WESTERN PACIFIC REGULATION No. 4 OF 1896. TO RESTRICT THE ALIENATION OF LAND IN THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO RESTRICT THE ALIENATION OF LAND IN THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS.

[L.S.] JOHN B. THURSTON.

1. *Limits of Regulation.*—This Regulation shall apply to all the islands comprised in the Protectorate established by Her Majesty in the Solomon Group.

2. *Interpretation.*—The word "native" in this Regulation shall mean aboriginal native of the British Solomon Islands, and the expression "non-native" shall mean any other person. The expression "native land" shall mean land owned by a native.

3. *Alienation of land restricted.*—From and after the coming into force of this Regulation no native or vacant land shall be acquired by any non-native person in the British Solomon Islands otherwise than as is provided in this Regulation.

4. *Contracts for purchase of native lands.*—Land may, with the sanction of the High Commissioner, be purchased from natives for the purpose of a trading station or for agricultural purposes, and provisional contracts to acquire such land may be entered into with natives. Every such provisional contract shall be submitted, together with a plan showing the situation of the land, to the High Commissioner, who, after making, by himself or his deputies, such inquiry as is possible with regard to the title of the proposed vendors and the fairness of the contract, may either confirm or disallow such contract.

5. *Condition on conveyance of land for trading purposes.*—Every conveyance by a native of land for the purpose of erecting a trading station shall be conditional on the erection and occupation within two years of such trading station. On breach of this condition the land shall revert to the native vendor.

6. *Condition on conveyance of native land for agricultural purposes.*—Every conveyance by a native of land for agricultural purposes shall be conditional on at least one-tenth part of the area of land conveyed being cultivated within five years of the date of the conveyance. On failure of the condition the purchaser shall be seized of all the land which has been cultivated,

cleared, or built on by him, and the remainder of the land comprised in the conveyance shall revert to the native vendor.

7. *Contracts for leases of native land.*—Leases may, subject to the approval of the High Commissioner, be obtained of native land for any purpose (including the working of minerals and the cutting of timber), and the provisions of section five of this Regulation with regard to contracts for the conveyance of native lands shall apply to contracts for leases of native land.

8. *Contracts for leases of native land determinable after six months' notice.*—Leases of native land determinable at any time after the expiration of not more than six months' notice on either side may be obtained without the previous sanction of the High Commissioner. All native land occupied after the coming into force of this Regulation otherwise than as provided in this Regulation shall be deemed to be held on lease determinable at any time after one month's notice on either side.

9. *Copies of conveyances to be lodged with High Commissioner.*—A copy of every conveyance or lease of native land granted under this Regulation must be deposited within six months from the date of execution thereof in the High Commissioner's Office, otherwise such conveyance or lease shall be of no effect.

10. *Vacant land.*—Leases may be granted by the High Commissioner on behalf of Her Majesty of land (other than land found to be acquired *bonâ fide* for valuable consideration by a non-native person) being vacant by reason of the extinction of the original native owners and their descendants.

11. *Relief in action for recovery of land brought against bonâ fide occupier.*—The approval of the High Commissioner to any conveyance or lease of native land shall not be conclusive evidence of the right of the vendor or lessor to convey or lease. But in any action brought against a person in occupation who acquired *bonâ fide* and without notice of the plaintiff's claim, the Court may, in an action for the recovery of the land (if it finds that the plaintiff is entitled in law to succeed), instead of ordering the defendant to remove from the land forming the subject of the action, order such defendant to pay the plaintiff such sum of money as it may think just, in which case the right of the plaintiff shall be vested in the defendant on payment of such sum of money in accordance with the order of the Court; or if the defendant claims to hold under a lease granted under this Regulation, the Court may order that the defendant retain possession of the land forming the subject of the action during the unexpired term of the lease, subject to the payment of such rent, and subject to such conditions, as the Court may think just. In fixing the amount of any sum or rent as aforesaid the Court shall not take into account the value of improvements effected by the defendant. In the case of land held under a lease the Court may order any such defendant as aforesaid to pay a sum of money in respect of past occupation.

12. *Tenants may remove buildings at determination of tenancy.*—Unless agreed to the contrary, buildings erected by a tenant holding on lease from a native or natives may be removed by such tenant at the expiration of the tenancy. In the event of any conveyance of native land becoming void by reason of the non-fulfilment of the conditions imposed by this Regulation the purchaser shall have no claim to the return of any part of the purchase money or other consideration.

