EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1898.

It is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 2nd August, 1898, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 31st May, 1898, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That he had attained the age of 21, and had not attained the age of 23, on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 24th February, 1896, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.
- (b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.
2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.
 - (b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.
3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.
5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.
6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
 - (2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
 - (3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.
7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical, Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination, of their intention to present themselves; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s. Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

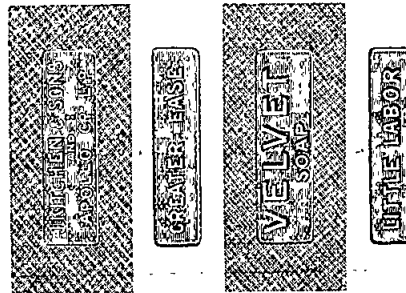

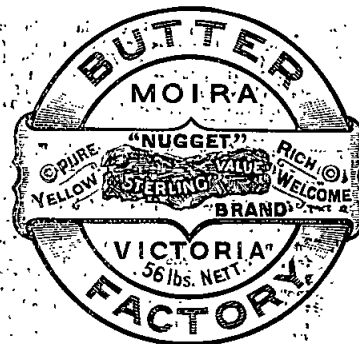

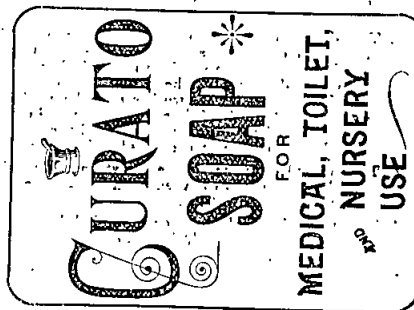

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.**STORES REGULATIONS.**

ALL business appertaining to the receipt, custody, and delivery of stores, plant, and material will be under the management of the storekeeper.

2. The storekeeper will be directly responsible to the secretary, to whom he will address all reports, and from whom he will receive his instructions.

3. It will be the storekeeper's duty to see that the prices of supplies that are not provided for under authorized contracts are fair and legitimate.

4. All stores, plant, and material, except the articles on issue to district and other officers (see clause 45), shall be under the supervision of the storekeeper, who must keep a clear and exact record of all receipts, issues, and payments, and be responsible that all articles placed in his charge are constantly under observation and in proper condition.

5. The storekeeper will receive and prepare for payment, in the manner hereinafter provided, all accounts for stores, plant, and material ordered for the board through the stores branch, and for all materials received by the district officers direct from contractors.

6. The storekeeper will direct the work of the officers and men of the stores branch, maintain discipline in the branch, and be responsible that the business is conducted in an economical, expeditious, and correct manner, and also see that all officers in receipt and custody of the board's materials are supplied with a copy of the stores regulations, and obtain from such officers a receipt therefor.

7. The storekeeper must report to the secretary any irregularities on the part of the staff working under him, and any neglect in carrying out stores regulations. He must suspend any workman guilty of insubordination or incapable of performing his duties.

RECEIPT OF STORES.

8. All supplies (stationery, printing and printed books excepted) must be obtained through the storekeeper on supply order forms (Form A).

9. Orders for supplies will be prepared by the storekeeper, but, before issuing such orders, the storekeeper must have first received a stores order for such supplies signed by the chairman, engineer-in-chief, or secretary (see clause 30), in accordance with section 18 of regulations for the guidance of officers. A copy of each order will be retained for reference by the engineer's or secretary's branches in block of the respective order books.

10. Order books will be supplied by the storekeeper to the engineer's and secretary's branches, also to all district officers who require them for the purpose of forwarding their requisitions for materials.

11. As far as possible, stores should be obtained for and be forwarded direct to "works," so as to avoid all unnecessary handling, bookkeeping and extra cost in cartage.

12. Officers receiving articles direct from contractors and others, and not from the storekeeper, will be held responsible for the quality and quantity of such articles, and any irregularities must be immediately reported to the storekeeper, whose duty it will be to have such irregularities rectified.

13. The storekeeper must see that all stores, plant, and material purchased for the board are accompanied by a bill of parcels or invoice (Form B), on which all particulars are to be furnished. If not forwarded with the goods the invoice must be obtained within forty-eight (48) hours from the time of delivery.

14. When goods are received the invoice is to be signed by the officer receiving them, and he will make any necessary corrections on face of same, and on the duplicate and triplicate cartage tickets.

15. It will be the storekeeper's duty to check rates and values.

16. Invoices, when signed by the officer receiving the articles, will be sent to the storekeeper, who will check them with order, and, if correct, file them in invoice book (Form C) to the credit of the person supplying the articles.

17. From invoices the storekeeper will debit the "stock" or "works" as the case may be.

18. Invoice forms (Form B) will be supplied to contractors and others by the storekeeper.

19. All accounts for payment must be rendered on the forms provided by the board for that purpose (Form O).

20. Each account must be numbered by the storekeeper and compared with invoices.

21. When an account is certified for payment, the account number must be inserted in the place provided on the right-hand top corner of invoice to indicate that such invoice has been passed.

