THE MT. PARADISE REFORMATORY SCHOOL FOR BOYS.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 316 of the Crimes Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1079), the Governor in Council has approved the premises of James Joseph Millane, known as "Mt. NOTE.—The births registered in the second quarter of 1896 numbered 8,201, and the deaths 3,737: the former having thus exceeded the latter by 4,464, or by 120 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year the births were fewer by 544, but the deaths more numerous by 14.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 18,492, and the recorded departures by sea 21,405, there having been thus an apparent net loss of 2,913. Adding to this an estimate for unrecorded departures, viz., 1,848, the actual loss by emigration is computed at 4,761, consisting of 3,276 males and 1,485 females. This loss was greater than in the corresponding quarter of the preceding year by 744, but less than in the preceding quarter by 2,901.

Owing to the large excess of emigration there was a net loss of population during the quarter of 297, resulting from a loss of 1,209 males, less a gain of 912 females, as shown in the table. An actual loss of population occurred on only three previous occasions since the Census of 1891, viz., one of 74 in the first quarter of 1895, one of 1,862 in the first quarter of 1894, and one of 4,010 in the first quarter of 1896.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 36,468, viz., 28,447 of males, and 8,021 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,213,912, viz., 627,599 males and 586,313 females.

In consequence of the migration returns being inflated by the inclusion of persons merely passing through Victorian ports en route to other countries, these returns are most misleading as a guide to the movements of population as between Victoria and other colonies and countries individually. Taking the records as they stand, however, they show an apparent balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales of 2,156, Tasmania of 1,181, New Zealand of 256, and South Australia of 34; but, on the other hand, a balance in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 3,771, the United Kingdom of 1,899, Foreign Ports of 485, Queensland of 278, and South Seas of 107. The recorded loss to Western Australia was 1,607 greater, and that to the United Kingdom 223 greater than in the corresponding quarter of 1895.

The net recorded emigration to Western Australia—which may, as pointed out on previous occasions, be regarded as the net movement of population not only from Victoria, but from the whole of Eastern Australasia to the western colony—was as follows during the last six and a half years:—786 in 1890, 1,960 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,255 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, and 13,533 during the first half of 1896: the total during the whole period being 41,520.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 66.

ABY-LAW of the Council of the Town of Port Melbourne made by the council of the town under the powers conferred by section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, for regulating the transferring of registrations taken out under the regulations made by the Board of Public Health under date of 4th March, 1890, for registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk. Whereas by section 2 of the regulations for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk adopted by the Board of Public Health under date of 4th March, 1890, it is set forth that every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy farm or milk store shall, on or before the 1st day of January in each year, register himself by signing and forwarding to the municipal clerk an application in the form therein set forth, and whereas such form specifies the place at which such business is to be carried on, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Port Melbourne, under and by virtue of the powers reposed in them under section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, do order as follows:—

1. That in the event of registration under the aforesaid regulations being effected, such registered person shall be permitted, upon the consent of the council being first had and obtained, to transfer the said registration for the same premises to some other person or persons duly approved of by the council.

2. That in the event of the said registered person wishing to transfer his registration to other premises within the jurisdiction of the council than that at first specified in the above-mentioned schedule he shall, upon the consent of the council being first had and obtained, and the premises to which the registration is proposed to be transferred being approved of by the Health Officer, be permitted so to do.

3. No further fee than that originally paid for the first registration under By-law No. 63 of the Town of Port Melbourne shall be demanded or received for any transference of registration under this by-law.

The foregoing by-law was duly adopted by the Council of the Town of Port Melbourne, at a special meeting held on Wednesday, 17th June, 1896, and confirmed at a special meeting held on 22nd July, 1896.





ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO MINING LEASES.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Mines Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1120) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part in respect to leases and licences, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind sub-clause (a) of Regulation 5 of the Regulations relating to Mining Leases, and doth substitute the following thereof (that is to say):—

(a) Erect posts, at least three inches square, and not less than three feet above the ground, as far as circumstances and occupiers will permit, to define accurately the boundaries and angles of the land, with a metal plate having painted thereon the words "Applied for lease" and the date of marking out, and the name of the applicant or (if more than two) the first two applicants legibly painted thereon; and in case only a portion of the surface is required the same shall be marked out by posts painted red, and at least two feet above the ground; and should such posts at any time during the pending of the application be removed or torn down, the applicant shall from time to time, on learning of such removal or tearing down, replace or restore the same, so that the posts may, if possible, be kept so erected and painted until the termination of the proceedings under these Regulations.

Fire Brigades Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNTRY FIRE BRIGADES BOARD AND LOCAL COMMITTEES OF COUNTRY FIRE DISTRICTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1896.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for (among other purposes) regulating the conduct of all elections; the preparation of rolls of brigades entitled to vote thereat; the mode in which nominations shall be made and polls taken thereat; the form of voting-papers; the mode in which brigades shall vote; and generally all matters whatsoever necessary for the proper carrying out thereof: And whereas certain regulations for the conduct of elections of members of the Country Fire Brigades Board and of elections for local committees of Country Fire Districts were made by the Governor in Council on the 28th day of November, 1892, applicable to the whole of Victoria, and whereas it is desirable that the said regulations should be repealed and others substituted therefor. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the regulations following applicable to those parts of Victoria known as the Nine Country Fire Districts as set forth in the First Schedule of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* aforesaid, and as amended by the various Proclamations by His Excellency the Governor, whereby certain portions of Country Fire Districts have been excised therefrom and other parts of Victoria included in Country Fire Districts, and to such other part or parts of Victoria as may hereafter be added to or included in any Country Fire District, that is to say:—

Fire Brigades Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNTRY FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

Repeal.

1. The regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 28th day of November, 1892, for the conduct of elections of members of the Country Fire Brigades Board are hereby repealed.

General.

2. Periodical elections of members for the Country Fire Brigades Board shall be held in the month of December in the year 1896, on a date to be fixed by the responsible Minister administering the Fire Brigades Act (hereinafter styled "the Minister"), and thereafter in the month of December in every second succeeding year, on a date to be fixed by him.

3. Elections to fill any vacancy occasioned by death, resignation, removal, or any cause other than retirement of a member through effluxion of time, shall be held within eight weeks after such vacancy is reported by the board to the Minister, on a date to be fixed by the Minister.

4. Twenty-eight (28) days at least before any election the Minister shall notify to the bodies entitled to vote the last day upon which nominations of persons proposed for election will be received, and such day shall be some day not less than fourteen (14) days before the election as the Minister may appoint.

5. Forthwith on receipt of the nomination of any candidate the returning officer shall notify such candidate that he has been nominated, and that he will be deemed to have consented thereto unless the returning officer receives from him, on or before a day to be named in the notice, being not more than seven days after the date of nomination, a written withdrawal of such candidate's name.

6. The returning officer, on receipt of any such notice of withdrawal within the specified time, shall omit or erase the name from the voting-papers, and if the number of candidates be thereby reduced to the number of persons to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith declare the remaining candidate or candidates duly elected.

7. In the event of an equality of votes, the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

8. Clauses 4, 5, 6, and 7, and the following regulations, shall apply to the conduct of both periodical and extraordinary elections.

Election of Representatives by Municipalities.

9. A list of the municipal councils of the municipalities, the municipal districts of which are within or partly within any country fire district, shall be furnished by the board to the Minister and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1896, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such municipal council omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof. Such list, with the name or names of any municipalities so added, shall be taken to be the roll of municipalities entitled to vote at the election of municipal representatives on the country board.

10. The council of each municipality within, or partly within, a country fire district may nominate for membership in the case of a periodical election two persons, or in the case of a casual vacancy one person.

11. In the nomination of candidates by councils, the proceedings in connexion therewith shall be conducted as nearly as may be as proceedings for the election of the mayor or president are conducted, or in accordance with any by-laws made by the council in that behalf.

12. The names or name of the persons or person nominated by the council of any municipality as aforesaid shall be forwarded to the returning officer so as to reach him not later than Four p.m. on the day appointed for receiving nominations.

