PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, throughout the Shire of Rutherglen;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, throughout the North and South Ridings of the Shire of Huntly;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, AND FRIDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, throughout the Shire of Creswick.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, and dated the 11th day of August, 1884, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of September, 1884, the Regulations contained in the Schedule thereto should, so far as regards

British ships and boats, be substituted for the Regulations contained in the First Schedule to an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 14th day of August, 1879:

And whereas by two Orders in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the 30th day of December, 1884, and the 24th day of June, 1885, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, as regards British fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by another Order in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 13th day of August, 1892, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th August, 1884, as regards Steam Pilot Vessels:

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:—

Art. 3.—A seagoing steam-ship when under way shall carry—

- (a) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.
- (b) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (c) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (d) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least 3 feet forward from the light so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

And whereas by another Order in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 30th day of January, 1893, the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, were further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 3 of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council now in recital and set out in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty that the said recited Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, should be rescinded to the intent that the modifications and additions made to the said recited Article 3, and set out in the Schedule hereto, should no longer continue in operation:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the 12th day of December, 1895, by a

Provisional Order within the meaning of *The Rules Publication Act 1893*, to rescind the said Order in Council of the 30th January, 1893:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of *The Rules Publication Act 1893* have been complied with:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to rescind the said recited Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, and to direct that from the date of this Order the provisions contained in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order and to this Order shall cease to be in operation, and the said recited Article 3 of the said Regulations contained in the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, shall have effect as if the said Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, had never been made.

SCHEDULE.

(e) To insure that the red and green side lights shall show an uniform light from right ahead of the ship to two points abaft the beam on the port and starboard sides respectively and shall not show across the bow of the ship itself, the said lights must be fixed and the screens fitted so that the rays from the red and green lights shall cross the line of the ship's keel projected ahead of the ship at a reasonable distance ahead of the ship.

With regard to all vessels whose lights are inspected by the officers of the Board of Trade the red or green side light will not be deemed to be fixed and fitted in accordance with the Regulations unless it is so fixed and screened that a line drawn from the outside edge of the wick to the foremost end of the inboard screen of such light shall make an angle of 4 degrees or as near thereto as may be practicable with a line drawn parallel with the keel of the ship from the outside edge of the wick.

23rd March, 1896.

The Tennessee Centennial and International Exposition Company respectfully begs to formally announce the fact that on 1st May, 1897, the Centennial Exposition will be opened in the city of Nashville, State of Tennessee, United States of America, to be continued for a period of six months. The occasion for holding this Exposition is to celebrate the one hundredth anniversary of the admission of the State into the Federal Union, and, this being the first event of the kind, it will be of marked interest, not only to the people of the United States, but to those of all North and South America as well.

Since its first conception the enterprise has assumed that importance and dignity which must command the consideration and attention of the entire commercial world.

The city of Nashville is situated very near the geographical centre of the United States. The same is true as to the centre of population; hence the holding of an Exposition at this particular point makes attendance at the least expense possible to the entire population of the country.

Again, the rapid and substantial development of the resources, both industrial and agricultural, of that section of the United States known as "The South" warrants the assumption that this proposed Exposition will be of great profit to those making exhibits along commercial lines.

In view of these facts, the Tennessee Centennial Exposition Company has the honour of extending to you and to your people a cordial invitation to participate with them in this Exposition. It is the desire of the management to make this an occasion through which closer commercial relations may be cultivated between the people of the United States and those of other countries; and the management is pleased to assure you that every arrangement will be made looking to that end.

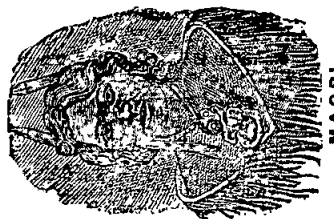

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

In the Supreme Court of Victoria
the 25th day of August, 1896.

REGULÆ GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Rules of Court, dated the 26th day of November, 1892, it is ordered as follows :—

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

1. In the proviso to Rule 3 the words "graduated in the University of Melbourne, or of his having passed at a matriculation examination, or graduated," shall be substituted for the words "passed at a matriculation examination, or of his having graduated in the University of Melbourne, or."

2. For Rule 6 the following rule shall be substituted :—

Final Examination.—Every such person must, not earlier than six months before the expiration of his articles of clerkship, and before he apply for admission to practise in the Court, also submit to be examined by the Board, and must pass in six at least of the following subjects :—

- (1) Conveyancing, and special legislation affecting it, in Victoria.
- (2) Special legislation affecting the law of contracts and torts in Victoria.
- (3) Divorce law.
- (4) Probate practice and special legislation affecting the administration of estates in Victoria.
- (5) Insolvency law.
- (6) Criminal law (taking as text-book Broom's Commentaries, 8th edition, Book IV., except Chapter 4).
- (7) Practice of the Supreme Court in its civil jurisdiction.
- (8) Practice of the County Court and before justices.

