PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THE subjoined Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania is published in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Imperial Parliament (48 and 49 Vict. cap. 60), intituled *The Federal Council of Australasia Act 1885*.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict. ch. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the First Session thereof shall be held in No. 118.—DECEMBER 4, 1896.—1.

such Colony as the Council shall from time to time determine; and further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation: And whereas in the Sixth Session of the Federal Council, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the months of January and February, in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, it was, on the first day of the said month of February, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: Now therefore I, the Right Honorable Jenico William Joseph, Viscount Gormanston, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred on me, do, by this my Proclamation, summon the Federal Council of Australasia, as constituted by the said Act, to meet at the Parliament Buildings, in Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, on Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, at the hour of Eleven in the forenoon, for the despatch of business.

COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY.— REGULATIONS.

THE subjoined fresh Regulations, issued by the War Department, under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces and by Students from the Colonial Universities, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES AND BY STUDENTS FROM THE COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES. 1896.

1. *To whom granted.*—Commissions in the Cavalry and Infantry of the Line will be granted to officers (who are *bona fide* colonists) of the Local Military Forces of certain colonies, and to students from Colonial Universities, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

2. *Allotment of commissions.*—Until further notice, two army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales.	Queensland.
South Australia.	New Zealand.
Victoria.	Cape of Good Hope.

Six will be allotted annually to Canada, one biennially to Tasmania, and two every three years to the Royal Malta Regiment of Militia.

In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

3. *Qualification of candidates.*—An officer of the Colonial Military Forces, who is a candidate for a commission in the British Army, will be required—

- (a) To be unmarried, and to be between the ages of 18 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination in military subjects.
- (b) To have served at least fifteen months as an officer in the Local Military Force of the colony from which he is nominated, and to have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field.

Literary Examination.*

4. *Subjects of literary examination.*—Subject to the exceptions stated in paragraph 5, a candidate will be required, before being permitted to present himself for examination in military subjects, to undergo a qualifying literary examination by the Civil Service Commissioners in the following subjects:—

- (1.) Mathematics—viz. (a), arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Book I.; (c) algebra, up to and including simple equations.
- (2.) French or German; the examination being limited to translation from the language, and grammatical questions.
- (3.) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.
English composition, tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or *précis*.
- (4.) The elements of geometrical drawing; including the construction of scales and the use of simple mathematical instruments.†
- (5.) Geography.

Any candidate who has previously passed an examination before the Civil Service Commissioners in three or more of the above subjects will be exempt from further examination in such subjects. But candidates who have to be examined in two or more subjects will be required to qualify in all at the same examination.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the following subjects:—

- (a) Mathematics—viz., algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and mensuration.
- (b) Classics (Latin or Greek).
- (c) English history:—General.
- (d) Freehand drawing.

The subjects selected should in all cases be stated in the application for papers. No examination passed under the age of seventeen will be allowed to count.

5. *Exemption for graduates, &c.*—The candidate will be exempted from the literary examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certificate from the proper University authority that he has taken his degree in Arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A. at one of the following Universities:—

or has passed the examination specified below at any of the following Universities:—

Oxford	...	The "First Public Examination."

Dublin	...	The "Final Examination of the Senior Freshman Year;" or the "Final Examination of the School of Engineering."
Durham	...	The "First Year's Examinations."
London	...	The "First Examination" for the degrees of B.A., LL.B., B.Sc., or M.B.
Scotch Universities	...	The "Examination of Candidates for the Army."
The Royal University, Ireland	...	"The Second University Examination in Arts, or the Second Professional Examination in Engineering."
Victoria University, Manchester	...	The Intermediate Examination.

Or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the University as exempting from the above examinations. A certificate that the examination is accepted by the authorities concerned must be produced.

An equivalent examination at the University of Malta, or one of the chartered Colonial Universities, will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

* After the examination that will be held in April, 1898, the subjects of examination and syllabus will be as given in Appendix II.

† Greater importance will be attached to neatness and exactness of drawing than to ability to solve geometrical problems.

6. *Literary examination held twice a year.*—The literary examination will take place in April and in November in each year.

7. *Mode of application.*—A candidate who is desirous of attending one of these examinations must apply to his commanding officer, at such date as will allow of the Governor forwarding the application so as to reach the War Office not later than the 1st of February or 1st September for the April and November examinations respectively. The Governor, in forwarding the application, will certify that the candidate is, having regard to the maximum limit laid down in paragraph 3(a), eligible in point of age, and that he will be prepared, when necessary, to recommend him in the manner prescribed in paragraph 8. Not more than three trials at these examinations will be allowed.

8. *Notification by Colonial Governor.*—The Governor of the Colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, each year, the names of any duly-qualified candidates he is desirous of nominating for examination in military subjects.