13. If on the day appointed for receiving nominations not more than the number of candidates required to fill the vacancies or vacancy in respect of which such nomination is made are nominated, the returning officer shall forthwith declare the persons or person so nominated duly elected.

14. If on the day appointed for receiving nominations candidates in excess of the number of vacancies have been nominated the returning officer shall make out a list of the names of the persons nominated, and forthwith forward to the council of each municipality entitled to vote a copy of such list.

15. Each of such councils shall upon receipt of the list of candidates strike out therefrom the names of the persons other than those for whom the council desires to vote, leaving not more than a sufficient number of names to fill the vacancies or vacancy in question, and shall return such list to the returning officer so as to reach him not later than Four p.m. on the day of the election.

16. The returning officer upon receipt of such lists as have reached him within the prescribed time shall proceed to count the votes given for each candidate, and after having ascertained the number of votes given for each, declare elected the candidates or candidate, according to the number of vacancies to be filled, receiving the largest number of votes.

Election of Representatives by the Fire Insurance Companies.

17. A list of all fire insurance companies carrying on business and insuring property within country fire districts shall be furnished by the country board to the Minister and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1896, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such insurance company omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof. Such list, with the name or names of any insurance company so added, shall be taken to be the roll of insurance companies entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the country board.

18. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable addressed to each fire insurance company, the insurance companies may elect persons to be representative members on the country board.

19. The principal officer, representative, or agent in Victoria for the time being managing the fire business of an insurance company carrying on business in country fire districts shall be qualified to vote at any election for the same on behalf of such insurance company.

20. Fourteen days before any election every fire insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other superior officer, notify to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer, representative, or agent authorized to vote on behalf of such company.

21. The candidates or candidate for the board shall be nominated, in writing, by two voters, and such nomination paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than seven days prior to the date of the election, addressed to the secretary of such association, and the secretary of such association for the time being shall be the returning-officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to preside thereat.

22. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association or his deputy, shall report to the Minister the names or name of the persons or person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon declare such persons or person to be elected to the board, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

23. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association or his deputy shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day at which a poll will be taken.

24. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary or his deputy, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken by ballot at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct, and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

25. The person voting on behalf of any company at any election for the country board shall be entitled to vote in accordance with the following scale:—

If the company in respect of which the vote is cast has, under the 106th section of the *Stamps Act 1890*, returned for the year previous to the election a premium revenue of less than £2,000, one vote for each member to be elected.

If £2,000 but less than £4,000, two votes for each member to be elected.

If £4,000 but less than £6,000, three votes for each member to be elected.

If £6,000 but less than £8,000, four votes for each member to be elected.

If £8,000 and upwards, five votes for each member to be elected.

26. The secretary or his deputy shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling and in the presence of the scrutineers (if any), open and count the voting-papers, and such secretary or his deputy shall report the result of such poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidates or candidate having received the largest number of votes to be the representative members or member on the board for the insurance companies, and shall notify the same in the *Government Gazette*.

Election of Representatives by Registered Fire Brigades.

27. A list of all registered fire brigades within the various Country Fire Districts shall be furnished by the country board to the Minister, and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1896, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such registered brigade omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list, with the names of any brigades so added, shall be taken to be the roll of brigades entitled to vote at any election of fire brigade representatives on the country board.

28. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to every registered brigade on the roll of each country fire district, such fire brigades may nominate two persons, or, in the case of an extraordinary vacancy, one person, to be representative members or member on the country board.

29. In the nomination of candidates for fire brigades, the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of captain of the brigade.

30. The names or name of the persons or person so nominated shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the returning officer shall report to the Minister the names or name of the persons or person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon declare such persons or person to be elected to the board, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

31. If on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates shall have been nominated a list of all the persons so nominated by registered fire brigades shall be prepared and shall be forwarded to the registered fire brigades on the roll of each country fire district, and the secretary or the captain of each fire brigade, after having been duly authorized by a majority of the registered members thereof present at a properly constituted meeting, shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except those of the candidates or candidate for which such fire brigade desires to vote, and return the list so altered to the returning officer.

