**NETTING IN YARRAM CREEK, SWAN BAY, AND SWAN PONDS.**

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke all existing proclamations relating to netting at the mouth of Yarram Creek and in Swan Bay and Swan Ponds, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation as under :—

1. Defining the limit of the mouth of Yarram Creek within which trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines are not to be used as a line running from the extreme outward or seaward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such creek enter Swan Bay.

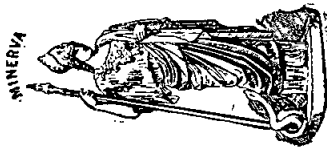

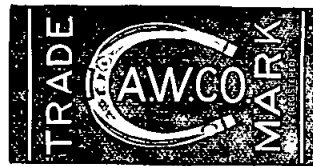

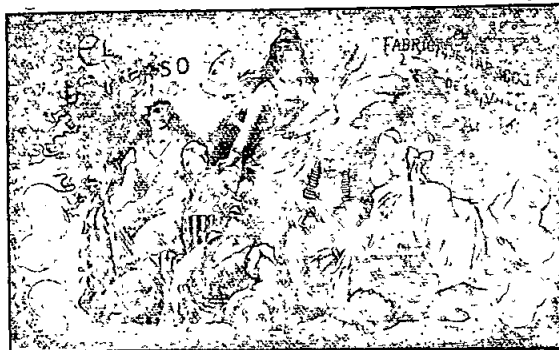

ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF MANSFIELD, MADE THE 5TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1896.

All that piece or parcel of land, being part of Crown allotment 31, parish of Korumburra, county of Buln Buln, comprising an area of two acres two roods and one perch or thereabouts: Commencing at the north-west angle of Crown allotment 32 of the said parish and county; thence along the common boundary of the said allotments 31 and 32 bearing S. 1° 16' E. two thousand four hundred and eighty-six links to the reserve of the Great Southern Railway line; thence along the said reserve for a distance of one hundred and eight links; thence N. 1° 16' W. two thousand five hundred and twenty-six links; thence along a sectional road bearing N. 88° 27' E. one hundred links to the point of commencement.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.—BY-LAW No. 6.

WATER SUPPLY.

Preamble. WHEREAS the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works did on the 29th day of May, 1894, make and pass a By-law No. 4, and intitled "A by-law to alter and amend By-law No. 3, and to make other provisions with regard to the charges and rate for water supply, and for the levying of such rates and charges," which by-law was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st, 8th, and 15th June, 1894, and it is expedient to alter and amend certain of the provisions of the said by-law.

1. Be it and it is hereby enacted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "The Board") that at and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, repeal of par-section 7 of the herebefore mentioned by-law of By-law shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed, and it is hereby further enacted as follows:—

Hire of meter 2. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not and rate of otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for rent thereof, which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of:—

- For 4-inch meter, Five shillings.
- For 2-inch meter, Six shillings.
- For 1-inch meter, Eight shillings.
- For 1½-inch meter, Ten shillings and sixpence.
- For 1¼-inch meter, Fourteen shillings.

And for other than inferential meters the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 per cent. upon the cost of each such meter, or as near to such rate as can be conveniently calculated, such Meter rent to rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the be exclusive amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter; such meter cost of hirer shall be fixed at cost of the hirer on his premises and main- where directed by an officer of the Board, but shall be kept in repair at cost of the Board, except in case of its receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

Testing meters. 3. In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him, but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Water supply for closets. 4. Every consumer of water who shall receive his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to Seven shillings and sixpence per annum on account of each water-closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through, and be recorded by such meter, save and except in the case of factories or premises having a range of privy closets receiving their water flush from one flushing-cistern, in each of which cases the allowance of deduction shall be Five shillings per annum for each privy seat in such range.

Licence to plumbers under Water Act and by-law not to apply to sewerage. 5. A licence, issued in conformity with the provisions of *Water Act 1830*, or any Act repealed thereby, or any by-law or regulation thereunder, shall not authorize the holder thereof to do any kind of work connected with the sanitary fittings of houses or the sewerage system.

