REGULATIONS TO GOVERN THE ISSUE OF LONG-SERVICE MEDALS TO THE VOLUNTEER FORCES OF VICTORIA.

HER Majesty the Queen having by Royal Warrant, dated 13th June, 1896, been graciously pleased to approve of the grant of the "Volunteer Long-Service Medal" being extended to the Volunteer Forces of the Colonies, the following Regulations regarding the Issue of the Medals to Volunteers in Victoria (recommended by His Excellency the Governor, and approved by the Secretary of State for the Colonies) are published for information:—

VOLUNTEER LONG-SERVICE MEDAL.

Eligibility.

1. Volunteers, including those who have retired after completing twenty years' service, and officers who have served in the ranks, but have not qualified for the volunteer officers' decoration, will, on completion of twenty years' service in the volunteer force, be granted a medal designated "The Volunteer Long-Service Medal," provided that they are recommended by their present or former commanding officers in the manner prescribed in paragraphs 3 and 4. Volunteers who, prior to the 3rd December, 1897, retired before completing twenty years' service from the date of enrolment, will be considered to fulfil the above conditions as to service if they have been returned as efficient twenty times.

Service.

2. The services rendered after the 3rd December, 1897, by every applicant for the medal, whether as officer, non-commissioned officer, or private, must be continuous.

When a break in service rendered prior to the 3rd December, 1897, occurs, the case will be dealt with as follows:—

(a) When the break does not exceed one year, the decision upon the validity or otherwise of a claim for the medal will be given by the Commandant, and will in such cases be final.

(b) When the break exceeds one year, the Commandant will investigate the case, and submit it, with his recommendation, for the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Defence.

Applications.

3. Applications for the medal will be made on Form 50, through the usual channel of correspondence, to the Commandant, whose decision, except as provided by paragraph 2 (b), upon the validity or otherwise of any claim for the medal will be absolutely final.

Nominal Rolls.

4. Commanding officers will forward with Form 50 a nominal roll, arranged alphabetically on Form 51. This roll will be forwarded in duplicate, one copy being retained by the Commandant, and the other forwarded, with his recommendation, to the Minister of Defence. The individual applications (Form 50) will not be forwarded to the Minister. The Commandant will, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, or 1st October, submit the nominal rolls to the Minister of Defence.

Publication of Names in General Orders.

5. Names of recipients will be promulgated quarterly in General Orders, after the publication of which the original applications (Form 50) will be returned by the Commandant to the head-quarters of the various volunteer corps for record and retention. The distribution of medals will be made by the senior officer of the corps, or as the Commandant shall decide, at the earliest time that a good muster of volunteers can be reckoned upon.

Surrender of Medals.

6. Any officer who is subsequently awarded the "Volunteer Officers'" decoration will surrender the medal.

Forfeiture of the Medal.

7. When the conduct of an officer or a volunteer, after he has been awarded the long-service medal, has been such as to disqualify him from wearing it, he may be deprived of it by His Excellency the Governor.

Restoration.

8. A medal forfeited by an officer or volunteer under the provisions of paragraph 7 may be restored to him by His Excellency the Governor.

Loss.

9. When a long-service medal has been lost, and it is desired to replace it, a declaration must be made before a magistrate, stating the circumstances under which the loss occurred, and the rank, name, and corps of the officer or volunteer to whom the medal belonged. This declaration will be forwarded to the Commandant, through the usual channel of correspondence in the case of an officer or volunteer who is still serving, and direct in the case of one who has retired. The medal will be replaced, on payment, if the explanation as to the loss is considered satisfactory.

The medal will be of the same design as that awarded to volunteers in Great Britain, except that the words "*et Imperatrix*." will be added to the inscription "*Victoria Regina*" on the obverse of the latter.

VICTORIAN VOLUNTEER "LONG AND EFFICIENT SERVICE" MEDAL.

