PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend the Law relating to Trusts and Trustees."
- "An Act for codifying the Law relating to the Sale of Goods."
- "An Act to further amend the *Instruments Act 1890*."
- "An Act relating to the Assignment or Transfer of Book Debts."
- "An Act relating to the Making and Levying of Rates within an Urban District under the *Water Act 1890* and for the Abolition of Fees for Summonses to recover Rates and Charges under the said Act."
- "An Act to further amend the *Marine Act 1890*."
- "An Act to rectify the Boundaries of the Gippsland West and Mornington Electoral Districts and certain Divisions thereof."
- "An Act relating to Mallee Lands."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the fifty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Income Tax Act 1896.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above-named Act and the Regulations made thereunder, every person and company (other than a company under section 10 of the said Act) liable to make any return under the said Act or Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 29th day of February, 1896. And every company liable to make a return under section 10 of the said Act or Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of March, 1896.

And further notice is hereby given that every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office at Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Act the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visd voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

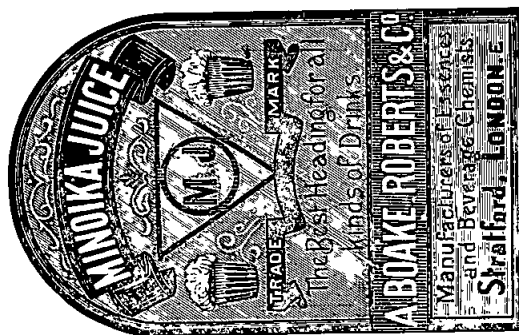

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BY-LAWS.— GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Water Act* 1890, make the By-laws following :—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Geelong Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.
2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board (that is to say)—
 - (i.) On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
 - (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £300; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.
 - (iii.) Buildings used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
 - (iv.) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
 - (v.) For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
 - (vi.) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Twopence per 100 gallons.
 - (vii.) Horses shall be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.
 - (viii.) Water for steam boilers shall be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
 - (ix.) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
 - (x.) On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons or by special agreement.
 - (xi.) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be One shilling per 100 gallons for the first 300 gallons; above 300 gallons and not in excess of 400 gallons the charge shall be Ninepence per 100 gallons; above 400 gallons and not in excess of 500 gallons the charge shall be Eightpence per 100 gallons; in excess of 500 gallons the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per 1,000 gallons.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—
 - (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity the charge for which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate

which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only 12,500 gallons per quarter.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes—one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter—the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or with any service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services :—

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength sufficient to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subject. Ordinary connexion with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock, screwed ferrules, and with 2 feet of lead piping with brass unions. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service-pipes, unless by special consent of the Board, shall be, for tenements of annual value not exceeding £40, $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. bore, for tenements exceeding £40 annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. bore.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owner shall be responsible for keeping the same in repair, and in every instance in which, after notice that repairs to service-pipes are required, damage is caused by reason of their leaking or being otherwise out of repair or broken, the occupier or owner shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. All water-troughs supplied from the pipes of the Board shall be lined with metal, so as to be perfectly watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically. All such troughs and fittings, shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water-trough the supply to which is charged under sub-section (iv.) of section 2 of these by-laws shall be of greater capacity than 25 gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto will be cut off until the same has been properly and efficiently repaired.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

18. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board, unless for the purpose of repair,

as mentioned in the last preceding section, in which case notice in writing must be given to the officer in charge of the works of the Board six days at least before removal.

20. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line, by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

22. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

23. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

24. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed, and the water is supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

25. If any person supplied with water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

26. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by carts, or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

27. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

28. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

29. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

The births of 1,063 children, viz., 565 boys and 498 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. In the month of December 1,045 births were registered, or 18 less than in the month under review. The births were slightly more numerous than in the corresponding month of the preceding year, but were 173 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 193 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 741, viz., 405 of males and 336 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 322, or 43 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 14, and less than the average of January during the previous ten years by 107. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 121. The deaths showed a marked increase over the exceptionally low number recorded in January 1895, but were still lower than in the corresponding month of any of the other previous ten years, except 1893 and 1894.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 28.51, and of deaths registered 19.88 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 108.0° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 45.4° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (67.1°) was one-fifth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (50.4°) took place on the 23rd, and the least range (2.0°) on the 24th. The daily range was 22.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.186 inches on the 8th, and the lowest was 29.405 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.817 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.61 inches, which was exceeded only twice in the month of January in any of the previous ten years. The average rainfall in January during the previous ten years was 1.84 inches, or .77 of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 43 per cent. in January, 1895; 42 per cent. in January, 1894; 50 per cent. in January, 1893; 53 per cent. in January, 1892; 50 per cent. in January, 1891; 48 per cent. in January, 1890.