##### REGULATION No. 3.

REGULATION for the making of a graduated rate, under Part III. of the *Water Act 1830*, on all property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate is hereby made for the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust:—

In the No. 1 Division, of Ninepence in the pound sterling;  
In the No. 2 Division, of Eighteenpence in the pound sterling;

respectively, on the annual value of all rateable property within the said divisions of the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated.

2. Such rate is made for the year 1896, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1896, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1896.

3. Such rate is payable on the 12th day of October, 1896.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

#### MACORNA NORTH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 4.

THE Commissioners of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1830*, do make the following Regulation:—

##### No. 4.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE MACORNA NORTH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

1. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.

3. Order of business at meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.
- (xi.) Reading of rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Addresses to Governor.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. Notice of motion to be given.—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. Motions to be moved in order in motion book.—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9. Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

11. Order, &c., of debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

13. Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. Mover of motion.—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. Designation of commissioners.—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

17. Priority of commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.
19. Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
20. Points of order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus—"Shall the decision of the chair be maintained?"
21. Commissioners not to digress, &c.—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.
22. Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.
23. Commissioner called to order to sit down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
24. Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.
25. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.
26. Committees of the whole.—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself into a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.
27. Commissioner not attending order for call.—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation.
28. Commissioners may demand documents.—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may, at any time during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.
29. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.
30. Question, how declared.—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
31. Motions, &c., to be in writing.—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
32. Amendments.—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order; but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment to "strike out and insert," the paragraph to be amended should first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out and inserted, and, finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.
33. Effect of rejection of original motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
34. If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.—If an amendment be negatived then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.
35. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.
36. Adjournment.—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except—1st, when a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd, when the commissioners are voting; 3rd, when adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th, when it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended.
37. Protests.—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.
38. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
39. Explanations.—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.
40. Privileged questions.—(1) When a question is before the Trust the only motions in order shall be—1st, to adjourn; 2nd, the previous question; 3rd, to lay on the table; 4th, to postpone indefinitely; 5th, to postpone to a definite period; 6th, to refer; 7th, to divide, if the sense will permit of it; 8th, to amend; to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded, it shall be put in this form—"Shall the main question now be put?" If this is carried all further amendments and debates shall be excluded, and the question be put without delay. If the question has been amended, the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to re-consider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendment are under discussion, it will be in order for any member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely, it shall not come up again during that meeting.
41. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, or unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.
42. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
43. Notices of meetings.—All notices of any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Trust shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by post or otherwise to the place of abode or place of business of each of the commissioners two clear days at least previous to such meeting; and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting; and in case of a special meeting shall specify the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.
44. Power to suspend officers.—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.
45. Committees of Trust, and quorum.—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.
46. Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust—and, if no quorum be fixed, three members—be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the

chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

47. Seal.—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least three commissioners.

48. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

49. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

50. Meetings of committee.—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

51. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

52. Petitions to be respectful.—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

53. Commissioners to affix their names.—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

54. Petition to be in writing.—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof; and the petition shall be prepared in a way similar to that adopted with regard to petitions presented to Parliament.

55. To be signed by the petitioners.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

56. No letters, &c., to be attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

57. No letters or memorials to be dealt with.—No letters or memorials shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, not later than the day preceding the day of meeting.

58. Deputations to signify intention.—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

59. Letters or memorials returned for amendments.—When letters or memorials do not accurately indicate the localities by giving the number of the allotment, and section, and name of the parish, or other technical description, it shall be in order to return the documents for amendment.

60. Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

61. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such other newspapers, if any, as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

62. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same by advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement, except when the Trust, by special resolution, which may be moved without notice, orders otherwise.

63. No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done for the Trust.

64. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

65. Suspension of rules.—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

66. Penalty.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation, he or she shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty of not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 4, was made by the Commissioners of the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this 8th day of June, 1896.

## REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of June, 1896.*

## PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Peacock  
Mr. McCulloch

Mr. Vale.

WHEREAS by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1413) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he may think expedient for securing the safety of the persons and property of the public from injury from fire or otherwise, and may by any regulation amend or repeal any condition contained in any Order in relation thereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

## REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC.

## DEFINITIONS.

The several words, terms, and expressions to which meanings are assigned in the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* or in any Order granted thereunder have the same respective meanings in these Regulations.

