NELSON HARBOR LIGHTS AND SIGNALS.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after Friday, the 10th day of April, 1896, the following light, and the undermentioned signals for indicating the depth of water at the entrance of Nelson Harbor, will be exhibited, namely:—

Haulashore Island.

A bright light will be exhibited from the beacon off Haulashore Island from sunset to sunrise. Owing to the exposed position of this light, mariners are cautioned to satisfy themselves that it is not extinguished prior to their entering or departing from the port by night.

An iron cage has been placed on this beacon in place of the barrel as hitherto. The cage is painted white, and the beacon retains its original colour (black).

Signals to Indicate Depth of Water at the Entrance.

When inward-bound vessels are expected or have arrived off the Port of Nelson, the following signals, to indicate the depth of water at the entrance, as shown by the tide-gauge, will be exhibited during flood-tide from the signal-staff on the Boulder Bank:—

Day Signals.

1. 10 feet of water at the entrance: One triangle at either yard-arm.
2. 11ft. 6in. of water at the entrance: Two triangles, one at each yard-arm.
3. 13 feet of water at the entrance: Three triangles, one at each yard-arm, and the third placed half-way down the mast below the yard, the three forming a triangle.
4. 14ft. 6in. at the entrance: Three triangles, one at each yard-arm, and the third placed at the centre of the yard, the three forming a straight line.

Night Signals.

5. Green lights will be used by night in place of the triangles used by day, and these lights will occupy similar relative positions to the triangles, and will indicate similar depths of water as those specified for the day signals.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

96/4306.

BY-LAW No. 139.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES AND RATES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Theatrical Companies of not less than six members may travel First Class on Second Class tickets, on production of necessary authority.
2. A rebate of £2 2s. may be allowed to the Commercial Travellers' Association of Victoria on each First Class All-lines Annual ticket taken out by its members during the period 1st January, 1896, to 31st December, 1896.
3. Exhibitors of Dogs at the Melbourne and Sydney Dog and Poultry Shows are to be issued return tickets between the two places at single fare; minimum number, six.
4. Return tickets at single fare are to be issued between Melbourne and Adelaide to players attending Lawn Tennis Tournaments; minimum number, four.
5. Polo players numbering not less than four nor more than eight may be issued return tickets at single fare between Melbourne and Adelaide.
6. Dogs between Melbourne and Sydney for exhibition at the Melbourne and Sydney Dog and Poultry Shows to be charged 10s. each for the return journey.
7. The rates for Commercial Travellers' Samples over all lines are as follows:—
 - Up to 5 cwt., £5 per cwt. per annum.
 - Over 5 cwt., £4 per cwt. per annum added.
 - Maximum weight to be charged for at these rates is 12 cwt.
8. Newspapers conveyed between Melbourne and Brisbane to be charged one-fourth the through parcels rates.
9. Bicycles, unaccompanied by owners, to be charged Parcels Rates, plus 50 per cent., by passenger trains; minimum weight, 56 lbs. each machine.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOW:—

1. Posts and Rails.—The scale of loading and charges to be as follow:—
 - Posts—Sizes 6ft. 6in. x 7in. x 3in.; minimum, 225 per 6-ton truck.
 - Sizes 6ft. 6in. x 7½in. x 3½in.; minimum, 180 per 6-ton truck.
 - Sizes 6ft. 6in. x 8in. x 4in.; minimum, 150 per 6-ton truck.
 - Rails—Sizes 9ft. x 7½in. x 2½in. to 1½in.; minimum, 240 per 6-ton truck.
 - Sizes 9ft. x 9½in. x 3in. to 1½in.; minimum, 150 per 6-ton truck.
 - Bogie waggons, double the above minimums.
 - Any excess number of posts or rails loaded in a truck to be charged *pro rata*.
2. Ladders up to 18 feet long to be allowed 60 cubic feet to ton.
3. Water for the public to be charged freight as for 6 tons per truck at firewood rate, plus 1s. 6d. for the water, if supplied by the Department; maximum charge for freight and water, 21s. per truck. The charge of 1s. 6d. for the water is made conditionally that the Department does not pay a higher rate for it.
4. The minimum charge for Rabbits sent at First Class rate by passenger trains to be 1s.
5. Long articles requiring more than one four-wheeled truck will be charged according to classification, with a minimum of 2 tons for each waggon, whether engaged in carrying the load or used as a safety only. When, however, it is cheaper to charge the actual weight of the consignment, plus 3d. per mile for each safety or extra truck used, this is to be done. No extra charge to be made for the long articles if the trucks on which they are carried contain an average of 2 tons each of any kind of goods. Bogie trucks to be regarded as equal to two four-wheeled trucks when carrying this description of goods.
6. Returned Egg Boxes, containing Chaff for Egg-packing, to be charged ½d. per box, in addition to present "returned empty" rate; minimum, 1d.
7. Raffia to be charged C Class rate and conditions.
8. Weighing charges at Rochester.—Melbourne rates to apply.
9. Hop-washing Engines and Hop-sulphurating Machines to be charged Second Class rate.
10. By-law 123, clause 27.—Gravel and Road Metal for Shire Councils, when charged ½d. per ton per mile, are to be subject to minimum of 15s. per four-wheeled truck, irrespective of weight.
11. Sheeps' Horns, in medium trucks, loaded to water level, to be charged 8d. per truck per mile; minimum, 20s.
12. Blankets, Flannels, and Woollens, despatched direct from Victorian factories, to be charged one class less than ordinary rates. In all cases to secure this concession the goods must be despatched from the station nearest to the factory.
13. Chloride of Lime, in lots of not less than 6 tons, to be charged C Class rate; smaller quantities First Class.

