## GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1897-8.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that Wednesday, the 1st day of December, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and that persons who are not already enrolled will be entitled to have their names entered on such lists by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualifications to be answered in writing before the Right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants on that day, and those to whom rights are not so issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights by falsely answering the questions when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a PROVINCE may obtain an Electors' Right for such PROVINCE.

No person whose name is already on the NEW LIST of Ratepaying Electors (now being prepared) for any Division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT may obtain an Elector's Right for such DISTRICT.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

for a period of two weeks from the 21st October, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

IN THE PARISH OF BULLARTO.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of August, 1897.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the council of the municipality of the shire of Glenlyon has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parish of Bullarto in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice

of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

Two acres three roods twelve perches, county of Talbot, parish of Bullarto: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 5, of section 2; bounded thence by that allotment and a line bearing S. 59° 44' E. twelve chains three links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 24° 58' E. five chains three links and S. 64° 4' E. eleven chains forty-seven links; thence by the Coliban River south-westerly one chain; thence by a line and allotment 14 bearing N. 64° 4' W. eleven chains eighty-three links; thence by allotment 6 bearing N. 24° 58' W. five chains seven links, and N. 59° 44' W. eleven chains thirteen links; and thence by a road bearing N. 0° 14' W. one chain sixteen links to the point of commencement,

The water rate hereinafter mentioned shall be and is hereby made and charged upon all rateable property within the United Shire of Beechworth, and which rate is made in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes to some of the inhabitants of the United Shire of Beechworth, and for the purpose of constructing waterworks, and paying the interest on the loans contracted by the council for such purposes.

3. The rate so charged as aforesaid, and which the owners and occupiers of all such rateable property shall pay, is as follows, viz:—

(a) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, Ten shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, a rate of Five pounds per centum per annum upon such valuation.

(c) In addition to the foregoing, every owner and occupier shall, for water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the council), pay at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(d) The minimum quantity of water to be charged and paid for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

(e) In respect of water supplied or used for irrigation or gardening purposes, Ten shillings per tap per annum shall be charged and paid for every tap supplying or standing in an area of 1,000 square feet or lesser area, and so in proportion for every greater area.

(f) The above rate (except for water supplied by measure) shall be paid in advance, by equal payments, on the 1st day of April and 1st day of October in each year.

(g) For water supplied by measure, payment shall be made quarterly, viz., on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in each year.

4. By-law number 3, making a rate for water supply purposes and fixing a scale of charges therefor, and made the 18th day of November, 1879, is hereby repealed.
