ARTISAN ATTENDANT (CARTER)—HOSPITALS FOR THE INSANE.

ASSISTANT LIGHTHOUSE-KEEPER.—DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND CUSTOMS.

A VACANCY at present exists in the Department of Trade and Customs for an Assistant Lighthouse-keeper. VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1897.

THE births of 50 boys and 44 girls, or in all of 94 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these, 39 occurred in Ballarat East, 42 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 4 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 123, viz., 64 of boys and 59 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 55, viz., 29 of males and 26 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 39. In May they recorded deaths numbered 65; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; in June, 1893, they numbered 67; in June, 1892, they numbered 72; in June, 1891, they numbered 37; in June, 1890, they numbered 65; in June, 1889, they numbered 50; in June, 1888, they numbered 54; and in June, 1887, they numbered 54.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING REGULATION, 1897. No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1897 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments of land liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water-supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be Ten shillings sterling per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. For water supplied by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by meter, shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by rate, at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

6. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION AS TO EXPORT ENTRIES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of July, 1897.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1471) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for generally regulating the export of goods from Victoria for the purpose of denoting what particulars shall be given in outward bills of entry, for the compilation of statistics and for prescribing the various forms to be used, and for prescribing and limiting the penalty (which shall in no case exceed Twenty pounds) that may be enforced for the breach of any such regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made on the 11th day of February, 1897, under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

6. No goods shall be shipped for export on any Sunday or holiday or before or after the hours specified in section 61 of the *Customs Act 1896* on any other day on board any ship in respect to which authority, as provided for in the said Act, has not been first obtained.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

CITY OF RICHMOND.—BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law numbered 49, to afford the use of the Public Baths in Gladell-street to the inhabitants of the city of Richmond, subject to certain conditions.

WHEREAS by the 480th section of the *Local Government Act 1890*, numbered 1112, it is enacted that the council may provide Public Baths, and afford the use thereof respectively to the inhabitants of the municipal district, under and subject to such by-laws as the council may make in that behalf, and either without charge or at such reasonable charges as the council may order by any such by-law.

Now therefore the Council of the City of Richmond do hereby order as follows:—

1. The baths shall be open to the public on week days, from 1st November to 31st March inclusive, from daylight to 9 p.m.; from 1st April to 31st October inclusive, from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.; and on Sundays, throughout the year, from daylight to 10 a.m., and from 4 p.m. to 10 p.m.

2. No person coming direct from any dirty employment shall enter the swimming bath before first washing himself in the shower bath.

3. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the baths.