Forty-five deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of influenza; a butcher, aged 75, of insanity; a female, aged 75, of cirrhosis of the liver; a gentleman, aged 75, of calculus; a labourer, aged 75, of hæmaturia; a gentleman, aged 75, of injuries, the result of being thrown from a buggy; a farmer, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a bootmaker, aged 76, of cancer; a storekeeper and two females, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a merchant, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of injuries, caused by being thrown from a buggy; a dealer, aged 77, of rheumatism; a tailor, aged 77, of heart disease; a grocer, aged 78, of rheumatism; four females, each aged 78, of cancer, apoplexy,

gangrene of lung, and burns respectively; a bootmaker, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 79, of rheumatism; a gentleman, aged 79, of cancer; a female, aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a quarryman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a carpenter, aged 81, of asthma; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a shepherd, aged 84, and an architect, aged 85, of heart disease; a female, aged 86, of syncope; a missionary, aged 86, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 89, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 89, of nephritis; a sailor, aged 92, of softening of the brain; a solicitor, aged 92, of valvular disease of the heart; a labourer, aged 96, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 76, a farmer, aged 77, and four females, aged 78, 83, 86, and 86 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-four deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 28 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, 3 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A cook, aged 51, was passed over by a railway train; and a male child, aged 2, by a cart; a gentleman, aged 75, and a female, aged 76, were thrown from vehicles; a carter, aged 35, was crushed between a lamp-post and a cart; a youth, aged 16, was killed through his bicycle coming into collision with a cab; a boy, aged 14, died of fracture of the skull, the result of diving into shallow water; a bootmaker, aged 16, of injury to the knee joint, resulting from the blow of a cricket ball; a miner, aged 29, of fracture of the spine, caused by a fall down a shaft; a tinsmith, aged 68, of intracapsular fracture, caused by a fall whilst walking; a female child, aged 2, of scalds; two females, aged 26 and 78 respectively, of burns; a male child, aged 1, and a female child, aged 2, of sunstroke; a male child, aged 2, was accidentally poisoned with sulphuric acid; a ship's chief officer, aged 39, was accidentally drowned at Port Melbourne, whilst intoxicated; a female, aged 71, in a water channel at Moonee Ponds; three boys, aged 5, 8, and 12 respectively, were drowned whilst bathing, viz., one at Surrey Hills, one in the River Yarra, and one at Malvern; two males, of occupation unknown, aged 30 and 50 respectively, and a blacksmith, aged 55, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a male child, aged 1 month, was suffocated with food; a female child, aged 4 months, was overlain; two boys, aged 12 and 13 respectively, were accidentally suffocated in sand at Middle Park. The homicidal deaths were those of a boy, aged 4, who died of fracture of the skull; and a female, aged 49, of peritonitis, caused by unskilful treatment—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former and of manslaughter in the latter case. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 54, who shot himself; a bootmaker, aged 26, who cut his throat; and a tanner, aged 56, who hanged himself. The execution was that of a labourer, aged 22, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol for the murder of his mate.

One hundred and sixty deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—84 in the Melbourne Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 6 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 12 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 317, of which 174, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 143, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 238 were under one year of age, 52 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 424. Of these, 231, or 55 per cent., were males, and 193, or 45 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 39 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 42 were between sixty-five and seventy, 29 were between seventy and seventy-five, 27 were between seventy-five and eighty, 8 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at ninety-six years of age.

As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year the mortality from zymotic diseases increased by 11, that from local diseases by 105, and that from violence and ill-defined causes—each by 9; whilst, on the other hand, that from constitutional diseases fell off by 10. Under the head of zymotic diseases, deaths from diarrhoeal diseases rose from 25 to 47, but those from scarlet fever fell from 6 to 2, and whooping-cough from 13 to 3. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from hydrocephalus fell from 17 to 6, and those from phthisis from 67 to 61; but those from cancer rose from 21 to 28. The increased mortality under local diseases was distributed over all the sub-classes except diseases of parturition, deaths from diseases of the nervous system having risen from 49 to 62, respiratory system (chiefly bronchitis and pneumonia) from 41 to 61, digestive organs (chiefly enteritis and liver diseases) from 111 to 163, urinary system from 22 to 33, generative organs from 1 to 4, and locomotive system from 2 to 7. One judicial execution took place during the month.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to influenza and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895, and the first month of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the recent epidemic of influenza, which caused 109 deaths in the last five months of 1895, is now subsiding, only 3 deaths having been set down to that disease in the month under review; also, that more deaths were set down to typhoid fever in January, 1896, than in the corresponding month for any previous year since 1890.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895* (59 Vict., No. 1409), ordered that all moneys arising from the rates struck by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust shall be kept in a separate and distinct account at the Mildura branch of the National Bank of Australasia Limited.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at £15 (Fifteen pounds) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1896.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than £15 (Fifteen pounds sterling) on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to

the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

11. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in said year 1896, excepting those by measure, which shall be payable monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 24th January, 1896.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by Part VI., division 1, and Part V, division 1 of the *Water Act 1890* (amongst other things) make from the date hereof the By-law following:-

1. The by-law heretofore made relating thereto shall be and the same is hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates or charges due and payable thereunder.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose, and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure.

3. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:-

- (a) For lands and tenements of the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £1.
- (b) For lands and tenements above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (c) Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the annual sum of £2 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied at stand-pipes, 6d. per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) That water supplied by meter shall be charged at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate, and 1s. per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic the minimum charge will be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. All persons using or requiring a supply of water for other than domestic purposes shall consume the same by meter, and shall provide such meter of approved gauge at their own expense, and keep and maintain the same in good working order to the satisfaction of the officer of the council appointed for that purpose.

