### SPLITTING OR GRINDING OF PEAS IN BOND.— REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined Regulations relating to the Splitting or Grinding in bond of Peas for exportation only; such Regulations to date from the 8th July, 1896.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The splitting or grinding of peas in bond will be allowed for exportation only.
2. Applications must be made in writing specifying the warehouse in which it is desired that splitting or grinding peas in bond shall be carried on.
3. The building shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and must be constructed of stone or brick.
4. The peas to be split or ground shall be removed into the grinding and splitting room, and after being split or ground shall be returned into the bond before being delivered for exportation.
5. The splitting or grinding house, as well as the places appointed for bonding purposes, shall be secured under the locks of the Customs Department.
6. The proprietor or occupier shall provide at his own cost all such locks and weighing machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable locker's office, and shall keep the same in good repair.
7. Peas may be entered direct from the ship, or transferred from any bonded warehouse to the receiving store, into which they must be weighed and a correct account thereof kept by the locker.
8. The hours of attendance shall be the same as at the other bonded warehouses, but if any extended time be required the same may be allowed by the Collector. The charge made for the attendance of an officer during ordinary bonding hours shall be at the rate of Two shillings per hour, and for any time beyond the charge shall be as laid down in the regulations for overtime for lockers.

**T**HE ACTING VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed.

**CHARGES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—**

1. Bicycles, packed in cases not exceeding 27 cubic feet, for use as samples only, may accompany *bonâ fide* agents by passenger trains on payment of half ordinary Parcels Rates, without any additional admeasurement charge.

**CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—**

1. Kauri Edgings to be charged Firewood rates and conditions.
2. Pyrites Colour to be charged C Class rate, minimum 1 ton; lots of 6 tons and upwards, for export, will be allowed rebate to B Class on production of proof of export.
3. Rabbit Boxes (empty) and Wooden Poles for carrying Rabbits, to be charged on same scale as Fish Baskets.
4. Sulphate of Ammonia to be charged First Class rate.
5. Wire Rope, in lots of not less than 6 tons, to be charged First Class rate.
6. Firewood from Gordons to Mount Blowhard to be charged the 28-mile rate.
7. Rates to and from Portland Freezing Company's Siding :—
  - (1) Ordinary traffic between the Siding and Stations other than Portland to be charged 2s. 6d. per truck, with a minimum charge of 10s. per trip, in addition to Portland mileage rate. Inward Goods to be signed for at Portland before being sent out to the Siding. Outward Goods to be consigned more or less.
  - (2) Frozen Meat between the Siding and Portland to be charged—
    - Per T Truck of 8 tons, 18s. 9d.
    - Per Tt Truck of 12 tons, 25s.
 Minimum per trip, 6 trucks. To be consigned at owners' risk, and loaded and discharged by owners.
  - (3) Ordinary traffic between Portland and the Siding to be charged Classification rates, with a minimum of 15s. per truck.

8. Colonial Wine in bulk to be charged C Class rate, minimum 1s., when it is cheaper than A Class rate, with First Class minimum.
9. General Earthenware, in lots of not less than 5 tons per truck, from Epsom to Melbourne and Suburbs, to be charged at same rate as Earthenware Pipes.
10. Empty Cases, second-hand (not Returned Empties), to be charged B Class rate, when in lots of 2 tons and upwards. Small lots to be charged C rate, minimum 6d.
11. Leather from Heyfield to Melbourne to be charged 24s. 5d. per ton, First Class minimum.
12. Wool Packs, in lots of 6 tons and upwards, to be charged B Class rate.
13. Lignite from Lal Lal to be charged same rate as Victorian Coal.
14. Empty Tins, in cases, for Compressed Vegetables, from Melbourne to Timboon to be charged A Class rate and conditions.

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The Vermin Destruction Acts.  
SHIRE OF WARANGA.—LOAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of July, 1896.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Turner	Mr. Williams

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Vermin Destruction Acts it is among other things provided that, on the application of the council of any shire, the Governor in Council, out of any trust funds or moneys under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Acts: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Waranga has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area) describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan an amount sufficient to purchase materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing not exceeding four lineal miles of fencing to every owner, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner [and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence, and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence] and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, with interest in the meantime at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on the amount of the value of such materials or on the value of so much thereof as is unpaid for, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*:

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £285 16s. in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said-recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of £285 16s., being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the *Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1896*, as a loan to the said shire of Waranga for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £285 16s. be paid to the council in one instalment of £285 16s.

That the said sum of £285 16s. be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £285 16s. be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £285 16s. to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £285 16s. be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years, by annual instalments of not less than £28 11s. 8d. each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the 31st May, 1897, and a further instalment of not less than £28 11s. 8d. on or before the 31st May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of £285 16s. is repaid.

