PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, throughout the Shires of Euroa, Kara Kara, Karkaroc, and Numurkah, and the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly;

MONDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, throughout the Shire of Mildura;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, throughout the Shires of Huntly, Strathfieldsaye, and Yackandandah.

ALIENATION OF NATIVE LAND IN SMALL ISLANDS FORMING PART OF HER MAJESTY'S DOMINIONS, OR BEING UNDER HER MAJESTY'S PROTECTION.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the *Pacific Order in Council, 1893.*)

TO PROHIBIT THE ALIENATION OF NATIVE LAND IN SMALL ISLANDS FORMING PART OF HER MAJESTY'S DOMINIONS, OR BEING UNDER HER MAJESTY'S PROTECTION.

(L.S.) JOHN B. THURSTON.

1. This Regulation shall extend to the following islands:—

Manahiki;
Rakahanga;
Tongarowa (Penrhyn);
Pukapuka and the Danger Islands; and
The islands of the Union Group.

2. From the date of the coming into force of this Regulation the alienation of native lands in the before-mentioned islands is prohibited; as is also the leasing of any such land except in the manner hereinafter provided.

3. Native land may, with the sanction of the High Commissioner, be leased for any term not exceeding 21 years. The terms of the proposed lease must be submitted to the High Commissioner for approval, and shall have no validity until such approval shall have been signified in writing. In the event of the proposed tenant having entered into possession, and of the approval of the High Commissioner to the proposed lease having been refused, such proposed tenant shall be deemed to be holding on a tenancy determinable at any time after one month's notice.

4. It shall be lawful, without the previous consent of the High Commissioner being given, for a lease of native land to be entered into on a tenancy determinable at any time after not more than six months' notice.

5. Unless otherwise agreed, the tenant of any native land may, on the expiration of the tenancy, remove any buildings erected by him.

6. This Regulation may be cited as the "Small Islands Native Lands Regulation, 1896."

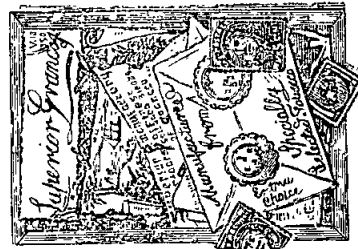

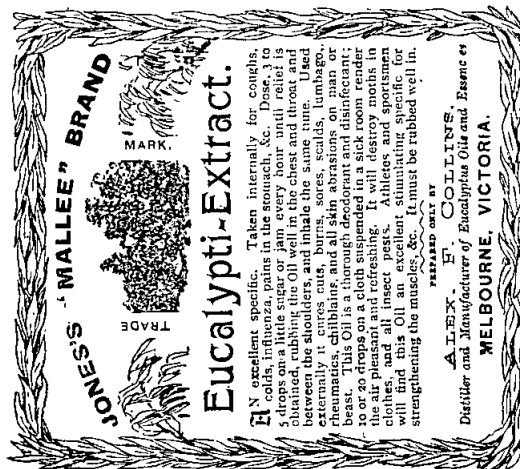

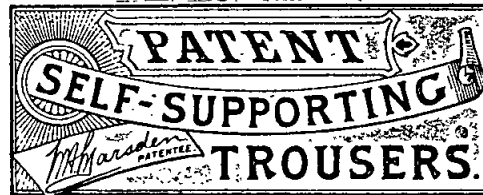

DANDENONG WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THAT the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1896*, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1896, in respect of water supply by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 15th September, 1896.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10) and under, the annual minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10) the annual sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to building, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

REGULATION No. 18.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust's District (exclusive of the Urban District of Tungamah as such Urban District was proclaimed and defined on 26th January, 1891):—

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Trust (excepting the Urban District of Tungamah) shall be imposed and levied for the year 1895.

2. For the supply of water to gardens and special plots of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's District (in the shires of Tungamah and Benalla), then shall be charged such sum as the Trust's Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1895.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. The foregoing Regulation, numbered 18, was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust this 3rd day of August, 1896.