5. The keys of all meters in use within the water supply district shall be in the custody of the council, or such officer or servant of the council as the council may appoint for that purpose.

6. No overflow pipe to any private bath will be allowed. Any person permitting or allowing an overflow pipe to be attached to such private bath shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding £5, and for every day such person permits or allows any such offence to continue, shall forfeit and pay a further penalty of £1 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

7. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the council for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure, and any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

8. Any person receiving water from the council, who, without the written permission of the council, shall take or carry away from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

11. Before any such licence shall be granted by the council the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and shall furnish an approved security to the council, in the sum of £30 sterling, to provide for any damage he may do, cause, or allow to be done to the property of the council, and the council shall have power to cancel such licence at any time.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13. No person but an officer or servant of the council, duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto. Any person offending against this clause of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

14. For the construction of this by-law the word council shall mean the Borough Council of Wangaratta.
The above by-law was passed and adopted on the 10th December, 1895, and confirmed on the 3rd February, 1896.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 40.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under Section 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 40, for regulating the City Market and the Weighing Machine provided in connexion therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. That the market situate within the City of Hawthorn, and being part of Crown portion 56, parish of Boroondara, county of Bourke, commencing at the north-west angle of Burwood and Camberwell roads, and thence bounded on the north by the south side of Burwood-road for a distance of 231 feet, thence southerly 80 feet 6 inches, thence south-westerly 80 feet 10 inches to Camberwell-road, then north-westerly to the north side of Camberwell-road a distance of 231 feet to the commencing point, and containing one rood twenty-eight perches and four-tenths of a perch or thereabouts, shall be open for public use on Wednesday in each week from sunrise till noon, and on Saturdays from sunrise till Eleven o'clock p.m. (Christmas Day excepted), and on at those days and times only, for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—

Butchers' meat, pork, poultry, fish, rabbits, game, wild fowl, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seed, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the city council may allow to be sold in the said market, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the said market any article or thing whatever, unless authorized to do so by lease granted by the said council, or by written permit issued by the Market Inspector, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale any article or thing in the market on or at any other days or times than the days and times hereinbefore mentioned.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding one year, at such rent as they may fix thereon, any shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to re-let the same as often as the period for such letting shall expire, or be otherwise determined, and for the good regulation of the said market each and every lease or permit shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for which such shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of article shall be exposed or offered for sale in or on the said shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience than is named or referred to in the said lease or permit, except with the consent in writing of the said council.

3. The said council hereby appoints and fixes the respective sums of money mentioned in Schedule "A" to this by-law as the stallages, rents, tolls, dues, and sums of money which it shall be lawful for the said council to demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling in such market any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A," or renting or using any stall or standing place in such market, or using any building, place, or machine provided by the said council for the weighing of carts. Provided, nevertheless, that any person who shall be a genuine keeper of a shop situated within the city shall be entitled to a standing in the market for a cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle from or in which to sell or expose or offer for sale any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A," on paying to the said council the sum of One pound per annum by quarterly instalments, in advance, for each cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle instead of the sums mentioned in the said Schedule "A."

4. No person shall have his or her name, or the title of his or her business shown on or affixed to any shed, shop, site, stall, or standing in such market, nor have such shed, shop, site, stall, or standing enclosed without the permission of the Market Inspector, but with such permission the same may be done at the cost of the applicant, but under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer.

5. No person shall do any of the acts mentioned in this clause, and if any person shall do any of such acts he or she shall on conviction thereof, for every such offence, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, that is to say:—

1. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening, or after the times appointed for closing, such market, or on other days than those named for holding such market.

2. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this by-law to be sold there.

3. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any article or things without having first paid to the Market Inspector the proper stallage, rent, toll, or due, payable in respect thereof, or in respect of the shed, shop, site, stall, or standing from, in, or on which such article or thing shall be sold or exposed or offered for sale in the said market.

4. Placing any matter or thing in any part of the said market so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the Market Inspector.

5. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Market Inspector.

6. Placing any hook, nail, or peg in any part of the market buildings, or showing or affixing any name or the title of any business on or to any shed, shop, site, stall, or standing in such market, or fitting up or enclosing any part of the market without the permission or contrary to the directions of the Market Inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when requested to do so by the Inspector, or defacing or injuring any part of the market buildings.

7. Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, or passages of the said market, and allowing the same to remain therein or thereon.

8. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.

9. In any way obstructing the Market Inspector in the discharge of his duties.

10. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.

6. That the council shall appoint an officer, to be called the Market Inspector, who shall also be Inspector of Provisions, and whose duties shall be generally as follows:—

To see that the market regulations as provided in this by-law are duly observed. To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbances, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.

To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome and cause the same to be dealt with according to law, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To remove from the said market, or from any place therein to any other place therein, any obstruction, cart, carriage, wheelbarrow, truck, basket, vehicle, hook, nail, peg, sign, signboard, partition, or fittings.

To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective, and cause the same to be dealt with according to law.

To collect all stallages, rents, tolls, and dues connected with the market according to the table in the said Schedule "A."
