CLOSE SEASON FOR MURRAY FISH.

NETTING IN YARRAM CREEK SWAN BAY, AND SWAN PONDS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke all existing proclamations relating to netting at the mouth of Yarram Creek and in Swan Bay and Swan Ponds, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation as under:—

1. Defining the limit of the mouth of Yarram Creek within which trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines are not to be used as a line running from the extreme outward or seaward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such creek enter Swan Bay.

2. Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines in the waters of Swan Bay and Swan Ponds to the westward of a line bearing north-east by east half-east from the Spit north of the Queenscliff Old Jetty to Swan Beacon and a line bearing north half-east from Swan Beacon to the White Beacon on the shore abreast of the middle red buoy in Cole's Channel.

Section 125 of Act 1098.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF LANCEFIELD.

By-Law No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Lancefield, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby make the following By-law, being No. 1 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area, namely:—

Commencing at a point 3 chains east and 10 chains north of the south-west corner of the Lancefield pre-emptive right; thence proceeding south 2,044 links to a point 1 chain east of the eastern boundary of Main-road; thence west crossing Main-road and along the southern boundary of Chancery-street to a point in line with the western boundary of Park-street; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of Park-street to the south-western corner of Park and High-streets; thence north-east across High-street along the eastern boundary of Park-street to the north-western corner of Noel-street; thence south-east along the north side of Noel-street to a point situated at the north-eastern corner of Noel-street and Main-road; thence crossing Main-road in a north-easterly direction to the starting point.

3. The Council will not accept as sufficient for any house any earth-closet or privy unless it be in the form of an earth-closet,

which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three (3) inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access, for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings and flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

4. Every occupier, and every person having the management or control of any house or premises, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil, which may be deposited in the pans, stand, or such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pans, &c.

5. The contents of the pan in use in every earth-closet shall, when full, but not less frequently than once a week, be removed to such place as the Council may have appointed.

6. No one but the person authorized by the Council shall be employed by the occupier of any house or premises for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove the same except in case of exemption.

7. Every occupier of premises from which night-soil is removed shall pay to the officer appointed by the Council such fee for removal per pan as the Council may fix for each year, and such fee shall be payable on demand by the authorized officer of the Council, and may be recovered from the occupier or owner as a debt due to the Council and incurred by the authority of such occupier or owner.

8. This by-law may be cited as "A by-law for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans."

9. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds) nor less than 5s. (Five shillings).

Health Act 1890.

INTRODUCTION OF HIDES INTO VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of June, 1896.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of an animal, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever. And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

- Introduction of unsalted hides forbidden.*—The introduction into Victoria from Queensland of unsalted hides of cattle is hereby prohibited.
- Introduction of salted hides.*—Before any hides are landed at any place within Victoria from any vessel the master of such vessel shall produce to the Chief Inspector of Stock a certificate from an inspector of stock at the port of shipment verifying that such hides have been thoroughly and effectively salted.
- Breach of Order.*—No person shall do or attempt to do, or omit from doing, or cause or omit to be done or attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempt to do any act directed or forbidden by this Order, or obtain or endeavour to obtain or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this Order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or any person acting under the authority of this Order.
- Penalties.*—All persons offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

This Order shall take effect from and after the 11th July, 1896.

That the said sum of £67 be paid to the council in one instalment of £67.

That the said sum of £67 be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £67 be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SALE OF TOBACCO, CIGARS, AND SNUFF.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of June, 1896.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1082) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such Regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. 22 of the Regulations relating to the manufacture and sale of tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and snuff which were made by Order dated the 28th day of January, 1896, and also the Fourth Schedule to the said Regulations, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The regulation fee for a licence to sell tobacco, cigars, and snuff shall be Five shillings per annum.
2. The term for an annual licence shall be from the 1st July to the 30th June following.
3. Such annual licences may be issued by the authorized issuers during the months of June and July in each year, and shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto.
4. On and after the 1st August in any year licences for the unexpired portion of the year ending 30th June following may be issued, the fee for which shall be at the rate of Fivepence per month. Such licences shall commence on the 1st day of the month in which they are issued, and terminate on 30th June following, and shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto.
5. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st July, 1896.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.—BY-LAW No. 6.

WATER SUPPLY.