13. *Saving clause.*—Except as in section eleven of this Regulation provided, nothing in this Regulation contained shall be construed to permit the occupation of land by any person who, but for this Regulation, would be liable to immediate ejection.

Short title.—This Regulation may be cited as "The Solomon (Land) Regulation 1896."

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 2nd December, 1895, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from Monday, the 23rd November, to Tuesday, the 1st December, both inclusive (Sunday excepted).

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, in the

TAILORING AND OUTFITTING FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. GALLAGHER BROS., OF NO. 6 DOVETON-STREET NORTH, BALLARAT,

for a period of seven weeks from the 16th November, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five females or more than one boy under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five females and one boy under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

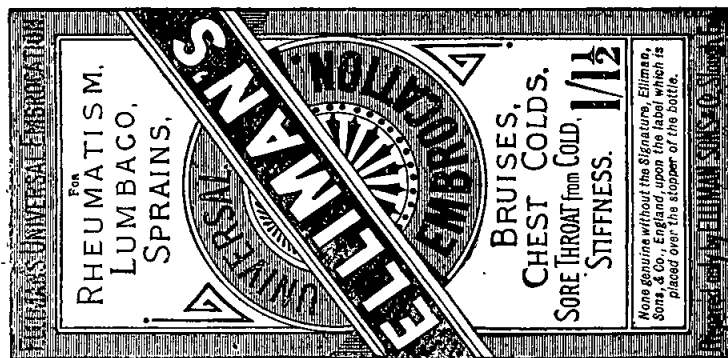

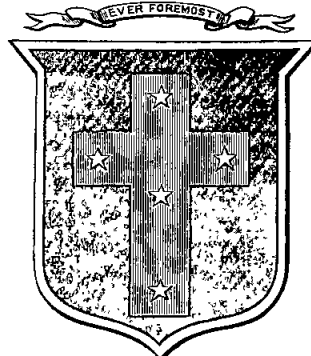

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE SUM OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL, DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of November, 1896.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* (60 Vict., No. 1451), it is among other things provided that the sum of £35,000 to be raised by the issue of Treasury-bonds under the authority of the said Act may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce ; fruits and honey of best quality and in best order exported to markets other than Australasian ; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts and viticultural education generally ; for the sowing and planting and cultivation of seeds or plants to be used for the manufacture of same ; and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following regulations, that is to say :—

BONUSES FOR EXPORT OF FRUIT PULP.

1. Out of the sum of £35,000 applicable under the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* a sum of £570 is hereby set apart to provide bonuses on fruit pulp exported from Victoria to markets other than Australasian.

2. A bonus of one half-a-penny per pound may be paid upon fruit pulp, of a kind and quality to be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, grown in Victoria, and exported therefrom to such foreign port or ports outside of the Australasian colonies as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture.

3. Bonus shall only be payable to the grower whose fruit has been converted into pulp, or to his agent.

4. In no case shall the amount of bonus to be paid hereunder to any one individual or association be more than £100 in the whole.

5. All pulp intended for shipment shall be packed in tins and cases of approved size and quality. The tins considered most suitable should contain 10 lbs. net weight of pulp each, and cases should be packed so as to contain ten tins. The use of new and sound cases and tins only will be allowed.

6. Intending shippers shall give or send written notice of intention to export to the Secretary for Agriculture at least fourteen days prior to the manufacture of the pulp.

7. Persons desirous of participating in the bonus payable under these regulations shall, when making application, state the nature of the appliances to be employed in the conversion of the fruit into pulp, and such appliances shall be subject to the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, and if it appear to him that all or any of such appliances are not suitable for the purpose, or are not kept clean and in proper working order, he may order that the fruit treated by such appliances shall not be entitled to bonus.

8. Pulp when manufactured and tinned shall remain unpacked for fourteen days for inspection.

9. Persons intending to ship pulp under these regulations shall notify their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture in writing not less than seven days prior to shipment, and such notice shall state the date of the proposed shipment, together with the variety and quantity of the pulp, and the name of the vessel by which it is intended to ship.

10. All cases of pulp exported under these regulations must, in addition to the exporter's mark, be branded "Victorian Fruit Pulp," and should also have legibly printed thereon the variety of the fruit and the quantity.

