PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

Submarine Mining in the vicinity of Swanspit Buoy Light and in South Channel.

For the purpose of permitting practice in submarine mining, vessels shall not, on and from the 15th day of March, 1896, until and including the 15th day of April, 1896, be navigated or anchored in the waters to the northward and westward of the Swanspit buoy light, within an area bounded by a supposed line running easterly from Swan beacon to Swanspit buoy light; thence northerly to small B.B.B. buoy which marks the shoal at the southern entrance to Cole's Channel; thence westerly to the outer pile which marks the entrance of the channel leading to Swan Island jetty; thence due south to Swan Point; and from thence southerly along the shore to the starting point.

INDIA—WEST COAST—NARAKAL.

INFORMATION has been received from the Port Officer, Cochin, that—

(1) The wreck buoy marking the site (approximately) of the hull of the *Sir Henry Havelock* was sunk about 21st December from collision, by some vessel unknown.

(2) A wreck buoy (cone, painted green, with "Wreck" in white letters) has, 23rd December, been again placed in the same position, marking approximately the site of the sunken vessel *Sir Henry Havelock*; the bearings (magnetic) are—

Narakal Flagstaff—N. 65° E.

Carriage of Liquid Ammonia on board Ship.

THE Board of Trade are advised that both the aqueous solution of ammonia and ammoniacal gas compressed into liquid form should be classed as dangerous goods, not only on account of the danger of explosion involved when they are contained in vessels not sufficiently strong to withstand the pressure which may be produced by a rise in temperature, but also on account of the highly dangerous nature of the gas.

The following precautions should be adopted when either of these liquids is carried on board ship:—

It should only be packed in iron vessels which have been carefully tested up to a pressure of 675 lbs. per square inch, and should be stored in a part of the ship beyond the influence of any heat from boilers or furnaces, and remote from the living quarters.

Ammonia solution of a specific gravity of .959 and upwards is exempted from the operation of the above instruction.

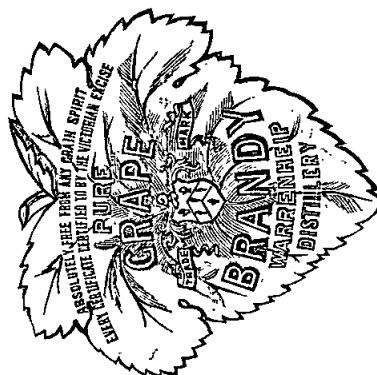

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

THE WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION NO. 6.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1896 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements, according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

WHEREAS by the *Seed Advances Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1433) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing the mode and form of making applications for advances of seed and whether by statutory declaration or otherwise, the form of orders to persons to supply seed to cultivators and the conditions on which such orders shall be honoured, and any other matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act necessary to give effect to the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Applicants for seed must fill up form prescribed in Schedule I. forwarded to them, and duly sign and declare same before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking affidavits, and shall deliver such form to the chairman of the local board appointed to hear such cases.

For the purpose of investigating applications local boards shall be appointed, and shall consist of such person or persons as the Minister may appoint.

It shall be the duty of every board so appointed to investigate all applications delivered to it, and report to the Minister thereon.

Upon approval by the Minister of any application a preferable lien on all crops, as prescribed in Schedule II., will be sent to the applicant for signature, which, on being signed before a witness, must be immediately returned to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne.

A warrant, as prescribed in Schedule III., will then be forwarded, enabling the said applicant to purchase seed to the amount approved of by the Minister, and shown on such warrant.

On production of the warrant seed to the value mentioned therein may be supplied, and a receipt obtained for same from the cultivator, and on such warrant and receipt, with declaration at back thereof duly declared, being forwarded to the Secretary for Lands, the amount of claim will be remitted.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TATURA RACE-COURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Thomas Hogan, Thomas O'Reilly, Charles Wm. Wilson, George Robbins, John Dickson Love, Henry McCarthy, and John Bartlett, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Tatura Race-course and Public Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 130 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
8. No person, unless authorized by the committee of management, shall ride or drive any animal with or without a vehicle upon the part of the reserve used for racing purposes.
9. No races, sports, or fêtes shall be held in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
10. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained, which consent shall be produced if required.
11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
12. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket, issued by the committee of management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.
13. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person or refusing to obey those authorized by the committee of management to keep order shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
14. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve and grand stand on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, shall be as follows :—

15. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institution, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.		
16. No person shall, after the 12th day of March, 1896, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions :—		

1. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Tatura Racing Club, or by those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound (£1).
2. That during the time he shall be in, on, or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the committee of management of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Tatura Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PRINCE'S PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors in respect of Prince's Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the colony of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the city of Melbourne do hereby make the regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the said Prince's Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing regulations in respect of the said Prince's Park.

REGULATIONS.

1. Unless otherwise directed by the trustees, the double gates of the park shall, from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September, be closed to the public from half-past six o'clock in the evening to six o'clock in the morning; and from the 1st day of October to the 31st day of March from eight o'clock in the evening to half-past five o'clock in the morning.
 2. No vehicle used for the transport of goods, stores, or materials of any description shall be allowed within the park.
 3. No horse or vehicle shall stand within the park, nor shall any person in charge of a vehicle ply for hire within the park.
 4. No horses or cattle shall be allowed to graze or wander at large upon any of the drives or pathways.
 5. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways, and all persons using the carriage-ways shall keep to the proper side of the road as on public roads.
 6. No person shall enter the park for the purpose of breaking in horses, or training or exercising horses, or break in, train, or exercise horses within the park, or jump horses over any of the fences, or drive cattle or sheep through the park, and no person shall drive or ride furiously or negligently along any of the roads in the park.
 7. No person shall ride or drive along that portion of the centre walk running from the lodge to McPherson-street, which lies between the roads on the east and west sides of the park.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey,

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor
in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*,
may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports
in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance
and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regu-
lation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection
and preservation and the good government and management of
all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and
enforce such rules and regulations; and that no rules or regu-
lations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have
any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the
corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong
or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for prevent-
ing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within
the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and
that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from
time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed,
and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the
Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive
Council thereof, do hereby make the following Additional Regu-
lations for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.—ADDITIONAL PORT REGULATIONS.

*Submarine Mining in the vicinity of Swanspit Buoy Light and
in South Channel.*

For the purpose of permitting practice in submarine mining,
vessels shall not, on and from the 15th day of March, 1896, until
and including the 15th day of April, 1896, be navigated or
anchored in the waters to the northward and westward of the
Swanspit buoy light, within an area bounded by a supposed
line running easterly from Swan beacon to Swanspit buoy light;
thence northerly to small B.B.B. buoy which marks the shoal
at the southern entrance to Cole's Channel; thence westerly to
the outer pile which marks the entrance of the channel leading
to Swan Island jetty; thence due south to Swan Point; and from
thence southerly along the shore to the starting point.

It is also notified that during the period above referred to
vessels shall not be navigated or anchored to the north of an
imaginary line extending between Nos. five (5) and nine (9) black
buoys, South Channel; and no vessel, unless it be to avoid
serious consequences, shall be anchored in that part of the said
channel which extends from No. five (5) to No. seven (7) black
buoys.

Council, with the consent of the municipal council, may, by Order
published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim such portion a
township by any name and with any boundaries, whether those
respectively indicated by the petition or not, mentioned in such
Order, and may from time to time in like manner and at the like
request alter the name and boundaries thereof: Now therefore
I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive
Council thereof, and acting on a petition signed by not less than

NORTHERN VERMIN DISTRICT.—ANNUAL RATE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Northern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin District: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods,

for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of other Governments, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

16. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

17. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 16 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated at RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Parcels up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.