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14. Spoilt Beer, certified by Customs Department to be unfit for consumption, may be returned to the brewery from which it was sent at half rate.

15. Ground Cornish Stone, for use in making Pottery, &c., to be charged A Class rate and conditions.

16. Returned Empty Acid Jars, in carboys and cases, when sent in lots of not less than 2 tons, to be charged B class rate and conditions.

17. By-law 132, clause 32.—Fruit Crates, containing small empty baskets, to be charged B Class rate; minimum, 6d.

18. Dextrine to be charged Second Class rate.

19. Storage charge for Contractors' Engines placed on Department's Sidings to be 1s. each a month, and waggons 6d. each a month.

20. Goods in lots of not less than 3 tons for stations on Timboon line, to be charged 30s. per ton from Melbourne and 27s. per ton from Geelong.

21. Beer in bulk from Ballarat to Bairnsdale to be charged 25s. per ton; minimum, 3 tons per consignment.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust, when the supply is not by meter, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell such water to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust, of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Wrought galvanized iron piping, of approved quality only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No services of a larger bore than half-inch to properties valued under £25 per annum will be permitted, but those properties which are valued at £25 and over per annum will be allowed a three-quarter inch service.

7. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of offence from the Trust. All water troughs must be fitted with self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

10. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

11. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offenders from payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890*, or these Regulations.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pan, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be used and contrived as that the water supplied to him by the Trust is, or is likely to be wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation or otherwise, howsoever, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes or make any fittings or connexions, and attach the same to any service-pipes of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already laid and connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless he can be proved to be a competent person.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the directions, of the Trust's officer, and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final, and binding on all parties.

16. Any person guilty of any offence against these Regulations not otherwise specifically provided for shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

The above Regulations, from one to sixteen, were agreed to at a meeting of the Trust held 29th February, 1896.

HORSHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. Before any interment shall take place application for permission must be made to the secretary, all charges paid, and information recorded, when an order to the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to be made.
2. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
3. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.
4. The name, age, last place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
5. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
6. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st of September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours will be from Two p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.
7. The charge may be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
8. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.
9. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
13. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
14. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.
15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.
16. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
17. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.
18. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
19. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
20. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
21. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

22. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MEENIYAN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Meeniyon Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least twelve working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be reopened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Melbourne Savings Bank Deposit Book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received). Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Meat.—With the exception of meat for the Victorian Naval Forces at Williamstown, fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than 10 inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef. As regards meat for the Naval Forces at Williamstown, the fresh meat must be supplied in sets of ribs, sirloin, and thick flanks, and, when the quantity admits, hind and fore quarters will be taken alternately; shins and sticking pieces to be removed from fore quarters; shins and kidney suet from hind quarters; mutton to be delivered in sides; kidney fat to be removed.

7. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

9. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

10. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

11. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

12. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.

13. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

15. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

16. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

17. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

18. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

20. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

21. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 23 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays. All work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture, &c., of the articles tendered for in these schedules are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise

stated in the schedules), and at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the

points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Parcels up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. BY-LAWS OF THE WILLIAMSTOWN HOSPITAL.

1. *Objects.*—This hospital is established for the reception of cases of accident or non-infectious disease only.

2. *Patients.*—This hospital will afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons, and will accommodate a limited number of paying patients if space is available; but no person able to pay therefor shall receive such aid gratuitously.

3. *Paying patients.*—Paying patients may be admitted as above at the discretion of an honorary medical officer and the visiting committee. Such patients shall pay in advance for maintenance and accommodation at the rate fixed by the committee of management, which payment shall not confer any right to the services of the honorary medical officers, but a paying patient may elect by which of the honorary medical officers he shall be attended. In no case shall a paying patient be admitted to the exclusion of an indigent patient.

4. *Life governors.*—Every donor of not less than £20 in one sum shall be entitled to be a life governor. Every person, institution, society, or corporate body who shall raise and contribute to the funds of the hospital an amount of not less than £25 in any one year shall be entitled to nominate a life governor. The executor first named in any will under which a sum of not less than £25 shall have been paid to the funds of the hospital shall also be entitled to be a life governor.