11. No person shall be paid bonus in respect of any pulp not arriving at the port of consignment in a good and marketable condition.

12. Account sales of the fruit pulp exported shall be obtained and forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture by the person or persons claiming bonus, and shall be verified to the satisfaction of the Minister for Agriculture in such manner as he may think fit to require, and no claim for bonus shall be entertained unless same is accompanied by account sales as herein provided.

13. Growers, when giving notice of intention to ship, shall state whether it is their intention to ship their pulp themselves or through an agent, and, if the latter, the name of the agent shall be stated.

**WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 7.**

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each One pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Nine pence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of

special arrangement with the Trust), situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum may be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case where a charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence; and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, and other like purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property, valued at £16 (Sixteen pounds) and upwards, situate within the Waterworks District of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Sixteen pounds sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

4. For any unoccupied piece or allotment of land, if not more than £2 (Two pounds) annual municipal value, a rate of 3s. (Three shillings) shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the shire of Borung.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable, the 1st moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

OMEQ WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1897 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum

shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be charged.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BALLANGIECH CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Ballangiech Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person, having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, and 4 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

Thus, the produce in 1894-5 was grown on 36,291 acres, but that for 1895-6 on only 31,055 acres (which is exclusive of 4,832 acres under orchards grown for private use). An attempt was made in 1895-6 to collect the areas under different fruits, but it will be seen that the information was returned for only one-third of the total area. In 1895-6 the number of persons growing fruit for sale (orchardists) was 4,535, and the number growing for private use was 3,236.

The births of 956 children, viz., 492 boys and 464 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. The number was, it will be observed, 101 lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and about a third less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1891, since which year there has been an uninterrupted falling off. It was, moreover, 315 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and as much as 345 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 438, viz., 230 of males and 208 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 518, or 118 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, fewer by 134 than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years. They were, moreover, 160 below the average of October during the previous ten years, and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 174.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.96 and of deaths registered 11.43 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month during the last ten years of 35.14 and 16.47 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 35.22 and 18.88. Thus, it is evident that either the birth and death rates during the month were most exceptionally low or else that the population has fallen off considerably since 31st December last, when the last estimate was made.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89.5° on the 28th, and the lowest was 36.9° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (57.5°) was three-tenths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.9°) took place on the 28th, and the least range (6.9°) on the 29th. The mean daily range was 20.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.284 inches on the 2nd, and the lowest was 29.589 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.958 inches) was nearly one-eleventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on seven days, the amount of rainfall being only .78 inches, or which was but little more than the exceptionally small amount which fell in October, 1895; it was, moreover, as much as 1.84 inches below the average of the month, and the lowest, with one exception, during the last eleven years. During the first ten months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 23.31 inches, or 8.68 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895, and 3.73 inches above the average of the period during the last ten years.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in October, 1895; 24 per cent. in October, 1894; 28 per cent. in October, 1893; 26 per cent. in October, 1892; 27 per cent. in October, 1891; and 31 per cent. in October, 1890. The low proportional mortality of children is a natural consequence of the fall in the birth rate.

In contrast to the diminished proportion of deaths of children under five years there has been a marked increase in that of adults at dependent or non-supporting ages—i.e., of 65 and upwards—during the last three years. It has, moreover, increased from an average of 13.5 per cent. in October of the years 1886 to 1890, to 24 per cent. in October, 1895, and 25 per cent. in October, 1896. This circumstance may fairly be taken as an indication that the proportion of aged persons in the population has also increased, partly in consequence of the decrease in the proportion of children, and partly of the emigration of adults at the supporting ages, 15 to 65.* The following are the proportions for October in each of the last eleven years:—

* In 1886-90, the percentages of deaths in the three age groups—under 5, 5 to 65, and 65 and upwards—were 35, 51½, and 13½ respectively; whereas in 1896 they were 21, 54, and 25 respectively. If the decrease of 14 in the percentage in the group under 5 were uniformly distributed over the other groups, the percentages in 1896 would have been 21, 62½, and 16½ respectively. The difference between these percentages and those actually recorded afford some measure of the disturbances by emigration, and, in a minor degree, other causes.

