NETTING IN YARRAM CREEK, SWAN BAY, AND SWAN PONDS.

It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke all existing proclamations relating to netting at the mouth of Yarram Creek and in Swan Bay and Swan Ponds, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation as under:—

1. Defining the limit of the mouth of Yarram Creek within which trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines are not to be used as a line running from the extreme outward or seaward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such creek enter Swan Bay.

2. Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines in the waters of Swan Bay and Swan Ponds to the westward of a line bearing north-east by cast half-east from the Spit north of the Queenscliff Old Jetty to Swan Beacon and a line bearing north half-east from Swan Beacon to the White Beacon on the shore abreast of the middle red buoy in Cole's Channel.

STEAM-SHIP "AUSTRALIEN" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

STEAM-SHIP "AUSTRALIEN" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1820 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infections or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship Australien has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case reported to be one of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria. And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, nor be taken or person authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigation, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore unde




