1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

*Marine Act 1890.*AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE  
MARKING OF LOAD-LINES ON SHIPS.

WHEREAS sections 120 and 121 of the *Marine Act 1890* enact that the provisions therein specified shall have effect in respect to the marking of a load-line on foreign-going and home-trade ships by means of a circular disc with a horizontal line drawn through its centre: And whereas it is further enacted by the *Marine Act 1892* that the centre of such disc shall be placed at such level below the deck line marked under the provisions of the said Act as may be approved by the Marine Board of Victoria, and shall indicate the maximum load-line in salt water to which it shall be lawful to load the ship: And whereas by section 5 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Marine Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may make regulations for determining the lines or marks to be used in connexion with such disc in order to indicate the maximum load-line under different circumstances, and at different seasons, and declaring that the provisions of the *Marine Act 1890* shall have effect as if any such line were drawn through the centre of the disc, for determining the mode in which the disc and the lines or marks to be used in connexion therewith are to be marked or affixed on the ship, whether by painting, cutting, or otherwise, for determining the mode of application for and form of certificates under the said Act, for requiring the entry of such certificates and other particulars as to the draught of water and freeboard of the ship in the official log-book of the ship or other publication thereof on board the ship, and as to delivering copies of such entries: And whereas by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* the said Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may repeal any such regulations when so made: And whereas the said Board did, on the 1st day of March, 1895, make regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal such regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of March, 1895, and also to make amended regulations in lieu thereof.

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the aforesaid regulations from the date hereinafter specified, and in lieu thereof doth make the following amended Regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Regulations.*—These Regulations may be cited as “The Regulations relating to the Marking of Load-lines,” and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1897, on which date the previous Regulations hereinbefore referred to shall be repealed.

2. *Circular Disc.*—The circular disc prescribed by section 120 (1) of the *Marine Act 1890* shall be 12 inches in diameter, with a horizontal line 18 inches in length, and drawn through its centre. The disc shall be marked amidships on each side of the ship, the position of its centre being placed at such level as is specified in the Certificate of Approval issued by the Marine Board.

3. *Size and Position of Load-lines.*—The lines to be used in connexion with the disc in order to indicate the maximum load-line under different circumstances, and at different seasons, shall be horizontal lines, 9 inches in length and 1 inch in thickness, extending from and at right angles to a vertical line marked 21 inches forward of the centre of the disc.

The maximum load-lines in fresh water shall be marked abaft such vertical line, and the maximum load-lines in salt water shall be marked forward of such vertical line, as shown in the diagrams hereinafter mentioned.

4. *Maximum Load-lines.*—Such maximum load-lines shall be as follows, and the upper edge of such lines shall respectively indicate:—

For fresh water.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded in fresh water.

For Indian summer.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages during the fine season in the Indian seas, between the limits of Suez and Singapore.

For summer.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages (other than Indian summer voyages) from European and Mediterranean ports between the months of April and September, both inclusive, and as to voyages in other parts of the world (other than Indian summer voyages) the maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded during the corresponding or recognised summer months.

For winter.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages (other than Indian summer voyages and summer voyages) from European and Mediterranean ports between the months of October and March, both inclusive, and as to voyages in other parts of the world the maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded during the corresponding or recognised winter months.

For winter (North Atlantic).—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages to or from the Mediterranean or any European port, from or to ports in British North America or Eastern ports in the United States, the entrance to which from the sea, or the entrance from the sea to the estuary or river on which such ports may be situated, is north of  $37^{\circ} 30'$  north latitude between the months of October and March, both inclusive.

Such maximum load-lines shall be distinguished by initial letters conspicuously marked opposite such horizontal lines as aforesaid, such initial letters being as follows:—

F.W.—Fresh water.

I.S.—Indian summer.

S.—Summer.

W.—Winter.

W., N.A.—Winter, North Atlantic.