Fifty-two deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of cancer; a compositor and a labourer, each aged 75, of apoplexy; a blacksmith, aged 75, of pneumonia; two carpenters, each aged 76, of rheumatism and apoplexy respectively; a labourer, aged 76, of syncope; a butcher, aged 76, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 76, of pleurisy; a female, aged 76, of uræmia; a labourer, aged 76, of calculus; a builder, aged 76, of cancer; a miner, aged 77, of cancer; a gardener, aged 77, of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 77, of paralysis; a female, aged 77, of otitis; a female, aged 78, of paralysis; a foundryman, aged 78, of paraplegia; a gardener, aged 78, of dilatation of the heart; a female, aged 78, of eczema; a solicitor, aged 79, of aneurism; two females, each aged 80, of bronchitis and congestion of lungs respectively; a labourer, aged 81, of cancer; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 81, of nephritis; two females, each aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 86, of influenza; a bootmaker, aged 86, of pneumonia; a female, aged 88, of influenza; a female, aged 90, of syncope; a female, aged 92, of congestion of the lungs; a male, of no occupation, aged 93, of bronchitis; a shipwright, aged 75, two females, aged 76 and 77 respectively, a labourer, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a carpenter and a female, each aged 82, two females, each aged 83, a confectioner and two females, each aged 85, a female, aged 87, two gentlemen, aged 88 and 89 respectively, and three females, aged 90, 90, and 92 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 22 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A rent collector, aged 52, was passed over by a railway train; a labourer, aged 21, died of fracture of the spine, the result of a fall from a horse; a female, aged 34, of shock to the system, occasioned by a fall; a female, aged 53, of fracture of the skull, consequent on a fall from a balcony; a female, aged 61, of gangrene of the arm, the result of an injury through falling off a chair; a miner, aged 73, of a fractured femur; a quarryman, aged 39, of fracture of the skull, consequent on an explosion in a quarry; a farmer, aged 49, of fracture of skull, caused by the breaking of a hay truss lift; a male child, aged 3, of traumatic tetanus; two male children, each aged 2, and a female child, aged 5, of scalds; two females, aged 37 and 60 respectively, of burns; a plumber, aged 53, of plumbism; two persons were accidentally drowned, viz., a boy, aged 9, by falling into a waterhole, and a grocer, aged 65, in a bath; whilst four more were "found drowned," viz., a male, of unknown occupation, aged 50, and a female, aged 56, in the River Yarra, and a commercial traveller, aged 29, and a dealer, aged 63, in the Saltwater River; and a female infant, aged 3 weeks, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born male infants, who were suffocated; and a female, aged 22, who died of peritonitis, the result of an illegal operation, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a jeweller, aged 26, and an accountant, aged 41, who poisoned themselves; three females, aged 15, 19, and 25 respectively, and a bootmaker, aged 35, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and twenty-nine deaths, or 29 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne, 18 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 8 in the Homeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 8 in the Metropolitan and 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, and 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 91, of which 55, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 36, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 65 were under one year of age, 10 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 347. Of these, 175, or 50 per cent., were males, and 172, or 50 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 32 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, 13 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 6 were between ninety and ninety-five.

N.B.—The figures in brackets represent the numbers in the corresponding month of the preceding year.

The decrease of 134 in the number of deaths in October, as compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, was chiefly accounted for by a diminution of 38 deaths under zymotic, 36 under constitutional, 51 under local diseases, and 12 under ill-defined causes (chiefly atrophy and debility). Influenza accounted for a decrease of 31 deaths in the zymotic class, an epidemic having prevailed in October, 1895. The decrease under the constitutional class is mainly accounted for by a falling-off under phthisis from 71 to 43, and under tubercular meningitis from 11 to 5. Under developmental diseases a decrease in the deaths from premature birth from 19 to 7 was counterbalanced by an increase in those from congenital malformations and other defects from 4 to 11, and from old age from 14 to 20. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system fell off by 17, those of the respiratory system by 29; and those of parturition by 7; but under the urinary system the mortality from Bright's disease rose from 8 to 15.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first ten months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November; also that the mortality from diphtheria was higher in October, 1896, than in the corresponding month of any previous year since 1890.

NOTE.—During the third quarter of 1896 the registered births numbered 8,384, and the registered deaths 3,705; the former having exceeded the latter by 4,679, or by 126 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year the births were fewer by 196, and the deaths fewer by 190.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 15,734, but the recorded departures as many as 21,120, resulting in an apparent net loss by emigration of 5,386. If to this be added an estimate for unrecorded departures, viz., 1,878, the actual loss by emigration is computed at 7,264, consisting of 5,781 males and 1,483 females. This loss was more than 2½ times as large as in the corresponding period of 1895, and over twice as large as in that of 1894.