“Consumer’s wires” means any electric lines on a consumer’s premises which are connected with the service lines of the undertakers at the consumer’s terminals.

“Aerial line” means any electric line which is placed above ground and in the open air.

“Pressure” means the difference of electrical potential between any two conductors through which a supply of energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth; and—

(a) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure may at any time exceed 500 volts if continuous, or 250 volts if alternating, but cannot exceed 3,000 volts, whether continuous or alternating, the supply shall be deemed a high-pressure supply;

(b) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure may on either system exceed 3,000 volts, the supply shall be deemed an extra high-pressure supply.

“High-pressure” and “extra-high pressure” respectively are used in relation to electric lines, conductors, circuits, and apparatus, according to the conditions of the supply delivered through the same or particular portions thereof.

Where these regulations require any metallic body to be “efficiently connected with earth,” it shall be connected with the general mass of earth in such manner as will insure at all times an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

## GENERAL.

1. *Pressure of supply to consumers.*—The pressure of a supply delivered to any consumer shall not exceed 250 volts at any pair of terminals, except with the express approval of the Minister. Such approval will only be given for special purposes and on the joint application of the consumer and the undertakers, and the supply will be subject to such further regulations as the Governor in Council may from time to time prescribe.

2. *Pressure of supply to transforming apparatus.*—The pressure of a supply delivered to a transforming station or to transforming apparatus on a consumer’s premises may exceed 250 volts, but shall not exceed the limits of high pressure.

3. *Limitations of extra high-pressure supply.*—An extra high-pressure supply shall not be given except to distributing stations or other premises in the sole occupation of the undertakers, and with the written consent of the Minister, and subject to such conditions as he may prescribe.

4. *Maximum current in conductors.*—The maximum working current in any conductor shall not be sufficient to raise the temperature of the conductor or any part thereof to such an extent as to materially alter the physical condition or specific resistance of the insulating covering (if any), or in any case to raise such temperature to a greater extent than 30° F.; the cross-sectional area and conductivity at joints must be sufficient to avoid local heating, and the joints must be protected against corrosion.

5. *Minimum size of conductors.*—The sectional area of the conductor in any electric line laid or erected in any street after the date of these regulations shall not be less than the area of a circle of one-tenth of an inch diameter, and where the conductor is formed of a strand of wires each separate wire shall be at least as large as No. 20 standard wire gauge.

6. *Specification of insulating material.*—All material used for insulating electric lines or apparatus shall be of the best quality, and thoroughly durable and efficient, having regard to the conditions of its use. Suitable provision shall be made for the protection of the insulating material against injury or removal.

If the protection so provided be wholly or partly metallic it shall be efficiently connected with earth.



7. *Insulation test of electric lines.*—Every main shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 200 volts, and the undertakers shall duly record the results of the tests of each main, or section of a main.

8. *Maintenance of insulation.*—The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of, or in connexion with, such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current; and suitable means shall be provided for the immediate indication and localisation of leakage. Every leakage shall be remedied without delay.

Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the undertakers shall duly record the results of the testings.

Provided that where the Minister has approved of any part of any electric circuit being connected with earth, the provisions of this regulation shall not apply to that circuit so long as the connexion with earth exists.

9. *High-pressure conductors to be covered.*—Every high-pressure conductor shall be continuously covered with insulating material to a thickness of not less than one-tenth part of an inch, and in cases where the extreme difference of potential in the circuit exceeds 2,000 volts, the thickness of insulating material shall not be less in inches or parts of an inch than the number obtained by dividing the number expressing the volts by 20,000.

10. *Testing of insulation of all parts of any high-pressure circuit.*—A high-pressure circuit shall not be brought into use unless the insulation of every part thereof has withstood the continuous application, during one hour, of pressure exceeding the maximum pressure to which it is intended to be subjected in use—that is to say, in the case of every electric line a pressure twice the said maximum pressure, and in the case of every machine, device, or apparatus, a pressure 50 per cent. greater than the said maximum pressure.

The undertakers shall duly record the results of each test.