In addition to a general acquaintance with the subjects above specified, knowledge of the following statutes and rules, and any modification of or addition thereto, will be required in connexion with such subjects :—

- (1) The Real Property Act 1890, sections 108, 109, 125, 169 to 173 inclusive, 181, 189, 197, 198, and 200.
The Partition Act 1890.
Voluntary Conveyances Act 1896.
The Transfer of Land Act 1890, Parts I. to VII. inclusive.
- (2) The Wrongs Act 1890.
The Instruments Act 1890, Parts VI., VII., VIII., and sections 228, 229, and 230.
The Instruments Act 1896.
The Bills of Sale Amendment Act 1891.
Registration of Firms Act 1892.
Book Debts Act 1896.
- (3) The Marriage Act 1890, Parts VII. to XI. inclusive, and the rules thereunder.
- (4) The Administration and Probate Act 1890 (except Part IV.), and the rules thereunder.
Administration and Probate Act 1892.
Intestates' Estates Act 1896.
- (5) The Insolvency Act 1890, and the rules thereunder.
- (7) The Supreme Court Act 1890, and the rules thereunder.
The Instruments Act 1890, sections 91 to 98 inclusive.
- (8) The County Court Act 1890, and the rules thereunder.

The Board may from time to time, with the approval of the Judges, prescribe any text-book, or add to or alter the text-book or statute law prescribed for examination, provided that no such addition or alteration shall come into force until the expiration of one year after a notice thereof has been posted in the Supreme Court Library and in the Office of the Prothonotary.

3. In Rule 8 the word "two" shall be substituted for the word "four."

4. The following rule shall be inserted after Rule 18 :—

- 18 (a). In case of non-compliance within the specified time with the preceding rule, or any rule to the like effect, or of the omission of any particular in any affidavit which ought to have been stated, in compliance with the practice therein referred to, the Board, if satisfied that the non-compliance or omission has been inadvertent, may permit the defect to be made good by an additional affidavit or affidavits on payment of a fee of two guineas for each affidavit required for that purpose, and may grant the certificate provided for by Rule 14, stating that it is subject to the Court's approval of the reception of such additional affidavit or affidavits, and the Court may, in its discretion, admit upon such certificate.

5. In Rule 25 the figures "50" shall be substituted for the figures "25."

In Schedule A (6) the words "a barrister and solicitor" shall be substituted for the words "an attorney, solicitor, and proctor," and at the foot thereof, opposite to "A.B. [name in full]" the words "[signature of candidate]" shall be added.

These rules shall come into force on the 1st day January, A.D., 1897.

Agricultural Colleges Act 1890.

REGULATIONS AS TO THE MANNER IN WHICH LANDS VESTED IN THE TRUSTEES
MAY BE DEMISED BY THEM, ETC.

FORM OF LEASE.

WHEREAS by section 28 of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1890* it is enacted that the Council of Agricultural Education may, from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make, alter, and repeal regulations for (amongst other purposes) regulating the manner in which any of the lands vested in the trustees may be demised by them, and the forms of the leases, and the terms, covenants, and conditions to be therein contained: His Excellency the Governor in Council has therefore approved of the subjoined form of lease, viz.:-

THIS Indenture made the _____ day of _____ 189 between _____ of _____ of _____ the trustees appointed by the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of Victoria under the authority of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1890* of the one part and _____ of _____ in the colony of Victoria hereinafter called "the lessee" of the other part

Whereas the Council of Agricultural Education continued or constituted by the said Act have made certain regulations as to the manner in which the lands vested in the trustees may be demised by them and the forms of the leases and the covenants and conditions to be therein contained and such regulations and the rents reserved by such leases have been duly approved by the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council and the trustees have thereupon agreed to grant this lease subject to such regulations and the term covenants and conditions and rent herein contained.

Now this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the rent hereby reserved and the covenants and conditions herein contained and on the part of the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns to be observed and performed. The trustees do by these presents grant and demise unto the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns all that piece of

grazing land in the colony of Victoria containing _____ acres _____ roods and _____ perches more or less situate in the parish of _____ county of _____ delineated on the plan drawn in the margin hereof and therein coloured yellow together with the appurtenances. And also that piece of agricultural land in the colony of Victoria containing _____ acres _____ roods and _____ perches more or less situate in the said parish and delineated on the plan drawn in the margin hereof and therein coloured pink together with the appurtenances.

