GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT 3 PER CENT. STOCK.

TENDERS will be received at this office until Two o'clock in the afternoon of Friday, the 19th day of November, 1897, for the purchase of the whole or any part of One hundred and twenty thousand pounds (£120,000) of Victorian Government 3 per cent. Stock, issued under Act No. 1468.

GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1897-8.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that Wednesday, the 1st day of December, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and that persons who are not already enrolled will be entitled to have their names entered on such lists by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualifications to be answered in writing before the Right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants on that day, and those to whom rights are not so issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights by falsely answering the questions when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a PROVINCE may obtain an Electors' Right for such PROVINCE.

No person whose name is already on the NEW List of Ratepaying Electors (now being prepared) for any Division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT may obtain an Elector's Right for such DISTRICT.

Foreigners who desire to obtain Electors' Rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so; and such foreigners, if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors, must obtain letters of naturalization before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BUSSELL, RONSON, AND BUSSELL, DRESSMAKERS, BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of one week from 30th October, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

Regulations for the making of a rate, the year 1898, on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also for the dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor; but no such rate shall be less than One pound sterling.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile, distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes, solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling a 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

OMEO WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.—REGULATION FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1898 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be charged.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns $1\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns $1\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 23,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load, to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

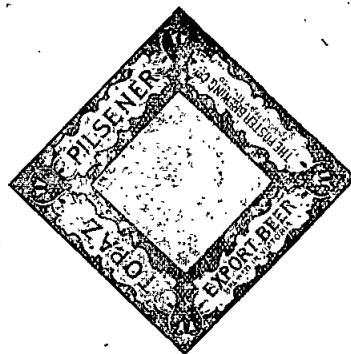

STAWELL HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

BY-LAWS of the Stawell Hospital and Benevolent Asylum. (Incorporated 11th June, 1897).

1. The Hospital and Benevolent Asylum will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid and maintenance to any poor person requiring them, irrespective of creed, country, or colour; but any person who shall be admitted under any circumstances and shall be found able to pay shall be required to do so.

2. Paying patients may be admitted provided the wards are not all occupied by ordinary patients; and the charge of admission shall be fixed by the house committee, subject to the approval of the committee of management.

3. Paying patients will receive the same treatment as ordinary patients, and they shall abide by the same rules, it being left to the resident surgeon to place them in any ward, either separate or with ordinary patients.

4. Accidents and cases deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance will be received at any time; in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sunday excepted) at such hours as may be appointed by the committee of management on the recommendation of a contributor and one member of the said committee, and special cases shall be admitted at any time on an order signed by the house committee and one of the honorary medical officers; but patients to the benevolent ward shall only be admitted after due inquiry on an order of the committee of management, and shall be discharged on the special order of the same, except in cases of misconduct, when the resident surgeon may discharge them immediately.

5. No female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one infected with an infectious disease (with the exception of cases of accident or emergency, as per By-law 4), shall be admitted except by the express permission of the house committee or the committee of management.

6. The institution shall be managed by a president, two vice-presidents, and honorary treasurer, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, and who shall hold office for one year, but be eligible for re-election, and by a committee called the committee of management, consisting of 21 contributors, not less than 8 of whom shall be residents of outlying districts, the members of such committee to be elected for the term of three years, subject to retirement as provided by the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1880*. One-third of the members of such committee who shall have been longest in office without re-election shall retire in addition to those who have been temporarily appointed by the committee. The vacancies caused by such retirement shall be filled at the annual general meeting. The members of the committee to be so elected shall be nominated at or before such meeting; but nominations (except for members of outlying districts) cannot be received without the consent of the person nominated.

7. The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year, for the following purposes:—

To receive the annual report.

To elect a president, vice-presidents, and treasurer.

To fill vacancies in the committee of management.

To elect the honorary medical officers.

To elect two auditors (see By-law No. 8).

To transact any other business of which notice has been given or that may arise at such meeting in connexion with the institution.

8. The contributors shall at each annual general meeting appoint two auditors, not members of the committee of management, to examine the accounts; but in case either of such auditors neglect or refuse to act, the committee of management is empowered to temporarily appoint another auditor or auditors; and it shall also be competent for the president, or, in his absence, a vice-president, at the request of not less than ten contributors, to convene, by advertisement, a meeting of contributors at any time for the purpose of electing auditors if any emergency arise to warrant the same.

