TONNAGE ADMEASUREMENT OF SHIPS OF THE KINGDOM OF DENMARK.

THE following despatch from the Colonial Office to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR—With reference to the Earl of Derby's Circular despatch of the 22nd May, 1883, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, copies of an Order in Council dated the 21st November last respecting the tonnage admeasurement of ships of the Kingdom of Denmark.

PRESENT :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of February, 1868, made by Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1868*, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the ships of Denmark, the certificates of Danish nationality and registry of which were dated on and after the 1st October, 1867, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry :

And whereas by another Order in Council dated the 30th day of December, 1878, Her Majesty was pleased to direct as regards Danish steam-ships that if the owner or master of any merchant ship belonging to the Kingdom of Denmark and measured after the 1st day of October, 1878, which is propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, should desire the allowance for engine-room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and allowance applicable to British ships, instead of under the Danish rule, the engine-room should be measured and the allowance calculated according to the British rules :

And whereas by another Order in Council dated the 20th day of April, 1883, Her Majesty was further pleased to direct that in the event of the net registered tonnage of merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Denmark, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room estimated under the British rules, being denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry issued on or after the 1st day of September, 1882, such ships should be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted in the said certificates :

And whereas by Section 84 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is enacted that, whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of that Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, and that such regulations are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1895 :

And whereas there still are or may be ships belonging to the Kingdom of Denmark to which the hereinbefore recited Orders of the 29th February, 1868, the 30th December, 1878, and the 20th April, 1883, may respectively apply, and it is expedient not to revoke the same, but to let the said recited Orders remain in force so long as there are any ships to which the same may so respectively apply :

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the *Rules Publication Act 1893* have been complied with :

Now therefore Her Majesty (in pursuance and exercise of the powers hereinbefore mentioned) is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to decree that the merchant ships of the Kingdom of Denmark, the measurement whereof shall on or after the 1st day of April, 1895, have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry or other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

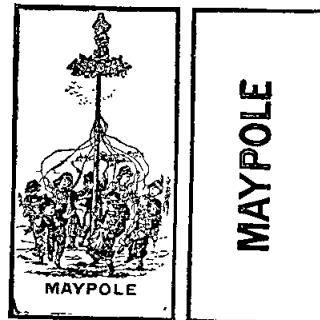

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 23.

This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah.

No person shall within the hours of Four o'clock p.m. on Saturday and Six o'clock a.m. on the succeeding Monday use water for the purpose of gardening or for any purpose whatever other than for domestic and manufacturing purposes.

Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust on the 9th day of January, 1896.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at £15 (Fifteen pounds) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1896.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than £15 (Fifteen pounds sterling) on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

11. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in said year 1896, excepting those by measure, which shall be payable monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 24th January, 1896.

SHIRE OF WYCHEPROOF SUBDIVIDED.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names appear on the municipal roll of the Shire of Wycheproof has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th day of December, 1895, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the said Shire of Wycheproof into three separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of nine members be elected accordingly.

NORTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the shire where it intersects the southern boundary of the parish of Towaniny; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that parish and the parish of Kalpiening to the south-west angle of the parish last named; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parish of Kalpiening to its north-west angle; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the parish of Toort to the western boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary northerly, easterly, and southerly to the point of commencement.

SOUTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the shire where it intersects the southern boundary of the parish of Towaniny; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parishes of Ninyeunook and Cooroopajerrup to the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence southerly by the western boundaries of the parishes of Cooroopajerrup, Bunguluke, and Wycheproof to the southern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary easterly and northerly to the point of commencement.

WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point in the southern boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of the parish of Thalia; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Thalia, Carapugna, and Nullawit to the north-east angle of the parish last named; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that parish to the shire boundary; thence following the shire boundary westerly, southerly, and easterly to the point of commencement.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF DRESS REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby cancel Part X. (Commissariat and Transport Corps) of the Dress Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

X.—ARMY SERVICE CORPS.

OFFICERS.

Full Dress.

Tunic.—Blue cloth, with collar and cuffs of white cloth. The collar rounded in front and ornamented with $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. lace round the top, gold cord similar to shoulder-strap along the bottom. Eight buttons in front and two at the waist behind. The skirt

rounded off in front and closed behind with a plait at each side and lined with black silk, white cloth edging $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide all round and up the skirt plaits. Shoulder-straps of twisted round gold cord, universal pattern, lined with blue, and a small universal pattern button at the top. Badges of rank in silver.

