#### NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the abovenamed Act and the regulations made thercunder, every
person and company liable to make any return under the said
Act or regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish
to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 3rd
day of February, 1896.

#### Factorics and Shops Act 1890.

N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the Factory of Messrs. Sands and McDougall Limited, or Spencer-street, Melbourne,

for a period of five weeks from the 13th January, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than six females and four boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females and four boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females and four boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-two hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Fifteen shillings per week and each boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive not less than Ten shillings per week, and, in addition, every female and each boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive on the shall be paid for such evertime at the rate of time and a half.

3. That every female and each boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she or he works overtime.

4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and

their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

# BRÁYBROOK SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1890 (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. —

The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Braybrook.

Petitioners state that they are desirous that the Shire of Braybrook should be re-subdivided into four (4) ridings, to be named as follows:—

Northern Riding.

Northern Riding. Southern Riding. River Riding.
Railway Riding.

The petitioners state that the number of ratepayers and the value of the rateable property in the Eastern Riding greatly exceed that of the other two ridings combined, while the number of representatives for each riding is the same; that the Eastern Riding is too large for a suburban riding; and that three representatives are not sufficient to properly represent the requirements of that portion of the municipality. The petitioners further state that the representation of the ratepayers of the shire as it exists at present is most unequal and unfair, 27 ratepayers in the Southern Riding having the same voice at the council table as 1,079 in the Eastern Riding.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired.





FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.-REGULA-TIONS FOR THE FIRST ELECTION OF COMMIS-SIONERS AND AUDITORS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of January, 1896.

WHEREAS by section 62 of the Mildura Irrigation Trusts
Act 1895 (No. 1409), it is enacted that the Governor in
Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from
time to time make Regulations for the purposes following:—

- (a) For determining the period or different periods not sexceeding three years for which commissioners of any trust, including commissioners for urban districts, shall hold office, the time of their election, and the order of their retirement from office:
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of commissioners and auditors shall be held, and in which lists or rolls of voters thereat shall be prepared, and the mode of voting thereat, and the time, mode, place, and all other matters connected with the nomination of commissioners and auditors:

  (c) For determining the mode of experiment as all other matters.
- (c) For determining the mode of appointment or election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties:
- (d) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners or auditors shall be filled up:
- (c) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner or auditor:

  f) For prescribing any other matters necessary for giving effect to Part V. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, so far as regards the First Mildura Irrigation Trust under the said Act, make the Regulations following, viz.:—

- 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Act" shall mean the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895; "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the directors" shall mean the directors of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district," shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation District, as described in the First Schedule to the said Act
- Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—The period during which the commissioners of the said trust elected at the first election of the trust shall hold office shall be twelve months.
- 3. Voters' list to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners and auditors of the said trust, a voters' list, in the manner hereinafter provided, shall be prepared by the directors; that is to say a list of the persons who, on the 1st day of January, 1896, appeared by the assessment books of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited to be rated in respect of lands occupied or owned by them in the irrigation district, and not being township allotments within the Mildura Riding of the Shire of Mildura.
- 4. Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the Act, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person in respect of which he appears by the said assessment books to be rated, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.
- 5. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.—In the case of partners, joint occupiers, joint owners, or tenants in common, the person whose name shall appear first on the assessment book shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him, and he alone shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

  6. Voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedulc.—Objections to list to be in avriting and forwarded to the directors.—The voters' list intended to be used in connexion with the first election of commissioners and auditors of the said trust shall be open for public inspection, free of charge, at the office of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited, Mildura, two days before the day appointed for taking the poll at such election, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m., and a notice in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule hereto shall, at least three days before the day so appointed, be posted on the outer door of the main entrance to such hall.
- 7. Grounds of objection to be stated.—All objections to the said list shall be delivered in writing to the Secretary of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited not later than Four p.m. on the day preceding the day appointed for taking the poll at such election.
- 8. Directors to correct and certify lists.—The directors shall consider all objections delivered as aforesaid, and make whatever corrections may be necessary to make the list accord with the assessment books of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited on 1st January, 1896, and otherwise conform to the said Act, and they or any two of them shall forthwith certify the list under their hands as correct, and cause the same to be

- delivered to the returning officer not later than Eight o'clock in the forencon of the day appointed for taking the poll.

  9. Certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners and auditors of the trust.

Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—In connexion with the first election of the commissioners and auditors of the trust every person intending to become a candidate for election shall not later than five days before the day appointed for taking the poll notify, in writing, to the returning officer his intention to become a candidate, such writing to be signed by him, and to state the office for which he is such candidate, and he shall, if a candidate for the office of commissioner, at the same time pay to the returning officer the sum of £10. the sum of £10.

Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—Third Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates in connexion with the said first election the number of candidates exceeds the number of connexions the number of conditates exceeds the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, then the returning officer shall, in respect of the offices for which there is such excess of candidates, forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed with the christian and surname of the candidates in full, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall cause notices to be posted up in conspicuous places throughout the district, giving the names of the candidates nominated and setting forth the date and place at which the poll shall be taken and the time at which the poll shall commence and be closed, and such poll shall take place accordingly at the office of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited, Mildura, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number or in the case of the hereinbefore mentioned twenty-nine ballot-papers the initials written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the six candidates for the position of commissioners, and the two candidates for the position of auditors, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners or auditors of the trust (as the case may be); and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners and auditors, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the scaled parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such scaled packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust.

# BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1896.

HE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District, the water rate for 1896 shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1895-6, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds, except such are entitled to the provisions of section 120, Water Act 1890.

  2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of Water Act 1839.
- 3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the aum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam beiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load, pro rata, upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, by special arrangement with the Trust, or the Trust may require a mater to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum, shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.