Preamble. WHEREAS the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works did on the 29th day of May, 1894, make and pass a By-law No. 4, and intitled "A by-law to alter and amend By-law No. 3, and to make other provisions with regard to the charges and rate for water supply, and for the levying of such rates and charges," which by-law was published in the Government Gazette on the 1st, 8th, and 15th June, 1894, and it is expedient to alter and amend certain of the provisions of the said by-law.

1. Be it and it is hereby enacted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "The Board") that at and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, repeal of por- section 7 of the hereinbefore mentioned by-law tion of By- shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed, and it law No. 4. is hereby further enacted as follows:—

Hire of meter 2. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not and rate of otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for rent thereof, which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of:—

- For 1/4-inch meter, Five shillings.
For 1/2 inch meter, Six shillings.
For 1-inch meter, Eight shillings.
For 1 1/2 inch meter, Ten shillings and sixpence.
For 1 1/2-inch meter, Fourteen shillings.

And for other than inferential meters the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 per cent. upon the cost of each such meter, or as near to such rate as can be conveniently calculated, such Meter rent to rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the be exclusive amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the com- Hire meter to mence of the then-current quarter: such meter cost of hire shall be fixed at cost of the hire on his premises and main- where directed by an officer of the Board, but shall tained at cost be kept in repair at cost of the Board, except in of Board. case of its receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

Testing 3. In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with meters. the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him, but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be Hirer to give returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter notice of from the Board, who shall leave the premises on removal. which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Water supply for closets. 4. Every consumer of water who shall receive his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to Seven shillings and sixpence per annum on account of each water-closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through, and be recorded by such meter, save and except in the case of factories or premises having a range of privy closets receiving their water flush from one flushing-cistern, in each of which cases the allowance of deduction shall be Five shillings per annum for each privy seat in such range.

Licence to plumbers under Water Act and by-law not to apply to sewerage. 5. A licence, issued in conformity with the provisions of *Water Act 1890*, or any Act repealed thereby, or any by-law or regulation thereunder, shall not authorize the holder thereof to do any kind of work connected with the sanitary fittings of houses or the sewerage system.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the 23rd day of June, 1896, in the presence of—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE PARISH OF BOROONDARA, AT CAMBERWELL.

WE, Edward Dillon, William Ryall, Herbert Burgess Barrett, James Hamilton Reid, Thomas Wakeham Gaggin, and Powell Buxton Lincoln, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order of 9th October, 1882, as a site for Public Gardens in the parish of Boroondara, at Camberwell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges, for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be divided as follows:—
 1. Pavilion, members', and ladies' reserves.
 2. The playing ground.
 3. The remainder of the reserve.
2. All persons shall be admitted to the third division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon cup or other important cricket or football matches shall be played in the reserve, or on days on which sports shall be held therein.
3. No person shall enter into any part of the first division, except on production of a ticket issued from time to time by the committee of management of the reserve, duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
4. Every person paying for admission to the reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day or days for which it is issued.
5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding

Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures; and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures, for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, or leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones thereon.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any building in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto, or to any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

(d) Being found in any part of the first, second, or third division of the reserve, save as herein provided; and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to him has been lost.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third division when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

14. The scale of charges for admission to the members' and ladies' reserves and the third division of the reserve shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of each person to the third division during any cup or other important cricket or football match or sports, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

(b) For admission of each person to the members' and ladies' reserves, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

Provided that the committee of management may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber which, at a height of 2 feet from the surface of the ground, is of a less diameter than 24 inches, on or from the Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:—

Counties of Grant, Talbot, Dalhousie, and Bourke, parishes of Korweinguboora, Moorabool East, Moorabool West, Deam, Wombat, Glenlyon, Bullarto, Coliban, Trentham, Blackwood, Coormull, Woodend, Bullengarook, and Macedon, being the lands formerly included in the *Wombat State Forest*, but excised therefrom by the *Crown Lands Reserves Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1347), and by Proclamations of the 16th December, 1884, and the 30th September, 1895: Excepting such portions as are legally occupied.—(96.F.498.)

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:

BULLARTO.—The Proclamation bearing date the 2nd July, 1894, by which certain lands situate in the parish of Bullarto, and comprising an area of six hundred and fifty-four acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz. —Six acres eight perches, county of Talbot, parish of Bullarto, being allotment 44 of section 1.—(96.M.114(L.S.))

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. 13. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3.
