Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

WATERPROOF FACTORY OF MR. F. L. RICHARDS, AT 134 AND 136 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from 13th May, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than ten females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said ten females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than fifteen shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece worker shall be paid 3d. per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

NORTH-WEST CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

NEW LIGHT-HOUSE, LIGHT TOWERS, ILLUMINATED AND OTHER BUOYS.

Caloundra Light-house.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is intended, on or about the 15th July, 1896, to exhibit from a new circular tower, painted white, a fixed light of the fourth (4th) order dioptric, showing a white light between the bearings of south through west to north 60° west, red from north 60° west to north 29° west, and white between north 29° west and north 22° west. The two latter sectors are intensified.

This light-house is situated about 8 cables to the westward of Caloundra Head. The focal plane is 170 feet above high water, and the light will be visible from a vessel's deck in clear weather at a distance of 16 miles.

Leading Lights, Brisbane Island.

The leading lights on Brisbane Island will be exhibited from skeleton towers, painted white.

From the back tower (high light) a powerful bi-form holophotal light will be shown between the bearings of south 67° west and south 45° west. The tower is 95 feet above high water, and the light will be visible from a vessel's deck in clear weather at a distance of 14 miles.

From the front tower (low light) a fixed light of the fourth (4th) order dioptric will be exhibited, and will be shown between the bearings of south 14° west and south 77° west, and between north 46° west and north 40° west. The tower is 56 feet above high water, and the light will be visible from a vessel's deck in clear weather at a distance of 12 miles.

Both sectors of this light are intensified.

Buoys.

The black buoys now marking the south-western extreme of the Spitfire and the eastern extreme of the Salamander Banks will be replaced by illuminated gas buoys with a fixed white light.

The red buoy now marking the northern extreme of the western banks will also be replaced by an illuminated gas buoy carrying an occulting white light.

The superstructures of the gas buoys will be ten (10) feet above the level of the sea, and the lights will be visible from a vessel's deck in clear weather at a distance of about three (3) miles.

On a line north-west $\frac{1}{2}$ north from Spitfire Bank buoy, on the following bearings, three (3) black buoys will be placed to mark the eastern side of the north-west channel:—

Northern Buoy (in 8 fathoms of water)—

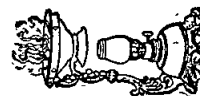

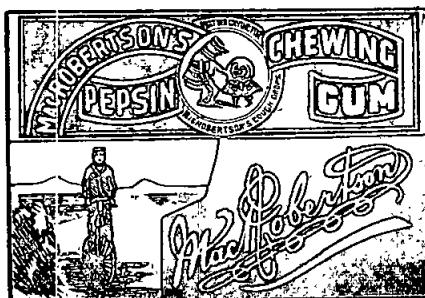

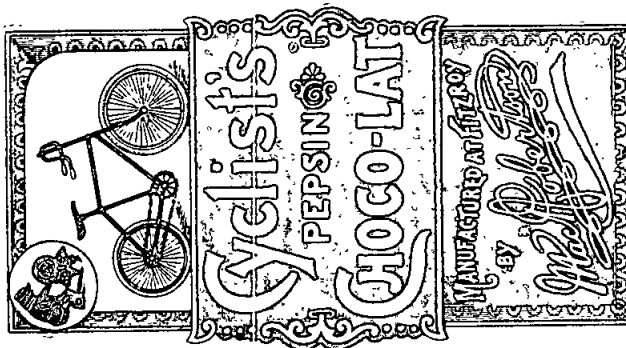

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL WITH
RESPECT TO APPLICATIONS FOR ORDERS AUTHORIZING THE
SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY, ETC.

Notices to be given by applicants for an Order.

1. Every council, company, person, or persons (hereinafter included under the term "Applicant") intending to apply for an Order in Council (hereinafter termed an Order) must give notice in writing of such intended application to the council of every municipal district within the area to which the proposed application refers, also to any council, company, person or persons authorized to supply electricity within such area.

If the applicant proposes to take power by the Order to interfere with or break up any tramway or railway he must give notice in writing to the council, company, or person by whom such tramway or railway is repairable of his intention to apply for such power.

Particulars advertisement must contain.

2. The applicant must publish by advertisement notice of the intended application, and every such advertisement must contain the following particulars, viz. :—

- (a) The objects of the application ;
- (b) The address and description of every applicant ;
- (c) A description of the proposed area of supply ;
- (d) The names of the streets dedicated to public use in or along which it is proposed that electric lines be laid down or erected ;
- (e) The time or times within which such electric lines are to be laid down or erected ;
- (f) Particulars of any tramway or railway which the applicant proposes to take power by the Order to interfere with or break up ; and
- (g) The address of an office in Melbourne, and of an office within the proposed area of supply, at which printed copies of the draft Order, and of the Order when made, can be obtained by any person at a price of not more than One shilling each ;
- (h) An address at which copies of notices of objections and other documents may be served on the applicant.

The advertisement must be headed with a short title, descriptive of the undertaking (corresponding with that at the head of the application), and it must state that every council, company, person, or persons desirous of bringing before the Postmaster-General any objection respecting the application must do so within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement, by notice addressed to the Postmaster-General, marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, and that a copy of every such notice of objection must also be forwarded to the applicant for the Order.