Assistant Commissary-General has a row of braided eyes below the lace on the collar, a chevron of lace $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch on the cuff with figured $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. Russia braiding above and below the lace, and extending to 11 inches from the bottom of the cuff.

Deputy Assistant Commissary-General.—The braided eyes on collar are omitted ; on the cuff an Austrian knot of round black gold cord traced, all round, with braided eyes.

Sub-Assistant Commissary-Generals have an Austrian knot on cuff, but without braided eyes.

Lace.—Gold, staff pattern for tunic, jacket, and mess waistcoat, and regimental pattern, with $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. dark-blue stripe in the centre, for cap and dress trousers.

Buttons.—Of universal pattern.

Trousers, Boots, and Spurs.—Blue cloth, with $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. lace down the side seams ; wellington boots. Steel spurs for Mounted Officers, except at levées and in the evening in mess or full dress, when brass spurs will be worn.

Pantaloons, &c., for Mounted Duties.—Blue cloth, with two stripes of white cloth, each $\frac{3}{4}$ inch wide and $\frac{3}{4}$ inch apart, down each side seam. Knee-boots and steel spurs, as described in page 2.

Helmet, white, with white puggaree, gilt ball mountings, and chain. Badge in front above puggaree. Officers at present in possession of cocked hats may wear them at levées, &c., but not on parade.

Sword.—Half-basket, steel hilt, with two fluted bars on the outside ; black fish-skin grip, bound with silver wire ; slightly curved blade, $35\frac{1}{2}$ inches long and $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide, grooved and spear-pointed.

Scabbard.—Steel, with a large shoe at the bottom, and a trumpet-shaped mouth. For Field Officers, brass.

Sword-knot.—Gold and blue cord, with gold and blue acorn.

Sword-belt.—Pale Russia leather, $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide, with removable slings an inch wide, the front sling lined with Russia leather ; a swivel-hook on the eye of dee of front sling for hooking up sword, running carriage for back sling ; two stripes of gold embroidery on belt and slings ; flat billets for sword and sabretache slings, with square gilt-wire buckles for sword and sabretache slings, with Russia leather protecting flap, to attach sabretache slings. Universal clasp with badge of Southern Cross.

Sabretache for Mounted Officers.—As described in General Instructions, page 7.

Shoulder-belt.—Pale Russia leather, 2 inches wide, with three stripes of gold embroidery, each $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide ; gilt chased buckle, tip, and slide.

Binocular Case.—Black patent leather, to hold a binocular field-glass, solid leather flap reaching to the lower edge of the case, ornamented with universal badge in gilt.

Undress.

Patrol Jacket.—Blue cloth, rounded in front, and edged with 1-in. black mohair braid all round and up the openings at the side ; five loops of flat plait on each side in front, fastening with olivets, and with crows' feet and olivets at the ends ; stand-and-fall collar. The sleeves ornamented with flat plait, forming crows' feet, 6 inches from the bottom of the cuffs. Double flat plait on each back seam, with crows' foot at top and bottom, and two eyes at equal distances. Pockets edged with flat plait forming a crow's foot at each end and an eye in the centre, top and bottom. Shoulder-straps of the same material as the garment, edged with $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. black mohair braid, except at the base. Black netted button at the top. Badges of rank in gold. The jacket to be long enough to reach the saddle when the officer is mounted.

Trousers, Boots, and Spurs.—Blue cloth, with stripes, pattern as for pantaloons ; wellington boots, steel spurs for Mounted Officers.

Pantaloons, &c., for Mounted Duties.—As for full dress.

Forage Cap.—Blue cloth, with gold embroidery $\frac{3}{4}$ inch wide on peak, and band of $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. lace of regimental pattern. Gold purl button and braided figure on crown. Badge in front of cap.

Field Service Cap, &c.—Blue cloth folding cap, 5 inches high, with white cloth top, and blue side flaps 4 inches deep, to turn down when required. Black mohair welts on cap and flaps, and at front and back seams. Badge on the left side.