No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for prescribing rates of charges for the use of the water supplied from any works constructed under the authority of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act, and the manner and conditions in and upon which

such water shall be used, and for determining the limits of the district to be rated for any such works, and for making and levying a water rate upon all or some of the lands and tenements within such district (except hospitals, benevolent institutions, buildings used exclusively for public charitable purposes, churches, chapels, and other buildings used exclusively for public worship, the dwellings of ministers of religious denominations, and buildings used as schools and receiving aid from the Government or otherwise of a public character) and for fixing the amount of such water rate, and the mode and conditions of levying and collecting the same, and generally for any or all of the purposes for which the Board of Land and Works is empowered by Division 1 of the said Part of the said Act to make by-laws relating to water supply: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the valuation of lands and tenements within the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District (Item 1 of the Seventh Schedule to the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid), for the purpose of making and levying a water rate during the financial year 1896-7, shall be the valuation of such lands and tenements during the municipal year 1895-6 by the corporation or council of any town, borough, or shire in which such lands or tenements are situated.

And the Honorable Henry Foster, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Stock Diseases Act 1890, Part I.
REGULATIONS.

At the Government Offices, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of September, 1896.

PRESENT:
His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, No. 1141, it is among other things provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such Regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes in section 4 of the said Act mentioned: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to make the following Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Victoria, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power him enabling in that behalf, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall come into force on the 5th day of October, 1896, but shall not apply to any stock which the inspector at the appointed crossing-place in Victoria shall be satisfied is free from ticks or tick or Texas fever, and was at the date of the coming into force of these Regulations at least within 100 miles of the Victorian border.

2. That in the construction of these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, the following words shall include the meaning respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

“Owner” shall include overseer or drover having the care, custody, or control of any stock.

“Stock” shall include any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, and any stallion, mare, gelding, or foal, and any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb, and any dog or bitch.

3. That any owner, subject to these Regulations, desiring to introduce stock from Queensland shall give not less than 48 hours' notice, in writing, of such his desire to the inspector of stock at the appointed crossing-place at which he desires such stock to cross.

4. The owner of any stock from any part of Queensland the introduction into Victoria of stock by land from whence has not been prohibited under some law for the time being in force desiring to introduce such stock into Victoria, shall, before being entitled to introduce the same into Victoria, produce to the Victorian Inspector of Stock, at the appointed crossing-place, a certificate under the hand of the New South Wales Inspector of Stock at the northern boundary of New South Wales at the place where such stock was crossed from Queensland a certificate in the form or to the effect of that contained in Schedule “A” hereto, indorsed under the hand of some one or more New South Wales district inspectors of stock along the route travelled by such stock.

5. In addition to the certificate in the last preceding clause mentioned, such owner shall furnish to the Victorian Inspector of Stock a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect in Schedule “B” hereto, declaring that none of the stock proposed to be introduced into Victoria has been affected with ticks or tick or Texas fever or been in direct or indirect contact with stock so affected, and where such stock includes or consists of a kind other than any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb, or any dog or bitch, that such stock has been in New South Wales territory for a period of not less than four calendar months immediately preceding the date of the making of the statutory declaration.

6. If required by the inspector such owner shall cause such stock other than any dog or bitch to be yarded in some suitable

place provided with a crush, and shall provide all the assistance necessary in the opinion of the inspector to fully and closely inspect such stock, and giving to the inspector every assistance in the carrying out of this duty.

In the case of any dog or bitch such owner shall cause the same to be brought to the inspector and aid and assist the inspector in closely inspecting the same.

7. If the inspector is satisfied that the stock is free from tick or ticks or Texas fever, and that the owner has complied with the provisions of these Regulations, such inspector may give such owner a permit, in writing, authorizing the introduction of such stock into Victoria at Albury or Echuca, or such other place as the chief inspector may direct.

Vegetation Diseases Act 1896.
RULES AND REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of September, 1896.

WHEREAS by section 13 of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for all or any of the purposes therein specified, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Vegetation Diseases Act 1896.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Vegetation Diseases Regulations 1896*.

2. What to be deemed diseases under the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896*.

The diseases mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be diseases, and any other disease which may hereafter from time to time be declared by the Governor in Council a disease within the meaning of the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896*.