Owing to the large excess of emigration there was a net loss of population during the quarter of 2,585, resulting from a loss of 3,575 males, less a gain of 990 females, as shown in the table. An actual loss of population occurred on only four previous occasions since the Census of 1891, viz., a loss of 1,862 in the first quarter of 1894, of 74 in the first quarter of 1895, of 4,010 in the first and 297 in the second quarter of 1896.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 38,346, viz., 29,974 males and 8,372 females. Had no such allowance been made, the

population as above given would have been greater by these numbers.

The records for the quarter show an *apparent* balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales and Queensland of 2,987, Tasmania of 549, and United Kingdom of 199; but one in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 7,795, South Africa of 1,118, South Australia of 136, Foreign Ports of 46, and New Zealand and South Seas of 26. It will be noticed that the net emigration to Western Australia and South Africa alone was 8,913; but as the whole net emigration from Victoria was only 5,386, a large number of immigrants (or passengers *en route*) from the neighbouring colonies must be included in the former number.

The migration to South Africa is now distinguished for the first time, the numbers having formerly been included in the immigration returns under the head of the United Kingdom, and thus leading to the erroneous impression that there was a net emigration to the United Kingdom. In the year 1895 the net emigration to South Africa was 1,388, and in the first quarter of the current year it was 424, in the second 404, and in the third 1,118, or a total of 1,946 in the last nine months.

The net emigration to Western Australia—not only from Victoria, but from the whole of Eastern Australasia—was as follows in the last six and three-quarter years:—786 in 1890, 1,960 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,255 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, and 21,328 in the first nine months of 1896; the total during the whole period having been 49,315.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 2nd December, 1895, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from Monday, the 23rd November, to Tuesday, the 1st December, both inclusive (Sunday excepted).

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing twice over before the right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on the new list of ratepaying electors (now being prepared) for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners, who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so.

for a period of six weeks from the 24th November, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 7.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each One pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at No. 116.—NOVEMBER 27, 1896.—2.

Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum may be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case where a charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence; and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, and other like purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied by water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property, valued at £16 (Sixteen pounds) and upwards, situate within the Waterworks District of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Sixteen pounds sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

4. For any unoccupied piece or allotment of land, if not more than £2 (Two pounds) annual municipal value, a rate of 3s. (Three shillings) shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the shire of Borung.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable, the 1st moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

OMEO WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1897 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be charged.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum;
Gardens and lawns, $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum;
Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum;
Gardens and lawns, $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum;
Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

Land Act 1890, Part I. ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1896.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

CHAPTER XI.—LICENCES—STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES.

CHAPTER XIII.—TIMBER LICENCES.

Licences on Crown lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

Sleeper Hewing in State Forests and on Crown Lands and Timber Reserves.

Subject to these regulations, there may be issued to woodcutters permits to cut or hew and take away railway sleepers from such portions of Crown lands, State Forests, and Timber Reserves as may be approved by the Hon. the Minister of Lands.

1. Sleeper hewing in every district shall be under the direct supervision of the forest officer in charge, who shall mark or brand (with the broad arrow, thus Λ) all trees that are to be felled. Should any hewer fell unbranded trees, his permit will be at once cancelled.

2. No sleepers are to be removed from any Crown lands, State Forests, or Timber Reserves, until they are counted and branded with the Crown brand by the forest officer, and paid for by the permit holder, or until approved and satisfactory arrangements are made for such payment.

3. Any person removing or having in his possession unbranded sleepers will be liable to prosecution under the provisions of Section 100 of the *Crimes Act 1890*, or Section 114 of the *Land Act 1890*.

4. The royalty charge shall be 3d. per sleeper.

5. The permit holder shall stack, ready for burning, all tops of trees and other debris caused by his operations, when so directed by the forest officer.

6. Conditions are to be signed in duplicate, one copy being given to the permit holder, the other being kept by the Department of Lands and Survey.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

If after the delivery of the supplies has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

6. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 8.

10. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. No subletting will be allowed. All work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week; and at a minimum wage of 6s. 8d. per day. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