5. *Maximum Summer Load-line in salt water*.—The upper edge of the horizontal line passing through the centre of the disc shall always indicate the maximum summer load-line in salt water. The relative positions of the upper edges of the other lines to be used in connexion with the disc, with the upper edge of the line passing through the centre of the disc (the maximum summer load-line), will be indicated in the certificate of approval.

6. *Maximum Load-line for Voyage*.—Part VI. of the *Marine Act 1890* shall have effect as if the maximum load-line applicable to a particular voyage were drawn through the centre of the disc.

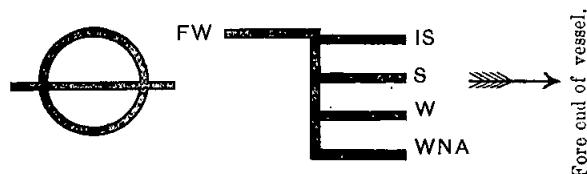
7. *Marking of Steam-ships and Sailing Ships*.—Steam-ships shall be marked on both sides with such of the horizontal lines as aforesaid as are applicable to the nature of their employment, and sailing ships shall be marked on both sides with such of the above-mentioned lines, in addition to the horizontal line passing through the centre of the disc, as indicate the maximum load-line for fresh water and for North Atlantic winter; but sailing ships engaged solely in the coasting trade shall only be marked, in addition to the horizontal line passing through the centre of the disc, with the line indicating the maximum load-line in fresh water.

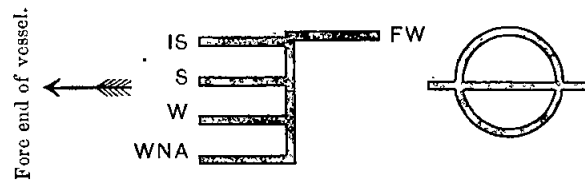
8. *Colour and Marking of Load-lines*.—The said disc and the said maximum load-lines in connexion therewith shall be painted white or yellow on a dark ground, or black on a light ground, and the position of the disc and of each of the lines shall, in the case of iron and steel vessels, be permanently marked by centre punch marks, and shall, in the case of wooden vessels, be sunk for their breadths into the planking a depth of not less than one-quarter of an inch.

9. *Diagrams*.—The position of the disc and the horizontal line passing through its centre, as also the lines to be used in connexion with the disc, are shown in the following diagrams:—

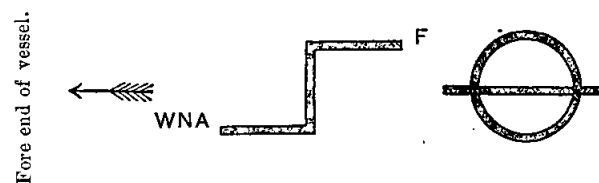
1. STEAM-SHIPS.

Starboard Side.

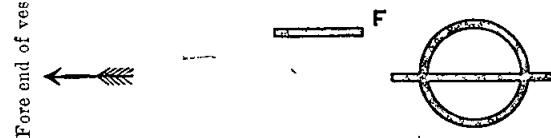


*Port Side.*

10. *Application for Certificate, &c.*—Application for a certificate of approval of the position of the disc and of the lines to be used in connexion therewith, or any alteration thereof, shall be made by one of the registered owners of the ship or by the builder of the ship to the Marine Board of Victoria. Every application shall be made in the form marked L.L. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

11. *Duration of Certificates.*—With respect to certificates of approval and their duration, the following rules shall prevail:—

- (a) As regards all ships classed in Lloyd's Register, or by any other corporation or association for the survey or registry of shipping approved by the Board of Trade, the certificate of approval shall cease to have effect when the class of the ship is changed or withdrawn. Such certificate shall be in the form L.L. 2 or L.L. 3 in the Schedule hereto, according as the ship is a steam-ship or sailing ship.
- (b) As regards unclassified iron and steel steam-ships, the certificate of approval will be granted for the period mentioned therein, and upon the expiration of such period the certificate shall cease to have effect. The certificate shall be in the form L.L. 2 in the Schedule hereto.