The above medal will still be awarded to volunteers or others who are eligible for the same under the present existing regulations, but that volunteers after five years' extra service as such may be awarded the "Volunteer Long-Service Medal" under the conditions of the Royal Warrant of 13th June, 1896. Volunteers, however, who join after the 3rd December, 1897, will only be awarded the "Volunteer Long-Service Medal."

Volunteers subsequently awarded the "Volunteer Long-Service" medal will surrender the Victorian "Volunteer Long and Efficient Service" medal.

NOTE.—The births registered during the third quarter of 1897 (viz., 8,238) were fewer by 178 and 342 and the deaths (3,565) fewer by 159 and 330 respectively than in the corresponding quarter of 1896 and of 1895, thus resulting in a decrease of only 19 and 22 respectively in the natural increase (4,673).

According to the returns of the immigration agent—unrecorded departures—there was a net emigration by sea during the quarter of 886, resulting from a net gain of 151 males but a net loss of 1,037 females. This was less than in the corresponding quarter of 1896 by 4,502, of 1895 by 688, and also much lower than in any other such quarter since 1891, when there was an excess of arrivals over departures of 1,192. Allowing for unrecorded departures (estimated) the net emigration during the quarter under notice is increased to 2,499, consisting of 1,094 males and 1,405 females, as shown in the table.

Deducting the net emigration from the natural increase, there results an increase of population during the quarter of 2,174, as against a loss of 2,585 in the corresponding quarter of 1896, but as against an increase of 1,631 in that of 1895, of 1,447 in that of 1894, of 866 in that of 1893, and of 3,247 in that of 1892.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 46,973, viz., 36,642 of males and 10,331 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the population at the end of September would have been set down at 1,219,507, viz., 629,010 males and 590,497 females.

Taking the migration returns as recorded by the immigration agent for what they may be worth they show a balance in favour of immigration during the quarter of 198 from New South Wales, 69 from South Australia, 176 from Tasmania, 294 from the United Kingdom, and 422 from Foreign Ports; but a balance in favour of emigration of 1,577 to Western Australia, 115 to Queensland, 107 to New Zealand, 107 to South Seas, and 139 to South Africa. The net emigration to Western Australia fell off by 6,218, as compared with the third quarter of 1896, and that to South Africa by 979; whilst during the first nine months of the year, the net emigration to the former fell from 21,328 in 1896 to 13,659 in 1897, and to the latter from 1,946 to 610.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

**I**n pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1850* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations, *videlicet*:—

201. So much of Clause I. of Part I. of the Regulations made and passed by the Commissioners on the 30th day of November, 1891, as defines the meaning of the words "the Secretary" shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted and read as part of the said clause, *videlicet*:—  
"The Secretary" shall include the person for the time being acting as Secretary to the Commissioners during the absence on leave, sickness, or inability to act of the Secretary.

**BOROUGH OF TARNAGULLA.**

BY-LAW No. 1 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Borough of Tarnagulla made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, 251, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, house and yard rubbish, for maintaining and preserving the cleanliness of public and private drains and channels, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Tarnagulla make the following by-law:-

1. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Tarnagulla.

3. The council may exempt any premises within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Tarnagulla from the operation of this by-law on the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances.

4. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced, when necessary.

5. Every occupier or person shall at least once in every week cause the contents of these receptacles to be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor or depot provided by the borough council.

6. Every occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in any street or lane, and shall cause them to be removed or replaced from time to time as often as occasion shall require, and shall be responsible for emptying and the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

7. Every such occupier or person shall provide and maintain on their premises a proper closet or privy building, constructed with openings or flues to supply ventilation, and the floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the adjoining ground, and shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleaning the same.

8. Every such occupier or person shall furnish and provide for their respective closets a suitable galvanized pan or bucket with proper handles; and such pan may be of the following dimensions, viz.:—15 inches wide and 14½ inches deep, but no pan shall in any case exceed the capacity of 2 cubic feet.

9. Every occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorizing earth for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan to be sufficiently covered with such deodorizing material to thoroughly deodorize the contents of the pan.