22. When satisfied of the correctness of the account, the storekeeper will certify same. He will also state on the account, for the information of the treasurer, to what "work" or "service" the account is chargeable, and forward same for counter certificate by the responsible officer; the requisition or stores order will be retained by the storekeeper to file for reference. (See clause 9).

23. Accounts, when certified for payment, are to be entered into the "Register of Accounts Certified Book" (Form H), and no certified account is, under any circumstances, to leave the storekeeper's office until so entered.

24. The amount of an account, when certified, will be entered to the debit of the person in whose favour it has been certified on the left-hand side of the invoice book in the portion of the book allotted to such person.

25. If articles that have been procured for a "work" or "service" be not used thereon, and are taken into stock by the district officer concerned, they must be entered in the district ledger, and a returned stores form (Form D), containing all particulars, and with triplicate part signed in full, must be forwarded to the storekeeper.

26. When stores are returned to the storekeeper, they must be accompanied or preceded by the Form I, with full and separate details of articles. The storekeeper will fill in rates and values in the space set apart for same, which must not be written on by the officer forwarding, and the said officer must state from what "work" or "service" the articles are returned, so as to permit of the "work" or "service" being credited with value, and the stock debited with the various articles.

27. The duplicate part of the return stores form, when returned by the cartage contractor duly signed, will be filed by the storekeeper, and will be his authority for certifying account for cartage on same.

28. When articles are procured for a certain "work" or "service," and the whole or a portion of such articles are transferred to and used for some other "service" (but not sent into store), the officer so transferring must advise the storekeeper of the transaction by previously obtaining an order from the engineer-in-chief, which must be forwarded to the storekeeper. The

Return Stores Form D, with full particulars, must accompany the articles. The triplicate part must be signed by the transferrer and also by the transferee, and the latter must forward triplicate to the storekeeper for credit and debit of "works" or "service."

29. All transactions under clauses 25 to 28 must be reported to the engineer-in-chief by the officer desirous of returning or transferring stores, plant, or material, and no goods purchased for a "service" are to be used on any other "service" without the approval of the engineer-in-chief being first obtained in writing.

ISSUE OF STORES.

30. Except in cases of great emergency, such as burst pipes, &c. (and then only upon written interim order from the officer in charge), stores, plant, and material will be issued only on written orders or requisitions bearing the signature or initials of the chairman, engineer-in-chief, or secretary.

31. Stores must be ordered or requisitioned from the storekeeper on the forms provided for the purpose (Form E), books of which will be supplied by the storekeeper. Officers ordering must retain copies of orders in butts of order books.

32. The orders must be forwarded to the storekeeper sufficiently early to enable him to supply the stores by the time they are required, and, if materials be obtained otherwise under pressure of requirement, the order must state from whom received, and if procured outside of contract schedule the price agreed on.

33. In the event of stores having, through unforeseen emergency, to be issued without the usual order having been first obtained, the officer drawing the stores must, at the earliest possible moment, furnish the storekeeper with the usual documents to cover the transaction, and any neglect to do this is to be reported by the storekeeper to the secretary.

34. Under the number of all official orders the storekeeper must quote the number of the order issued to contractors, or otherwise, and file the official order for reference.

35. When stores are supplied from stock, a receipt must be obtained for same on the delivery receipt form (Form F), and the storekeeper will be held responsible that nothing leaves his custody without a receipt on the proper form being obtained.

36. The delivery receipt will be in triplicate. The carter or person who takes away the goods will sign the butt of delivery receipt book, and will take with him the duplicate and triplicate. On the duplicate the carter or other person will obtain the signature of the person authorized to receive the articles, and the triplicate he will leave with the articles for the information of the officer receiving them.

37. If the cartage be by time, the officer issuing the articles must insert on the block, duplicate, and triplicate of delivery receipt book, in the space set apart for that purpose, the hour or time the cart arrives for loading, and initial same in ink. The officer receiving must insert on the duplicate and triplicate the hour or time delivery is made and accepted, and initial same in ink, with full particulars of arrival if he considers delay has taken place during transit. The carter will return the duplicate duly completed to the storekeeper within 48 hours after delivery of material; the latter will file same as a voucher for the stores and his authority to pay cartage.

38. When goods have to be sent by rail, a railway consignment note (Form N) must be used in triplicate. The butt of consignment book will contain all particulars; the duplicate and triplicate will show the number of actual packages or items with marks or address to whom consigned and name of railway station. The railway receipt will be obtained on the duplicate, which will be returned by carter, merchant, or district officer to storekeeper for checking railway freight. The triplicate will be handed over to the Railway Department as the instruction and authority for carriage.

39. The consignment note or triplicate should be attached to railway account when sent in for payment, but if not so attached the number of the note must be quoted on railway account for reference.

40. When goods have to be delivered by rail the duplicate and triplicate of delivery receipt book must be forwarded to the officer to whom the goods have been consigned, and the latter, after signing the duplicate, will return it to the storekeeper, who will paste same in delivery receipt book.

41. The accounts for cartage on articles supplied from or returned to stock, and for all articles supplied through the stores branch, will be dealt with and certified for payment by the storekeeper.