3. All dealers, nurserymen, fruit-growers, and other persons producing for sale or otherwise nursery stock, plants, or fruit, may give notice to the board, or the inspector in the district where the nursery, garden, or orchard of such person is situate, of his desire that his nursery, garden, or orchard be inspected, whereupon the board will cause inspection thereof to be made by a duly-appointed officer in that behalf. Such officer shall, if he finds the same free from all disease, give a certificate to that effect (hereinafter called a clean certificate) or otherwise, in accordance with the facts, and shall, in case further directions for disinfection than are contained in these regulations are necessary, give such directions.

Such certificate shall be in force for six (6) months from the date thereof, unless revoked upon further inspection.

4. All persons having in their possession nursery stock, trees, plants, or fruit which they know to be infested with any disease hereinbefore enumerated, shall cause the same to be disinfected and cleansed in accordance with these regulations, and no such infested nursery stock, trees, plants, or fruit shall be forwarded distributed, or parted with until the same are so disinfected and cleansed, and a certificate thereof obtained.

5. No person shall distribute any plant, tree, or any part thereof which may be growing amongst vines known to be infested with the disease known as *Phylloxera vastatrix*.

6. All importers from outside the colony of Victoria of nursery stock, trees, or plants, the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of which is for the time being prohibited except subject to regulations, must give notice to the chairman of the central board under the *Vegetation Diseases Act*, or some other person appointed by him, upon the arrival of any nursery stock, trees, or plants, before the removal of such nursery stock, trees, or plants from any dock, wharf, station, or warehouse where such nursery stock, trees, or plants have been landed; and such nursery stock, trees, or plants shall be removed from such dock, ship, wharf, or station to the Quarantine Ground, which shall be the Horticultural Gardens at Burnley, and such expense of transmission and the treatment thereof of the same shall be borne by the consignee or owner; and if such nursery stock, trees, or plants are found to be free from disease, the said chairman or other person appointed by him shall issue a certificate to that effect. And all such nursery stock, trees, or plants, if found to be infested with disease, shall be dealt with according to the rules and regulations under the Act.

7. All persons having in their possession, boxes, crates, or other packages or wrappings in which nursery stock or fruit has been conveyed, shall have such boxes, crates, or other packages or wrappings disinfected in accordance with the directions contained in these regulations forthwith upon the removal of the original contents.

8. All persons shipping, sending, or delivering any tree, plant, or vegetable which has been proclaimed by the Governor-in-Council under the provisions of section 3, sub-section (2), of the Act within the colony, shall place upon or securely attach to each box, crate, or other package or parcel containing the same a distinct mark, stamp, or label, showing the name of the producer, shipper, or sender, and the locality where grown.

9. Boxes, crates, or other packages or wrappings shall be disinfected by immersing the same for five minutes in boiling water.

10. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of, or who shall fail to comply with these regulations, shall be liable to a penalty of, for a first offence, not exceeding Ten shillings, and for any subsequent offence not exceeding Five pounds.

DUTIES OF INSPECTORS.

1. Each inspector shall keep a record of what is being done in his district towards the eradication of any insect or fungous diseases, the various remedies applied, and the results of the same to be also noted. Such report to be sent in monthly to the central board.

2. Each inspector shall report to the central and local boards all and every case of disease in any orchard or garden within the district in which he has control.

3. Every inspector shall advise the owner of any diseased trees or plants how best to treat the same in order for the eradication of the disease, and to assist generally in carrying out the provisions of this Act.

4. Upon the discovery of any insect or fungous disease not hitherto known in the colony, the inspector shall immediately report the same to the central board.

LOCAL BOARDS OF ADVICE.

1. The colony of Victoria shall be divided into ten (10) districts as under, for each of which a local board of advice shall be appointed:—

(a) *The Central District* to comprise the counties of Evelyn and Bourke. Meetings to be held at the office of Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

(b) *Western District* to comprise the counties of Grant; Grenville, and Ripon. Meetings to be held at Geelong.

(c) *Geppstead District* to comprise the counties of Croajingolong, Tambo, Dargo, Tanjil, and Buln Buln. Meetings to be held at Sale.

(d) *North-Eastern District* to comprise the counties of Benambra, Bogong, Delatite, and Wonnangatta. Meetings to be held at Wangaratta.

(e) *Goulburn Valley District* to comprise the counties of Moira, Rodney, Dalhousie, and Anglesey. Meetings to be held at Tatura.