- (c) As regards unclassed wooden ships which have been opened out for survey, and unclassed iron and steel sailing ships, the certificate will be granted for a fixed time varying with the age and condition of the ship, and at the expiration of such period it shall cease to have effect. Such certificate shall be in the form L.L. 3A in the Schedule hereto.
- (d) As regards unclassed wooden ships which have not been opened out for survey, no limit of time will be imposed in the certificate, which shall be in the form L.L. 3B in the Schedule hereto.
- (e) As regards all vessels having deck erections in respect of which deductions have been made for freeboard, if any change tending to invalidate the right to such deductions is made in the structural condition of the deck erections, the certificate of approval shall thereby cease to have effect.

12. *Certificate to be issued in duplicate.*—Every certificate of approval shall be issued in duplicate; one part shall be delivered to the applicant, and the other part shall be furnished to and retained by the Secretary to the Marine Board.

13. *Expiration of Certificates.*—On a certificate of approval ceasing to have effect, application shall at once be made by the registered managing owner of the ship for the granting of a new certificate of approval, but such new certificate shall not be issued until the old certificate shall be delivered up to the Marine Board, who shall cancel the same.

14. *Entries in Official Log.*—The master of every British ship shall, before she leaves any dock, wharf, port, or harbor in Victoria, for the purpose of proceeding to sea, enter in the official log all the particulars stated in the certificate so issued as aforesaid if not previously entered.

15. *Certificate to be conspicuously exhibited on board.*—The managing owner or master shall forthwith, on the delivery to him or his agent of any such certificate as aforesaid, cause the same to be framed and put up in some conspicuous part of the ship so as to be visible to all persons on board the same, and shall cause it to be continued so put up so long as such certificate remains in force and such ship is in use.

16. *Amidships.*—For the purpose of these Regulations the expression "amidships" shall mean the middle of the length of the load water line as measured from the fore side of the stem to the aft side of the stern post.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this third day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

*Note.*—In accordance with the Regulations made by the Marine Board of Victoria the disc and lines must be permanently marked by centre punch marks or cutting, and the particulars given in this certificate are to be entered in the official log. The certificate must also be framed and put up in some conspicuous part of the ship.

If and so soon as any change is made in the structural condition of those deck erections in respect of which deductions have been made for freeboard, this certificate will be cancelled, and must be delivered to the Secretary to the Marine Board for that purpose, and the owner must then apply for a new certificate.

The *freeboard for Winter, North Atlantic trades*, applies to vessels sailing to or from the Mediterranean or any British or European port, and which may sail to or from or call at ports in British North America or eastern ports in the United States, the entrance to which from the sea, or the entrance from the sea to the estuary or river on which such ports may be situated, is north of 37° 30' north latitude from October to March inclusive.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF ANIMALS BY SHIP.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make regulations for the carriage of animals on ships leaving Victorian ports and also for affixing penalties to any breach of any regulations made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following regulations, that is to say:—

These regulations may be cited as "The Regulations for the Carriage of Animals by Ship," and shall come into force on the first day of November, 1897.

## GENERAL.

**Definitions.**—For the purposes of these regulations the words and expressions following shall have the meaning set opposite to each:—

"Steerage passenger" shall mean all passengers except *bond fide* first cabin passengers.

"Passengers" shall include all persons carried in a ship whether for or without payment or consideration of any kind, exclusive of the master and crew, and the owner, his family, and servants.

"Cattle or large cattle" shall include both sexes of horned cattle, horses, camels, asses, and mules, and four sheep or four pigs or four goats shall be deemed equivalent to and may, subject to the same conditions, be carried in lieu of one head of large cattle.

**Penalty.**—Any breach of these regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

**Classes of ships.**—For the purposes of these regulations the ships to which such regulations apply shall be divided into two classes, namely:—

Class I.—Ships carrying passengers exceeding twelve (12) in number.