Mess Jacket.—Blue cloth, edged all round with $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. gold lace, forming a bull's-eye or ring at the bottom of each back seam ; white collar and cuffs ; a line of $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. gold braid along the collar seam ; cuffs pointed and edged with $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. lace, a loop of gold braid at bottom of collar to fasten across the neck ; a row of gilt studs down the front on the left side, fastened with hooks and eyes, white silk lining. Shoulder-straps with badges of rank as for tunic.

Mess Waistcoat.—White cloth, with collar, edged with $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. gold lace all round, including collar ; to fasten with hooks and eyes ; gilt studs down the front on the left side. The pockets edged with Russia braid, with crows' feet at ends and centre.

Sword-belt.—White buff leather, $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide, with sword slings 1 inch wide, sewn into gilt rings—(tache slings for Mounted Officers)—three dees on belt for sabretache slings. Flat billets for sword and tache slings, with square gilt-wire buckles. Gilt universal clasp, with badge "Southern Cross" and motto.

Shoulder-belt.—White buff leather, 2 inches wide ; no buckle, tip, or slide.

Sword-knot.—Buff leather, $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide, with runner and acorn.

Cloak.—Blue cloth, with sleeves. Stand-and-fall collar, with three black hooks and eyes in front, and three small flat silk buttons at the bottom to fasten the cape. Round loose cuffs,

6 inches deep. A pocket in each side seam outside and one in the left breast inside. Four buttons down the front. A cloth back-strap, to fasten with a large flat silk button at the top of each pocket; a similar button in front on the right, to hold the end of the back-strap when it is not buttoned across behind. Blue ratinett lining. The cloak to reach within 8 inches of the ground. Shoulder-straps of the same material as the garment; a small button of universal pattern at the top. Badges of rank in gilt metal.

Cape.—Blue cloth, long enough to cover the knuckles, lined with blue ratinett; a cloth band round the top, to fasten with a cloth strap and black buckle, and a fly inside the band, with three button-holes for attaching cape to cloak. Three buttons down the front.

Serge Patrol Jacket (for camp wear).—Blue serge; welted seams, stand-up collar, square in front, fastened with hook and eye. Shoulder-straps of white cloth with $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. blue stripe in centre, fastened at the top with a small netted button $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter. Badges of rank embroidered in gold. Five gilt buttons down the front, a slit on each side of jacket. Sleeves ornamented with flat plait forming a crow's foot 6 inches from bottom of cuff. Two outside breast-pockets and watch pocket inside breast. White linen collar slip to be worn.

Gloves.—Brown dogskin, plain backs.

HORSE FURNITURE.

As described for Mounted Officers of Infantry Battalions. White patent leather sword-belts and white patent leather shoulder-belts in possession may continue to be worn until they require to be replaced.

INSPECTOR OF ORDNANCE MACHINERY.

Tunic, Lace, Buttons, Full Dress-Trousers, White Helmet, Sword, Scabbard, Sword-knot, Sword-belt, Shoulder-belt, Binocular Case, Patrol Jacket, Forage Cap, Undress Sword-belt, Undress Shoulder-belt, Undress Sword-knot, Khaki Jacket, and Trousers.—As described for an Officer of corresponding rank in the Army Service Corps.

Undress Trousers.—Blue cloth, with scarlet stripe $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide down each side seam.

Cloak.—Black waterproof, with cape combined.

WARRANT OFFICERS, NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS, AND MEN.

Full Dress.

Tunic.—Blue tartan cloth, with collar and cuffs of same material. Collars square in front, but slightly rounded at the corners, hook and eye at the bottom, black leather tab. The collar edged all round with white worsted cord. An Austrian knot of white worsted cord on each sleeve. Skirt square in front; white edging down the front, up plait, and round tunic. Eight large buttons in front, two at the waist behind. Shoulder-straps of white cloth with blue stripe centre, with a small universal button at the top. Badges of rank or chevrons to be worn.

For Warrant Officers, Sergeant-Major, and Sergeants, gold cord on collar and sleeves. Warrant Officers' tunics to be of cloth, and to have gold tracing lace inside the cord.

Buttons.—Brass, universal pattern.

Trousers.—Blue tartan, with two stripes of white braid $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide down each side seam. Warrant Officers' trousers to be of cloth.