This notification must reach the War Office by the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

- (a) A certificate of birth, or in default, a declaration made by one of the candidate's parents or guardians before a magistrate, giving his exact age. A certificate of baptism cannot be accepted unless the date of birth is inserted therein.
- (b) A certificate of having served the required number of annual trainings (each training in a distinct year), and of having completed a service of 15 months in the corps to which the candidate belongs.
- (c) A certificate from the Governor that he is satisfied that the candidate is actually a colonist, that he is of good moral character, and, in all other respects, a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's Army.
- (d) A certificate that the candidate has passed the examination described in paragraph 4, or a University Certificate as prescribed in paragraph 5.

STUDENTS OF COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES.

9. *Commissions for Colonial University students.*—A commission will be granted under these Regulations to one student annually of the University of Malta, and of each of the chartered universities in colonies not having a military college through which commissions in the army may be obtained.

10. *Age.*—The candidate must be unmarried, and must be within the ages of 18 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for examination in military subjects.

11. *Literary examination.*—The literary examination of students of the chartered colonial universities will be conducted entirely by those universities. Geometrical drawing will be an obligatory subject of such examination.

12. *Name of candidate to be notified to War Office, with documents prescribed.*—The name of the candidate selected for nomination must be forwarded so as to reach the War Office on the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

- (a) A certificate that the candidate is a British born or naturalized British subject.
- (b) An extract from the register of his birth, or, in default, a declaration made by one of his parents or guardians before a magistrate, giving his exact age. A certificate of baptism cannot be accepted unless the date of birth is shown therein.
- (c) A certificate of good moral character for the four years immediately preceding the date of application, from the heads of all schools, colleges, or other educational establishments at which the candidate has been educated during the period, or, if such a certificate cannot be produced, a statement showing the reason for the omission, together with some other satisfactory proof of good moral conduct.
- (d) A certificate from the head of the college that the candidate has passed the required university examination, including geometrical drawing.

Examination in Military Subjects.

13. *Examination in military subjects.*—An examination in military subjects of candidates nominated under paragraphs 8 and 12, who have previously passed the literary examination, will be held in September in each year. The subjects and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follow:—

1. Fortification	600
2. Military Topography	600
3. The Elements of Tactics	600
4. Military Law	600

The scope in these subjects will be that embraced by the Synopsis of the Course of Instruction at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst.* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst.

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain one-third of the marks in each subject, and half of the aggregate. Not more than three trials will be allowed at these examinations.

14. *Inspection by Medical Board.*—A candidate will be required to undergo an inspection by a medical board,* to be convened by the Governor of the Colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed with his examination unless certified by such board to be physically qualified in all respects for a commission in the army (see Appendix I.).

APPENDIX I.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

I.—A candidate for a commission in Her Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty, and it should be stated whether he is of pure European descent.

II.—The examination will be conducted by a board of medical officers.

III.—The attention of the board will be directed to the following points:—

(a) That the correlation of age, height, weight, and chest girth is equal or superior to that which is given in the following table:—

(b) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heels, and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vortex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(c) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his hands above his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to empty his chest of air as much as is possible. This is best done by continuous whistling with the lips as long as sound can be produced. The tape is carefully gathered in during the process, and when the minimum measurement is reached it is recorded.

He will then be directed to inflate his chest to its utmost capacity. This maximum measurement will likewise be recorded. The mean of the two measurements will be considered as the true chest measurement.

(d) The regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows:—

Letters and numbers corresponding to Snellen's Optotypi (Test Types for the determination of the acuteness of vision, 1892 edition) will be used for testing the standard of vision. If a candidate's vision, measured by Snellen's test types, be such that he can read the types numbered D=6 at 6 metres, or 20 English feet, and the types numbered D=0·6 at any distance selected by himself, with each eye separately, and without glasses, he will be considered fit. If a candidate cannot read with each eye separately, without glasses, Snellen's type marked D=36 at a distance of 6 metres, or 20 English feet, i.e., if he do not possess one-sixth of Snellen's standard of normal acuteness of vision, although he may be able to read the types D=0·6 at some distance with each eye, he will be considered unfit. If a candidate can read with each eye separately Snellen's types numbered D=36 at a distance of 6 metres, or 20 English feet, without glasses, but cannot read them beyond that distance, i.e., if he just possesses one-sixth of normal acuteness of vision, and his visual deficiency is due to faulty refraction, he may be passed as fit, provided that, with the aid of correcting glasses, he can read Snellen's type D=6 at 6 metres, or 20 English feet, with one eye, or at least Snellen's types D=12 at 6 metres, or 20 English feet, with the other eye; and, at the same time, can read Snellen's type marked D=0·8 with one or both eyes, without the aid of glasses, at any distance the candidate may select.