Class II.—Ships carrying passengers not exceeding twelve (12) in number.

and the regulations applicable to each class shall be as follows:—

## Class I.

## REGULATIONS FOR SHIPS PROCEEDING TO SEA FROM ANY PORT IN VICTORIA AND CARRYING MORE THAN TWELVE (12) PASSENGERS.

1. Animals shall not be carried below any deck on which steerage passengers are berthed, nor in any space adjoining any compartment in which passengers are berthed, except in ships built of iron, and of which the compartments are divided off by water-tight bulkheads.

2. Animals shall not be carried on any part of a ship where they would interfere with the light, ventilation, or approach to the entrance of the steerage, nor in any part where they would obstruct the passage to any water-closet set apart for the use of passengers.

3. A sufficiently clear space on the spar or weather deck shall be left for the use and exercise of the steerage passengers at the rate of at least 10 superficial feet for each statute adult. In the case of a steam-ship, such space shall be at that end of the ship in which the steerage is situated: that is to say, if the steerage is forward of the bridge the promenade space shall be forward of the bridge, and if the steerage is abaft the bridge the promenade space shall be abaft the bridge also. No space forward of the windlass or breakwater, or the top of any hatch, will be measured or allowed for passengers' promenade space.

4. A clear passage on deck of at least 2 feet wide, extending from end to end of the ship on both sides, shall be provided and kept free of obstruction, or, if the above is found to be impracticable, and the surveyor or other officer appointed by the Marine Board approve, in lieu thereof a good and substantial gangway shall be fitted on top of the stalls or pens on both sides of the ship, so that there shall be a clear passage kept free of obstruction, extending from end to end of the ship and to all the boats or other life-saving appliances. Such gangway shall be securely constructed, not less than 2 feet wide, and fitted with proper stanchions of wood or iron, placed at distances of not more than ten (10) feet apart, and fitted with double rails or man ropes. The said gangways shall be of a substantial character, and approved by the surveyor or other officer appointed by the Marine Board. A single gangway of a like character to the above may be substituted, provided it is placed along the middle of the ship, but such a gangway must not be in any way connected with the stalls or pens, but form a permanent part of the ship.

5. No animals, cargo, or stores shall be carried under or near any of the boats or other life-saving appliances in such a way as to interfere with the free access to the same and the gear connected therewith.

6. No cargo of any kind shall be carried on the bridge or spar deck without permission in writing from the surveyor or officer aforesaid.

7. Not more than six dogs, and no pigs or male goats, shall be carried.

The foregoing regulations shall not apply to any ship which is an "emigrant ship" within the meaning of section 268 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, or any Act amending the same.

## Class II.

## REGULATIONS FOR SHIPS PROCEEDING TO SEA FROM ANY PORT IN VICTORIA, AND CARRYING PASSENGERS NOT EXCEEDING TWELVE (12) IN NUMBER.

8. Cattle may be carried on any deck or in the lower hold provided that the distance from the deck or bottom of the hold shall not be less than seven (7) feet to the deck above, and that adequate ventilation is provided.

9. Cattle shall not be carried on or over any hatch or hatch-way.

10. Cattle shall not be carried in any part of the vessel in such a manner as to interfere with its ventilation, or in any place in which, in the ordinary course of navigation, such cattle would interfere with the proper management of the vessel, or with free access to the boats or other life saving appliances and the gear connected therewith.

11. A good, substantial, and sufficient gangway, free of obstruction, must be provided from end to end of the vessel, and to all the boats.

12. No cattle shall be carried in any part of a vessel unless properly secured in substantial stalls or pens erected for the purpose.

13. The stanchions of stalls or pens shall be securely fastened to the decks by means of iron sockets or other equally secure method; and the materials used in the construction of the stalls or pens, whether of wood or iron, shall be of a substantial character, and of sufficient strength and so adjusted as to withstand the action of the weather and to resist the weight of the cattle being thrown against them.

14. Each stall or pen shall be provided with proper battens to prevent the cattle (other than bullocks, cows, camels, sheep, pigs, or goats) from slipping; such battens shall be securely fastened to the deck by angle iron plates, or other equally secure fastenings, and all iron decks must be covered with wood between the battens. The sides and ends of stalls or pens shall be not less than seven (7) feet high.