## PART IV.—MOUNTED RIFLES.

To section II. (Regulations) the following paragraph is added:—

*Entrainment of Horses.*

- "14. The senior officer, non-commissioned officer, or soldier at all stations where Mounted Rifle horses are entrained for purpose of proceeding to camp or parade shall inspect the horses prior to entrainment.  
"Stallions or horses younger than three years of age, or with sore backs or patent injuries, shall not be allowed to entrain.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and orders respecting the enrolment and disbanding of any volunteer corps, the appointment, promotion, and rank of all volunteer officers, and the relative rank of such officers and of the officers of any military and naval force and officers holding any military or naval staff appointment in the service of the Government of Victoria, the requisites to require a volunteer to be deemed an effective, the constitution, assembling, and proceedings of courts of inquiry to hear, receive, and examine evidence relating to and to report on any matter connected with the government or discipline of the volunteer force, or of any corps thereof, or on any charge brought against a member of any such corps, the maintenance of discipline, the power of arrest, the payment and recovery of subscriptions, fines, and penalties, and the general government, discipline, and management of the volunteer force and the several corps thereof, and the persons appointed to the paid staff of or serving for pay in the said force, and may from time to time alter or repeal any such regulations and orders, and may call for such returns as may from time to time seem requisite: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for Volunteer Cadet Corps, and, in accordance with the provisions of section 81 of the above in part recited Act, doth direct that the same shall apply to all Volunteer Cadet Corps enrolled within Victoria, that is to say:—

Paragraph 29 is cancelled, and the following is substituted thereof, viz:—

29. Commissioned officers unable to maintain an effective Detachment, or to remain actively connected with the Cadet Corps, may be placed upon the Unattached List of the Cadet Corps. Failing a return of active duty within two years, their Commissions may be withdrawn for non-effectiveness.

Paragraph 30 is cancelled.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE GRAYTOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Graytown Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of 5 miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four

(4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable annually, in advance, at the time of registration.

For every horse, Four shillings per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, Three shillings per annum.

For every sheep, One shilling per annum.

For every goat, Sixpence per annum.

4. The herdsman shall use due vigilance over all stock branded and received on the common, so as to prevent straying. Should, however, any stock be missed from the common he shall give a written notice to the owner or owners thereof within three days by delivering such notice at his or their known place of abode, and render aid in finding the missing stock, but the managers or the herdsman shall not be responsible for any stock lost from the common.

5. No person shall be permitted to herd the stock depastured by him on the common, nor remove them therefrom, without the knowledge of the herdsman. If, however, in the interim of the periods which may from time to time be fixed for branding, any owner intends to remove his stock, or any portion thereof, from the common, he may do so by delivering a written notice to the herdsman of his intention, specifying the stock proposed to be removed and the day of removal, and the stock so removed may be replaced by an equal number of others or their equivalent, upon being produced to the herdsman for branding and registration, and paying a fee of Sixpence each to the managers. Any breach of this Regulation shall exonerate the herdsman from any further responsibility in respect of stock belonging to such owner.

6. Bulls and entire horses shall not be allowed on the common without the written authority of the managers.

7. All stock intended for depasturing on the common shall, in the first instance, be produced to the herdsman by the owner or his representative at the common yard for branding and registration, and the owner shall furnish the herdsman with written particulars of the private brands and the description of the stock, and at each periodical branding the owner shall render the herdsman all reasonable aid in mustering his stock.

8. The common register shall be open for inspection by any person who shall have stock registered and running on the common every Saturday between the hours of Eleven a.m. and Two p.m., free of charge.

9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed on the common.

10. No pigs shall be allowed on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

**WHEREAS** by Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies, under the said Part of the said Act, blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*; and that, except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land: And whereas by certain Proclamations as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Part of the said *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, certain lands respectively described in such Proclamations were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part each of such Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

A By-law of the City of Ballarat, made under the *Factories and Shops Acts* and numbered 79, for closing all shops of any particular class other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, within the municipality of the said city for one afternoon in each week, and for imposing a penalty on any shopkeeper failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and in compliance with a petition presented to the Council of the City of Ballarat, and certified to by its municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class of produce dealers and produce merchants within such municipal district to be affected hereby, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballarat order as follows:—

1. That every shopkeeper keeping a shop for the sale of farming produce and other goods of the class usually sold by produce dealers and produce merchants shall close such shop or cause the same to be closed on Friday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon. Provided always that in the event of any such shops being closed in any week for a public holiday on any day other than Friday, on the Friday immediately preceding such holiday the shop may be kept open until the usual closing hour.

2. That any produce dealer or produce merchant keeping a shop for the sale of farming or other produce and other goods of the class usually sold by produce dealers and produce merchants failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) sterling.