(f) *Western Port District* to comprise the county of Mornington. Meetings to be held at Pakenham.

(g) *South-Western District* to comprise the counties of Polwarth, Heytesbury, Hampden, Dundas, Villiers; Normanby, and Follett. Meetings to be held at Warrnambool.

(h) *Northern District* to comprise the counties of Bendigo, Gladstone, Gunbower, Tatchera, and Talbot. Meetings to be held at Bendigo.

(i) *North-Western District* to comprise the counties of Kara Kara, Borung, Lowan, Weeah, Karkaroc, and Millewa. Meetings to be held at Horsham.

(j) *Mildura District* to comprise the irrigation colony of Mildura. Meetings to be held at Mildura.

2. Local boards of advice to be formed throughout the colony. Each board to consist of seven members—three to form a quorum—to be elected by the fruit-growers living in the district; each grower to have one vote only.

3. At the first meeting of such local board, and in each succeeding year at the first meeting held after the anniversary of the day of the election of the first chairman, the members present at such meeting shall elect one of its members chairman, who shall hold office for twelve months, if he so long continue a member of the local board. In the event of a vacancy occurring at any time in the office of chairman, through resignation or otherwise, between the date of the election of one chairman and the date appointed for the annual election of chairman, the board may elect any one of its members to be chairman, who shall hold office until the time appointed for the next annual election of chairman. In the absence of such chairman at any meeting, the members present shall appoint one of its members to preside thereat. Each member of such local board shall hold office for three years. Any member absenting himself from three consecutive meetings without leave from the board will forfeit his seat, and the said vacancy shall be filled by an extraordinary election; and the member elected to fill such vacancy, or any other vacancy which may at any time occur through resignation or otherwise, shall hold office until the expiry of the time for which the member was appointed whose office he is filling.

4. The Governor in Council may at any time remove any person from or accept the resignation of any person of his office as a member of the board.

5. The duties of the local board shall be to assist the inspector by directing his attention to any case of disease in any orchard or garden in their district; to at once communicate with the inspector, or, failing the latter being in the district, with the central board, in the event of any new disease being noticed in any orchard or garden; to assist the inspector in adopting the best means and measures of eradicating any disease found in the district; and to receive the reports of the inspectors.

6. Each local board at its first meeting, and thereafter from time to time as often as such office becomes vacant, shall appoint one of its members to act as secretary, who shall keep a record of the minutes of each meeting and report the business transacted thereat to the central board within a period of fourteen days.

ELECTION OF LOCAL BOARDS.

1. *Returning officer*.—The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint some fit and proper person to be the returning officer for each and every one of the ten parts into which Victoria has been divided, to conduct the election of members of the local boards in each of such parts respectively, in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf, and may from time to time remove such returning officer.

2. *Time of election*.—The election of members of the local boards shall take place on the _____ day in the month of _____ 189____, and on the _____ day in the month of _____ in each succeeding third year. In the event of a vacancy at any time occurring in the office of member of a local board, through resignation or otherwise, between the date of election of such member and the date appointed for general election of members, an extraordinary election shall be held, and the person so elected thereat shall hold office until the time appointed for the next general election of members of the local board.

3. *Places of election*.—The election for members of the local boards shall be held at the places named in the Third Schedule of these regulations.

4. *Notice concerning nomination and election to be given.*—The returning officer for each of such parts shall give twenty-eight days' notice of his intention to proceed on the day appointed to hold an election of members of the local board, and such notice shall be given by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and some newspaper circulating in the town at which such election is held, and the returning officer shall also in such advertisement name the day appointed by him as the day of nomination, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election within which all candidates must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and shall affix thereto the date on which it is given.

5. *Nomination.*—Any fruit-grower whose name appears on a roll for that part of Victoria in which he is resident, and being desirous of nominating any person as a candidate for election by such part as a member of the local board for that part, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form in the First Schedule hereto; stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate together with the other particulars required by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four persons qualified under the provisions hereinbefore contained to nominate a candidate, and also by the person named therein as a candidate accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post at the place appointed not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed as the day of nomination.