Helmet, white.—As described for Officers, but with brass mountings. For Warrant Officers as for Officers.

Haversack, white.—As issued by Ordnance Store.

Great Coat and Cape.—According to sealed pattern issued by Ordnance Store.

Gloves.—White for all ranks.

Leggings.—Brown canvas, with straps and buckles. Top, bottom, and edges bound with brown leather.

Boots.—As described on page 15.

Undress.

Jacket.—Blue serge, without trimmings, except shoulder-straps, which are to be the same as for Full Dress. Five universal-pattern brass buttons down the front. For Warrant Officers, blue cloth patrol jacket, as described for Warrant Officers of Artillery.

Trousers.—As described for Full Dress, but in blue serge.

Forage Cap.—Blue cloth, with a band on cap of white worsted braid 1 inch wide, and white worsted button on top; universal badge over braid. For Sergeants the band to be of gold lace, and a small gold pearl button. For Warrant Officers, as for Officers, but without braided figure on crown.

Camp Working Dress.

Juniper Trousers.—Canvas or drill overalls.

No. 1106, Part I, section 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Additional Regulations (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS.

Any holder of a licence under section 49 of *The Land Act 1869* or of a lease under section 47 of *The Land Act 1862*, who may be desirous of exercising under the provisions of section 18 of the *Land Act 1890* the exclusive right of purchasing the land so held, shall apply in the form prescribed in Schedule 3A hereto.

Any person holding a licence or who shall hereafter hold a licence under section 49 of *The Land Act 1869* for land situated without the boundaries of a borough, township, or village, and who has or shall hereafter have paid in fees for the occupation of the area specified in the licence a sum in the aggregate equal to the value of the land (which value shall be determined in the manner prescribed in section 18 of the *Land Act 1890*), shall be entitled to apply for the issue of a licence under the said section at the reduced rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per annum, and upon the approval of such application a licence shall issue at such reduced rate accordingly.

TYLDEN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Tylden Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations gazetted on the 24th September, 1876, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave, or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery nine working hours prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct one, under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep, and no coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Ten a.m. to half-past Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from One to Four p.m.
13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
14. That the fixed time for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
15. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
16. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
17. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
18. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.
19. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials shall be permitted to enter the cemetery without the consent of the trustees first obtained.
20. That no catacomb shall be allowed.
21. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment, either in said or other cemetery.
22. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and, in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Statute 1830* and the Act numbered CCOXXXVII., in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
23. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall

have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

24. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Six a.m. to Six p.m., from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. during the other months of the year.

25. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

26. That no person shall be allowed to pluck or to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

27. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

28. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty.

29. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.

NYAH CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Nyah Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

NOTE.—During the year 1895 the births registered numbered 33,719, or 539 fewer, and the deaths recorded 15,631, or 201 more, than in the previous year. The excess of births over deaths was thus 18,088, viz., 8,503 of males and 9,585 of females, as compared with 13,828 in 1894.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 81,199, but, as the recorded departures by sea numbered 88,886, there was an apparent loss by net emigration of 7,687, of which 4,580 was of males, and 3,107 of females. Allowing for unrecorded departures by sea, however, the estimated total loss by emigration is believed to have been 15,422. This is greater than in 1894 by 1691, than in 1893 by 2,011, or than in 1892 by 3,137; the total loss in the four years having amounted to 54,849.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) to the end of 1895 the estimated allowance made for unrecorded departures by sea has been 31,809, viz., 24,811 of males and 7,058 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of 1895 would have been 1,213,638, viz., 629,987 males and 583,651 females. No allowance, however, is made for overland migration, as all attempts to estimate its direction or extent have been unsatisfactory.

The records of migration for the year show a balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales and Queensland of 4,156, Tasmania of 1,258, and South Australia of 846; but a balance in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 11,127, New Zealand and South Seas of 1,563, United Kingdom of 1,169, and foreign countries of 88. Since all persons who merely enter Victorian ports en route for other countries are included in the returns, the foregoing figures do not indicate correctly the movements of population as between Victoria and the various countries indicated. Consequently, the net emigration of 11,127 persons to Western Australia consists not only of Victorians, but also of emigrants bound for that colony from New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania, and New Zealand, who happen to call in on their way at the port of Melbourne. Hence this number may be regarded as practically the net emigration from the whole of Eastern Australasia (including Tasmania and New Zealand); this emigration was 982 larger than in 1894, and far larger than in any other previous year. The abnormal flow of emigrants to the United Kingdom, which began in 1893, still continues; the total number so emigrating in the last three years being 3,853.

