GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1897-8.—ISSUE OF
ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that Wednesday, the 1st day of December, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and that persons who are not already enrolled will be entitled to have their names entered on such lists by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualifications to be answered in writing before the Right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants on that day, and those to whom rights are not so issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights by falsely answering the questions when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a PROVINCE may obtain an Electors' Right for such PROVINCE.

No person whose name is already on the NEW LIST of Ratepaying Electors (now being prepared) for any Division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT may obtain an Elector's Right for such DISTRICT.

Foreigners who desire to obtain Electors' Rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so; and such foreigners, if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors, must obtain letters of naturalization before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next.

The births of 884 children, viz., 457 boys and 427 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. The number was, it will be observed, 73 lower than in October, 1896, and much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 382 below the average during the previous ten years, or 385 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 472, viz., 247 of males and 225 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 412, or 87 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, more numerous by 34 than in the corresponding month of the preceding year, but fewer than in any of the previous ten years; they were also 121 below the average of October during the same period, or 123 below it, allowing for increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 23.07 and of deaths registered 12.32 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month during the last ten years of 34.14 and 15.91 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37. It is possible that much of this great disparity may be due to the present population having been over-estimated, for which the municipalities are responsible.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80.2° on the 27th, and the lowest was 38.3° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (55.1°) was nearly 2½° below the average, and was the lowest recorded for October with four exceptions, viz., 54.3 in 1880, 54.5 in 1871 and 1884, and 54.6 in 1886. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.3°) took place on the 16th, and the least range (8.6°) on the 1st. The mean daily range was 18.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.140 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.280 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.784 inches) was about one-tenth of an inch below the average, and, with one exception, in 1890, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 1.77 inches, which was nearly an inch higher than in October, 1896, but about two-thirds of an inch below the average of the previous ten years, and lower than in any corresponding month of the previous ten years, except 1888, 1895, and 1896.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 19 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in October, 1896; 21 per cent. in October, 1895; 24 per cent. in October, 1894; 28 per cent. in October, 1893; 26 per cent. in October, 1892; and 27 per cent. in October, 1891.

Thirty-eight persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a miner, aged 75, died of phthisis; a sawyer, aged 75, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 75, of senile gangrene; two females, each aged

76, of cancer and softening of the brain respectively; a labourer, aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 76, of intestinal obstruction; a saddler, aged 76, of uremia; a female, aged 77, of influenza; a labourer, aged 77, of phthisis; a carpenter, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; another, aged 78, of insanity; a merchant, aged 79, of gastro-enteritis; a master mariner, aged 80, of cancer; a female, aged 80, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 81, of apoplexy; a livey-table-keeper, aged 83, of heart disease; a male, of no occupation, aged 83, of pneumonia; a farmer, aged 83, of congestion of the liver; a boardinghouse-keeper (male), aged 84, of pneumonia; a shoemaker, aged 84, of nephritis; a labourer, aged 84, of natural causes; a female, aged 86, of eczema; another, aged 88, of cancer; a female, aged 76, a stonemason, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a hawker, aged 80, four females, aged 82, 82, 86, and 87 respectively, an engineer, aged 89, a labourer, aged 92, and a female, aged 97, of old age.

Twenty deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 10, a labourer, aged 36, and a line repairer, aged 53, were passed over by railway trains; a clerk, aged 17, was killed by coming into collision with a lorry whilst riding a bicycle, an engine-driver, aged 25, died of injuries received through being crushed in a shaft; a labourer, aged 36, of injuries resulting from a fall down a clay-hole; an engine-driver, aged 68, of traumatic tetanus; a female child, aged 3, of burns; a male and a female child, both aged 3, of scalds; a female child, aged 2, was poisoned by strychnine accidentally taken; a boy, aged 9, was drowned through falling into a clay-hole; and a bookbinder, aged 22, in the Saltwater River; whilst a seaman, aged 53, was "found drowned" in the River Yarra; and a female child, aged 2 months, was suffocated, the evidence being insufficient to show how caused. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 24, who died of septic peritonitis, resulting from an illegal operation (verdict—"wilful murder"). The suicidal deaths were those of a plumber, aged 37, who cut his throat; a butcher, aged 19, a basket-maker, aged 32, and a sergeant of police, aged 57, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and twenty-six deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 2 in the Women's, 3 in the Children's, 3 in the Homeopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 12 in the Metropolitan and 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 90, of which 32, or 36 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 64 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 57 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 382. Of these, 215, or 56 per cent., were males, and 167, or 44 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 14 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 35 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 at the ages of ninety-two and ninety-seven respectively.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one of the previous year, there was an increase of only 3 under zymotic diseases, and but little difference under any of the other classes of disease, except the constitutional class, the local, and violent deaths, the two former of which show an increased mortality of 22 and 23 respectively, but the latter a falling off of 11. In the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 43 to 67, and those from tubercular meningitis from 5 to 8, but those from

cancer fell from 35 to 29. In the local class deaths from diseases of the nervous system—chiefly inflammation of the brain and insanity—increased by 24, of the circulatory system by 5, of the lymphatic by 3, whilst deaths from childbirth rose from nil to 7 (as against which there was a fall from 3 to 1 under puerperal fever); whereas, on the other hand, those from diseases of the digestive system fell off by 3, of the urinary system by 6, and of the organs of generation by 2. Under violence, deaths from accidents were fewer by 7, and those from homicide and from suicide each fewer by 2.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896, and the first ten months of 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that diphtheria, prevalent in an epidemic form in 1897, still causes a more than average mortality.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the Regulation following:-

The following rates are those which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:-

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the waterworks area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties, and shall be paid in equal moieties on the 1st January, 1898, and 1st July, 1898. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners on the 4th day of October, 1897, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of-

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for domestic purposes, and for other than domestic purposes, to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

2. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (excepting where permission is given to any unlicensed person in writing by the Trust).

5. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Trust shall see fit, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

6. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, or injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable, for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper-bit joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, or bricks, or stone.

10. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe or water-tap conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe or tap requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any)—and if none, the owner—shall, in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable, for each offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

14. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

15. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of, the Trust.

16. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

17. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6 feet 3 inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1 foot 9 inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

18. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first applying a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

19A. The Trust may enter into a special agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic, without the use of a water meter, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

20. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Ten pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Ten pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may authorize in each case.

21. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons One shilling.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him or her with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

23. Permission must be granted by the Trust to any person requiring water for any other purpose other than domestic, either by meter or special agreement. The Trust reserve the right to grant water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for any other than domestic, without the written authority of the Trust, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.

24. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust."

RATING REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 55.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say:—

In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing on the 1st January, 1898, and terminating on the 31st December, 1898, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 55, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 19th day of October, 1897.

As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The house coal must be the best of its kind, free from shale, small coal, dust, or other impurities. The smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities.