6. *Fruit-growers' rolls.*—For the purposes of election of the members of local boards, a roll of fruit-growers for each district shall be prepared, under the direction of the Minister, by some person in that behalf appointed by the Governor in Council, such roll to contain the name of all fruit-growers occupying any land within the district for fruit-growing who have registered their names with the returning officer for the district in which such land is situate; such roll to be forwarded to the returning officer of each part at least one clear month before the day of each and every election.

7. *Return and poll.*—Whenever any office as member of a local board of advice for any part has to be filled, the returning officer for such part shall, in the event of there not being more persons duly nominated than are required to fill the vacancy or vacancies in respect of which such election is appointed, make a return to the central board, and declare such persons duly elected members of the local board of advice of the part in connexion with which such election is appointed; but if more persons be duly nominated than are required to fill the vacancy or vacancies in respect of which such election is appointed, the returning officer shall forthwith publish in the *Government Gazette* a list of the names of such candidates, and a poll shall be taken, and such returning officer shall forthwith cause voting-papers to be printed in the form in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall initial each of such papers, and shall enclose it in an unfastened envelope having his own name and address printed thereon, and shall send by post under a fastened cover one of such voting-papers and addressed envelopes to every person whose name appears on the roll as aforesaid. The returning officer shall indorse on every voting-paper so sent a number corresponding to that placed opposite the name of such person on such roll, which roll the returning officer shall retain in his own custody until after the election, as hereinafter provided.

8. In the event of an insufficient number of persons being duly nominated to fill any vacancy in any office, the returning officer from time to time, upon being required so to do by the Minister, shall take the steps necessary for and shall hold a further election or further elections until all vacancies in the constitution of the board have been filled.

9. *Voting-paper to be delivered or posted.*—The voter having recorded his vote on the voting-paper and signed it, shall enclose such voting-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon, and shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, or post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer before noon of the day fixed for holding such election. If there remain upon any voting-paper so received more names than those of the number of vacancies to be filled, such ballot-paper shall be treated as informal, and the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the returning officer.

10. *Appointment of scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer opens the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day of holding the election.

11. *Number of votes to be counted: Casting vote.*—The returning officer shall at noon of the day named in such advertisement for holding any election proceed, in the presence of any scrutineer appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting-papers therein contained, and compare the number and signature thereon with the number and name on the roll, and shall count the votes for each and every such candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the returning officer shall give public notice in the *Government Gazette* of the number of votes given to each and every candidate, and shall declare such of the candidates to a number equal to the vacancies to be filled as have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the local board; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, and a larger number than any other candidate, the returning officer shall record his casting vote in favour of one of them. The returning officer shall within seven days from and after the holding of any election return to the central board the name or names of the candidate or candidates who have been duly elected a member or members of the local board.

12. *Voting-papers to be kept for fifteen months.*—The roll and all voting-papers so counted, as aforesaid, shall be at once enclosed in a packet, which shall be sealed up and indorsed by

the returning officer. All voting-papers not counted, as aforesaid, shall be similarly enclosed and indorsed. All voting-papers received after noon of the day of election shall be indorsed by the returning officer with the time of their receipt, and shall be enclosed in separate packets, and all such several packets shall be transmitted by post to the secretary to the central board. Such packets shall be kept for a period of fifteen months, when the same may be destroyed.

TIMES AND PLACES OF MEETINGS OF LOCAL BOARDS.

13. The first meeting of each local board shall be held within fourteen days after the first election held under these regulations, at the places named in the Third Schedule of these regulations, and future meetings shall be held as each board may determine from time to time, but at no longer interval than three months between each meeting.

REGULATIONS FOR DEALING WITH THE DISEASES UNDER THE VEGETATION DISEASES ACT 1896.

CODLIN MOTH.

(*Carpocapsa pomonella*.)

1. All trees of apple, pear, apricot, and quince must be bandaged with bands made of gunny-bags, hessian, or other material approved by the board, bands to be not less than 4 to 5 inches in width to be placed on the trees not later than the end of November, and the occupier shall finally remove and cleanse such bandages, and destroy all grubs therein on and after the first, but not later than the end of April, and such bands may remain on all the year round, but must be replaced before the last day of November. The bands are to be examined at least every three months, and all grubs and their cocoons destroyed by dipping in boiling water.