10. At least once in every week, or so much oftener as may be necessary, and as the borough council may from time to time direct, the pan shall be emptied by the nightman employed by the borough council, and the night-soil removed, be either rendered inoffensive in a destructor, dessicator, or incinerator, provided by the borough council, or be trenched or ploughed

into land in such locality as may be provided by the borough council, and covered with earth to a depth of not less than 9 inches.

11. No closet-door or trap for removing the pan shall abut or open upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width, and no pan shall be removed or emptied and the contents conveyed through the streets of the borough, except between the hours of Twelve o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m., and except they be inclosed in an air-tight cart.

12. Every such occupier or person shall not employ any persons for the removal of night-soil, save those authorized by the borough council for the purpose, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in cases where exemption is granted.

13. The occupier of any land within the Borough of Tarnagulla on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-yards, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to, in the case of a horse, cow-yard, or cattle-shed manure, 2 cubic yards, and in the case of pig-sty manure, 1 cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

14. Nothing contained in this by-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier or person having the management or control of any premises from causing any dung (soil not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being so used, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used, as to contravene any by-law of the borough council, or to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

15. The occupier of any premises within the Borough of Tarnagulla used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause all rubbish, blood, offal, bones, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed at least once in every 24 hours, and to be deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the borough council from time to time for the final reception of the same; and generally shall cause the said premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to do so, the offensive matter may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

16. No such occupier or person shall deposit any rubbish, yard sweepings, or filth of any kind upon any land, street, lane, drain, water channel, or other place other than the depots provided for the deposit of such by the borough council.

17. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, and not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the borough council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the borough council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Municipal Council in and for the Borough of Tarnagulla this twenty-third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1898.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION No. 55.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 55.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say:—

In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing on the 1st January, 1898, and terminating on the 31st December, 1898, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 55, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 13th day of October, 1897.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Two shillings in the £1 of such valuation.

(3) For each vacant allotment, Two shillings in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation thereof.

2. The following shall be the charges in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering of such building, the same to be paid before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe to be charged one-half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, this 13th day of October, 1897, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION  
No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for domestic purposes, and for other than domestic purposes, to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

2. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (excepting where permission is given to any unlicensed person in writing by the Trust).

5. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Trust shall see fit, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

6. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, or injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable, for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper-bit joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, or bricks, or stone.

10. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe or water-tap conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe or tap requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any)—and if none, the owner—shall, in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable, for each offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

14. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

15. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of, the Trust.

16. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

17. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6 feet 3 inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1 foot 9 inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

18. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first applying a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

19A. The Trust may enter into a special agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic, without the use of a water meter, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

20. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Ten pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Ten pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may authorize in each case.

21. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons One shilling.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him or her with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

23. Permission must be granted by the Trust to any person requiring water for any other purpose other than domestic, either by meter or special agreement. The Trust reserve the right to grant water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for any other than domestic, without the written authority of the Trust, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.

24. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust."

RATING REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. For every house or tenement of over Fifty pounds (£50) annual municipal value, a rate of Five per cent. (5 per cent.) upon the amount of such valuation.

5. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed on.

6. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.

7. For every public water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

8. All public water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

9. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste-pipe from any private bath.

10. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified at his own expense, provide a meter.

11. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully and negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who are in arrears with the payment of their water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes or by any other means that are available by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

12. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe

of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence on that behalf to execute such works.

13. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

14. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officer of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

15. For any breach of any of these Regulations, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

16. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1898, and shall be payable in two instalments. The first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1898, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1898.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1898.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water Act 1830*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

**REGULATION No. 18.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement used as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Four pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings.

6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

7. For every water-trough Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework,



brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1898, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

#### TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 2, 1898.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, repeal the following Regulation heretofore made by them, viz.:—Regulation No. 2, 1897, passed on the 16th day of November, 1896, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of December, 1896, and do hereby, in further pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. No person receiving water from the Trust at or upon any premises shall allow any person to carry or take away any water from such premises, and no such person shall sell any water to any other person.