42. District officers having lodged official covering order for materials, to be issued as required must forward by the carter to the storeman, as each separate delivery takes place, a printed interim order, fully signed and dated in ink or indelible pencil, stating details of articles required. District officers must forward to the storekeeper a list of the foremen, inspectors, &c., they may from time to time authorize to sign for goods, or issue interim orders, and direct the persons so authorized to carefully check the nature and quantity of the articles sent, and, if any alteration be made, to initial the entry and sign the form.

LEDGERS.

43. Articles procured for "stock" will be posted to the left-hand or debit side of the various accounts in the Stock Ledger (Form L), quantity, rate, and value being shown. The postings to debit side will be made from the invoices and return stores forms. (See clauses 17 and 25.)

44. The issues will be entered up from the delivery receipts, and will be put on the right-hand or credit side of the various accounts, quantity, rate, and value being shown. (See clause 35.)

45. District officers having stores, plant, or material in their charge will be held responsible for them.

46. The storekeeper must keep district stock ledgers, with money values, which will show the articles in each separate charge. District officers must keep delivery receipt books for

daily entry of issues, stating "service" or "work" concerned, and whether articles are used for construction or maintenance. All entries must be initiated by the district officer in charge, who must prepare at the end of each month a summary of the month's issue, and copy same on the preceding reverse pages of delivery receipt books, commencing on the page opposite the last entry for the month. These books must be forwarded to the stores office not later than the 5th of the following month. Two delivery receipt books must be used by the district officer, so as to have one in use while the second is being dealt with by the stores office.

47. The district officers must keep a stock book or ledger for debit and credit of material in their charge, same to be posted monthly from delivery receipt book summary, or at intervals during month, if convenient.

48. District officers must sign an inventory (Form K) of all articles in their charge at the end of each financial year, or at such times as they may be required to do so.

49. The "Works and Balance Ledger" (Form M) will contain accounts for the various "works" or "services," and in these accounts, on the debit side, will be shown the value of all articles drawn from stock, and on the credit side the value of all articles returned to stock, or transferred to other "services."

50. The "Works and Balance Ledger" will contain the "Profit and Loss" account, and also show, at the end of the financial year a summary of all excesses and deficiencies from the various stock accounts.

51. The "Works and Balance Ledger" will also contain the "General Stock" account, which will be a monetary summary of the whole business for the year.

52. All ledger entries must have the folios and voucher numbers quoted for reference.

MISCELLANEOUS.

53. As often as may be deemed necessary, the storekeeper may average prices of articles identical in description, so as to reduce such articles to a uniform price, and he may convert articles that may be bought by weight to a price per number, so as to save repeated weighings and labour when such articles are issued from stock.

54. As often as may be found necessary, and at least once in each year, viz., on the 30th June, the stock will be taken and all accounts balanced. All officers having charge of stores and materials must afford every facility for the preparation of inventories by the stock-taker.

55. At the end of the financial year, the various stock and district ledgers must be closed and balances brought down for preparation of balance-sheet. Details of distribution of stock showing various "services" must be supplied to the treasurer prior to 27th July in each year. Any excess or deficit found to exist by stock-taker must be adjusted in ledgers for following year upon authority being duly obtained from the board. A record of excesses and deficiencies when prepared by stock-taker must be forwarded to the secretary for attachment to balance-sheet.

56. A priced inventory or stock book will be compiled, which must show the actual stock of stores, plant, and material in the custody of each responsible officer at the close of the financial year, together with "Inventory Sheets," duly signed, showing excesses and deficiencies in each charge.

57. The storekeeper will from the various ledger accounts prepare and submit a general balance-sheet, which will be a summary of receipts, issues, and stock on hand, making allowance for profit and loss (if any) on stock sales, deficiencies written off, &c.

58. The storekeeper will be held responsible for any discrepancies that may be disclosed by the "Profit and Loss" account, until such time as the board determines how such discrepancies are to be finally dealt with.

59. When materials not included in contract schedules are required, and the estimated value does not exceed £25, the storekeeper must arrange for offers to be forwarded in writing direct to the secretary, and when the estimated value exceeds £25, the transaction must not be dealt with by the issue of more than one order, with the object of reducing each account to or under £25, but public tenders must be invited by advertisement.

60. When an officer in charge of material changes or vacates his position, he must obtain an order from the engineer-in-chief or secretary to transfer the material in his charge to another officer, and the order must be sent to the storekeeper advising him of the transaction, so that he may obtain a list of the transferred materials, duly signed by the officer accepting, for the purpose of altering the name of the officer in the stores office books.

61. The storekeeper must keep the time of all workmen employed at the stores depots within the metropolitan area, and prepare wages sheets therefrom, showing "work" or "service" upon which they are engaged.

62. The storeman of each store depot shall have the custody of all teams entering in and proceeding out with material, for the purpose of dealing with such teams, and shall sign cartage receipts for all goods coming into the storeyard. If the goods are received in transit for testing or otherwise, he shall give a receipt, subject to test or examination, and shall then hand over the triplicate carters' ticket to the officer in charge of testing the goods.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed this fourteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the presence of—