11. *Quick-acting cut-off for high-pressure lines, &c.*—Every high-pressure electric line, conductor, or other apparatus shall be protected by a suitable automatic quick-acting cut-off.

Provided that it shall not be incumbent upon the undertakers to provide such a cut-off for the outer conductor of a concentric main which is, with the approval of the Minister, efficiently connected with earth.

12. *Transformers.*—In every case where a high-pressure supply is transformed for the purpose of supply to one or more consumers, some suitable automatic and quick-acting means shall be provided to protect the consumers' wires from any accidental contact with or leakage from the high-pressure system, either within or without the transforming apparatus.

13. *Limit of power in high-pressure electric line.*—A high-pressure electric line shall not be used for the transmission of more than 300,000 watts, or in the case of an aerial line 100,000 watts, except with the consent in writing of the Minister, and efficient means shall be provided to prevent this limit being at any time exceeded.

14. *Protection from lightning.*—Where any portion of any electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such injury.

15. *Accidents to be reported.*—Where any accident by explosion or fire, or any other accident of such kind as to have caused or to be likely to have caused loss of life or personal injury has occurred at any part of any electric line or work, the undertakers shall give immediate notice thereof to the Minister.

16. *Earth return.*—No earth return shall be allowed on any electric light or power circuit.

#### AERIAL LINES.

17. *Maximum intervals between supports.*—Every aerial line shall be attached to supports at intervals not exceeding 200 feet where the direction of the line is straight, or 150 feet where the direction is curved, or where the line makes a horizontal angle at the point of support.

18. *Supports, construction and erection of.*—Every support of an aerial line shall be of a durable material and properly stayed against forces due to wind pressure, change of direction of the line, or unequal lengths of span. The factor of safety shall be for aerial lines and suspending wires at least six, and for all other parts of the structure at least twelve, taking the maximum possible wind pressure at 35 lbs. per square foot. Every support if of metal shall be efficiently connected with earth.

19. *Low-pressure conductors to be insulated.*—Every low-pressure aerial conductor shall be continuously insulated with a durable and efficient material, to be approved by the Minister, and shall be further efficiently protected on the outside against injury by removal or abrasion. If this protection be wholly or partly metallic, it shall be efficiently connected with earth.

20. *Attachment of aerial lines.*—All aerial lines shall be attached to insulators, and shall be so guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors shall not be attached to the insulators by uninsulated metal binders.

21. *Height from ground and distance from buildings, &c.*—An aerial line shall not in any part thereof be at a less height from the ground than 20 feet, or within 5 feet measured horizontally, or 7 feet measured vertically, from any building or erection other than a support for the line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of supply.

22. *Service lines from aerial lines.*—Service lines from aerial lines shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance, and from this point of attachment they shall be enclosed and protected in accordance with the subsequent regulations as to electric lines on the consumer's premises. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building but is within 7 feet from the building shall be completely enclosed in stout indiarubber tubing.

23. *Protection of telegraph and telephone wires from interference.*—Except where otherwise permitted by the Minister, in the case of aerial conductors carrying alternating currents, the two conductors constituting the lead and return for any circuit shall be run parallel with each other, and at a distance apart not exceeding 18 inches; and the position of such lead and return shall be interchanged by crossing every half-mile, or at least once in any shorter length of parallel telegraph or telephone wire, which would be liable to induction.

24. *Conductors not to be placed on telegraph or telephone poles.*—In no case, without special permission from the Postmaster-General, the Board of Land and Works, or the Victorian Railways Commissioners, shall any aerial conductor be attached to any pole or support carrying a telegraph or telephone wire belonging to the Postmaster-General, the said Board, or Commissioners.

25. *Protection of telegraph and telephone lines from induction.*—Every aerial conductor shall be placed and used with due regard to electric lines and works from time to time used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the currents in such electric lines and works, and every reasonable means shall be employed in the placing and use of aerial conductors, to prevent telegraph and telephone wires being injuriously affected, whether by induction or otherwise, to the entire satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, the Board of Land and Works, or the Victorian Railways Commissioners, as the case may be.

26. *Angle of crossing thoroughfares.*—Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the spans shall be as short as possible.