2. A bandage shall be considered cleaned and rendered fit to be used again when all grubs found therein are effectually destroyed.

3. The occupier shall remove all rough and loose bark from trees, and burn or otherwise destroy such bark as soon as removed.

4. The occupier shall at once gather up all infected fruit, and shall forthwith treat all such fruit for the effectual destruction of the grub, either by immersion in boiling water, or in such other way as the board may sanction, and no person shall make use of any such infected fruit before the same shall have been treated in accordance with this regulation.

5. As soon as the tree has shed its blossoms, and the young fruit has set, spray with a mixture of Paris green and lime—1 lb. of Paris green and 4 lbs. of lime to 150 to 200 gallons of water. This should be thoroughly mixed and strained before using, and is to be applied once, as soon as the fruit has set, and again at an interval of ten days, four sprayings being sufficient for the purpose.

APPLE-ROOT BORER.

(*Leptops Hopii*.)

1. When the leaves are on the tree the eggs must be looked for, and the leaves on which the eggs are collected and destroyed by burning or scalding.

2. All trees found to be attacked by this insect must be at once treated with bisulphide of carbon.

Holes of not less than 6 inches deep to be made in the ground, into which the carbon, one small wine-glass full in each hole, must be placed, and the holes immediately closed.

3. All trees of apples, pears, and cherries must be encircled by zinc bands of not less than 3 inches in width, to prevent the perfect insect from ascending the tree for the purpose of depositing its eggs.

4. All these insects when found on trees must be destroyed by boiling water in a vessel suitable for the purpose.

APPLE-BARK OR MUSSEL SCALE.

(*Mytilaspis pomorum*.)

1. All nursery stock and young trees must be examined before planting, and, if found to be affected with scale, must be immersed for 30 minutes in tobacco water:—4 lbs. of refuse tobacco, 4 lbs. soft soap, boiled together, with 50 gallons of water added.

2. Any tree infested with this scale must be thoroughly sprayed when the tree is without leaves with a strong kerosene emulsion, viz., 1½ lbs. of mineral soap, 2 pints of kerosene to 15 gallons of water (or prepared in such other manner as the board may direct) and the stem, also the larger branches of the tree, scrubbed with a hard brush with the same mixture; and for spring or summer spraying, the emulsion at half the above strength should be used. The winter spraying and scrubbing must be continued at intervals of one week until the pest has been eradicated.

3. All prunings, except those required for purposes of propagation, which latter should be dipped in tobacco water as above, must be burned at once, and must not be stacked, as has been the common practice.

PEAR AND CHERRY SLUG.

(*Selandria cerasi*.)

1. After pruning, and when the tree is without leaves, the roots of pear and cherry trees must be carefully bared, or partly so, and two shovelfuls of air-slaked lime spread over the roots of each large tree, the same to be covered up immediately; this to destroy the larvae which are just beneath the soil and near the stem of the tree.

2. Spray the tree when the leaves are on with Paris green, 1 lb. of Paris green, 4 lbs. of lime, to 200 gallons of water. When the fruit is ripening, spray with hellebore—1½ ozs. to the gallon of water, to be applied as the slugs appear on the leaves, and to be continued until all traces of the slugs have disappeared.

RED SCALE OF THE ORANGE.

(*Aspidiotus coccineus*.)

1. All orange and lemon trees, especially before being planted out, must be carefully examined for the presence of this scale, when, if found, the trees should, before being planted, be immersed in tobacco water, as per instructions in the case of Apple-bark or Mussel Scale.

2. All trees affected with this scale must be thinned out as far as practicable by pruning, and all prunings burnt at once on the spot, or as near to it as possible.

3. When the trees have been carefully thinned, spray with kerosene emulsion or resin compound, in like proportions as given for Apple-bark or Mussel Scale. Infested trees must be sprayed at intervals of one week, and all fallen leaves must be gathered up and burned at once.

APPLE AND PEAR SCAB.

(*Fusicladium dendriticum*.)

Spray with Bordeaux mixture:—1st, before the bursting of the bud; 2nd, after the leaves appear; and 3rd, when the fruit is formed.

SHOT-HOLE OF THE APRICOT.

