Income Tax Act 1895.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above-named Act and the regulations made thereunder, every person and company liable to make any return under the said Act or regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 3rd day of February, 1896.

And further notice is hereby given that every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office at Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Act the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OF MESSRS. SANDS AND McDUGALL LIMITED,
OF SPENCER-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of five weeks from the 13th January, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than six females and four boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females and four boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-two hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Fifteen shillings per week and each boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive not less than Ten shillings per week, and, in addition, every female and each boy under the age of sixteen years shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half.
3. That every female and each boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she or he works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

BRAYBROOK SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Braybrook.

Petitioners state that they are desirous that the Shire of Braybrook should be re-subdivided into four (4) ridings, to be named as follows:—

Northern Riding.
Southern Riding.
River Riding.
Railway Riding.

The petitioners state that the number of ratepayers and the value of the rateable property in the Eastern Riding greatly exceed that of the other two ridings combined, while the number of representatives for each riding is the same; that the Eastern Riding is too large for a suburban riding; and that three representatives are not sufficient to properly represent the requirements of that portion of the municipality. The petitioners further state that the representation of the ratepayers of the shire as it exists at present is most unequal and unfair, 27 ratepayers in the Southern Riding having the same voice at the council table as 1,079 in the Eastern Riding.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired.

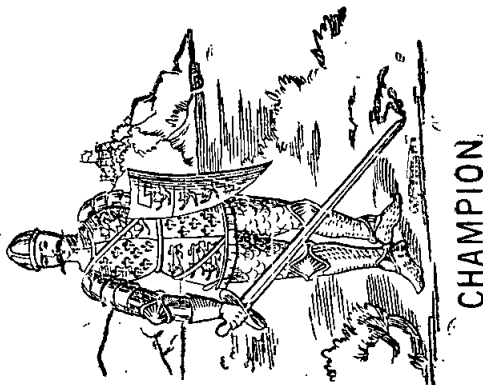

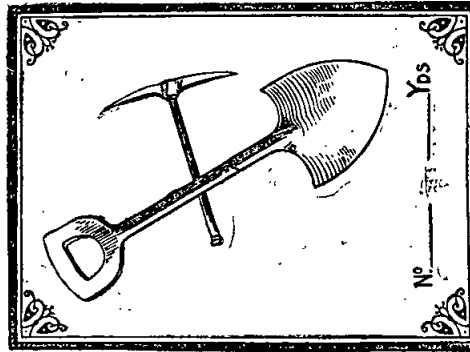

FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE FIRST ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS AND AUDITORS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of January, 1896.

WHEREAS by section 62 of the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895* (No. 1409), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make Regulations for the purposes following:—

- (a) For determining the period or different periods not exceeding three years for which commissioners of any trust, including commissioners for urban districts, shall hold office, the time of their election, and the order of their retirement from office;
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of commissioners and auditors shall be held, and in which lists or rolls of voters thereat shall be prepared, and the mode of voting thereat, and the time, mode, place, and all other matters connected with the nomination of commissioners and auditors;
- (c) For determining the mode of appointment or election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties;
- (d) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners or auditors shall be filled up;
- (e) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner or auditor;
- f) For prescribing any other matters necessary for giving effect to Part V. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, so far as regards the First Mildura Irrigation Trust under the said Act, make the Regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations "the Act" shall mean the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*; "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the directors" shall mean the directors of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district," shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation District, as described in the First Schedule to the said Act.
2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—The period during which the commissioners of the said trust elected at the first election of the trust shall hold office shall be twelve months.
3. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners and auditors of the said trust, a voters' list, in the manner hereinafter provided, shall be prepared by the directors; that is to say a list of the persons who, on the 1st day of January, 1896, appeared by the assessment books of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited to be rated in respect of lands occupied or owned by them in the irrigation district, and not being township allotments within the Mildura Riding of the Shire of Mildura.
4. *Form of voters' list.*—*First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the Act, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person in respect of which he appears by the said assessment books to be rated, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.
5. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of partners, joint occupiers, joint owners, or tenants in common, the person whose name shall appear first on the assessment book shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him, and he alone shall be entitled to vote accordingly.
6. *Voters' list to be available for inspection.*—*Second Schedule.*—*Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to the directors.*—The voters' list intended to be used in connexion with the first election of commissioners and auditors of the said trust shall be open for public inspection, free of charge, at the office of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited, Mildura, two days before the day appointed for taking the poll at such election, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m., and a notice in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule hereto shall, at least three days before the day so appointed, be posted on the outer door of the main entrance to such hall.
7. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be delivered in writing to the Secretary of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited not later than Four p.m. on the day preceding the day appointed for taking the poll at such election.
8. *Directors to correct and certify lists.*—The directors shall consider all objections delivered as aforesaid, and make whatever corrections may be necessary to make the list accord with the assessment books of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited on 1st January, 1896, and otherwise conform to the said Act, and they or any two of them shall forthwith certify the list under their hands as correct, and cause the same to be

delivered to the returning officer not later than Eight o'clock in the forenoon of the day appointed for taking the poll.

9. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners and auditors of the trust.

10. *Directors may appoint returning officer for first election.*—For the purposes of the said first election the directors may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer.

11. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—In connexion with the first election of the commissioners and auditors of the trust every person intending to become a candidate for election shall not later than five days before the day appointed for taking the poll notify, in writing, to the returning officer his intention to become a candidate, such writing to be signed by him, and to state the office for which he is such candidate, and he shall, if a candidate for the office of commissioner, at the same time pay to the returning officer the sum of £10.

12. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

13. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.*—*Third Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates in connexion with the said first election the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, then the returning officer shall, in respect of the offices for which there is such excess of candidates, forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed with the christian and surname of the candidates in full, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall cause notices to be posted up in conspicuous places throughout the district, giving the names of the candidates nominated and setting forth the date and place at which the poll shall be taken and the time at which the poll shall commence and be closed, and such poll shall take place accordingly at the office of the Mildura Irrigation Company Limited, Mildura, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

14. *Returning officer to preside at polling booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

15. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer, and his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any persons, not exceeding six in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

16. *Pencils and ballot-box to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

17. *Mode of voting.*—The returning officer or his deputy shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, and he shall also deliver twenty-nine ballot-papers to such one of the councillors representing the Mildura Riding in the Shire of Mildura as all or a majority of the said councillors shall, in writing, nominate for that purpose which written nomination shall be produced to and lodged with the returning officer or his deputy. Every ballot-paper delivered as aforesaid shall be initiated by the returning officer or his deputy; and every person voting shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. In case any person voting is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. All the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and, except as hereinafter expressly provided as to voting by proxy, no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

18. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number in the roll set opposite to the name of the person entitled to vote; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such person's name as having voted. In the case of the twenty-nine ballot-papers to be delivered to one of the councillors as hereinbefore provided the returning officer or his deputy shall instead of a number write the initials of his name only.

19. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any person voting suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect as to the offices for which such greater number is suffered to remain.

20. *What questions may be asked.*—The returning officer or his deputy may, if he sees fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person claiming to vote in his own right tendering his vote the question following:—

(a) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll in use at this election?

and to any person claiming to vote as proxy for another the questions following in respect of each proxy:—

(b) Is the signature (A.B.) at the foot of the proxy form presented by you, to the best of your belief, in the actual handwriting of (A.B.) personally?

(c) Is the said (A.B.) the person whose name appears in the roll in use at this election?

(d) Are you (C.D.) the person named in the said proxy form?

(e) Have you already received ballot-papers in respect of three proxies at this election?

and no other question shall be put to any person tendering a vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such questions, or who shall not answer the last question absolutely in the negative, and all the other questions absolutely in the affirmative, or who in the case of a proxy shall not deliver up to the returning officer or his deputy the proxy form, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

21. *Voting by proxy.*—All proxy forms shall be in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations or to the like effect, and shall in all cases be signed by the person entitled to vote by proxy in his own actual handwriting, or, if unable to write, by his own mark, and such signature or mark shall be attested by a magistrate, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for taking affidavits or declarations, a legal practitioner, a bank manager, a public or State school teacher, or a postmaster or postmistress, either in Victoria or elsewhere.

22. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall willfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election in his own right or in right of the same person, or who shall use or attempt to use more than three proxies, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person who only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as he is entitled so to do.

23. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number or in the case of the hereinbefore mentioned twenty-nine ballot-papers the initials written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the six candidates for the position of commissioners, and the two candidates for the position of auditors, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners or auditors of the trust (as the case may be); and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

24. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners and auditors, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners, shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust.

25. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner or auditor at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final, binding, and absolutely conclusive.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1896.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District, the water rate for 1896 shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1895-6, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds, except such are entitled to the provisions of section 120, *Water Act 1890*.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements having no water meters, shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1896. And all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed, payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1896. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1896.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1896.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where a charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load, *pro rata*, upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, by special arrangement with the Trust, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum, shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS, 1896-99.

FIRST DIVISION.—292 SERVICES.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 21st day of January, 1896, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Parcels up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted. Should the contractor desire to relinquish his contract he may be permitted to do so provided he pays over to the Postmaster-General a sum equal to 10 per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips.

13. A separate *bonâ fide* tender must be sent in for each service.

14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the establishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.

17. The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.

18. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.