The advertisement must be inserted once at least in the *Government Gazette* and also once at least in each of two successive weeks in one and the same newspaper, published and circulating in the proposed area of supply, or in such other newspaper as the Governor in Council may direct.

Objections to the granting of an Order.

3. Every notice of objection respecting an application for an Order must be sealed or signed by the objector or objectors or by some one on his or their behalf and forwarded under cover addressed to the Postmaster-General, marked on the outside *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, so as to reach the General Post Office within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement of the application.

A copy of the notice of objection must also be served by the objector or objectors upon the applicant for the Order or served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same in a registered letter to, the address given in the advertisement.

Within the time limited for bringing objections, if any objecting council, company, person or persons desire to have any clauses or other amendments inserted in the Order, the objector or objectors must deliver a copy thereof to the Postmaster-General, and also serve a copy on the applicant for the Order, in the manner provided for serving notices of objection.

Consent of council necessary before application is made for Order in Council.

4. No application for an Order (other than an application from the council of the municipal district), will be entertained by the Governor in Council unless proof of the consent of every council having jurisdiction within the proposed area of supply to the granting of such Order, or a request from the applicant asking the Governor in Council to dispense with the consent of any council that has not consented and giving the reasons for such request, is deposited with the Postmaster-General within three months from the date of the said *Government Gazette*.

Every application for an Order must within twenty-eight days from the date of the *Government Gazette* in which was published the advertisement of intention to apply be forwarded addressed to the Postmaster-General and shall be signed or sealed by, or on behalf of, the applicant, headed with a short title descriptive of the proposed undertaking corresponding with that at the head of the advertisement hereinbefore mentioned. With the application there must be deposited six copies of the draft Order, as applied for, and also of any schedule or schedules referred to therein.

8. The deposited copies of the draft Order must be in print. They must be printed on one side only, and each schedule annexed must begin on a new page. Draft Order to be in print, &c.

The name and address of every applicant for the Order must be printed on the outside of the draft.

There must be a notice at the end of the draft stating that notices of objection are to be forwarded under cover addressed to the Postmaster-General, marked on the outside *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, and are to be sent to the Postmaster-General within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement of the application, and that a copy of every such notice of objection is to be served on the applicant for the Order, or served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same in a registered letter to, the address given in the advertisement.

9. The draft Order must contain amongst other things—

- (a) The address and description of every applicant;
- (b) A description of the proposed area of supply;
- (c) A statement of the public or private purposes for which a supply is to be given;
- (d) Provisions concerning the breaking up of, or interference with, any tramway or railway, where powers are sought to be obtained by the Order for those purposes or either of them; and
- (e) Conditions restrictions and liabilities with regard to the several matters set out in section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*.

Particulars required in draft Order.

10. The applicant must also keep available a sufficient number of printed copies of the draft Order at the address in Melbourne and at the place within the proposed area of supply to be specified in the advertisement hereinbefore mentioned; such copies to be there furnished to all persons applying for them, at a price of not more than One shilling each. 11. BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the provisions of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust, the whole or portion of whose waterworks district has been proclaimed an urban district, may, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make Regulations for or relating to all or any of the subjects mentioned in the said section. And whereas the Waterworks District of the Bright Waterworks Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person supplied with water for domestic use solely from the works of the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.
2. No person shall use a hose for the purpose of irrigating gardens, nor shall water be drawn from the mains for any other purpose than domestic use unless the supply be by measure.
3. The charge for water by measure shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as may be required by the Trust.
4. The use of water by hose or otherwise for garden purposes or for any other than domestic use solely shall be absolutely prohibited between the hours of Six o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m.
5. The penalty for each offence in respect of a breach of any such regulations shall not exceed Five pounds, and may be recovered from any offender in a summary way before any two justices.
6. The foregoing Regulations were duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, at their office, Bright, on the 2nd day of March, 1896. And the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto, this 13th day of April, 1896, in the presence of—

No. 1374) it is amongst other things provided that if any act, matter, or thing prescribed by or under the said Act to be made or done at or within a fixed time cannot be or is not so made or done, the Governor in Council may by Order from time to time appoint a further or other time for making or doing the same, whether the time or any such further or other time within which the same ought to have been done has or has not elapsed or expired: And whereas the assessments of incomes for the year ended the 31st day of December, 1895, were not all made on or before the 31st day of March, 1896, as prescribed in the Regulations made pursuant to the said Act, and dated the 10th day of February, 1896: And whereas by an Order, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act as hereinbefore recited, and bearing date the 16th day of March, 1896, it was appointed that all assessments of incomes for the year ended the 31st day of December, 1895, which were not made on or before the 31st day of March, 1896, should be made on or before the 30th day of April, 1896, and that the tax payable on such assessments should be paid on or before the 15th day of May, 1896: And whereas the assessments of incomes for the second period for which assessments were prescribed to be made as aforesaid were not all made on or before the 30th day of April, 1896, as prescribed by the said Order of the 16th day of March, 1896: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint that all assessments of incomes for the year ended the 31st day of December, 1895, which were not made on or before the 30th day of April, 1896, shall be made on or before the 12th day of June, 1896, and that the tax payable on such assessments shall be paid on or before the 27th day of June, 1896.

And the Honorable George Turner, Her Majesty's Treasurer for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