(*Phyllosticta circumscissa*.)

Spray with Bordeaux mixture:—Before the bursting of the buds; then when the leaves are fully developed; and, if necessary, about a month later.

LEAF CURL OF THE PEACH.

(*Ecosceus deformans*.)

Spray with Bordeaux mixture just before the bursting of the buds; then with a weak solution of the mixture when in leaf.

All trees on which disease appeared in a previous season should be well cut back.

Victoria, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Acts: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Minhamite has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area) describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan an amount sufficient to purchase materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing not exceeding four lineal miles of fencing to every owner; and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land; and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner [and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence, and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence] and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, with interest in the meantime at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on the amount of the value of such materials or on the value of so much thereof as is unpaid for, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof; and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*:

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £170 in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: [Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of £170, being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the *Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1896*, as a loan to the said shire of Minhamite for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £170 be paid to the council in one instalment of £170.

That the said sum of £170 be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £170 be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £170 to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £170 be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years by annual instalments of not less than £17 each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the 31st May, 1897, and a further instalment of not less than £17 on or before the 31st May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of £170 is repaid.

That in the month of May in each and every year until the whole amount of the loan be repaid the council pay to the Treasurer of Victoria on such loan, or on so much thereof as is unpaid, interest at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum.

*Health Act 1890.***INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP, AND DOGS INTO VICTORIA FROM QUEENSLAND, NORTH OF QUARANTINE BOUNDARY LINE, PROHIBITED.**

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever. And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs, into Victoria from Queensland, north of the Quarantine boundary line, as follows:—

QUARANTINE BOUNDARY LINE.

Commencing at the mouth of South Trees Inlet; and bounded thence by that inlet and the Boyne River upwards to Machine Creek; by that creek upwards to the main Rockhampton road; by that road westerly and north-westerly to the Calliope River; by that river upwards to its head in the Calliope Range; by that range northerly to the east corner of Calliope consolidation; by the boundaries of that consolidation south-westerly, southerly and north-westerly to the western watershed of Callide Creek; thence by that watershed southerly to the north-east corner of Rannes resumption; by part of the northern boundary of that resumption, and by the eastern and northern boundaries of Rannes lease, to Granville Creek; by that creek downwards to Olanda consolidation; by the east and south boundaries of that consolidation to the Dawson River; by that river downwards to the north-east corner of Ashfield lease; thence by the north and west boundaries of that lease, the north boundaries of Nulalbin lease and Alberta occupation licence, the northern watershed of Minosa Creek and tributaries, the northern boundaries of Marshmead and Speculation occupation licences, the north-west boundary of Speculation occupation licence, and the northern boundaries of Kenmare North occupation licence and portion A of Comet Downs lease to the Comet River; by that river upwards to the south-east corner of Arcturus Downs consolidation, by the southern, south-eastern, and south-western boundaries of that consolidation, the southern and western boundaries of Marmadillo consolidation, and the northern boundary of Rainworth lease to Separation Creek; by that creek downwards to the Nogoa River; by that river upwards to the northern boundary of Teleton No. 2 resumption; thence by the north boundary of that resumption to a range forming the southern watershed of Medway Creek and its tributaries; by that watershed southerly and north-westerly to the Drummond Range; by that range southerly, and by the watershed between Alpha Creek and Dismal Creek north-westerly to the northern boundary of Birkenhead No. 6 Block, by the north boundary of that block, by part of the east and by the northern boundaries of Mount Euniskillen consolidation, and by the eastern and southern boundaries of Paradise Downs No. 2, Block A, and Block B occupation licences, the eastern and northern boundaries of Northampton Downs consolidation, the eastern and northern boundaries of Evora consolidation, the eastern and southern boundaries of Home Creek consolidation, and by the eastern and northern boundaries of Avington consolidation to the Alice River; by that river downwards to the south-east corner of Barcaldine consolidation; by the southern and western boundaries of that consolidation, the south-eastern and southern boundaries of Wellshot consolidation, the northern boundary of Westland lease, and north-eastern and northern boundaries of Toccal consolidation, the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Silsoe consolidation, the northern and part of the western boundaries of Vergemont consolidation, the south-eastern, southern, and south-western boundaries of Rosebrook station, the southern, south-western, and north-western boundaries of Cork station, the north-eastern and northern boundaries of Brighton Downs station, the western boundaries of Llanheridol station, the southern and western boundaries of Bell block, part of the western boundary of Kirby block, the northern and western boundaries of Beadesert station, the northern and western boundaries of Toolyuck station, the eastern and northern boundaries of Mount Merlin station, and by the southern and western boundaries of Devoncourt station (including Devoncourt, Teddington, Loch, and Parkside), to Minger Creek; thence crossing

