NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above-named Act and the regulations made thereunder, every person and company liable to make any return under the said Act or regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 3rd day of February, 1896.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

ENVELOPE DEPARTMENT OF MESSRS. SANDS AND McDUGALL'S
FACTORY AT SPENCER-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of two weeks from the 22nd January, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than nineteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said nineteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than fifteen shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR CUTTING UP PLUSH, SILK,
AND WOOLLEN CLOTHS IN BOND.

WHEREAS in the Fourth Schedule of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, it is amongst other things provided that plush cut up into sizes or lengths for covering furniture, silk cut up into sizes and lengths for making neckties, and woollen cloths cut up into sizes or lengths for making caps under Regulations to be made by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may be delivered free of duty: Now therefore I, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, hereby make the following regulations under which the above-mentioned goods may be admitted duty free:—

1. The goods shall be imported in the piece and cut in Victoria.
2. Before delivery of the goods by the landing waiter, an application shall be made by the importer to the Inspector of Drawbacks for permission to cut up, and for the services of an officer to superintend the cutting.
3. The officer appointed to superintend the cutting shall accompany the goods from the landing place to the premises where they are to be cut, and shall remain and supervise the cutting.
4. Plush for furniture covering shall be cut into sizes suitable for single articles of furniture.
5. Silk for neckties shall have a strip not less than 6 inches wide cut off the full length of the piece, and the remainder shall be cut into lengths of not more than 50 inches; or, if it be desired that the material should be cut diagonally, the strip need not be taken off, but each cut piece shall not exceed 36 inches in length.
6. Woollen cloth for caps shall be cut into pieces of the actual sizes and shapes required for the caps.
7. The cutting up shall be completed on the same day that the goods are delivered, or failing this, a sum equal to the duty on the material in the piece shall be deposited with the Collector of Customs until such time as the cutting has been completed.
8. Should an extension of time for completing the cutting be required, an application for the further services of an officer shall be made to the Inspector of Drawbacks, who may allow the same on payment of overtime.

GIPPSLAND LAKES.—ENTRANCE TO MITCHELL RIVER AND WESTERN ENTRANCE TO McLENNAN'S STRAITS.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners published 6th February, 1889, notice is hereby given that on or before Monday, the 27th January, 1896, the Light erected on a point of land on the Bumberrah Shore, about two cables length from the beacon marking the entrance to the Mitchell River, will be discontinued, and in lieu thereof an all-round White Light will be exhibited from a new beacon erected in 10 feet of water on the south side of the Mitchell River, and marking the entrance thereto; also, that the Red and White Light erected on the north bank of the Mitchell River will be discontinued, and in lieu thereof an all-round Red Light will be exhibited from a new beacon erected in 6 feet of water marking the west side of the entrance to Jones' Bay, and in line with the existing beacons which mark the north side of the Mitchell River.

It is also notified that about five cables to the northward of the old beacons two new ones have been erected marking a navigable depth of 10 feet at low water from the western entrance to McLennan's Straits into Lake Wellington. The Light on the eastern bank of the western entrance to McLennan's Straits will also be removed in line with the new beacons, which are surmounted by basket balls.



The births of 1,041 children, viz., 552 boys and 489 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. In the month of November 1,063 births were registered, or 22 more than in the month under review. The births were slightly more numerous than in the corresponding month of the preceding two years, but much fewer than in any other month of December since 1887; they were also 154 below the average of the month, and 173 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 751, viz., 398 of males and 353 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 290, or 39 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in November by 193, but were below the average of December during the previous ten years by 98. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 98. The deaths show a marked increase over the uniformly low level of December, 1893 and 1894, but were still fewer than in the corresponding month of any other previous years since 1884, except 1892.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.92, and of deaths registered 20.14 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.9° on the 8th, and the lowest was 45.3° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (64.4°) was the same as in December, 1894, and was two-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.9°) took place on the 8th, and the least range (11.5°) on the 25th. The mean daily range was 22.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.100 inches on the 22nd, and the lowest was 29.289 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.722 inches) was nearly one-seventh of an inch below the average, and the lowest record for December during the last eleven years.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.17 inches. The average rainfall in December during the previous ten years was 2.46 inches, or .29 of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 42 per cent. to that mortality, as against 39 per cent. in December, 1894; 45 per cent. in December, 1893; 49 per cent. in December, 1892; 54 per cent. in December, 1891; 44 per cent. in December, 1890; and 54 per cent. in December, 1889.