9. The committee of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the institution, present a report to the annual general meeting, and conduct the affairs of the institution generally; and may from among themselves from time to time appoint sub-committees for any purpose, which, in their opinion, would be better regulated and managed by means of such committees; it may fix the quorum of such committees, and may continue, alter, or discontinue such committees.

10. The committee of management shall meet for general business once at least in each month, and for special business whenever requisite, such meetings to be convened by the secretary at any time or place that may be ordered by the committee of management, the president, a vice-president, or upon the requisition of not less than three members of such committee.

11. Every contributor to the institution of a sum of not less than £25 in one amount, the executors (not exceeding two in number) of a will by which a sum of not less than One hundred pounds (£100) has been added to the funds of the institution, the representative nominated by any municipality making a donation of not less than £100 in one sum, the representative nominated by any society or organization making a donation of £50 in one sum, shall be life governors. The committee of management shall have power to add to the list of life governors such persons as they may deem expedient for eminent services rendered to the institution. Every life governor shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of the contributors, and to nominate five indoor and five outdoor patients in each year. Every contributor of £1 per annum and upwards shall be entitled to nominate one indoor and one outdoor patient in each year.

12. Members of the committee of management are not to be limited in the number of patients they may recommend.

13. No person shall be qualified to vote at a meeting of contributors unless he shall have been a contributor for the space of six months previous to such meeting, provided always that

where a contributor shall have paid his subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any such meeting shall take place the payment of his subscription at any time before such meeting shall entitle him to the privileges of a contributor for and during the ensuing twelve months. Life governors and life subscribers only shall be entitled to vote by proxy.

14. The committee of management shall at each monthly meeting appoint a house committee, who shall retire monthly, but be eligible for re-appointment on the next committee.

15. The house committee shall (a) at least once a week visit the institution for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and (b) once at least in each month audit the house accounts and check the stores book, and (c) also watch the entire expenditure of the institution, and (d) shall report to the committee of management any alterations or suggestions they may think necessary.

16. Any contractor to the institution being a member of the committee of management shall absent himself from its sittings while any subject relating to his contract is under consideration.

17. The committee of management shall have power from time to time to make, rescind, alter, or amend any rules for the internal management or regulation of the institution upon seven days' notice thereof being given to each member, and upon being carried by a majority of two-thirds of a meeting, consisting of not less than ten members of the committee of management.

18. No proposition to enact or amend any by-law shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice in writing has been given of such.

19. All by-laws and rules made prior to the date of making these by-laws are hereby repealed; provided always that any regulations made or agreements entered into under any rule or by-law now in force shall be taken to have been made under these by-laws until the same be amended or rescinded.

HON. TREASURER.

20. The honorary treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the institution, and pay the same into such bank or banks as the committee of management shall direct to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting as having been approved of by the said committee by draft on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the president or one of the vice-presidents and by the secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the said committee.

21. The committee of management shall have power to invest in Government debentures or stock contributions specially given for the purpose of endowment, or any bequests or other funds which in the interest of the institution the committee of management may deem desirable to so invest, and no portion of such endowment funds shall be used unless authorized by a meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, providing that the interest arising from such funds from time to time shall be received and placed to the maintenance account of the institution.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

22. The honorary medical officers shall consist of legally-qualified medical practitioners, who shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the institution at all times; they shall assist the resident surgeon in the performance of all capital surgical operations; but no such operations shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff; and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the institution.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

23. The resident surgeon shall be a duly-qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period without the permission of the committee of management. He shall be allowed private practice within the limit of the Borough of Stawell, provided such private practice does not interfere with his duties as resident surgeon.

PUPIL NURSES.

24. A limited number of nurse pupils, as may be determined upon by the committee of management, shall be engaged from time to time upon the terms, and subject to the rules decided upon by the said committee, who shall be trained to become nurses competent to fulfil all the duties necessary in a hospital.

ANNUAL MEETING.

25. The secretary or president shall convene the annual general meeting on the last Thursday in July in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the committee of management, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

THE COMMON SEAL.

26. The common seal of the institution shall not be affixed to any deed or document, except by the secretary in the presence of the president or one of the vice-presidents, who shall duly attest the sealing thereof.

27. All contested elections or appointments shall be by ballot only.

28. A contributor for the purposes of, and within the meaning of these by-laws, shall be a person who has paid £1 per annum by way of subscription or contribution to the ordinary funds of the institution.

29. Every firm or partnership becoming contributors shall exercise their privilege through some one member of the same.

30. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer of the institution shall be members of all sub-committees by virtue of their offices.