32. The returning officer shall, on the receipt of such lists as have reached him within the prescribed time, proceed to count the votes received by him, and shall report the result of such poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidates or candidate having received the largest number of votes to be the representative members or member on the board.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS FOR LOCAL COMMITTEES OF COUNTRY FIRE DISTRICTS.

Repeal.

1. The Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 28th day of November, 1892, for the conduct of elections of Local Committees for Country Fire Districts, are hereby repealed.

Regulations.

2. On or before a day to be specified by the responsible Minister administering the Fire Brigades Act (hereinafter styled "the Minister"), and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to the councils of each municipal district forming part of each country fire district, such municipal councils may nominate a person to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district of which such municipality shall form part.

3. In the nomination of candidates by councils the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of mayor or president of the council; or such proceedings may be conducted in accordance with any by-laws to be hereafter made by any city or other municipality for that purpose.

4. The name of the person so nominated for any country fire district shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer.

If the same person shall be nominated by all such councils who have exercised the right of nomination for any country fire district, such person shall be forthwith declared by the returning officer to be elected as a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which he shall have been so nominated, and such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

5. If on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates for the local committee of any one or more country fire districts shall have been so nominated, the returning officer shall prepare a list of all persons nominated, and shall forward the same to the council of each municipality forming part of such country fire district; and such council shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except that of the candidate for whom such council desires to vote, and return such list so altered to the returning officer.

6. The returning officer shall, on receipt of such returned lists, count all the votes received by him, and shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district in which such municipalities are comprised.

7. In the event of an equality of votes, the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote, the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

8. On or before a date to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable, addressed to each fire insurance company, the insurance companies may elect persons to be representative members of the respective local committees.

9. The principal officer, representative, or agent for the time being managing the fire business of an insurance company carrying on business in country fire districts shall be qualified to vote

at any election for the same on behalf of such insurance company.

10. Fourteen days before any election every fire insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other superior officer, notify to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer, representative, or agent.

11. Candidates shall be nominated, in writing, for the local committees by two voters, and such nomination-paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than seven days prior to the day of election, addressed to the secretary of such association, and the present secretary of such association or such other person who shall from time to time fill such office shall be the returning officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to preside thereat.

12. Should only one person be so nominated for any fire district, the secretary of such association or his deputy shall report to the Minister the name of the person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon notify the election of such person in the *Government Gazette*.

13. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected in any fire district, the secretary of such association or his deputy shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day on which the poll shall be taken.

14. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary or his deputy in the usual manner by ballot, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct; and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

15. The person voting on behalf of each company, at any election for local committees shall be entitled to only one vote for each member to be elected.

16. The secretary or his deputy shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling, and in the presence of the scrutineers (if any) open and count the ballot-papers, and such secretary or deputy shall report the result of the poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes for each fire district, to be the member of the local committee of the said fire district, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

17. In the event of an equality of votes the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

18. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to the fire brigades on the roll of each country fire district, such fire brigades may nominate a person to be a member of the local committee of the country fire district for which such fire brigades shall be on the roll, and the name of the person so nominated shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer.

19. If the same person shall be nominated by all such fire brigades as shall have exercised the right of nomination for any country fire district, such person shall be forthwith declared by the returning officer to be elected as a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which he shall have been nominated, and such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

20. If on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates for the local committee of any country fire district shall have been nominated, the returning officer shall prepare a list of all persons so nominated by fire brigades, and shall forward the same to fire brigades on the roll for such country fire district, and such fire brigades shall, before a day to be specified, at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except that of the candidate for which such fire brigades desire to vote, and return the list so altered to the returning officer.

21. The returning officer shall, on receipt of such returned list, count all the votes received by him, and shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which such fire brigades are enrolled. And such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

22. In the event of an equality of votes the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

23. In the nomination of candidates for fire brigades, the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of captain of the brigade.

24. Such of the insurance companies whose names are published in the *Government Gazette* as entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the country board shall be taken to be entitled to vote at any election of insurance companies' representatives on the respective local committees for the districts within which such property so insured is situated.

