## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation revoke so much of the Proclamation made on the 27th day of September, 1897, as relates to the appointment of Thursday, the 28th day of October, 1897, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Avoca, and do hereby appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, throughout the City of Bendigo;

TUESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, throughout the Shire of Violet Town;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, throughout the Boroughs of Creswick and Wangaratta, the Shires of Avoca and North Ovens, and the North and Central Ridings of the Shire of Violet Town;

WEDNESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Violet Town;

WEDNESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, throughout the Borough of Majorsca.

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 21.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust according to the valuation for the year 1898 of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1898. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1898, and the second instalment upon the 1st day of July in the same year. THE Government having made arrangements for the resumption of portions of Mr. James O'Connor's Mallee allotments numbered 162, 162A, 163, 164, and 165, in the county of Tatchera, and known as "Ultima," applications will now be received for allotments within the proposed subdivision of such areas.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF EVERTON.**

**W**E, Hiram Allan Crawford, Dawson Ward, John Whitteker, Edward Rickards, and Walter Carlton Crawford, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Everton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for agricultural societies, shows, races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or rope, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter into any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
