JURISDICTION UNDER PACIFIC ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1893, EXERCISABLE IN FANNING AND CHRISTMAS ISLANDS, AND REGULATION AMENDING THE SAMOA ARMS REGULATION, 1895.

(In the name of Her Majesty Victoria of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Empress of India, &c., &c., &c.)

WHEREAS the Right Honorable Joseph Chamberlain, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, has, in accordance with the powers vested in him under Article 6 of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, directed the High Commissioner that jurisdiction under the said Order in Council may be exercised in relation to Christmas and Fanning Islands:

Now therefore I, Henry Spencer Berkeley, Assistant High Commissioner, proclaim that jurisdiction under the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, is extended to Christmas and Fanning Islands.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's Assistant High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO AMEND QUEEN'S REGULATION NO. 1 OF 1895, INTITLED "QUEEN'S REGULATION TO RESTRAIN THE SALE AND USE OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION IN SAMOA."

H. S. BERKELEY.

1. On and after the coming into force of this Regulation, section 4 of the Samoa Arms Regulation No. 1 of 1895 shall be repealed, and the following section shall be substituted therefor:—

The court may, for any reason it may think fit, issue a warrant authorizing any person named therein to search for arms on board any British vessel or boat, or on any land, or in any store, warehouse, dwelling-house, or other building occupied by a British subject. In making such order the court may impose any condition or conditions it may think fit for the proper execution of the order, and may authorize the person named in the warrant to appoint a substitute to act for him. The commanding officer of any of Her Majesty's ships and the commanding officer of any ship of war belonging to His Imperial German Majesty or to the Government of the United States of America shall have the same powers as the court in issuing warrants to search for arms, provided that such warrants shall in each case be executed by officers or men of the ship of war under the command of such commanding officer. Any British subject resisting a search for arms as herein provided shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

2. This Regulation may be cited as "The Samoa Arms Amending Regulation, 1895," and the principal Regulation and this Regulation may be cited together as "The Samoa Arms Regulations, 1895."

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to authorize the granting of a Lease of certain Crown Land in the Parish of Moolap as a Site for the Manufacture of Salt.”

“An Act to amend the ‘Police Regulation Act 1890.’”

REGULATION RESPECTING EXAMINATIONS HELD BY THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of January, 1896.

WHEREAS it is provided by the *Medical Act 1890* that any person shall be entitled to be registered under Part II. of the said Act who has attained the age of twenty-one years, and has been engaged continuously during a period of not less than four years in the acquirement of professional knowledge, and has passed an examination before the Dental Board of Victoria in the subjects prescribed by them, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council: And whereas it is further provided that, subject to the provisions of Part II. of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations with respect to examinations held by the said Board, and the fees to be paid for such examinations, and generally for carrying the said Part of the said Act into effect: And whereas the said Board has prescribed the subjects of examination hereinafter specified in Clause 1 of the Regulation following:—

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke all existing Regulations respecting such examinations, or requiring any further or other qualifications than are required by the following Regulation, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby approve of the said subjects prescribed by the said Board as hereinbefore mentioned, and doth make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Candidates for registration as dentists under Part II. of the *Medical Act 1890* shall pass an examination before the Board in the following subjects:—

1. Chemistry and metallurgy as applied to dentistry.
2. Dental materia medica and therapeutics.
3. General elementary anatomy and physiology.
4. General elementary pathology and surgery.
5. Dental anatomy and physiology.
6. Dental surgery and pathology.

The examination in the foregoing subjects may be written, or oral, or both.

II. Practical.—

- (a) Practical chemistry.
- (b) The treatment of dental caries, the preparing and filling of cavities, and the performance of dental operations in dental surgery:

- (c) The mechanical and surgical treatment of the various irregularities in children's teeth.
- (d) Mechanical dentistry and dental metallurgy.*

2. NOTICE TO BE GIVEN BY CANDIDATES.

Every candidate desirous of being examined with a view to obtain a certificate of fitness to practise dental surgery or dentistry shall, fourteen clear days previous to the first day fixed for examination, give the Registrar written notice of his intention to present himself at such examination, and evidence, in writing, to the satisfaction of the Board, showing that he is or will, on such day, be twenty-one years of age, and pay to the Registrar the prescribed fee.

3. FEE.

The fee for the examination shall be Five pounds five shillings.

4.

Candidates who have attained the age of twenty-one years, passed the examination, and satisfy the Board that they have been engaged for four years in acquiring professional knowledge, will be registered under Part II. of the said Act.





PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Borung which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Borung, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Karkaroc."