25. The names of the country fire brigades published in the *Government Gazette* as entitled to vote at the election of fire brigades' representatives on the country board shall be taken to be the roll of country fire brigades entitled to vote at any election of fire brigade representatives on the respective local committees of each country fire district in which such brigades are established.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANUFACTURE OF
ETHER FROM SPIRITS FREE OF DUTY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1896.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the *Customs Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1081), His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations relating to the manufacture of ether from spirits free of duty, viz.:-

REGULATIONS.

1. Application to manufacture ether from spirits free from duty must be made in writing to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.
2. Every application must state the place where operations are intended to be carried on, the number of stills to be worked, and the quantity of spirits likely to be used annually; contain a full description of the buildings; and must specify in detail what other business or businesses (if any) are to be carried on in the same premises.
3. Satisfactory evidence must be given that—
 - (1) The proposed premises are suitable for the manufacture of ether.
 - (2) There is proper accommodation for a bond for the holding and safe keeping of the spirits.
 - (3) If other businesses are to be carried on in the same premises, it is desirable to give permission for the manufacture of ether.
4. Upon consideration of the report made to him the Commissioner may approve of the application, or refuse it without cause assigned.
5. If the application be approved, the applicant must take out a licence to use a still or stills, in accordance with the provisions of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*.
6. The applicant must enter into a bond for £500 with two good and sufficient sureties for the due compliance with the regulations, and safe keeping, dealing with, and manufacture of the spirit into ether.
7. All spirits used in the manufacture of ether must be of Victorian manufacture.
8. Every person who is permitted to manufacture ether under these regulations, and who wishes to obtain spirits free of duty for that purpose, must make application therefor to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, who, upon the application being approved of by him, may direct the officer in charge of any distillery to deliver the spirit free of duty in quantities not less than 28 gallons; and the removal of such spirits from the distillery to the ether manufactory shall be under the supervision of an officer.
9. All spirits so delivered must be kept under lock and key, as directed by the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, until disposed of in accordance with these regulations.
10. Every operation in connexion with the manufacture of ether under these regulations shall be conducted under the personal supervision of an excise officer.
11. The manufacturer shall pay for the service of such excise officer during the time he is employed supervising the manufacture of the ether, and whilst travelling to and from the place of manufacture, such charge as the Secretary shall approve.
12. Before any ether can be removed samples must be submitted to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, and upon his approval delivery may be given.
13. The Commissioner may at any time, and without any cause being given, suspend or withdraw his sanction to manufacture spirits free of duty into ether.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Bast, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REBATES OF DUTY UPON SUGAR AND GLUCOSE.—
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1896.

WHEREAS by the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1895* (59 Vict. No. 1401) it is amongst other things enacted that, on and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, a rebate of Three shillings per hundred-weight shall be allowed to manufacturers on all sugar used in the manufacture of ale, beer, cordials, syrups, jam, jellies, and preserves; and on all sugar and glucose used in the manufacture of confectionery; but that such rebate shall be allowed to only licensed or registered manufacturers under regulations approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the regulations relating to rebates of duty upon sugar and liquid glucose, made in pursuance of the provisions of the *Duties of Customs Act 1895* (No. 2), and bearing No. 90.—August 28, 1896.—2.

date the sixteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS FOR REBATE OF SUGAR AND GLUCOSE DUTIES.