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.***VICTORIAN NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.—ADDITION TO FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.**

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.—SECTION I, GENERAL REGULATIONS, ORDNANCE STORES.—REQUISITIONS FOR STORES.

After para. 136 the following is added:—

136a. When requisitioning for stores, corps will use the black and red forms now in use except in the case of requisitions for stationery and expendible stores required by the Permanent Naval and Military Branches and the Head-quarters Staff, which will use the No. 5 (order on contractor) forms for all stationery and expendible stores required. Where the stores required are provided for under the schedules to public contracts, officers requisitioning are to make out a separate order in duplicate for the stores required from each contractor. The name of contractor, schedule item number, and price are to be inserted on order; the values are to be extended out and the total amount of the order shown. When articles are required that are not provided for in any of the contracts such articles must be placed on a separate order, and the Controller of Stores will arrange for their purchase. The requisitions, when prepared as above, are to be forwarded to the Secretary of Defence, through the Naval or Military Commandant (as the case may be), for the approval of the Minister; and, when approved, they will be transmitted to the Controller of Stores, who will arrange for the supply and delivery of the stores. When delivered, the officer authorized to receive the stores will sign the order accompanying them and return it to the Controller of Stores, who will file it in his office.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF HOTSPUR.

WE, John Munro, junior, John King, John McDonald, Charles Smith, and Archibald McLean, junior, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the town of Hotspur, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOTANICAL GARDENS, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* power is given to the Board of Land and Works from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the rules and regulations made by it on the 13th day of July, 1885, in respect of the Botanical Gardens in the city of Melbourne, and doth hereby make the Regulations following, for the care, protection, and management of such gardens:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Unless the Minister of Lands shall otherwise direct, the gates of the gardens shall be opened daily at seven o'clock a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and at 7.30 o'clock a.m. during April, May, June, July, August, and September, and shall be closed at sunset. A bell shall be rung five minutes before the locking of the gates, and any person found in the gardens during unauthorized hours shall be liable to prosecution.

2. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, vases, labels, fountains, fish, or birds in the gardens, or step on the beds, borders, edgings, or seats, or engage in any sport or games, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter, or light fires therein, or smoke, annoy visitors, or carry flowers into the gardens.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or stick bills on such fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the summer-houses, trees, seats, gates, posts or fences, or other property, or write thereon, or otherwise deface the same.

4. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or constable.

5. Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be allowed within the gardens, unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of adult friends or nurses, whom they shall not leave while therein.

6. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Minister of Lands, shall offer for sale in the gardens any article.

7. No bicycle or tricycle other than children's bicycles or tricycles shall be ridden in or through the gardens, and no carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except perambulators or go-carts, shall be allowed to enter or remain in the gardens, unless such cart or other vehicle be used or required in connexion with works therein.

8. Any person found removing, taking from, or injuring plants, flowers, seeds, or fruits in the gardens, shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom, and to be prosecuted.

9. No person shall enter into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes in the gardens, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.

10. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain within the gardens, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church, or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4 and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

MIEPOLL.—The Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of October, 1893, by which certain lands situate in the township of Miepoll, and comprising an area of four hundred and eighty-six acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments is hereby revoked, so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz.:—Fifty-three acres twenty-one perches, county of Moira, parish of Miepoll, being allotments 1 and 2 of section G, and allotments 6, 11, 12, and 36 of section H.—(665, 739, 1173, 1665, and 2189/5.)

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

Propellers not to be moved whilst the Vessel is Moored at a Wharf.

93A. The person in charge of any steam vessel shall not, without the authority of the Port Officer, Pier Master, or Wharf Manager, permit the propelling engines of such vessel to be worked while moored alongside any wharf.