27. *Crossing wires, &c.*—Where any aerial line is erected so as to cross one or more telegraph, telephone, or other wires, it may pass over, under, or, where specially permitted by the Minister, between such wires, provided precautions are taken to keep such line at least 1 foot clear of the other wires in all directions; and both the aerial line and the telegraph and telephone wires shall be respectively affixed to separate supports, placed within 6 feet of the point of intersection where practicable, but in no case to exceed 10 feet, and further protected from coming in contact, under any circumstances, by guard irons or wires; all such guard irons or wires to be efficiently connected with earth.

28. *Suspending wires.*—Every aerial line having a sectional area greater than 7, No. 16, S.W.G., shall be suspended, by means of non-metallic ligaments, to a suspending wire, securely affixed to the support, and efficiently connected with earth at every point of support. Every such suspending wire shall be in lengths not exceeding 300 feet, and shackled with insulating shackles. Where the conducting wires are crossed, as provided in regulation 23, the suspending wires shall also be crossed in the same manner. All suspending wires, if of iron or steel, shall be galvanized.

29. *Discharge of pressure in case of fire.*—In the case of any high-pressure aerial line exceeding one-half mile in total length, means shall be provided whereby the pressure may be discharged from any portion of the line erected over or alongside of any building or buildings without loss of time in case of fire or other emergency.

30. *Maintenance.*—Every aerial line, including its supports and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions. Every support shall bear a distinctive mark approved by the Minister to indicate the ownership.

31. *Disused aerial lines to be removed.*—No aerial line or support or attachment thereto shall remain erected for more than one month after it has ceased to be in use, unless the undertakers intend, within a period not exceeding three months, to take it again into use, and shall give notice of such intention to the Minister.

32. *Bare conductors for long distances.*—For the purpose of transmission of electrical energy over long distances the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Minister, after due inquiry by the Minister, and on his being satisfied that the public safety will not be endangered thereby, grant permission, under special conditions, for the erection of bare conductors overhead in sparsely populated districts, and beyond the area of cities and towns.

#### ELECTRIC LINES OTHER THAN AERIAL LINES.

33. *Construction of receptacles for electrical lines.*—All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and where laid under carriage ways shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic; and reasonable means shall be taken by the undertakers to prevent accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

34. *Crossing pipes, &c.*—Where any electric line crosses, or is in proximity to, any metallic substance, special precautions shall be taken by the undertakers against the possibility of any electrical discharge to the metallic substance from the line or from any metal conduit pipe or casing enclosing the line.

35. *Electric continuity of metal conduits, pipes, and casings.*—All metal conduits, pipes, or casings containing any electric line shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical connexion throughout their whole length.

36. *Precautions against charging of short lengths of pipe, &c.*—Where isolated lengths of metal conduit, pipe, or casing are used for the protection of any electric line at road crossings or similar positions, special precautions shall be taken to prevent the possibility of any electrical charging thereof.

37. *Precautions to be taken when bare conductors are used.*—Where the conductors of electric lines placed in any conduit are not continuously covered with insulating material, they shall be secured in position, and no unfixed uninsulated material of a conducting nature shall be contained in the conduit. No such conductor shall be at a higher potential than 300 volts.

Adequate precautions shall also be taken to insure that no accumulation of water shall take place in any part of the conduit, and to prevent any dangerous access of moisture to the conductors or the insulators.

In the case of any such electric lines laid in conduits, the insulators shall be so disposed that they can be readily inspected.

38. *High-pressure lines laid above ground.*—Every portion of any high-pressure electric line placed above the surface of the ground, or in any subway not in the sole occupation of the undertakers, shall be completely enclosed either in a tube of highly insulating material embedded in brickwork, masonry, or cement concrete, or in strong metal casing efficiently connected with earth.

39. *High-pressure lines laid in proximity to other electric lines or to the surface of the ground.*—Where any high-pressure electric line is laid beneath the surface of the ground, efficient means shall be taken to render it impossible that the surface of the ground or any neighbouring electric line or conductor shall become charged by leakage from the high-pressure electric line.