1. Persons desirous of obtaining rebate of duty on sugar and glucose used by them in their manufactures, must register their names, callings, and places of business with the Secretary for Trade and Customs, Melbourne.
2. Claims for rebate must be made in the form of Schedule 1 hereto, and must be accompanied by the seller's invoice of the sugar or glucose in respect of which the rebate is claimed.
3. Every person desirous of claiming rebate shall keep a book in the form prescribed by the Secretary for Trade and Customs, showing the quantity of sugar and glucose purchased, the quantity of sugar and glucose used in manufacture, and the quantity of each article manufactured in which such sugar and glucose are contained, and must prove to the satisfaction of the Secretary for Trade and Customs that the duty in respect of which rebate has been claimed has been actually paid.
4. In order to obtain rebate an officer of Customs must have been present when the sugar and glucose in respect of which rebate is claimed has been manipulated in such a manner as to render it unfit for ordinary use. Provided that in cases where the Secretary for Trade and Customs may not consider that the above regulation must be strictly carried out in order to protect the revenue this condition may be waived by him.
5. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may at any time refuse to grant rebate without cause assigned, or may allow rebate in any case where he may deem it just to do so, notwithstanding that these regulations may not have been complied with in every respect.
6. Each person desirous of manufacturing under these regulations shall give a bond, in the form of Schedule 2 hereto, with two sufficient sureties in the sum of £100, conditioned that he will in every way comply therewith, and will not improperly or illegally deal with any sugar or glucose in respect of which he may claim or intend to claim rebate.
7. Any place registered under these regulations, and any books or documents kept thereon, shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Customs officers.
8. The expenses of Customs supervision shall be paid by the manufacturer registered as aforesaid, and the amount payable in each case shall be fixed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.
9. No person shall be permitted to register under clause 1 of these regulations who is carrying on business as a grocer or storekeeper in the same locality as that in which his place of manufacture is situated, and no person who having been registered shall thereafter carry on any such business shall be entitled to receive rebate under these regulations.
10. No rebate of duty will be allowed on any sugar or glucose when such has been used prior to registration.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF PORE-PUNKAH.

WE, John Chandler, James B. Merry, Arthur G. Croft, George Rayner, William Yeates, John Harrison, and George Weston, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the township of Porepunkah, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart by the Committee or Management for sports, games, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management: provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.







advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet.

3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

By-Law No. 67.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered sixty-seven (67), for regulating traffic and processions within the Town of Warrnambool.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows:—

PART I.

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriages, footways, streets, or public places, within the town of Warrnambool, shall discontinue to do so on being required by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the footpaths shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footpath.

3. Every street musician or vocalist shall, when requested by any householder or his servant or any member of the police force, depart from the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

4. No procession of persons or vehicles, or of both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets of the town of Warrnambool, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, of the said town, and only by the route specified by such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police force of the said town.

5. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing or advertisement in any of the local newspapers by direction of the Mayor, or in his absence, or in case of sudden emergency, of the Town Clerk of the aforesaid town, any street, footpath, or public place shall be declared closed against traffic of vehicles or persons or both, the drivers and vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force or the officer of the council of the aforesaid town, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or travelling on, or by withdrawing and removing from, any street, footpath, or public place, where mentioned herein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be in any street or other place mentioned in such notice, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall when so required by any member of the police force or council's officer aforesaid, remove their horses and vehicles thence to any other street or public place which may be indicated by any member of the police force or the council's officer aforesaid.

6. When any number exceeding ten (10) vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and ordering thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force or the council's officer aforesaid.

7. No person shall drive any vehicle or ride or drive any horse or other animal at other than a walking pace across the intersections or around the corners of any of the streets in the town of Warrnambool.

8. No person shall at one and the same time act as driver or have the charge of more than one cart, dray, or other vehicle drawn by animal power on any street, road, or other public place within the town of Warrnambool.

PART II.—BICYCLES, TRICYCLES, ETC.

9. The expression "machine" in this part of this by-law shall mean and include any bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

10. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon or along any footway made or set apart for the use of pedestrians.

11. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

12. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell or whistle.

13. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or foot passenger, shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, and shall give warning of his or her approach as in the last section preceding.

14. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person in charge of same, the person driving, riding, or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue so dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

15. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than eight (8) miles per hour, or part thereof, upon or along any of the streets or public places within the town of Warrnambool.

PART III.—FLAGS, FLAG-POLES, SIGNS, SCREENS, BLINDS, ETC.

16. No person shall place or keep placed any flag, flag-pole, temporary sign, or projection from any building or structure so that such flag, flag-pole, temporary sign or projection shall extend over or overhang any portion of any street, footway, or public place within the town of Warrnambool.