Area described in petition:—Commencing at a point on the 36th parallel of south latitude at the south-west angle of mallee allotment 59 in the county of Karkaroc; thence north by a road line to the north-west angle of mallee allotment 211; thence west by a road line to the south-east angle of mallee block 47B; thence north by the eastern boundaries of mallee blocks 47B, 47A, 46B, 46A, and a line in continuation thereof due north to the north boundary of mallee block 29B; thence easterly by the north and southerly by the east boundary of the said block to its south-east angle; thence easterly by the north boundary of mallee block 28A and south by the eastern boundaries of mallee

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Borung, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Karkaroc," such municipality to be not subdivided.

THE BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

By virtue of the *Water Act 1890*.

REGULATION for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1896, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Sixteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Sixteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Twelve shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Sixteen pounds. In all such cases where the municipal valuation exceeds Sixteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered

to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of April, 1896.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Boort Waterworks Trust on the 14th day of December, 1895, and the seal was affixed hereunto in the presence of—

EL DORADO PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the El Dorado Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave, or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

4. Any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission, in writing, before proceeding with the work.

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the trustees' office at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless applications therefor be made at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for same.

6. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. Every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

8. No coffin shall be buried in the cemetery within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

11. Any person desiring to place any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

12. No person shall put up any erection or place any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees, and any workman (though not employed by the trustees) shall, while occupied in any of the works aforesaid, be deemed to be under the supervision and control of the manager, who may define his hours of labour within the said cemetery, and see that all work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch. All persons engaged in such work shall obey all lawful and necessary commands of the said manager, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

13. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, or other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same.

14. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

15. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner.

16. No child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

17. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any fireworks be discharged therein.

18. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

19. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

20. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

21. The secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

22. No waste paper, weeds, dead leaves, or decayed flowers shall be left or deposited anywhere, except in the places set apart for the purpose.

23. Any person committing any breach of any of these rules and regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or the manager, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

24. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

25. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

Third—That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept up by the said _____ and heirs and near relations in proper repair to the satisfaction of the trustees. ABERFELDY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Aberfeldy Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—
1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron, securely cemented.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH, KNOWN AS "PRINCE'S PARK."

THE Council of the Borough of Maryborough and the Board of Land and Works do hereby, in pursuance of section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Municipal District of Maryborough, known as "Prince's Park":—

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be divided as follows:—
 - The grand stand and enclosure.
 - Playing ground.
 - Show ground.
 - Lake Victoria.
 - Remainder of the reserve.
- All persons shall be admitted to the fifth division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
- No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division, except on production of a ticket duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
- Every person paying for admission to the third division or fifth division, or any part thereof, or to the grand stand and enclosure, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
- Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match, sports, or shows shall deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, which the council may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the council may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the council in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, bridges, crossings, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, or leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.
- No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the council; and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
- All goats, pigs, poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.
- No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve,

notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:

- Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- Being found in any part of the reserve and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the council, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
- Obtaining admission to any part of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third and fifth divisions and to the grand stand and enclosure on such days (not exceeding twenty-one in any one year) as the council shall determine, shall be as follows:—

- For admission of each person to the third and fifth divisions during any cricket or football match, sports, or shows, such a sum as the council shall determine, not exceeding One shilling.
- For admission of each person to the grand stand and enclosure, such a sum as the council shall determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

Provided always that the council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

15. No steamers or boats of any description whatsoever shall be permitted upon the fourth division of the reserve without the previous consent, in writing, of the council, and payment of an annual licence-fee to be fixed by the council. The council shall have power to cancel any permit or licence upon giving 24 hours' previous notice, in writing, to the licensee, whereupon such licensee shall, immediately at the expiration of such notice, remove his steamer or boat from the said division and outside the precincts of the reserve without compensation. Provided always that the moneys received as licence-fees shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1153) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land, from time to time to suppress and destroy all vermin from time to time on any land so occupied or owned by him, or on the adjacent half-width of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and for such purpose to do all necessary or proper acts or things, and that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to name any specified day on and from and after which the duty thereby declared shall, in any part of Victoria described in such proclamation, be simultaneously commenced, continued, and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name the tenth day of February, 1896, as the day on and from and after which the duty thereby declared shall, in the colony of Victoria, be simultaneously commenced, continued, and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land throughout the said colony of Victoria.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will

be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

SECOND DIVISION.—255 SERVICES.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 11th day of February, 1896, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted. Should the contractor desire to relinquish his contract he may be permitted to do so provided he pays over to the Postmaster-General a sum equal to 10 per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly.

Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips.

13. A separate *bonâ fide* tender must be sent in for each service.