15. Cattle shall be protected from the weather by proper and suitable shelter. The whole of the fittings to be approved by a surveyor or other officer appointed by the Board.

16. Each horse, mule, or ass carried shall be provided with a separate stall, having a deck space of not less than 7ft. 6in. by 2ft. 4in. All other cattle not provided with separate stalls shall be carried in pens, having a deck space of not less than 10ft. by 8ft.

17. Not more than four head of large cattle shall be carried in one pen, or if small store cattle, five beasts may be allowed; but sufficient deck space shall be allotted in every pen to enable the cattle to properly feed and rest during the voyage.

18. Not more than sixteen sheep, goats, or pigs may be carried in one pen having the deck area specified for four large cattle, but they may be carried in two tiers, each tier to be not less than 3ft. 6in. high. Temporary hurdles will not be allowed.

19. Proper arrangements must be made to the satisfaction of a surveyor or other officer appointed by the Board for insuring cleanliness in connexion with the animals, and for the stowage of their fodder, so that such fodder shall not be unduly exposed to the weather at sea.

20. In front of every single row of cattle there shall be for convenience in attending to such cattle a sufficient passage-way free from obstruction, and of such width as shall be approved by the inspecting officer. Spare pens for every hundred large cattle carried shall also be provided, and the gross dimensions of such pens shall be equal to three (3) per cent. of the space required for every hundred head of any sized cattle.

21. All enclosed portions of the vessel used for cattle shall be efficiently ventilated (in addition to any ventilation obtained from hatchways) by cowls or other proper means for the admission of fresh air and the removal of foul air.

22. Every camel, horse, mule, or ass shall be securely tied by the head so as to stand athwartships, and every head of cattle shall have an efficient head rope attached round the neck or horns, so that the animals can, if considered necessary, be properly secured.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this seventeenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

## STEIGLITZ PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

**ORDERS** for opening a grave must be given the day previous to interment. The burial may be more speedily effected when practicable, but cannot be guaranteed, and all charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but persons desiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them at their own expense under the direction of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be given on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule, and every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

3. Any applicant desiring to bury a corpse in any private grave or vault (not his own) must bring the consent in writing of the owner of such grave or vault to be left with the order.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

5. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession will be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals are from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays when the usual and only hours will be from Twelve noon to Four p.m. throughout the year.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

8. A plan or drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, monument, tablet, or fence proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. The trustees claim the right (notwithstanding the plans at present habitually used and referred to) to make any desirable alterations in the unsold portions of the cemetery in the size of allotments, width or direction of paths, &c., always provided that unobstructed access by existing paths be preserved to every grave previously purchased.

10. All persons damaging the fences or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

12. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

13. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

15. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

16. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Thistle Act 1893*, I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare certain plants named respectively *Rosa Rubiginosa*, commonly known as "Sweet Briar," and *Ulex Europæus*, commonly known as "Furze," to be thistles within the meaning of the *Thistle Act 1890* throughout the Shire of Ferntree Gully.

THE Government having made arrangements for the resumption of portions of Mr. James O'Connor's Mallee allotments numbered 162, 162A, 163, 164, and 165, in the county of Tatchera, and known as "Ultima," applications will now be received for allotments within the proposed subdivision of such areas.

Applications, accompanied by the registration fee of £1, must be made on the usual form, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, and lodged at any Crown Lands Office or Receipt and Pay Office in the colony before 22nd day of October next.

The number of allotments available will be about 48, in areas not exceeding 640 acres.

One application by each applicant is sufficient, and will be considered as being made for any one of the allotments available, and not for any particular area; it must be filled in "Application for portions of O'Connor's land at Ultima."

The applications received will be dealt with by a Special Local Land Board, at Swan Hill, on Thursday, 11th November, and, if necessary, following days. ## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF NEWSTEAD.

THE Council of the Shire of Newstead, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Newstead, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for football or cricket matches, or sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, buildings, or fences in or around the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall bring any horse or vehicle into the reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter into any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