Squint, inability to distinguish the principal colours, or any morbid conditions, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

* It is suggested that a candidate, before commencing his course of study, should be thoroughly examined by a competent physician. By such an examination any serious physical disqualification would be revealed and the candidate probably spared expense and the mortification of rejection. It must be understood that this informal examination is solely for the benefit of the candidate, and can in no way affect the decision of the medical examining boards.

IV.—The following additional points will then be observed:—

- That his hearing is good.
- That his speech is without impediment.
- That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as sound.
- That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.
- That he is not ruptured.
- That he does not suffer from hydrocele, varicocele, varicose veins in a severe degree, or other disease likely to cause inefficiency. A slight defect, if successfully cured by operation, is not a disqualification.
- That his limbs are well formed and developed.
- That there is free and perfect motion of all the joints.
- That his feet and toes are well formed.
- That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease.
- That he has no congenital malformation or defect.
- That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.

V.—The opinion of the board regarding a candidate's fitness or unfitness will be final.

All the subjects of Class I. may be taken up. Only two of the subjects of Class II. may be taken up, and if one of these subjects be a modern language it must be different from the modern language selected in Class I.

Candidates must qualify in arithmetic,* and obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as may indicate, in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency.

SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR THE FOREGOING MILITARY EXAMINATIONS.

Mathematics I.—Arithmetic; algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem, the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including solution of triangles; mensuration.

Mathematics II.—Further questions and problems on the syllabus of Mathematics I.; elementary solid geometry, including Euclid, Book XII, Propositions 1 to 21, Book XIII, Propositions 1 and 2; geometrical conic sections; statics; the equilibrium of forces acting in one plane and of parallel forces, the centre of mass, the mechanical powers; dynamics, uniform and uniformly accelerated rectilinear motion; uniform circular motion, falling bodies and projectiles in vacuo; hydrostatics, including the pressure of fluids, specific gravities, floating bodies, barometric heights. In statics, dynamics, and hydrostatics, a knowledge of the construction and of the use of the more simple instruments and machines will be expected.

Mathematics III.—Plane analytical geometry, the straight line, circle, parabola, ellipse and hyperbola, referred to rectangular axes, with simple applications. Differential and integral calculus, including differentiation and integration of simple functions, Taylor's theorem, maxima and minima with one independent variable, tangents to curves, curvature, areas of curves; statics, force diagrams, friction, virtual work; dynamics, simple harmonic oscillations, collisions, energy; Newton's Principia, the first, second, and third sections in Book I, the propositions to be proved by Newton's methods.

Latin.—Passages selected from the authors usually read in schools will be set for translation into English. Passages from English authors will be given for translation into Latin prose and verse, but candidates will be allowed, in the place of verse composition, to answer questions of a simple character, which will test whether they possess a fundamental knowledge of the grammar of the language, and such an elementary acquaintance with Roman history as is required for the intelligent study of the books they have read.

Greek.—Passages will be set for translation into English from the authors usually read in schools, and in other respects the examination will proceed on the same lines as in Latin.

French.—Translations of unseen passages from French into English, and from English into French. The passages for translation will be taken mainly from standard authors, and a few simple questions may be asked on the passages set, as to the structure and character of the language, and allusions of obvious and general interest. The *read* examination will include dictation. 300 marks will be allotted to colloquial knowledge of the language.

* In examinations which are not competitive, candidates who fail in arithmetic only, but who otherwise qualify, may be, if again presented, re-examined in that subject only, at the next examination.

German.—The passages for translation will be taken mainly from standard authors, and in other respects the examination will proceed on the same lines as in French.

English composition.—The standard of positive merit will be looked for in logical arrangement of thought and in accuracy and propriety of expression, but large deductions of marks will be made for faults of writing and spelling. (Candidates are also warned that, for similar faults in the use of the English language, similar deductions will be made from the marks obtained in other subjects.)

Geometrical drawing.—Practical plane geometry; the construction of scales; and the elements of solid geometry, and of simple orthographic projection. Great importance will be attached to neatness and exactness of drawing.

Geography.—Simple questions in descriptive and general geography.

English history.—The general paper in this subject will be confined to events subsequent to the Norman Conquest. It will test whether the candidates are accurately acquainted with the facts of English history, and also possess an intelligent knowledge of the meaning of the facts.

The paper on the fixed period will be confined to distinctly modern history. It will require from the candidates more minute knowledge than the general paper.

Natural science subjects.—The standard of examination in these subjects will be such as may be reasonably expected from the education given at schools possessing appliances for practical instruction, such as a laboratory, &c. A considerable portion of the marks will be given for proficiency shown in the practical part of the examination. A knowledge of the metric system will be expected.