Excepting and always reserving out of this demise unto the trustees for the time being for the purposes of the said Act (hereinafter called the trustees) all live timber trees and other trees now growing on said land.

Excepting all minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano within the boundaries of the said land with full liberty and authority for the holder or holders of any gold-mining lease or leases or mineral lease or leases granted by the Governor of Victoria in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by virtue of and pursuant to the Mines Acts their licensees agents and servants at any time or times hereafter during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold or for all such minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano and extract and with or without horses carts waggons and vehicles to remove the same therefrom and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts erect machinery carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those under which persons have the right to mine in and upon Crown lands compensation being paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for surface damage to be done to the land hereby demised by reason of mining thereon under any such lease such compensation to be determined by a warden as by the *Mines Act 1891* (No. 2) provided. And also excepting to the trustees the right to grant licences or leases of any of the said land for such of the said purposes as they lawfully may during the said term to any other persons. And also the right to the trustees their licensees agents servants workmen and other persons authorized by them to enter into and upon the said demised premises or any part thereof with or without horses carts waggons and vehicles to cut timber on the said land and to remove the same therefrom. And also excepting to the trustees and their agents servants licensees and tenants the use of all such parts of the land as shall be required by the trustees for roads dams reservoirs basins aqueducts or drains the same to be set out by the trustees together with the right to construct the same.

To hold the said pieces of land unto the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns from the _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and _____ for the term of _____ years the said piece of land coloured yellow for grazing purposes only and the said piece of land coloured pink for agricultural and grazing purposes only.

Yielding and paying for the same unto the trustees during the said term the rent of _____ per annum payable in four quarterly payments always in advance on the _____ day of _____ the _____ day of _____ in each year the first payment to be made on the _____ day of _____ and such payments shall be free and clear of all taxes rates or assessments.

And the lessee doth hereby for himself his executors administrators and approved assigns covenant with the trustees that the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns will during the said term pay the said rent hereinbefore reserved at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions. And also will during the said term pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable in respect of the said premises.

And also that the said lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns will keep the said land free from noxious weeds and will preserve all live timber or other trees except those which the trustees shall permit to be destroyed felled or grubbed up. And also that he be the said lessee his executors or administrators will during the said term cultivate and manage the said agricultural lands in a good and husband-like manner and according to the most approved system of agriculture. And also that the said lessee will during the said term at his and their own expense without being thereunto required well and sufficiently repair maintain and keep and at the end or sooner determination of the tenancy leave all buildings erections and improvements now being on the land hereby demised in good and substantial repair and condition. And will during the said term keep the said buildings now erected and standing on the land hereby demised insured in the names of the trustees against loss or damage by fire in some insurance office approved of by the trustees for a sum not less than £ _____ and will when thereunto required produce to the trustees or their agents the policy or policies of insurance and the receipts for the premiums and other sums payable for effecting and keeping on foot the said insurance. And permit to be laid out all the moneys which shall be received under or by virtue of any such policy or policies in rebuilding or repairing such part of the said buildings now erected and standing thereon as shall have been destroyed or damaged by fire.

And also that should the said lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns with the consent of the trustees erect any buildings for the purpose of residence on the said land then and in such case the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns at the end of the said term or within one month therefrom shall have the privilege to sell or remove the said buildings provided he or they shall not have committed any breach of the covenants conditions or provisions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed or performed and he or they shall remove them or forfeit all claim to them if not removed within the time hereby allowed.

And also will at once after the granting of this lease to the satisfaction of the trustees commence and continue to destroy and will within one year after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf by the trustees upon the demised land all kangaroos wallabies dingoes or native dogs dogs run wild dogs at large foxes rabbits and any of the animals and birds included in the term "vermin" in the Act in that behalf or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the Land Acts and will keep the same land free of such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf during the currency of this lease.

And also will observe perform and comply with the requirements of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* or any further Act or Acts of the Parliament of Victoria relating to the suppression or destruction of rabbits.

And also will permit the trustees and the holder or holders of any gold-mining lease or leases or mineral lease or leases granted by the Government of Victoria in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by virtue of and pursuant to the Mines Acts their or any of their agents and servants and any person to whom the trustees shall grant any licence in respect hereof to enter into and upon such land with or without horses carts waggons and vehicles and to search for mine extract and remove all or any minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano and to cut down and carry away any live or dead timber thereon without any leave or licence being required in that behalf from the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns.

