Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be

liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.
