PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

Wednesday, the 25th, and Thursday, the 26th, days of March instant, as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Talbot;*

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Rosedale,* and as a Bank Holiday at Rosedale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Tarnagulla,* and as a Bank Holiday at Tarnagulla;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST, AND THURSDAY, THE 2ND, DAYS OF APRIL NEXT,

as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale;*

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Benalla; *

THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

a s a Bank Holiday at Hamilton;

TUESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Allendale and Kingston.