Fifty deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a collector and a female, each aged 75, died of apoplexy; a farmer and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; two females, each aged 75, of pneumonia and enteritis respectively; a plate-layer, aged 75, of injuries occasioned by a fall out of bed; a storeman, aged 76, of influenza; a female, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a pattern-maker, aged 76, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 76, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman and a dyer, each aged 76, of pneumonia; a laundryman, aged 76, of injuries received through being crushed in a lift; a female, aged 77, of syncope; a gentleman, a gardener, and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, of asthma; a carpenter, aged 77, of pneumonia;

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 11, and a labourer, aged 35, were passed over by railway trains; a boy, aged 6, by a jinker; and another, aged 8, was killed by the kick of a horse; a groom, aged 50, died of rupture of the intestines, caused by a horse falling on him; 8 persons died of injuries resulting from falls, viz., a jeweller, aged 20, who received a fracture of the skull by a fall from a bicycle; a seaman, aged 29, who fell from the mast of a steamer; a cab-driver, aged 58, who fell off his cab; a storekeeper, aged 30, who fractured the skull through jumping from a waggon in motion; a contractor, aged 57, who injured his head; two females, aged 65 and 70 respectively, who succumbed to fracture of the femur; and a platelayer, aged 75, of an injury to the hip; a laundryman, aged 76, was crushed in a lift; a wharf labourer, aged 53, died of fracture of a rib whilst lumping on the wharf; a boy, aged 11, of injury to the head through coming into collision with a tree; a female infant, aged 3 weeks, of injuries resulting from the father having accidentally sat upon her; a new-born female infant, of compression of the brain at birth; a female child, aged 8 months, and a female, aged 33, of burns; a female child, aged 9 months, of scalds; a male child, aged 2, of sunstroke; a boy, aged 4, of fish poisoning; a female child, aged 1, was accidentally drowned in a tub of water; a seaman, aged 33, and a clothing manufacturer, aged 48, were accidentally drowned, the former whilst drunk; 3 persons were drowned whilst bathing, viz., a boy, aged 11, at West Melbourne; a boy, aged 12, at Footscray; and a paper-bag maker, aged 29, whilst having a sea bath at St. Kilda; a female, aged 27, was found drowned in the river Yarra; a male infant, aged 3 days, was overlain; and a female infant, aged 5 months, was suffocated by the bedclothes. The homicidal deaths were those of a manager of the sanitary works, aged 22, who was shot; and a female, aged 29, who died from criminal abortion, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former, and of manslaughter in the latter case. The suicidal deaths were those of two gentlemen, aged 38 and 72 respectively, who shot themselves; a farmer, aged 99, who cut his throat; a carpenter, aged 50, and a labourer, aged 63, who drowned themselves; and a boilermaker, aged 66, who hanged himself.

One hundred and fifty-nine deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne Hospital, 21 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 7 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 12 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 15 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 319, of which 176, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 143, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 268 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 432. Of these, 222, or 51 per cent., were males, and 210, or 49 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 32 were between twenty and twenty-five, 33 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 51 were between sixty-five and seventy, 32 were between seventy and seventy-five, 30 were between seventy-five and eighty, 10 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 was ninety-nine years of age.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

In the month under review, as compared with the previous one, the increased mortality was distributed over the various classes of disease as follow:—24 under zymotic diseases, 133 under local diseases, 12 under violence, 25 under ill-defined causes, with slight variations in other classes. In the zymotic class, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 1 to 20, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 14 to 33, but those from influenza fell from 28 to 12; in the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 9 to 18, but those from old age fell from 21 to 14; and in the local class deaths from diseases of the nervous system rose from 57 to 87, those from enteritis from 46 to 118, from dentition from 7 to 12, and from other diseases of the digestive organs from 24 to 43; moreover, those from atrophy and debility also rose from 16 to 41. Fully two-thirds of the increases referred to were confined to infants and children under five years.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to influenza and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year, although the deaths from typhoid fever in the last twelve months were fewer than in any of the previous five years except 1893, those in December, 1895, were more numerous than in the corresponding month of any of those years:—

Security will be required either in Government debentures, Melbourne Savings Bank Deposit Book (in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board), or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified for tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The supplies are to be equal in every respect to the contract sample or specification, and are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

10. The packages, cases, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oatstraw, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 11th day of February, 1896, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted. Should the contractor desire to relinquish his contract he may be permitted to do so provided he pays over to the Postmaster-General a sum equal to 10 per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

12. 11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12.