5. *Voters.*—Life governors and annual subscribers of not less than £1 shall be entitled to vote at all elections. Public bodies and associations who shall subscribe in any one year a sum of not less than £5 may nominate one of their number, who shall be entitled to the same privileges as an annual subscriber of not less than £1 for that year, and no person shall be entitled to more than one vote.

6. *Friendly societies.*—Friendly societies who shall subscribe not less than one guinea in any one year shall be entitled to nominate one of their number who shall be entitled to the privileges of an annual subscriber of that amount.

7. *Partnerships.*—Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

8. *Committee of management.*—The hospital shall be governed by a committee of management, to consist of the president, vice-presidents, the treasurer, and not more than fifteen (15) other members, not more than four (4) of whom shall be honorary medical officers. The whole of the elected members of the committee shall be elected in accordance with section 14 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be elected by the contributors at the annual meeting, and shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. The persons named in by-law 5 shall alone be eligible for election as president, vice-president, or other member of committee, and then only by their being nominated by two voters for the current year. Such nomination shall be lodged at the office not less than 24 hours before the time of election.

9. *Casual vacancies.*—Any casual vacancies may be filled up by the committee of management, in accordance with section 15 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

10. *Duties of committee of management.*—The committee of management shall direct the business of the hospital; shall frame regulations (subject to these rules) for its control; shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on its behalf; and shall appoint and discharge all paid officials. This committee shall meet every month, on such days as they shall appoint; four members to form a quorum. In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of such meeting, it shall be in the power of the members present, or if there be no members present, of the secretary, to adjourn such meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from the date of such adjournment.

11. *Who shall preside.*—The president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall preside at all meetings of the committee of management. In the absence of the president and vice-president, the members present shall elect a chairman from among themselves.

12. *Penalty for non-attendance.*—Any elected member of the committee of management, except an honorary medical officer, who shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings, or who, while acting as a member of the visiting committee, shall be absent from four consecutive meetings of such committee without leave or excuse (the reasonableness of which shall be determined by the said committee), shall thereupon cease to be a member.

13. *Contracts for supplies or works.*—No member of the committee of management, or official of the hospital, shall be a contractor for any supplies or works to or for the hospital, or become security for any such contractor directly or indirectly.

14. *Treasurer.*—All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer thereof, who shall, with all reasonable despatch, pay in same to the hospital banking account. Payments shall be paid by the treasurer only upon the orders of the committee of management, under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which such orders shall have been made; such payments to be made by cheque upon the banking account, signed by the treasurer and president (or vice-president) and countersigned by the secretary.

15. *Annual report.*—The committee of management shall present an annual report of the affairs of the hospital, together with a detailed statement of accounts duly audited, and a schedule of the attendance of each member of committee at the meetings of general and visiting committees respectively.

16. *Special meetings of contributors.*—A special meeting of contributors may be called at any time upon the requisition of twelve (12) voters. Seven (7) days notice of such meeting shall be given by advertisement in one of the local newspapers. The occasion of such meeting shall be stated in the requisition and in such notice, and no other business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that so stated.

17. *Visiting committee.*—A visiting committee shall be appointed by the general committee.

18. *Honorary medical officers.*—The honorary medical officers shall be legally qualified medical practitioners registered in the colony of Victoria. They shall have admittance to the hospital at all times, and one of them shall attend there daily, the rotation of their duty to be regulated by themselves collectively, and subject to the approval of the visiting committee.

19. *Neglect by honorary medical officers.*—Any honorary medical officer, who, in the opinion of the committee of management, has neglected his duty, shall be reported to a special meeting of the said committee convened for the purpose, who shall have power to remove the name of such practitioner from the list of honorary medical officers.

20. *Complaints.*—Patients having a complaint to make may communicate it to one of the honorary medical officers, or to the visiting committee, who shall thereupon record the same in writing. The visiting committee shall have power to inquire into and take action in the matter of said complaint, or to refer the same to the next meeting of the committee of management.

21. *Discharge of patients.*—Patients shall be discharged on the certificate of the honorary medical officer attending each respectively, but patients guilty of misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any honorary medical officer or by the visiting committee, the cause of such dismissal to be entered in the visiting committee's reports. Provided that if any patient shall have been an inmate of the hospital for a period of six continuous months, it shall be competent for the committee of management to direct that a consultation of all the honorary medical officers of the hospital shall be called in reference to such patient's case, and if the majority of such medical officers present at such consultation shall be of opinion that such patient ought to be discharged, the committee of management may direct that such patient be discharged accordingly.

22. *Persons indigible for admission.*—No female for the purpose of confinement, no insane person, no child under the age of five (5) years except for surgical treatment, and no person suffering from any contagious disease shall be admitted to this hospital.