And also will permit the trustees and their agents servants and licensees and the holder or holders of any gold-mining lease or leases or mineral lease or leases aforesaid to sink and make all such shafts pits levels adits tramways rails or roads and use and occupy such portions of the demised land for brick-making purposes as the trustees may direct or set out and use and divert all waters and direct all buildings and machinery on the demised land as may be requisite or necessary for making marketable the said live or dead timber minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano which may be found in on under or upon the said demised land.

And also will permit the trustees and their agents servants and all persons authorized by the trustees to set out make construct and use the said roads dams reservoirs basins aqueducts and drains.

And also will permit any person appointed in that behalf by the trustees at any time to enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease are being performed by the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns.

And the lessee for himself his executors administrators and approved assigns doth hereby further covenant with the trustees that he will not do or permit or suffer to be done any act whereby the water in any dams reservoirs basins or aqueducts may be polluted or contaminated or whereby any such dams reservoirs basins or aqueduct works of the trustees may be injured but will at all times use his and their best endeavours to conserve the purity of the water and to prevent injury and damage to the property of the trustees.

And also will not assign sublet mortgage subdivide or part with the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the trustees signified in writing.

And the lessee in manner and form aforesaid doth hereby further covenant and declare that the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns will not during the continuance of the term hereby granted fell ring injure destroy grub up or cut down any live timber or other trees in or upon the land hereby demised unless with the sanction of the trustees signified in writing.

Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared between the parties hereto that the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns at the termination of this demise shall not be entitled to any compensation whatever for any improvements made by him or them upon the land hereby demised or any part thereof.

Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that if the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns shall at any time during the said term become or be made bankrupt or insolvent or shall assign his or their estate for the benefit of his or their creditors or if he or they shall fail to use the premises hereby demised *bond fide* for the purposes for which the same has been demised respectively or use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the said rent hereinbefore reserved shall be in arrear for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants conditions and provisos by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the trustees to declare this lease to be forfeited and then the trustees by their officers or agents may without any demand enter forthwith into and upon any part of the said demised premises in the name of the whole and the same to repossess and enjoy as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed.

And it is hereby agreed and declared that in any such case it shall be lawful for the trustees their agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the trustees had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law And then and in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for the same by any person whomsoever the defendants to such action may plead leave or licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them to the trustees and all persons acting on their behalf for the entry or trespass or other matters to be complained of in such action or other proceedings.

Section 125 of Act 1098.

SHIRE OF ORBOST.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

Pans and cesspits.—The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be adopted.

Removal of night-soil.—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire; and such pan or pans shall be emptied and contents thereof removed as the said council shall direct.

Use of disinfectants.—Every householder shall use, or cause to be placed for use, in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

Charge for removal.—For the removal of such night-soil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said council or the person appointed on its behalf the sum of One pound nineteen shillings (£1 19s.) per annum for a once-a-week service, and for a fortnightly service One pound six shillings (£1 6s.) per annum for every pan used, such sum to be payable quarterly in advance, and in default of payment the same to be and to become recoverable in any court of petty sessions: Provided that in cases of special nature the said council shall be at liberty to make such charge as it may deem fit.

Extent of application of By-law.—This by-law, numbered six (6), shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Orbost.

Penalties.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) or less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

The above by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Orbost on the 27th day of May, 1896.

The 12.30 and 1.10 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge will only stop at Hawksburn and Armadale, and will run past Caulfield. The 1.30 and 1.46 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge will only stop at Hawksburn, Toorak, Armadale, and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. The 12.10, 12.45, 1.17, 2, 5.10, and 5.20 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge, the 12.48, 1.14, 1.58, 2.29, and 5.48 p.m. trains from Caulfield, and the 5.21 p.m. train from Oakleigh will not run. The 12.20 and 1 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge will only stop at Toorak and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. Passengers from roadside stations on the Oakleigh line for the Mordialloc line can travel free to Prince's-bridge by the 12.9 or 1.25 p.m. Oakleigh line trains, then by the 1.10 or 2.25 p.m. trains.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION No. 11.

ALL water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measure shall be, and are hereunder, for the year 1896, determined by the Trust.

GRAVITATION WATER.

The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the River Murray, the Gunbower Creek, or the Barr Creek, through the Trust channels or otherwise, shall be, for indigenous grasses or pasturage, Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre.

For irrigation of lucerna and fodder crops the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per inch per acre. For second or subsequent watering, Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre.

For irrigating cereals and field crops the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per inch per acre. For second or subsequent watering, the charge shall be Sixpence per inch per acre.

FILLING TANKS.

For filling tanks inside the Trust area a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) for each tank shall be made. That for all water supplied by gravitation outside of the Trust area double rates shall be charged, but when the owners or occupiers pay for water supplied, and fill tank or tanks whilst irrigating the land surrounding or adjacent to such tanks, for such tanks so filled Ten shillings (10s.) only shall be charged for each tank.