#### STREET BOXES.

40. *Street boxes.*—In addition to the provisions contained in Regulation 33 as to the construction of receptacles for electric lines, the following regulations shall be observed with respect to the construction of street boxes :—

- (a) The covers of all street boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened, except by means of a special appliance.
- (b) The covers of all street boxes containing high-pressure apparatus other than cables shall be connected to strips of metal laid immediately underneath the adjacent roadway, and efficient means shall be taken to render it impossible that the covers or other exposed parts of these boxes, or any adjacent material forming the surface of the street, shall become electrically charged, whether by reason of leakage, defect, or otherwise.
- (c) Where street boxes are used as transformer chambers, reasonable means shall be taken to prevent as far as possible any influx of water, either from the adjacent soil, or by means of pipes; and in the case of any such street box exceeding 1 cubic yard in capacity, ample provision shall be made, by ventilation or otherwise, for the immediate escape of any gas which may by accident have obtained access to the box, and for the prevention of danger from sparking.
- (d) All street boxes shall be regularly inspected for the presence of gas, and if any influx or accumulation is discovered the undertakers shall give immediate notice to the council or company whose gas mains are laid in the neighbourhood of the street box.

#### TRANSFORMING STATIONS.

41. *Transforming stations.*—Transforming stations, or points in a system of distribution in which a high-pressure supply is transformed for the purpose of supply to consumers, and which are not on the consumer's premises, shall be established in suitable places which are in the sole occupation and charge of the undertakers.

Where transformers are attached to street poles they shall be securely fixed thereto at a height of at least 18 feet above ground, and shall be provided with switches and fusible cut-outs placed in the lead and return of the high pressure or extra high-pressure conductors, in such a manner that the transformer can be completely disconnected from the supply mains, and the whole apparatus shall be enclosed in a watertight covering, which, if of metal, shall be efficiently connected to earth, and necessary precautions shall be taken to render it impossible for the low-pressure or secondary conductors to receive current from the high-pressure or primary conductors.

#### CONSUMER'S PREMISES.

42. *Responsibility of undertakers for their lines, &c., on consumer's premises.*—The undertakers shall be responsible for all electric lines, fittings, and apparatus belonging to them or under their control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

43. *Fire risks.*—In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the undertakers shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

44. *Main fuses or disconnectors.*—A suitable safety fuse or other automatic disconnector shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction, except in cases where the service line is protected by fuses in a street box.

45. *Treatment of electric lines and apparatus on consumer's premises.*—All electric lines and apparatus placed on a consumer's premises shall be highly insulated and thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture, and any metal forming part of the electric circuit shall not, unless efficiently connected with earth, be exposed so that it can be touched. All electric lines shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

46. *Transformers and high-pressure apparatus to be enclosed in metal, &c.*—Where the general supply of energy is a high-pressure supply, and transforming apparatus is installed on a consumer's premises, the whole of the high-pressure service lines, conductors, and apparatus, including the transforming apparatus itself so far as they are on the consumer's premises, shall be completely enclosed in solid walls, or in strong metal casing efficiently connected with earth, and securely fastened throughout.

47. *Connexion to consumer's premises not to be made where leakage would result.*—The undertakers shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with their mains unless they are reasonably satisfied that the connexion would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises; and where the undertakers decline to make such connexion they shall serve upon the consumer a notice stating their reasons for so declining.

48. *Discontinuance of supply on discovery of leakage on consumer's premises.*—If the undertakers are reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the undertakers, then and in such case any officer of the undertakers, duly authorized by them in writing, or, if the undertakers so require, an electric inspector may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, by notice require the consumer at some reasonable time after the service of the notice to permit him to inspect and test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

In any case where the undertakers require the services of an electric inspector under this regulation they shall pay him the prescribed fee.

If, on such testing, the officer or the electric inspector discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the undertakers shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice of the discontinuance to the consumer, and shall not recommence the supply until they are reasonably satisfied that the leakage has been removed. This regulation shall not affect any power contained in the Order or otherwise enabling the undertakers to discontinue the supply.

49. *Appeal to electric inspector.*—If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the undertakers in refusing to give or in discontinuing or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application and on payment of the prescribed fee, be tested for the existence of leakage by an electric inspector.

