## PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the Banks and Currency Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

Tuesday, the 21st day of April instant,

as a Bank Holiday at Alexandra;

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Violet Town and Yea, and as a Bank Holiday at Echuca, Newstead, Violet Town, and Yea; THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

as a Bank Holiday throughout the Shire of Maffra;

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Mansfield, and as a Bank Holiday at Mansfield;

Tuesday, the 28th, Wednesday, the 29th, and Thursday, the 30th, days of April instant, as Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, throughout the Town of Warrnambool;\*

THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

as a Bank Holiday at Warrnambool;

WEDNESDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF MAY NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Huntly;\*

FRIDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF MAY NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kilmore, \* and as a Bank Holiday at Kilmore;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF MAY NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Avon.