The figures of births and deaths, and consequently those of population, may be slightly altered when the returns are finally examined.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BROADFORD.

WHEREAS Robert Corney, Malcolm McLeod, Frederick William Petch, Alexander McLeod, Charles Edward Lloyd, and John Zwar, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Township of Broadford, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, or remove sand or soil therefrom.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No dogs shall be allowed into the reserve on such days as fees for admission thereto are charged as hereinafter provided.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket, issued by the committee of management, duly authorising the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person shall be liable to removal from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

THE REDESDALE, EMBERTON, AND METCALFE COMMON is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom thirty acres, more or less, of land in the parish of Redesdale, being the portion lying

between the western boundaries of allotments 34E, 32E, and 32G and the Coliban River.—(95.G.36409.)

THE KAMAROOKA GOLD-FIELD COMMON is hereby abolished.—(95.Mc.40737.)

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies, under the said Part of the said Act, blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*; and that, except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* aforesaid, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies, under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* aforesaid, the land described hereunder, viz.:—

CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.—NAR-BE-THONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber on or from the Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:

(1) County of Anglesey, parish of Nar-be-thong: The unappropriated Crown land situate within a distance of ten chains from the portion of the north boundary of the land comprising the Watts River drainage area, vested in the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, extending from Mount St. Leonard to a point in line with the south-east boundary of allotment 90A, parish of Nar-be-thong.

(2) County of Anglesey, parish of Nar-be-thong: The unappropriated Crown land comprised within the following boundaries, viz.—Commencing at the west angle of allotment 83, parish of Nar-be-thong; thence north-easterly and south-easterly by that allotment and allotments 82, 81, 80, 79, 78, and 77, northerly and south-easterly by allotments 29A and 28A, and north by allotments 25A, 19, 13, 12, and 7 to a point distant twenty chains north from the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence west by a line three miles and a quarter; thence south by a line to the north boundary of the land vested in the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works; and thence north-easterly and easterly by that boundary to the point of commencement.—(95.B.80097.)

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL FENCING RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire-net fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per mile of fencing to be the fencing rates payable under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual fencing rates per mile of fencing payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fences, that is to say:—

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be One shilling per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Four shillings per square mile.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 4 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by Part VI., division 1, and Part V., division 1 of the *Water Act 1890* (amongst other things) make from the date hereof the By-law following:—

1. The by-law heretofore made relating thereto shall be and the same is hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates or charges due and payable thereunder.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose, and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure.

3. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For lands and tenements of the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £1.

(b) For lands and tenements above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(c) Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the annual sum of £2 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied at stand-pipes, 6d. per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) That water supplied by meter shall be charged at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate, and 1s. per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic the minimum charge will be for 10,000 gallons per annum.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. All persons using or requiring a supply of water for other than domestic purposes shall consume the same by meter, and shall provide such meter of approved gauge at their own expense, and keep and maintain the same in good working order to the satisfaction of the officer of the council appointed for that purpose.

5. The keys of all meters in use within the water supply district shall be in the custody of the council, or such officer or servant of the council as the council may appoint for that purpose.

6. No overflow pipe to any private bath will be allowed. Any person permitting or allowing an overflow pipe to be attached to such private bath shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding £5, and for every day such person permits or allows any such offence to continue, shall forfeit and pay a further penalty of £1 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

7. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the council for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure, and any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

8. Any person receiving water from the council, who, without the written permission of the council, shall take or carry away from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

11. Before any such licence shall be granted by the council the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and shall furnish an approved security to the council, in the sum of £30 sterling, to provide for any damage he may do, cause, or allow to be done to the property of the council, and the council shall have power to cancel such licence at any time.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13. No person but an officer or servant of the council, duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto. Any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

14. For the construction of this by-law the word council shall mean the Borough Council of Wangaratta.