This regulation shall be indorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding regulations.

#### ARC LIGHTING.

50. *Arc lamps to be guarded.*—All arc lamps shall be so guarded as to prevent pieces of ignited carbon or broken glass falling from them, and shall not be used in situations where there is any danger of the presence of explosive dust or gas.

51. *Height from ground.*—Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting, except where suspended over the roadway, shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 feet from the ground. If suspended over the roadway of any street, arc lamps shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 20 feet from the ground.

52. *Cut-off switch.*—Arc lamps used in any street for private lighting shall be fixed so as not to be in any part at a less height than 8 feet from the ground, and shall be so screened as to prevent risk of contact with persons. A cut-off switch, fixed in a suitable locked receptacle, shall be provided for every such high-pressure arc lamp, and such switch shall be of such pattern and construction as will provide—

- (a) That the lamp can by its means be entirely disconnected from the supply circuit;
- (b) That the switch itself can be safely operated in the dark without special precautions; and
- (c) That there shall be no danger of any injurious electrical arcing, sparking, or heating being caused by the operation of the switch.

53. *Penalties for default.*—If the undertakers make default in complying with any of the preceding regulations, they shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such default, and to a daily penalty not exceeding £10.

The recovery of a penalty under these regulations shall not affect the liability of the undertakers to make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

These regulations are made subject to the power of the Governor in Council to make such further or other regulations as he may think expedient, and nothing in these regulations shall be construed to authorize the undertakers to lay any electric line or work their undertaking otherwise than in accordance with the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* and the Order granted to them.

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £711 8s. in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said-recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of £711 8s., being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the *Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1896*, as a loan to the said shire of Pyalong for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £711 8s. be paid to the council in one instalment of £711 8s.

That the said sum of £711 8s. be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £711 8s. be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £711 8s. to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £711 8s. be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years, by annual instalments of not less than £71 2s. 10d. each. application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1896, as a loan to the said shire of Benalla for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £525 be paid to the council in one instalment of £525.

That the said sum of £525 be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £525 be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £525 to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway but shall remain



subject to the right-of-way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Woorayl has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

Six acres thirty-five perches, county of Buln Buln, parish of Nerrena, being part of allotment 37D: Commencing at the south-west angle of the said allotment; bounded thence by allotment 37E bearing N. 30° 5' W. forty-five chains seventeen links; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 1° 47' W. seventeen chains thirty-eight links, N. 88° 13' E. one chain, S. 1° 47' E. seventeen chains thirteen links, and S. 30° 5' E. forty-four chains seventy-two links; and thence by a road bearing S. 48° 42' W. one chain two links to the point of commencement,

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following addition to Schedule No. 1 to the Regulations relating to Drawbacks, and doth order that such addition shall have effect from the 1st day of March, 1896, inclusive (that is to say):—

**REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE SHEPPARTON COMMON.**

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Shepparton Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' licensees, and farmers residing within a distance of 10 miles from the common on the east side of the Goulburn River, or within a distance of 5 miles from the common in any other

direction, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every horse, Six shillings per annum.  
For every head of other large cattle, Five shillings per annum.  
For every sheep or goat, Five shillings per annum.

3. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. All licences applied for and issued during the currency of a term shall be subject to the full rate, but in case of removal of any stock already licensed an equivalent number may be placed in their stead for the unexpired term of the licence, provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman, in writing, an account of such number and the description of the same.

5. Before any stock are placed on the common they shall be duly registered and delivered to the herdsman, who shall be in attendance at the mustering yards.

6. No stock shall be allowed to depasture on the common unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.

7. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall assist at the bi-annual mustering; or, in default, pay Sixpence for every head they may have depasturing on the common.

8. No entire horse or bull over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

9. No person shall remove horses, cattle, sheep, or goats from the common without first notifying the herdsman.

10. All stock affected with any contagious disease shall be removed from the common by the owners within twenty-four (24) hours after notice to do so has been served upon them by the herdsman, and, in default of compliance therewith, the managers may destroy such stock at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

No. 1126) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Act to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and that upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby extend the provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* aforesaid to the Shire of Charlton.
