be elected at the annual meeting.

14. The auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting.

15. Members to fill the vacancies of retiring members of committee shall be elected at the annual meeting.

16. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. (Hospital and Charities Act 1890, section 14.)

17. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the Chairman of Committees, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of treason, felony, or misdeameanour, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of committee montributor to such institution until the annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said act, are required to go out of office. (Hospital and Charities Act 1890, section 15.)

18. All contested elections or appointments shall be by ballot only.

21. No contributor shall be entitled to vote at annual meetings nless his subscription shall have been paid prior to 30th June in each year.

22. At all the meetings of governors and contributors, the president, or one of the vice-presidents, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

23. The annual meeting of governors and contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

(1) The election of members of committee of management.

(2) The election of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and two auditors for the ensuing year.

(3) The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given in writing to each member of committee four (4) clear days before such meeting.

24. At all general meetings of governors and contributors, fifteen shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present within half-au-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

25. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any twelve or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary or president to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at summoned.

Medical Officer.

26. The institution shall be under the care of a duly qualified medical officer, who shall arrange that the institution shall be visited at least once a day, and at such other times as may be necessary. He shall receive for his services such remuneration as the committee of management may determine

Honorary Surgeons.

27. It shall be optional for the annual meeting of contributors for the time being to elect one or more honorary medical officers, who shall be legally qualified medical practitioners, and shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the hospital at all times; they shall assist the visiting surgeon in the performance of capital surgical operations; but no such operations shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the hospital.

Treasurer.

28. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and be deposited by him at least once a week in such bank as the committee of management may

appoint.

29. On receiving any money from the collector he shall sign the collectors' acquittance-book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

30. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president (or a vice-president) and the treasurer,

and countersigned by the secretary.

31. Previous to signing a cheque for the payment of account the treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

32. He shall cause to be prepared by the sccretary, for submission to the committee at the meeting in each month, a progress sheet, in prescribed form showing the actual position of the hospital funds on the previous Monday, with an estimate of the surplus or deficiency at the end of the financial year, such balancesheet to be signed by him, and faid on the table by the secretary, with the bank certificate or pass-book made up to the same date.

Secretary and Collector.

33. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes accounts, and records of the hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before same, carry out all resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the committee of management.

He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the hospital, in all cases give a receipt for same, and pay to the treasurer, at least once in every week, all moneys he may have received, and render an account of the same to the committee of management. He shall furnish security from a public company to such an amount as the committee may deem necessary.

35. Members of committee and honorary professional staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending in-patients and out-patients subject to the approval of the committee. Accidents and cases of decided emergency shall be admitted at any time, and in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) at such hours as may be appointed by the committee.

36. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, nor person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who in the opinion of one of the medical officers and visiting surgeon, or of the committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

37. Any person wishing to be received in the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted with the sanction of the house committee. He shall be charged six (6) shillings per day (or a smaller sum if deemed expedient by the committee), and in the event of any operation being performed a fee shall be paid by him to the hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the medical officer, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas.

38. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

39. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice being detected in receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall consult the visiting surgeon, and the committee may order the removal of such person from the hospital, provided the case be not one of emergency.