IRRIGATION BY PUMPING.

For cereals, and field crops, such as wheat, oats, barley, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

Amber cane and sorghum.—A charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre for the first watering. For a second or subsequent watering, a charge of Eightpence (8d.) per inch per acre shall be made.

For lucerna and indigenous grasses, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

Fallow lands.—A charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made. Other lands, carrying crops, to take precedence as to supply.

FILLING TANKS.

For filling all tanks inside of the Trust area a charge of One pound (£1) each shall be made. For all water supplied outside of the Trust area (tanks included) the charges shall be three times those of inside of area.

GARDEN RIGHTS.

The rate or the price for the right to irrigate gardens or orchards under a garden right (which may be taken out at any time during the year 1896, and shall be in force only during the continuance of that year) shall be Ten shillings (10s.) for the first and same acre, and Seven shillings and Sixpence (7s. 6d.) for each additional acre.

The minimum charge for irrigating any area shall be Five shillings (5s.)

Such person or persons as the aforesaid Trust may appoint, from time to time, for the purpose of collecting water rates, shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by provision of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this 13th day of November, 1895.

MACORNA NORTH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION No. 5.

THE Commissioners of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water:—

1. All water supplied from the Trust works shall be paid for by measure. All measurements shall be made by gauges, of form and pattern approved by the Trust and fixed under the direction of the Trust, and all quantities shall be determined by the officer of the Trust deputed for the purpose.

2. All water shall be supplied through properly constructed outlets, to be applied for and constructed as provided in Regulation No.

3. All persons requiring water from the Trust works shall make application for same to the water bailiff (each application to be accompanied with a deposit of 25 per cent.), who shall enter same in a book supplied for the purpose, and every applicant will be supplied as near as possible in the order that his name appears in the order-book (if water is available). The Trust does not incur any liability through the failure to supply any order for water, no matter from what cause such failure may arise.

4. The Trust reserves to itself the right to fix a maximum or minimum quantity of water from time to time which shall be supplied to any block of 320 acres or fraction thereof.

5. The manipulation of the works of the Trust shall be solely in the hands of the Trust officers, who shall turn the water on and off, and any person not being duly authorized who shall in

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any way interfere, damage, or tamper with any of the works shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

6. The rate or price to be paid for water supplied for the irrigation of grass land between the 1st day of July and the 30th day of November shall be Fourpence per inch per acre, and for water supplied for similar use between the 1st day of December and the 30th day of April the charge shall be Sixpence per inch per acre. The minimum charge to be made for water supplied for each watering for the above purpose shall be Ten shillings between the 1st July and the 30th November, and Ten shillings between the 1st December and the 30th April.

The rate or price to be paid for water supplied for the irrigation of land under cultivation between the 1st day of July and the 30th day of November shall be One shilling for crops per inch per acre, and for water supplied for similar use between the 1st day of December and the 30th day of April the charge shall be One shilling per inch per acre. The minimum charge to be made for water supplied for each watering of land under cultivation shall be Ten shillings between the 1st day of July and the 30th day of November, and Ten shillings between the 1st day of December and the 30th day of April.

OUTLETS.

7. Every separate block of land within the Trust shall have at least one outlet, and every owner or occupier shall apply for such outlet to be constructed by the Trust, and shall pay to the Trust as part cost of same the sum of Three pounds.

8. In cases where a block of land is divided into two or more parts an outlet shall be applied for and provided for every portion that has an area of 20 acres, and where the area is less than 20 acres an outlet must be provided by the owner or occupier at his own cost, but shall be constructed in accordance with plans approved by the engineer, and to his entire satisfaction.

9. All outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot approved by the Trust engineer.

10. After having made application for an outlet, and pending the construction of same, water may be delivered through a cut or opening in the bank upon depositing the sum of One pound, such cut or opening to be made by the applicant for water under the supervision of the Trust officials, and repaired by the applicant to the satisfaction of the water bailiff, when the deposit will be refunded.

11. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against or breach of this Regulation shall be liable, for any such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

RESERVE FOR WATERING PURPOSES AND FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOORABBIN, AT CHELTENHAM.—REGULATION.

- George James Scantlebury.

Provided nevertheless that the said David Abbott, William Lamb Smith, Maurice Edward Benjamin, and Edwin Thomas Penny shall hold office as members of the Committee of Management of such portion of the reserve for Watering purposes and for Public Recreation for so long only as they may respectively continue to be Councillors of the Shire of Moorabbin.

3. 10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.
11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.
12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