2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust unto the premises of consumers shall be of the best galvanized quality; and all cocks shall be of high-pressure pattern, and all such service-pipes and cocks shall not be laid or connected with the pipes of the Trust until approved of, in writing, by the Trust's officer, or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch diameter; for the supply of water for all other than domestic purposes by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize, in writing, in each case.

3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, and is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of any such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing an efficient self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

5. No overflow-pipes to private baths shall be connected or affixed.

6. No water-closets shall be supplied direct from any main of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

7. No extension or alteration of any service whatever will be permitted without the written permission of the Trust, and such extension or alteration shall be under the supervision of the Trust's officer, or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved of by the Trust or the Trust's officer, or by such other person as may be authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be removed by any person without he shall give six clear days' previous notice, in writing, to the Trust of his intention so to do.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge

imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, as may be deemed expedient, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause or complaint remains, or is not remedied.

9. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise through the pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

10. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound for each period of three years, the first period dating from 1st January, 1898.

11. Any person infringing these Regulations, or any of them, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

#### TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGU- LATION FOR 1898, No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1898 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling and ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1898.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order (among other things)—

- (a) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such Waterworks Trust.
- (b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council, bearing date the 19th day of October, 1897, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the extent and boundaries of the Waterworks District thereof were, in and by the said Order in Council, duly defined and limited: And whereas by clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, it was ordered that the Municipal Council of the Shire of Wycheproof for the time being and one other Commissioner should be the Waterworks Trust for the said Waterworks District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to repeal the aforesaid clause: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That the said clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered and provided that the councillors for the time being for the North, South, and West Ridings respectively of the Shire of Wycheproof and one other person shall, as from the date hereof, be the Commissioners of the said Wycheproof Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Victoria, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of sheep, cattle, or other ruminant animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or of hay, straw, or fodder into Victoria from India, or by any vessels calling at any port in India.

WHEREAS by section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make rules for regulating the practice and proceedings of the Licensing Courts and for fixing the scale of fees and costs to be allowed to persons practising as counsel or attorneys therein, and for regulating the keeping of all registers, books, entries, and accounts by officers of the said courts, and for regulating the expenses to be paid to witnesses in the said courts, and that any such rules may apply to all Licensing Courts, or to such of the said courts as may be specified in that behalf by the Governor in Council: And whereas by the said section it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may also from time to time make regulations to enforce the carrying out of the said Act and for giving effect to the same: And whereas rules and regulations were accordingly made on the 29th day of August, 1893, fixing (*inter alia*) a scale of allowances to witnesses: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend such scale: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth make the following further rule and regulation (that is to say):—

*Costs of witnesses' attendance.*—The costs of witnesses in attendance at the hearing of any matter or cause by the Licensing Court (although they have not been summoned and although they have not been examined) may be allowed at any rate not exceeding that mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and such rates shall be, on and after the 30th day of November next, in full force and effect, in lieu of the rates fixed by the Order of the Governor in Council made on the said 29th day of August, 1893 (that is to say):—

ALLOWANCE TO WITNESSES.

For Travelling.

1. To every witness or interpreter the *sum actually paid*, but not exceeding One shilling for every mile he may reside from the court at which he may be required to attend.
2. To every witness or interpreter who may travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, the sum actually and properly paid for fares both in going to and returning from the court at which he may be required to attend.
3. No allowance under clause 1 will be made to any witness or interpreter residing within three miles of the court which he may be required to attend.
4. In all cases where practicable witnesses or interpreters must travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, and in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

For Attendance—Subject to Qualification as below.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make Orders as follow, that is to say:—

TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall dig or remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth on or from the bed of the portion of the Yarrowee Creek extending from the east side of Princes-street, in the town of Ballarat East, to the south side of Scott's-parade, or from the Crown lands abutting thereon.—(97.C.4010.)

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

10. Coal to be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

11. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the ship's bunkers, as required by condition No. 8, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.

12. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

13.