Chemistry.—The laws of chemical combination and decomposition, and the preparation, classification, and properties of the principal metallic and non-metallic elements, and of such of their compounds as are treated of in inorganic chemistry. In the practical part of the examination only the more ordinary apparatus and the less dangerous re-agents will be supplied, and no candidate will be allowed to bring his own apparatus or re-agents.

Heat.—The elementary portion of the subject.

Physics.—The elementary properties of electricity, magnetism, light, and sound.

Physiography, i.e., physical geography.

Geology.—Chiefly economic, including the recognition of the more familiar minerals and rocks, and their properties and uses.

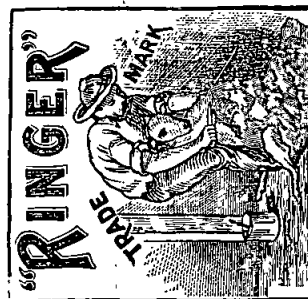

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property, valued at £16 (Sixteen pounds) and upwards, situate within the Waterworks District of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Sixteen pounds sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

4. For any unoccupied piece or allotment of land, if not more than £2 (Two pounds) annual municipal value, a rate of 3s. (Three shillings) shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the shire of Borung.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable, the 1st moiety on the 1st day of January, and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

**OMEO WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.**

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1897 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be charged.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum;

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

No. 53.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say:—In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st January, 1897, and terminating on the 31st December, 1897, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 7.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each One pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at

Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1897.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum may be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case where a charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence; and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, and other like purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than £15 (Fifteen pounds sterling) on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by-measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

11. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in said year 1897, excepting those by measure, which shall be payable monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 10th November, 1896.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1897.

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement over Twenty pounds (£20) and under Forty pounds (£40) annual municipal value, an amount equal to seven and a half per cent. (7½ per cent.) on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For every house or tenement of Forty pounds (£40) and up to Fifty pounds (£50) annual municipal value, a rate of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for the year.

4. For every house or tenement of over Fifty pounds (£50) annual municipal value, a rate of Five per cent. (5 per cent.) upon the amount of such valuation.

5. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed on.

6. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.

7. For every public water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

8. All public water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

9. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

10. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

11. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully and negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who are in arrears with the payment of their water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes or by any other means that are available by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

12. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence on that behalf to execute such works.

13. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust; and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

14. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officer of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

15. For any breach of any of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

16. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable in two instalments. The first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1897, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1897.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

No. 6. The Shire of Birchip Division, comprising all that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District within the Shire of Birchip.

And by the same order it was further directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied differentially, as between such said several divisions, and doth determine that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say:—That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—

Shire of St. Arnaud Division—Twenty-four pence.
Shire of Kara Kara Division—Nineteen pence.
Shire of Dunnmunkle Division—Twenty-four pence.
Shire of Stawell Division—Fifteen pence.
Shire of Borung Division—Twenty-four pence.
Shire of Birchip Division—Twenty-four pence.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 24.

1. This regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined by Orders in Council, bearing date the 23rd June, 1890, and the 30th September, 1895.

2. In clauses 2 and 5 of Regulation No. 13 the words "One shilling" shall be substituted for the words "One shilling and sixpence."

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

MIRAM MIRAM CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Miram Miram Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so; and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days; September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person, having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the requirements or any like supplies suitable for the service at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account or from the security money the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be two feet wide by five feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In case the firewood for Yarra Bend is required to be supplied at per ton weight, the contractor will be bound to weigh the wood upon the Asylum weighbridge. Each load to be tared separately. The weighbridge ticket to be rendered in support of the account. Firewood, when ordered by weight, is not to be stacked by the contractor, but it must be deposited on such ground as may be pointed out.

5. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If after the delivery of the supplies has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

6. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 8.

10. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. No subletting will be allowed. All work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and at a minimum wage of 6s. 8d. per day. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Saturday, 19th December, 1896.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the period from 1st January, 1897, to 30th June, 1897, and fee of Five shillings for licence, are forwarded with the Tender.

SPECIAL.—Subject to conditions 1, 2, and 8 hereunder. If offer is considered satisfactory, the successful tenderer will be entitled to a renewal for the 12 months from 1st July, 1897.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Twelve noon on Saturday, 19th December, 1896, for the occupation, for grazing purposes only, of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 123 of the *Land Act 1890* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under section 7 of the *Vermine Destruction Act 1890*, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

Conditions:

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*, except under the 123rd section thereof, under which the licence is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1890*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and also for persons desiring to take water for domestic supply.

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

BY-LAW No. 44.

A By-law of the Borough of Ararat, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 44, for the Regulation and Government of Drivers of Bicycles and other Velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat, order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law, the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise, shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine, shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep his machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse, or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse, or other beast of burden, may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse, or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any machine furiously or negligently through or upon any public place or thoroughfare.

8. Every person offending against any of the conditions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
